Falley Field became the home for Washburn baseball in 1990. Since the first game in 1990 Falley Field has been a great venue for baseball in the MIAA. The ballpark will soon undergo major improvements and make the setting among the elite in NCAA Division II.

Initial plans for Falley Field include five major changes. The foul lines will be reconfigured and the current fencing will be replaced by 4-foot wooden fencing along the foul lines along with 8-foot fencing in the outfield.

Three additional batting cages will be installed along the left field line and bullpens will be constructed to run parallel along each foul line. An equipment and maintenance facility will be added adjacent to the right field bullpen. The infield surface will be recrowned and astroturf will be installed to replace existing surface.

Washburn University was established in February 1865 as Lincoln College by a charter issued by the State of Kansas and the General Association of Congregational Ministers and Churches of Kansas. A two-story brick building on the northeast corner of 10th and Jackson Streets was soon erected and the first classes began in January 1866. In 1868, the school was renamed Washburn College, in recognition of a \$25,000 donation by Ichabod Washburn, a church deacon and resident of Worcester, Mass.

The university was granted a permanent location in 1865 when Topekan Col. John Ritchie donated a 160-acre site, which at the time was a considerable distance southwest of the city. Construction on the first building began in 1872, with occupancy

taking place in 1874. For the next two decades, college President Peter MacVicar conducted an aggressive development campaign. His efforts resulted in the establishment of numerous Victorian limestone structures which characterized the campus for the next 90 years.

Expansion of the school was constant. The School of Law was organized in 1903, as was a School of Fine Arts and a medical school, which educated physicians until 1913. During the next three decades structures such as the Mulvane Art Museum, Benton Hall and Whiting Field House were added to the campus. In June 1966, a tornado struck Topeka and several historic buildings on campus were demolished. The Washburn community rallied and financial support from friends and alumni made possible the rebuilding of many school facilities during the coming



years. Today, university facilities offer more than one million square feet of modern academic and support space.

In 1941, the citizens of Topeka endorsed Washburn by voting to establish a municipal university, supported in part by the city and governed by a local board of regents.

In 1952, the Washburn Board of Regents officially changed the name of the school to Washburn University of Topeka. In 1999, the university's primary funding was moved from city property tax to county sales tax sources, with the school retaining status as a municipal subdivision of the state. In addition to local financial support, Washburn has received state funds since 1961, which have been coordinated by the Kansas Board of Regents since 1991. Washburn is governed by its own nine member Board of Regents.

Washburn provides broadly-based liberal arts and professional education through more than 190 certificate, associate, baccalaureate, master's and juris doctor programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Law, Business, Nursing and Applied Studies. Ninety-seven percent of the faculty hold a doctorate or the highest degree available in their discipline.



Dr. Jerry B. Farley
University President

Jerry Farley became the 14th President of Washburn University in 1997 following an extensive career in finance and business affairs at several

Oklahoma higher education institutions. Aside from a full schedule of Washburn responsibilities, Dr. Farley speaks and teaches around the United States on topics related to Higher Education Finance, Auditing, Management and Leadership. He is a C.P.A. and has been the president and chair of the board of several state and national professional organizations. He has

authored or co-authored numerous articles and books on finance and accounting.

Dr. Farley holds a degree in finance and accounting, an MBA, and a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration - all from the University of Oklahoma.

Serving on local and state boards has always been a priority for Dr. Farley. He is past president of the Topeka Chamber of Commerce. He has served on the board of directors of Red Cross, American Cancer Society, Boy Scouts, United Way and economic development corporations including Go Topeka.

He is the recipient of awards for outstanding contributions in public service, accounting, and higher education.

Loren Ferré became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D. Ferré is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

This past season, Ferré was named the Central Region Athletic Director of the Year.

John Burns is in his third season as a Certified Athletic Trainer after joining Washburn Athletics in August of 2003.

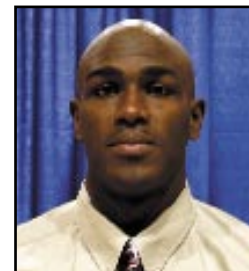

Falley Field became the home for Washburn baseball in 1990. Prior to that, the Ichabods played their home games at McDonald Park, about three miles from campus.

