



2003 Season Preview

Don't let the 3-8 record from last season mislead you. The Ichabods saw continued improvement throughout last season, winning three of their last six games. The team plans to build on last year's successes and give fans an even better 2003.

The Ichabods are returning 36 lettermen from last season's 3-8 squad and eight starters on offense and defense are back after head coach Craig Schurig's first year at the helm of the Washburn program.

"Last season we had a lot of new faces in the lineup," Schurig said. "Those new faces gained a lot of experience and playing time last season, and with that game experience they picked up, we believe it will help us this season and in years to come."

The Ichabods had 18 true freshmen play last season and those freshmen are a year older and stronger thanks to the more than \$150,000 of improvement in the weight room.

"The entire team has bought into our program," Schurig said. "From the way they conduct themselves in the weight room, to the classroom and to the field, we have a total team effort and everyone is heading the direction that we as a coaching staff want to go - a winning program on and off the field."

The Offense

The Washburn offense returns eight starters from last season's squad that recorded 3,972 yards in total offense, the fifth highest single-season total in school history. The majority of that was through the air where the 'Bods passed for 2,447 yards - the fourth single-season total in school history.

The Ichabods averaged 25.4 points per game in 2002, which was sixth in the MIAA. However, the Ichabods averaged 30 points per game in their last six contests.

"We learned an entirely new system and as the season went along, our offense improved as they grasped the offense," Schurig said.

Quarterbacks

The Ichabods will have a pair of experienced juniors battling for the starting quarterback position in Dustin

Hickel and Tyler Schuerman.

Hickel (left) started the final 10 games last season and passed for 2,160 yards and 21 touchdowns completing 46 percent of his passes.

Schuerman returns after being injured on the first play of the season against Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a sophomore, Schuerman passed for 1,034 yards and rushed for 477 more and led the Ichabods in total offense with 188 per game appearing in eight games.

"Having two experienced quarterbacks in a good problem to have," Schurig said. "No matter who starts, we will have a game-tested quarterback to lead the offense and the team has confidence in both quarterbacks."

Also seeing time at quarterback last season was sophomore Cason Lehman. Lehman passed for 246 yards and three touchdowns last year. Lehman is versatile and his athletic ability allowed him

to also line up at running back and wide receiver last season.

Receivers

The Ichabod receiving corps received a lot of experience last season with four of the top five receivers last season being either true freshman



or redshirt freshmen. The 2002 MIAA Freshman of the Year Sam Sissom (left) exploded on the scene grabbing 12 touchdown receptions and 719 yards, setting new freshman records in each category. Senior DaWight Benning tied Sissom with 41 receptions on the season and had 617 receiving yards and six touchdowns. Sophomore Mike Odupitan averaged 21. 9 yards per reception and gained 394 yards in nine games with four touchdowns. Lehman, when not throwing the ball or running it, had 360 reception yards and 18 catches with one touchdown and tight end Jeff Scott had 11 catches for 77 yards as a true freshman.

"Our receivers are still young in game experience with the returning freshmen and DaWight playing his

first full year after redshirting at Oklahoma a couple of years ago," Schurig said. "But they are a talented group and defenses will not be able to look for one receiver over the other because we do have depth and skill, which is something we want to have in all of our positions."

Offensive Backfield

The Ichabods will have plenty of competition at running back as many as 10 different 'Bods are looking for starting positions.

Seniors Chris Huelsman (left) and Darryl Humphrey rushed for 222 and 121 yards respectively. Huelsman

started last season in the receiver rotation, but switched back to his native running back slot toward the end of the season.

Redshirt freshman Trent Hearn had a tremendous spring practice and broke camp as the No. 1 tailback. Hearn rushed for 3,100 yards his junior and senior seasons at Lancaster High School in Texas and 46 touchdowns.

Also looking for carries will be redshirt freshmen Chris Brown, Brett Dubert and Chris McCann.

Other newcomers looking for repetitions will be transfer Jeff Womack from Dodge City Community College and incoming freshman A. J. Patterson.

Womack rushed for 2,300 yards and 26 touchdowns his final two seasons in high school in Riviera Beach Fla., and Patterson was Topeka's offensive player of the year rushing for 1,977 yards and 19 touchdowns as a senior finishing his prep career with 3,817 yards.

"We have the depth in the backfield to create great competition for carries and playing time," Schurig said. "This depth is something that we want to create in all positions on the playing field."

At fullback, sophomore Rawshawn Bland enters the fall as the No. 1 fullback and redshirt freshman Chris Brown is behind him on the depth chart. Bland rushed for 113 yards and one touchdown last season. Also returning at fullback will be junior Kip Kraisinger who missed last season after suffering a knee injury.

