

# **A Winning Tradition**

Washburn teams compete for NCAA Division II championships as a member of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA).

Washburn currently offers intercollegiate competition for men in the sports of baseball, basketball, football, golf and tennis. Women compete in basketball, softball, tennis and volleyball.

Success has been obtained by both teams and individuals. The Ichabod football team continues its move toward the top of the conference after recording its first winning season since 1988 after going 6-5 last season.

The Ichabods basketball team has won seven MIAA regular season championships in the last 14 years and advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament during those same seasons. The Ichabods advanced to the NCAA Regional Tournament last season. The Ichabods reached the semifinals of the national tournament in 1994.

The Lady Blues basketball team reached the "Sweet 16" of its 1995 national tournament while making a fifth straight appearance at the national event. In 1996-97, WU was the top-ranked academic team in NCAA Division II, and the second ranked during the 1997-98 school year.

The volleyball program accomplished its second winning season since 1986 three seasons ago and notched its first upper division MIAA finish in the same year.

The men's tennis team was selected for its third appearance in the NCAA Division II national tournament in 1998. The women's tennis team also advanced to the NCAAs and hosted the Midwest Regional on campus this past season for the third straight year.

Both the baseball and softball teams have had much success in recent years. The Ichabods finished second in the MIAA and advanced to the MIAA Championship game. The Lady Blues were MIAA co-champs in 2000 and were runner-ups in the conference tournament.

The Ichabod golf program has made great strides since joining the MIAA. Washburn was ranked in the nation's top-25 in 1998 and made its first ever NCAA appearance.

Individually, many student-athletes earn all-conference, all-region and All-America honors each year. During the 1999-2000 season, 39 student-athletes representing all nine of Washburn's teams earned an all-MIAA honor in their respective sport.

While Washburn strives for success on the playing field, the university also takes pride in the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes.

During the 1999-2000 academic year, 94 of the university's 196 student-athletes maintained a 3.0 grade point average or above. Forty-five Ichabods and Lady Blues representing nine Washburn teams were named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll for their respective sport. The cumulative grade point average entering the 2000 fall semester was 2.85.

Each year, several student-athletes are honored at the district or national level through the GTE Academic All-America program. Washburn placed two student-athletes on national all-America teams. Baseball player Pat Colley and football player Aaron Doonan were each named to the second team in their respective sport.

## Loren Ferré Athletics Director



Loren Ferre' became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a sixyear appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D.

Ferre' is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

In his two-plus years at Washburn, Ferre' has been instrumental in the establishment of a strong Ichabod Club support team and the raising of funds for athletic scholarships. In addition, he created a position for a full-time marketing and promotions director who will help bring in new private dollars for scholarships and more excitement at all Washburn athletic contests.

While at BHSU, Ferre' was also director of the Donald E. Young Sports Fitness Center, a 172,000 square foot, \$10.2 million facility. During his Black Hills tenure, the athletics department nearly tripled its outside revenue, including large increases in ticket sales and scholarship funding. All 10 varsity teams won a conference title in his final three years.

Before joining the staff at Black Hills State, Ferre' spent 17 years at the University of North Texas. He was the director of the Coliseum (1987-90) and prior to that was the associate and assistant director since 1980. He held the post of event coordinator (1978-80).

Ferre' is a 1971 graduate of Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of arts degree. He earned a master's in journalism from North Texas in 1982. He is currently completing course requirements for a doctorate of education in sports administration from the University of Northern Colorado.

Ferre' and his wife Sarah, have two daughters, Caitlin and Hope, and reside in Topeka.




Moore Bowl has served as the home for Washburn football since its dedication on Sept. 28, 1928. Throughout its 72-year history, the bowl has been witness to hundreds of high school and college games, longstanding conference rivalries and the tornado of 1966.

Construction of the bowl was part of a \$215,000 athletic project, which also included the addition of Whiting Field House to the Washburn campus. The bowl was built in a natural depression south of Old Thomas Gymnasium and was designed to be similar to the facility at the University of Colorado. By taking advantage of the natural depression, the bowl was constructed in just seven months at a cost of approximately \$30,000. The construction work was under the direction of Cleveland S. Loper, head of the engineering department, with the contract for the excavation given to C.A. Ritchie of Topeka.

The original design for the horseshoeshaped bowl (overall size of 400' by 650') called for 15,000 seats — 8,000 in the original construction with the remaining seats to be built along the north end of the horseshoe. Additional seating was not added and the bowl currently has a seating capacity of 7,200. A press box and concessions stands were added to the facility in 1963 but destroyed three years later in the '66 tornado.

The bowl was named in honor of George Godfrey Moore, a Topeka sports enthusiast who had developed a reputation throughout the Midwest as a keen sportsman and friend of Washburn.