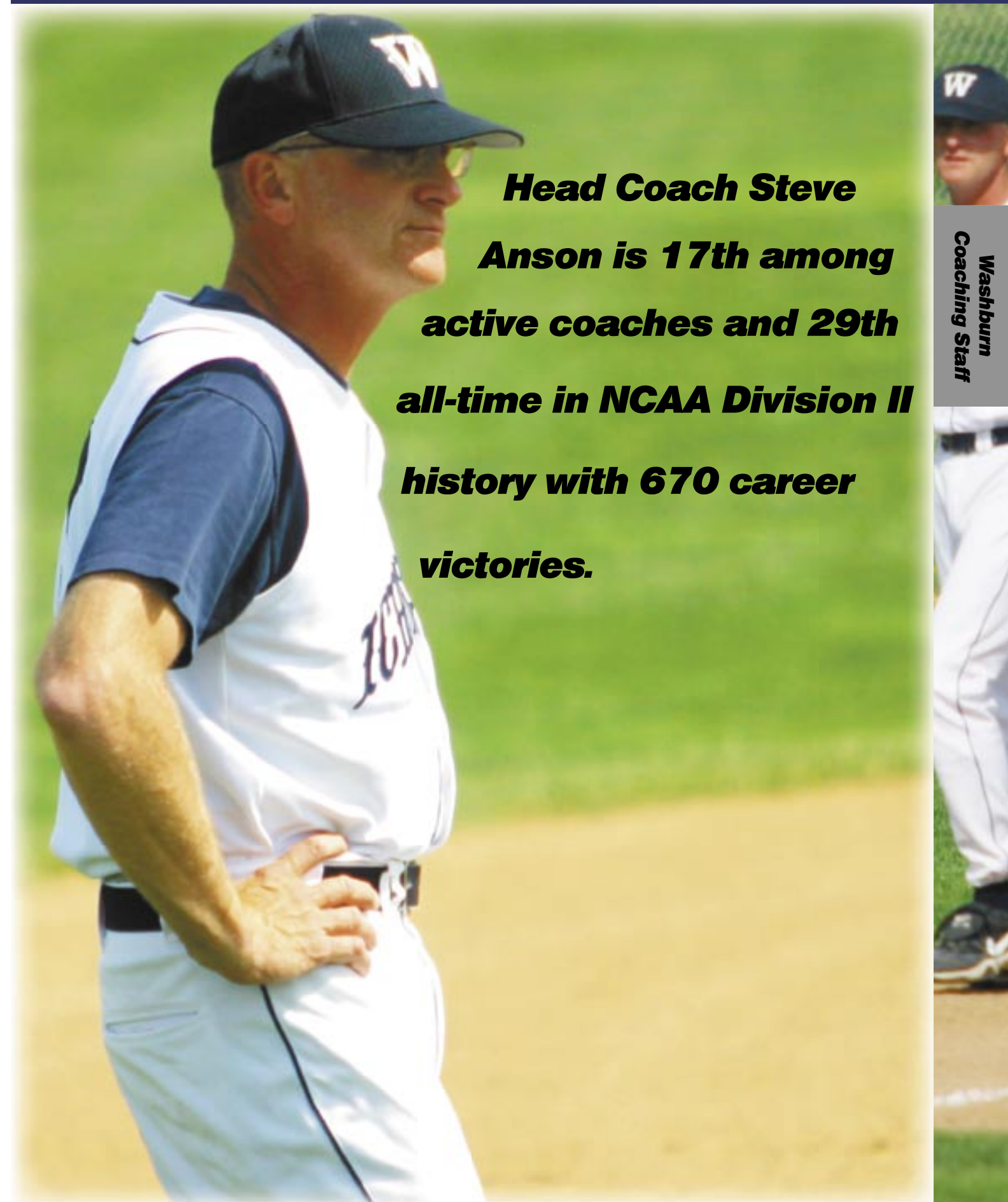

Steve Anson - Head Coach

Now entering his 27th season with the Ichabod baseball program, Steve Anson has guided the Ichabods to eight 30-win seasons, six bids in the MIAA postseason tournament, five consecutive NAIA District 10 playoff appearances and a Central States Intercollegiate Conference (CSIC) crown.