Offense Line

The Ichabods' offensive line has four starters returning from last season headed by second team All-MIAA pick Tim Watts. Last season Watts played left tackle, but this season he is moving to right tackle.

Joining Watts is junior Matt Durler at right guard and senior Kevin Pierce at center - both of whom started all 11 games last season on the offensive line. Senior John McKinley will start at left guard, a position,

where he started five games.

Transfer Tyrone Barrett joined the Ichabods last spring at will anchor the line at left tackle.

Also looking for playing time will be sophomore tackle Jim Holland who played in nine games, juniors Adam Toby and Ben Thursby. Redshirt freshman Pat Mack will also provide depth on the offensive line.

"The first unit has experience as well as members of the second line," Schurig said. "And overall we are stronger and will look to be more physical up front and the line's work in the off-season will lead us to that goal."

The Defense

The defense allowed nearly 42 points per game in the first seven outings of the season, but over the last four, the Ichabods improved allowing only 20, including the first shutout in 36 games in a 49-0 win over Missouri-Rolla.

The Ichabods now have a full year under its belt with the 4-4 defensive alignment and with eight starters returning and solid group of those who saw playing time last season, the defense should be improved.

The Ichabods were 10th in scoring defense, pass defense, rush defense and total defense.

"The returning players have valuable experience that will help us improve game by game this season," Schurig said. "We have better athletes on defense than we had last season, and we have more depth to increase competition at all positions."

Defensive Line

The Ichabod defensive line has three of four starters returning with senior defensive end Jacob Barth (left) and defensive tackle Eric Taylor. Taylor is moving from defensive end to the line's interior where he will join junior nose guard Bryce Kelley. Also returning is sophomore defensive end Terell Cobb who started the final five games as a true freshman.

> New to the mix will be University of Oklahoma transfer Blake Nichols. Nichols redshirted last season for the Sooners. Junior Bo Kobuszewski is moving

from linebacker to defensive end and will provide extra depth on the line.

"In this scheme, the front line is vital to the success of the rest of the defense," Schurig said. "They have to penetrate and control the line of scrimmage."

Linebackers

The linebackers may be the most experienced group of returnees for the defense with all four starters returning. At outside linebacker, sophomore Josh Looney and senior Brooks Myers (left) return. Myers finished fourth on the Ichabods with 88 tackles and Looney recorded 62.

On the inside, senior Morgan Dewey and sophomore Grant Gould accounted for 185 tackles last season with Gould tallying 93 and Dewey 92.

"In this defensive scheme, the linebackers should be in a position to lead the team in tackles as they are very run oriented," Schurig said.

The Ichabods have a pair of linebackers returning after injuries in seniors Brian Peel and Jeff Wimpy. As a junior at Washburn, Wimpy recorded 48 tackles.

Secondary

The Ichabods have two starters in the defensive backfield returning in a pair of seniors senior cornerback Darold Smith (right) and junior free safety Joe Corcoran (left). Smith led the MIAA in passes defended with 16 including four interceptions, tying for the team lead with Corcoran. Corcoran led the MIAA in tackles with 124, the third highest single season total

in school history.

Sophomore Mark Jackson, a redshirt freshmen Tramaine Young and Henry Talley will all battle for the other starting cornerback position. Jackson played in 10

games last season. Young is a transfer from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M.

"Our cornerbacks and safeties will continue to be active against the run, but they will need to improve their fundamentals in pass coverage," Schurig said.

Special Teams

The Ichabods special teams will have the newest faces of any other part of the team this season as they are without a returning starter.

First team All-MIAA and honorable mention All-America punter Eric Roth spent his four years rewriting the Ichabods' punting records, so this season, the punting and the placekicker positions are wide-open.

Freshman Connor Sabel and Derek Banion will battle for placekicking duties and freshmen Ben Boswell, Joe Sample and Sabel along with redshirt freshman Adam Azeltine will all compete for the punting duties.

"We will be young with our kicking game," Schurig said. "But we have excellent candidates and will have good competition for these duties."

Etc.

The Ichabods have nearly 100 student athletes preparing for fall camp, which is the most numbers in many years for the Washburn football program. These numbers will add to team depth and add to the competition of playing time between each position.

This season also marks the start of a new era with the opening of Yager Stadium at Moore Bowl. After a \$4.25 million improvement and renovation, the team, campus and community are excited to start the 2003 season.

"We are looking forward to not only playing in the new facility, but we want to put a product on the field that will be worthy of our new stadium," Schurig said.
