

If when building a program, the key step is not to take a step backwards, the Ichabods are well on their way into building a program that will continue to climb up the ladder in the MIAA.

The Ichabods, under now third-year head coach Craig Schurig, improved two wins to 5-6 from a 3-8 record in the first year under the new coaching staff.

The MIAA had five teams tie for the conference title in 2003, and even though the Ichabods were 3-6 in the MIAA for the second season in a row, Schurig believes there was improvement.

"We played a lot better in conference games, but we did not improve in the number of wins," Schurig said. "We were more competitive throughout all of the games last season, and we've closed the gap between us and the rest of the leaders in the MIAA, but we still have a ways to go to be where we want to be."

One way to find the success of a program is in the off-season conditioning program. The Ichabods have had upwards of 45 football players staying in Topeka over the summer to take part in workouts and weightlifting.

"The number has improved every summer we (the new coaching staff) have been here," Schurig said. "Our first summer there were maybe 10 that stayed in town to work out. The commitment from the players to the offseason workouts has really helped us on the field during games by being able to play a more physical type of game on both sides of the ball and we now just need to play that style of football for a full 60 minutes"

The Offense

The Washburn offense returns eight starters from last season's squad that finished fourth in the MIAA in total offense after averaging 372.4 yards per game. The Ichabods had little problem moving the ball up and down the field, however the Ichabods struggled when it came to redzone offense as they scored 28 of 49 times they reached the opponents 20 yard line. Of the 28 scores, 24 were touchdowns. Ten times when the Ichabods did not score, they lost possession on turnovers.

"We are going to have to do a better job of scoring more consistently when we reach the redzone and do a better job of protecting the ball not only inside the 20's, but all over the field," Schurig said.

The Ichabods had 30 turnovers last season.

Quarterbacks

The Ichabods enter the 2004 season with a clear-cut quarterback in senior Tyler Schuerman at the helm of the Washburn offense. The 2000 MIAA Freshman of the Year started the final game of 2003 against Missouri Southern after splitting time with Dustin Hickel, who has been moved to wide receiver this season.

Schuerman used a solid spring practice to retain his starting quarterback position.

'Tyler was the No. 1 quarterback after the season was over last fall and entered the spring at the No. 1 quarterback,"

Schurig said. "Therefore after the great spring that he had, he's our man, and this will be his team to lead."

Schuerman passed for 1,247 yards and six touchdowns as a junior.

"Splitting time last season between Tyler and Dustin was tough on everyone," Schurig said. "We never really got into a good offensive flow."

Backing up Schuerman this season will be redshirt freshman Jordan Brill from Elkhorn, Neb.

Receivers

The deepest position on the field for the Ichabods could be at the wide receiver spot as the Ichabods return three starters in juniors Mike Odupitan, Sam

Sissom and Cason Lehman. Throw Hickel into the mix and the Ichabods have a talented foursome for Schuerman to pick from for passes.

"We are talented at the wideout positions," Schurig said. "There is going to be a battle for playing time between the four that we have coming back from last season, plus the addition of the redshirt freshmen that will be looking for playing time as well."

Sissom, the 2002 MIAA Freshman of the Year, led the team with 39 receptions and 555 receiving yards with six touchdowns.

Lehman had 32 receptions for 514 yards and Odupitan had 29 receptions for 475 yards while leading the returning wide outs with a 16.4 yard per reception average. His six touchdown receptions were for

an average of 21 yards including a 24-yard game-winner against Southwest Baptist with 1:11 remaining in the game. Hickel had two receptions for 35 yards as a part-time wide receiver.

Also looking for playing time will be senior Andre Zandevakili, sophomore Marquetis Burgess and redshirt freshman Jarod Tetuan.

The Ichabods also return two players who have been starters at one time or another at tight end in senior John Hoytal and junior Jeff Scott. Scott started 11 games as a true freshman at tight end and Hoytal started all 11 games in 2003 collecting five catches for 60 yards while Scott recorded six receptions for 91 yards.