In 2004, Anson picked up his 600th win as the Ichabod skipper March 7 against North Dakota. He became the 30th NCAA Division II coach to reach the 600-win mark overall in 2002.

At Washburn, Anson has coached the Ichabods to a 647-

557-3 (.538) record, making him the winningest coach in team history. His overall career record is 670-579-3 through 27 seasons. He ranks 17th on the active NCAA Division II victory list and was 29th in all-time wins in Division II. He is second in victories among active MIAA coaches.

He was named the CSIC coach of the year after his team won the conference championship in 1989 and the MIAA Coach of the Year in 1994 after Washburn went 37-13. His 1991 squad won the MIAA North Division title and finished runner-up at the conference postseason tournament.

2000 was a banner year for the Ichabods as they finished the season 37-21. The 37 wins tied a school record for wins in one season. The Ichabods also set numerous school records for hits, triples, doubles and at-bats.

Experience and maturity should be evident as the Washburn baseball team takes the field for the 2006 season.

The Ichabods return 19 letterwinners, including six position starters and a pitching staff that should be led by returning players who know what to expect from the season. Five of the seven players who hit .300 return, as do two pitchers with ERAs under 4.00. Head coach Steve Anson hopes that the depth his team has in every aspect of the game will lead the Ichabods to another winning season and a chance for postseason play.

"I think Central Missouri will be the favorite again," said Anson. "But the conference is going to be a dog fight with probably six or seven other teams with a chance to get into the playoffs."

Here's a look at the 2006 squad Anson hopes will have what it takes to get through the season with a winning record:

The Pitching Staff

Senior Jake Lenherr and junior Randy Wild will return to the mound as the top starters while senior Josh Ray and juniors Jake Loveless, Jeff LaCerte and Brett Unrein will also look to start. Junior transfer Eric Dales and senior transfer Adam Schroeder were injured during the fall, but will work this spring to get into the rotation.

Lenherr led the staff last year with a 7-3 record, 75 strikeouts, eight complete games and three shutouts. His completed game total led the MIAA and his 3.89 ERA was the seventh lowest in the league, leading him to second team all-MIAA honors.

"Jake's a guy that can give you a chance

to win every time. He throws strikes and works ahead in the count," said Anson.

Wild, 5-4 in 10 starts, led WU and was fourth in the MIAA with a 3.14 ERA. His .204 opponent batting average was the lowest allowed in the conference.

"He suffered some close losses last year but has worked hard since then and built up his confidence," said Anson. "He's improved his control and can throw in the low 90's."

Left-handed junior Troy Baird, freshman Drew Tucker and sophomores Matt Traxler and Lindsay Prestia will all look to work out of the bullpen, as will right-handed juniors Raub Kirkwood and Keith Barkemeyer and sophomore Sam Keim. Unrein can also come out of the pen, earning three saves last year.

"We're going to have a solid bunch that can start or come out of the pen for us," said Anson. "With only one freshman, we should have an experienced staff that can set the tone for every game."

Behind the Plate

The Ichabods will probably have the most depth but the least experience in the catching position this year. Junior transfer Tommy Mangino and sophomore transfer Mark Stoltz will join redshirt freshman Carl Lisher and junior Tyler Frazee, a converted two-year pitcher. Stoltz had surgery and missed the fall while Mangino was with the Ichabod football team.

Around the Infield

Power-hitting senior Jesse Schmidt will return for his fourth season at first base. He hit .337 and led the team in home runs (9), hits (64), and RBI (56), earning all-conference honorable mention honors. Schmidt led the team with a .988 fielding percentage, making five errors in 434 chances.

"He's a solid defender and if he cuts down his strikeouts, he should continue to be a power threat," said Anson.

Redshirt freshman Jeff Maxon and sophomore transfer Taylor Martin will also look for time at first and, as lefties, could also see opportunities in pinch-hitting situations.

Senior third baseman Michael Hammersmith will look to return to his spot. He batted .301 with 32 RBI. Also looking to play at that corner will be senior Chris Atkins and freshman Ryan Vande Velde. Atkins batted .312 last year

playing mostly in the outfield.

Anson will have some choices to make in the middle of his infield. Atkins can play at second base but will have competition from sophomore Bryce Wood and Kirkwood. Sophomore Tyler Blankenship got some experience at shortstop last year and will look for the starting job. Also able to play at short is Wood.

