

Season Preview

Even after a tough finish to last season, head coach Steve Anson has high hopes for the Washburn baseball team this spring.

Anson, who picked up his 600th career collegiate coaching victory in the last series of last season, saw his team lose too many leads late in ball-games in 2002.

The Ichabods lost 13 games by three runs or less to finish with a 16-32 record, including 10 by just a single run.

“We lost a lot of really close games that we had chances to win,” said Anson, who is in his his 24th season at the helm of the Ichabods. “We need to execute and win those games this year.”

After getting off to slow starts the past couple of seasons, Anson also knows the importance of winning early to start 2003.

“It will be really important to get off to a good start and compete early,” said Anson. “Our schedule is as challenging as it has been in the last six or seven years. We have a very tough non-conference schedule against a lot of very competitive teams.”

The squad returns 13 letterwinners from 2002, which include 10 seniors. Senior second baseman Ben Rutherford and senior centerfielder Dylan Smith have been steady contributors for the last three seasons,

while closer Brigham Joy tied the school record with seven saves and had a team-best 3.27 ERA as a junior last season.

“We need our seniors to step up and take charge and instill in our new players what it takes to win in this conference,” said Anson. “It will be a dog fight for the four spots (MIAA Tournament) again this season.”

Central Missouri State may be the front-runner for the conference title

again after making the national semi-finals last season.

Pittsburg State, Missouri Southern and Northwest Missouri challenged for national tournament spots last season.

The Ichabods hope to take advantage of their team speed and depth to challenge for a top spot in the MIAA.

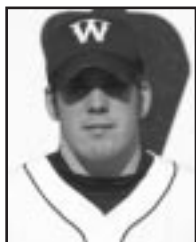

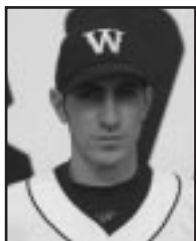

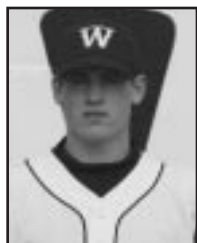

2002 In Review

Even though coach Steve Anson reached a milestone victory late in the season, the Washburn Ichabods didn't do much celebrating last season and missed the MIAA Tournament finals for the first time in five seasons.

The Ichabods, who finished with a 16-32 overall and 10-19 MIAA record, let leads slip away and couldn't close out tight games early in the season.

The Ichabods let leads slip away in both games of a doubleheader with Rockhurst on February 23 to fall to 1-4 to open the season.

Kevin Smith got the Ichabod their first two wins with a complete game nine-inning win over Bethany and a complete-game three-hit shutout against Nebraska-Omaha March 7.

Washburn got some more good outings by their starting to get it going by taking three out of four games in one stretch to improve to 6-8.

Ryan Fickel tossed a complete game to lead the Ichabods to victory over Fort Hays State 3-1 and Jeff Stack followed a few days later with a 6-1 victory by giving up eight hits and an earned run in nine innings.

Washburn fell back on hard times to lose nine of their next 11 games, including MIAA sweeps by Northwest Missouri State and Emporia State early in the conference season to dig into a hole in the MIAA race.

The Ichabods responded by winning six of their next eight, capped by a 13-8 win over Southwest Baptist on April 13.

Then the season hit rock bottom for

Washburn, which fell in 11 of 12 games down the stretch.

The Ichabods dropped seven straight in MIAA play, including doubleheader sweeps by Missouri Southern and Missouri Western and a three-game sweep by Central Missouri at home.

In his eighth try setting on 599 career victories, Anson's squad came through to give the coach his 600th career win with a 5-3 victory over Pittsburg State on May 4. Kevin Smith pitched eight solid innings, giving up only two runs on six hits.

Brigham Joy was Washburn's Most Valuable Player and earned second team All-MIAA honors as a relief pitcher. Joy tied a school record and tied for the MIAA lead with seven saves and posted a 2.86 ERA in 22.0 innings pitched.

Joy had eight straight relief appearances without surrendering a run in one stretch during the season, which spanned 9.2 innings.

Dylan Smith was the only other member of the team to earn all-conference honors. He was selected to the All-MIAA honorable mention team by leading Washburn with a .331 average and 54 hits in 163 at-bats.

Allan Cooper, Matt Deutsch, Ryan Garton, Brigham Joy, Justin Padilla, Ben Rutherford and Kyle Wilson each made the MIAA Commissioner's Honor Roll. Rutherford was a Verizon Academic All-District second team selection, while Ryan Garton was an MIAA Presidential Scholar.

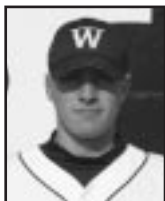
