A new era in Washburn football began when Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001.

In only three seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl.

The Ichabods finished the 2004 season with an 8-4 record as Washburn has improved five victories in the win column since Schurig's first season at the helm.

After coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program, Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In his three seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 27 players receive All-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 40 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, including two Academic All-Americans.

While under Schurig, the Ichabod football program has also seen sweeping changes in facilities with the improvements to Yager Stadium and equipment upgrades in the weight room.

While on the Pittsburg State coaching staff, Schurig was a part of an NCAA



national finalist squad in 1995, four MIAA Championship teams and eight NCAA Division II playoff teams. He helped guide one of the top defenses in Division II including the top-ranked defensive squad in 1999.

Prior to working with the defensive backs, he worked three seasons with the Gorillas' tight ends.

Before arriving at Pittsburg State, Schurig spent the 1992 season as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater, Colorado School of Mines joining the Gorillas in 1993.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a four-year letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

## Brian Miller Offensive Coordinator

Brian Miller begins his fourth season as the Ichabods' offensive coordinator and offensive line coach.

In three seasons at the helm of the Ichabod offense, the squads have recorded three of the top eight passing seasons in school history and three of the top six total offensive years in Washburn history.

In 2004, the Ichabods set new school offensive records for most passing yards, total offense, passing touchdowns, first downs and points in a season while recording a second-straight 1,000 yard running back.

Miller, a native of Golden, Colo., was the offensive coordinator at Minnesota-Crookston from 1996 to 2001.

Prior to coaching at UMC, Miller coached for the Northern State Wolves, where he was special teams coordinator, and coached defensive line and running backs, each for a season.

Coach Miller graduated in 1989 with a

bachelor of arts degree from Hastings College in Nebraska, and a master of science from St. Cloud State.

He and his wife Michelle reside in Topeka with their two sons: Matt and Alex, and daughter Bailey.

## Chris Brown Defensive Coordinator

Chris Brown is in his fourth season as the Ichabods' defensive coordinator and defensive secondary coach. Brown came to Washburn after spending three seasons as the linebackers coach at Liberal High School where the Redskins compiled a 37-5 record from 1998-2001.

Brown, a native of Liberal, Kan., is a 1996 graduate of Pittsburg State University where he recorded 470 tackles in 43 starts in his career at free safety. He is one of only three Gorillas to earn all-American honors three times. He was an unanimous first team all-American selection his senior season and was named the CNN Division II National Player of the Year in 1995. In the championship game as a freshman he recorded a record 21 tackles against Jacksonville State. He was also named to the NCAA Quarter Century Team from all players from 1975 to 1999 at free safety.

His senior season the Gorillas were second

in the nation in scoring defense allowing 10.9 points per game, fifth in rushing defense 67.5 and sixth in total defense 239.6 ypg. He also took part in the 1992 Kansas Shrine Bowl.

He and his wife, Daphne, live in Topeka with their boys, Hunter and Hayden.

## Rob Robinson

### Wide Receivers / Recruiting Coordinator

Rob Robinson is in his fourth season on the Ichabod coaching staff. He will direct Washburn's wide receivers and kickoff return team and lead the 'Bods recruiting efforts as the coordinator.

This past season, he coached only the third Washburn receiver to reach at least 1,000 yards as the Ichabods broke the school record for most passing yards in a season.

Robinson spent one season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig.

Robinson is a 2000 graduate from William Jewell College in Liberty, Mo. He was a four-year lettermen for the Cardinals at fullback, playing on special teams as well.

He was named the 1997 and 1998 Special Teams Player of the year and

was an all-conference selection his junior season. As a senior he was named to the Player's Council and was a third team all-HAAC selection.

His son Tabor was born on April 21, 2005.

## David Trupp

### Defensive Line/ Speed, Strength and Conditioning Coordinator

David Trupp, C.S.C.S., is in his fourth season as the Ichabods' defensive line coach and the strength and conditioning coordinator. He also coaches the punt team. Trupp has also attained his Level 1, Olympic Certification training.

Trupp, spent the 2001 season as the defensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Monett (Mo.) High School.

From 1996 to December 1998, Trupp was the defensive tackle coach and an off-season strength and conditioning supervisor while completing his master's degree at Pitt State.

Trupp received his teaching certificate in 1992 from Washburn after completing his bachelor of science degree from Baker University. He was also a member of the Nebraska Cornhusker's football team from

1986 to 1987 before transferring to Baker.

He coached at Washburn Rural High School, Topeka High School and Hayden High School. He played high school football at Washburn Rural High School.