In the Outfield

Anson will see some of the most depth he's seen in a while in outfield. Senior all-MIAA honorable mention honoree Sam Sissom will return for his fourth season looking to start in center field again. He hit .324 as the leadoff man and was second in the MIAA in stolen bases with 29. Junior transfer Lucas Hackmann and freshman Calvin Iversen will also look for time there.

Sophomore Shane Miles got some time in right field and will try returning their after rehabbing a broken hand. He hit .269 last year with six doubles. Senior Luke Manners played in left field last year, batting .292 with a pair of homers.

Looking to fill in some time in the corner outfield spots will be freshman Reed Howard and sophomore transfers Robert Dolan and Nick Barnes.

"We've got lots of depth and good competition for every outfield spot this year," said Anson. "I'll try and give everyone a look and see who comes out on top."

The Designated Hitter

Wild will return to his role as the DH this year. The power hitter will have the top returning average after hitting .364 last year with 33 RBI.

The 2005 Washburn baseball season started off strong with the Ichabods winning 13 of their first 21 games but a tough stretch late in the season led Washburn to a 23-31 record and eighth-place finish in the MIAA at 10-21. Despite not finishing as high as they wanted to, the Ichabods did bring home numerous awards and sent one player off to play professional baseball.

The Ichabods started the season with a 16-game home stand, going 8-8 in the games. Included in that stretch was a doubleheader split with NCAA tournament participant Wayne State and a four-game sweep of Minnesota-Crookston. Washburn out scored the Golden Eagles 55-8 and batted .411 as a team. Randy Wild pitched a no-hitter, striking out 14 and walking just one. Jake Lenherr pitched a two-hit shutout in that series, striking out a team season-high 15. Chris Atkins batted .800 (12 of 15) with 10 RBI and five runs scored while Shane Miles had eight hits and eight RBI during the four games.

After leaving the friendly confines of Falley Field the Ichabods won four straight on the road and capped the streak at five with a home win over Truman. Nolan Deitrich batted .643 (9 for 14) during the winning streak and Lenherr picked up two wins with 16 strikeouts with a 0.64 ERA.

A split with Fort Hays State led the way into MIAA play. Midway through the conference season the Ichabods were looking good at 20-18 overall, but a 10-game losing streak dropped Washburn out of postseason contention. The Ichabods were batting .313 before the streak and were holding opponents to a .280 average. They finished the season hitting .297 in the last 16 games while opponents had a .373 average. The Ichabods finished strong, though, taking two of three against in-state rival Pittsburg State to

wrap up the year.

After the season was over Jerad Head became the first Ichabod since Rick DeHart in 1992 to sign a professional contract when he put his name on the dotted line for the Cleveland Indians.

Head, a junior shortstop, led the Ichabods in 2005 with a .376 batting average and earned all-MIAA honorable mention honors. He stole 25 bases and moved into sixth in all-time steals with 56 in his career. He had 16 multi-hit games, including a pair of four-hit performances.

Head went to Cleveland's Instruction League in Winter Haven, Florida, in September and he will return for spring training on March 1.

Joining Head on the all-conference team were second team member Lenherr and honorable mention honorees Deitrich, Wild, Jesse Schmidt and Sam Sissom.

Wild finished second on the team with a .364 batting average and on the mound he led the staff and was fourth in the conference with a 3.14 ERA. His .204 opponent batting average led the MIAA. Lenherr finished up leading the team with a 7-3 record. His eight complete games led the MIAA and he was second with three shutouts.

Schmidt batted .337 and led the team with nine home runs and 56 RBI. Sissom was a .324 hitter with 29 stolen bases, the second most in the league. His 47 walks led the MIAA and his 53 runs scored was the eighth highest total.

Overall, the Ichabods were sixth in the MIAA with a .307 batting average and their team ERA of 6.95 was seventh. They were the fifth best fielding team with a .956 percentage.



All-MIAA honorable mention pitcher Randy Wild threw a no-hitter against Minnesota-Crookston, striking out 14. He finished the year with a 3.14 ERA to lead the team and his .204 opponent batting average led the MIAA. He was a .364 batter as the designated hitter.