Offensive Backfield

The Ichabods will also have talent and depth at running back as 2003 MIAA Freshman of the Year and second team all-MIAA selection Trent Hearn. Hearn returns after rushing for 1,116 yards and 16 touchdowns as a redshirt freshman joining Washburn's all-time leading rusher Dino DeLisa as the only other Ichabod to rush for more than 1,000 yards.

The Ichabods' Ra'Shawn Moseley will be pushing Hearn for carries, and he also makes a change of pace runner out of the backfield.

"Trent is a powerful runner with great speed," Schurig said. "Ra'Shawn is quick and he can outrun people to the corners and get up the field. He is strong too, but both backs should compliment each other well."

Also looking to get into the rotation is sophomore Jeff Womack, along with redshirt freshman A.J. Patterson, the 2002 Topeka Capital Journal Offensive Player of the Year, and sophomore Ricky Smith. Smith, a transfer from Fort Scott Community College was named to the Jayhawk Conference second

team after rushing for 675 yards on 108 carries with six touchdowns as a freshman.

At fullback, junior Rawshawn Bland returns at starter for the second straight season. Bland, one of the top fullbacks in the MIAA, was third on the team after rushing for 177 yards on 57 carries and one touchdown. Sophomore Chris McCann will be in the mix as well.

Offense Line

On the offensive line, the Ichabods are going to have some holes to fill after the graduation of three starters in John McKinley, Tim Watts and Kevin Pierce.

Returning starters include senior left tackle Tyrone Barrett and senior center Matt Durler. Barrett was a second team all-MIAA pick last season and Durler is moving from right guard where he started 11 games last season.

Junior right tackle Jim Holland



played in spots last season as well as senior right guard Bryce Kelley who will start on the line this season.

Filling the left guard spot will be junior transfer Rudy Su'e, who comes to Washburn from East Central Junior College in Mississippi and rejoins Barrett, who he played along with two seasons ago.

"These guys have had the spring to gel and learn how to play off of each other," Schurig said. "And we are going to need for them to be solid up front for this offense. But overall I belive we have improved on the line between last season and this season."

Also looking for playing time will be junior transfer Dan Schneider and sophomore Pat Mack. A trio of freshman will also push for playing time in Jeff Rickard and Topeka native and Seaman teammates Kyle Hainline and Aaron Lockwood.

The Defense

After allowing nearly 42 points a game in 2002, the Ichabods dropped two touchdowns per game off their points allowed average allowing 28 per game last season.

"It's an improvement," Schurig said. "But it is nowhere close to where we need to be."

The Ichabods return six starters from last season and have nine who gained valuable experience a year ago.

"Our defense is a young defense, but they are an experienced defense who will do nothing but improve," Schurig said.



Defensive Line

The Ichabod defensive line returns only one fulltime starter from last but eight of the nine players on the preseason depth chart saw significant action as either redshirt- or true-freshman.

The one returning fulltime starter is in sophomore defensive tackle Blake Nichols. Nichols had 33 tackles, including six for loss to go along with two sacks.

He will be joined up front by fellow sophomores Zach Hemmerling at defensive end and Nick Bull and Trey Lewis at the defensive tackle position. At the other defensive end will be redshirt freshman Dustin Moyer. Moyer injured his elbow against Fort Hays State in the second game of the season and received a medical redshirt.

Of the eight Ichabods listed on the two deep entering the fall, all eight are underclassmen.

"We are young up front." Schurig said. "But the abilities of these players will make up for some of their youth. Each of the players up front played a lot last season in the defensive line rotations and that is experience that is invaluable."

Competing for playing time in the rotation will be sophomores Trey Lewis and Cody Huenefeld, redshirt freshman Mitch Birt and freshman Eric Eisenbarth, who enters the fall as the No. 2 defensive tackle.

Linebackers

The Ichabod linebackers are the most experienced faction of the defense as all four started last season.

Junior inside linebacker Grant Gould led the team and finished third in the MIAA with 111 total tackles. Gould was an honorable mention all-MIAA pick at linebacker last season.