Trupp and his wife Jean have one son, Connor and one daughter, Keira. The Trupps live in Topeka.

## Cooper Harris Linebackers/Special Teams Coordinator

Cooper Harris is in his fourth season with the Ichabods after spending one season as graduate assistant for the 2001 NCAA Division II Champion North Dakota Fighting Sioux.

He coaches the Ichabod linebacking corps and is also the Ichabod special teams coordinator.

In 2000, Harris served as defensive coordinator at William Aberhart High School in Calgary, Alberta. He helped coach the team to a city championship.

Harris played in the Canadian Football League from 1995-2000 for Toronto and Hamilton. He was a linebacker, special teams captain and special teams MVP in 1998 for Hamilton and was a member of two Grey Cup champion teams in Hamilton and Toronto.

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Harris graduated from Pittsburg State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in physical education. Harris has also finished his master's degree in sports psychology from the University of North Dakota.

Harris played for the Gorillas from 1992-1994, earning second team all-conference honors in 1993 and first team all-conference

honors in 1994. As a senior, Harris was a team captain and most valuable defensive player at linebacker.

At Pitt State, Harris recorded 241 tackles in 31 games, which ranks eighth on the Gorillas' all-time tackles chart. He recorded 17 in the 1992 NCAA National Championship game against Jacksonville State. Before transferring to Pittsburg State, Harris was an honorable mention all-America and first team all-conference choice at Independence Community College. He was also the team captain and chosen as the team's Most Valuable Player.

Cooper's father Wayne is in the Canadian Football League's Hall of Fame.

Zac Nally



Former Washburn Wide Receiver Zac Nally begins his third season as an Ichabod graduate assistant coach after spending the last three seasons as a student assistant for the Ichabods. He will coach the tight ends. Nally was a three-year member of the on-the-field Ichabods. His career was cut short after injuring his knee during the 2001 spring game. His one catch for the Ichabods was a 30-yard touchdown reception against Southwest Baptist on homecoming in 2000. He was also named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll that season.

Nally graduated from Washburn in May, 2003 with his degree in physical education and is currently working on his master's degree. Nally has one daughter, Allison.

Dion Meneley



Topeka native and former Pittsburg State linebacker Dion Meneley is in his third season as a Washburn graduate assistant coach. Meneley is working on his master's degree in administration and will help guide the line-backing corps. Meneley was a two-time first team All-MIAA selection at outside linebacker and a two-time honorable mention pick as well. Meneley was a six-year member of the Pitt State football team due to a medical redshirt in 1997. In 1995, he saw action in all 14 games as a redshirt freshman recording 22 tackles helping PSU post a 12-1-1 record and finish as the NCAA-II runner-up. As a junior he finished the regular season tied for third on the team with 60 tackles. He started first two games of '97 before suffering season-ending knee injury. He saw action in all 10 games in 1998, after moving to defensive end and recorded 66 tackles including eight sacks. He moved back to linebacker as a senior and recorded 55 tackles (23 solo) with 9 TFLs and 3 QB sacks and was also a 1999 PSU team captain.

Justin Schreiber



Justin Schreiber begins his second season on the Ichabod coaching staff. Schreiber was the quarterback for offensive coordinator Brian Miller while at Minnesota-Crookston. Schreiber holds nine Golden Eagle football records including passing yards in a game (403), season (2,192) and career (5,399) records for total offense; touchdowns in a game (5) and career (42); passing touchdowns in a game (4) and career (28); passing yards in a game (286) and career (3,520). He was also named to the Don Hansen Weekly Gazette Preseason All-American Honorable team prior to his senior year. Schreiber is a native of Glyndon, Minn., and is working on his master's in Liberal Studies.

Cassidy McCrite



Former Central Missouri State defensive back and Topeka Kan., native Cassidy McCrite begins his second season as a graduate assistant for the Ichabods. He will coach the defensive line. At CMSU, McCrite was a reserve strong safety and played on special teams. McCrite sat out his senior year because of an injury. As a junior, he made nine tackles, while recording an interception and two pass break-ups. During his sophomore year, McCrite recorded one solo tackle, an interception and a pass break-up. McCrite graduated from CMSU in May 2004 with a major in liberal arts, emphasis in physical education and a minor in health. McCrite is a 1999 graduate of Hayden High School where he earned all-state football honors in 1998 for the 4A state championship team. He also lettered in baseball and track at Hayden. McCrite's dad, Pat McCrite, played for the Ichabods in 1965-1966.