Nolan Deitrich is now an assistant coach after batting .341 last year with 26 RBI and 10 doubles. He earned honorable mention all-MIAA honors as a second baseman. He batted .643 during a five-game winning streak early in the year.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, a 10-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri and Kansas, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 15 years, the league has undergone several changes, highlighted by expansion and increased participation in national championships.

The MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 11 national championships and more than 100 individual national titles.

The MIAA currently conducts conference championships in eight men's and eight women's sports. Men's champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball, tennis, and golf. Women's champions are determined in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, softball and tennis.

Ralph McFillen was named to succeed Ken B. Jones as commissioner of the MIAA in January 1997, and took over in July of that year. He formerly served as commissioner of the Metro and Gulf South conferences. Matt Newbery, formerly an assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State University, joined the conference in July 1994 as director of sports information.

Washburn first fielded an inter-collegiate baseball team around the first of the century. Early yearbooks place the first team in 1898. The first records of baseball were in 1947. The first Ichabod boys of spring went 3-4 against the University of Nebraska-Omaha, Kansas State University and Missouri Valley College.

The school's second team in 1948 went an impressive 10-0 followed by a 10-3 record in 1949. After a 2-6 record in 1950, Washburn discontinued baseball until Marion McDonald brought back the sport in 1957.

The '57 Ichabods went 8-5 and finished fourth in the Eastern Kansas Baseball League with a 3-5 record.

Through the 50-year history of the baseball program, Washburn has amassed a 951-609-3 (.608) all-time record. The Ichabods have had 31 winning seasons, 19 losing seasons and one .500 season.

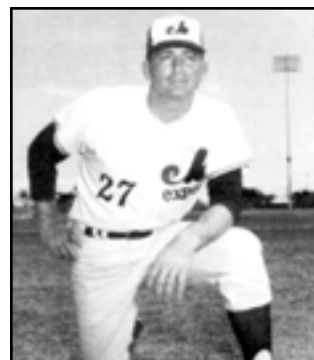
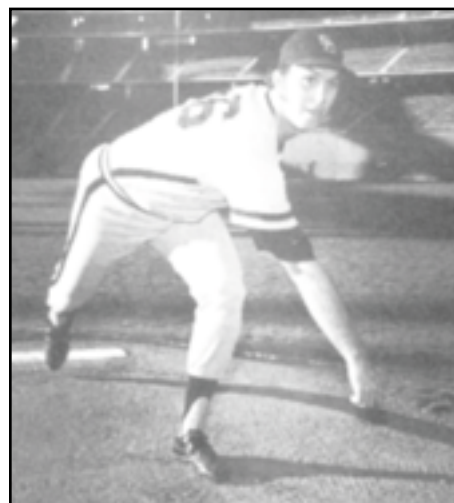
Former Ichabod Jerad Head signed a professional contract with the Cleveland Indians and joins Davey Lopes (LA Dodgers), Jerry Robertson (St. Louis Cardinals/Montreal Expos), Steve Simpson (San Diego Padres/New York Mets), Rick DeHart (Los Angeles), J.P. Wright (Minnesota Twins) and Travis Stockam (New York Mets) as Ichabods to go on to the pros. Chad Rodriguez, a second team All-America selection in 1996, was a pick by the Kansas City Royals organization. 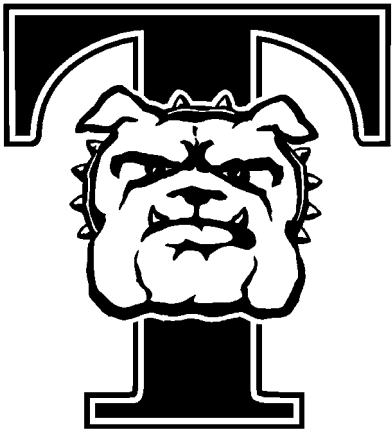

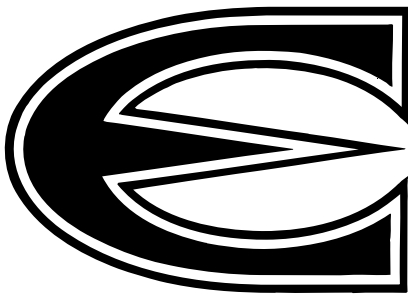