Joining Gould on the inside in senior Evin Beck. Beck started four games last season and finished sixth on the team with 54 tackles including eight for loss and a sack.

Moving to one of the outside linebacker posi-

tions is senior Joe Corcoran who started every game last season at free safety. Corcoran had 90 tackles last season and tied for the team lead with four interceptions returning one of them for a touchdown.

At the other outside linebacker is junior Josh Looney. Looney had 61 tackles last season including seven for loss and two sacks while leading the team with two forced fumbles.

"We are the most experienced on defense in the linebacking corps," Schurig said. "These are the guys this defense is built for and they should be the leaders on this side of the ball."

In the rotation for playing time will be junior Terell Cobb, who is changing from a defensive end position where he had 29 tackles to an inside linebacker spot and junior Taurence Minikwu will look for time on the inside as well. Also in the mix will be sophomore Aaron Neal. Neal had 13 tackles including two for loss in 2003. Russell Munson, a redshirt freshman transfer from Oklahoma, will also be looking for playing time as well.

Secondary

The defensive backfield returns two starters in sophomores Fletcher Terrell and Tramaine Young. Terrell was an honorable mention all-MIAA pick led the conference with 19 passes defended and 15 pass breakups. He had four interceptions for 190 yards in return average. Young had 17 tackles and one interception in 2003.

At the other cornerback will be sophomore Henry Talley. Talley played in four games last season.

Converted wide receiver, junior Calvin Stuckey will also compete for time in the secondary.

At free safety will be redshirt freshman Adam Ewy, from Maize, Kan., who transfered to Washburn from Cowley County where he played baseball.

Sophomore Chris Brown has converted from running back to free safety and will be joined by Blake Meyer who will see time at the safety position in passing situations as well as some time at an outside line-backer spot.

Special Teams

The Ichabod special teams return both their punter and placekicker in sophomores Ben Boswell and Connor Sabel respectively.

Boswell averaged 31.6 yards per punt last season, but he will be pushed by junior transfer Curt Massey from Coffeyville County Community College. Massey was a first team all-Jayhawk conference punter after averaging 39.3 yards per punt, which led the conference.

Sabel took over the kicking duties midway through the season and hit two of his four attempts including a 34-yarder in the season finale against Missouri Southern.

The return game is in solid hands as punt returner Sissom who was fifth in the MIAA in return average with 9.2 yards per runback.

The Ichabods are primed and ready to take the next step and record the first winning season since 1999 when the Ichabods were 6-5, but finished 4-5 in the MIAA.

A winning season and a winning record in the MIAA would really be a boost the Ichabods could build off of and continue to push the Washburn football program into the upper echelon of the MIAA.

The Story Behind Mr. Ichabod

The name "Ichabod" was derived from the first name of Ichabod Washburn, an early benefactor of the university. Ichabod Washburn was born in Kingston, Mass., on Aug. 11, 1798.

In 1831, he began what was his life work - and the pride of Worchester, Mass., - when he essayed the drawing of wire. He was cofounder of Washburn and Moen Manufacturing (later American Steel and Wire).

His own lack of formal education made him acutely aware of its importance. When approached by the residents of Topeka to help save the ailing Lincoln College, Ichabod Washburn responded with a \$25,000 gift. In May, 1869, Lincoln College was renamed Washburn College in recognition of his outstanding contribution.

Until 1938, there was no graphic representation or any particular

characteristics associated with the mascot. During the 1937-38 school year, the editors of the KAW yearbook decided that such items were important to the university and began to accept suggestions for a design of Mr.

Ichabod. The adopted design was drawn by Bradbury Thompson (BA '34).

The following explanatory material accompanied the first representation of an Ichabod in the KAW: "He has courage and enthusiasm as shown by his brisk walk. He is democratic and

courteous, for he tips his hat as he passes. Sincere in his search for truth and knowledge, he studiously carries a book under his arm. His friendly smile makes you like him. He is neatly dressed and he fits well into his generation ... but adopts himself with equal ease to any change in life.
