In 2004, the Washburn Ichabods continued their rise to new heights as they finished with a school best 6-3 MIAA record and tied a school record for the most wins in a season as they finished 8-4. The Ichabods also won their first postseason game in 18 years as they topped Northern State in the Mineral Water Bowl in Excelsior Springs, Mo. The Ichabods look to continue their rise in the conference race under fourth-year head coach Craig Schurig, who has led the Ichabods to a five-win improvement since his first season at the Washburn helm in 2002.

"We are continuing to get better and we want to take the momentum from last year and carry it into this season," Schurig said. "We are in the toughest conference in Division II and we believe we are doing things, both on and off the field, that will help us compete and win in the MIAA."

There has already been a new commitment from the players as the Schurig regime enters its fourth season. This season nearly 50 of the 75 returners to the Ichabods have remained in Topeka to workout over the summer.

We had maybe 10 football players here our first summer," Schurig said. "The players have shown a commitment to the program and it has shown in the fourth quarter of games with us being able to compete for 60 minutes and not tire after halftime.'

The Ichabod offense returns seven starters from a record-breaking unit from 2004. The Ichabods set new school records for most passing yards in a season (2,991), most passing completions (210), most passing attempts (383), passing touchdowns (34), total offensive yards (5,099), offensive plays (869), yards per play (5.9), points in a season (407) and points per game (33.9).

"Our offense put up some of the best numbers in school history, and with the personnel we have returning, we believe we should be able to continue to have a very aggressive offense and put the pressure on opposing defenses to stop us,"

The Ichabods offense also improved from 2003 in the turnover category as they committed 26 turnovers (2.1 per game) compared to 30 turnovers (2.7 per game).

"We controlled the ball and did not make as many mistakes and that helped our offense have the season we did last year," Schurig said.

The Ichabod offense ranked fourth in the MIAA with 424.5 yards per game and scored the third most points in the league.


The Ichabod offense will have a new signal caller in sophomore Jordan Brill as Tyler Schuerman wrapped up his career with 11 Washburn individual records including total offense and career passing.

Brill did see action in seven games last year as he passed for 542 yards completing 45 of 80 passing attempts with five touchdowns. He had his only start against Pittsburg State subbing for the injured Schuerman.

"Jordan has experience and you are not going to get two tougher opponents back-to-back as he had in Northwest Missouri in relief after Tyler was injured and at Pittsburg State," Schurig said. "He got his feet wet in those games and he did do a lot of good things. But most importantly he got that game experience that you can not replicate in practice."

There is a battle for the back-up position as the Ichabods have another five quarterbacks on the roster. Sophomore Shane Miles and redshirt freshman Brandon Walker and true freshman Beau Wofford will look for time as a backup as well as transfer, Tommy Mangino. Mangino has been away from the football field for a year as he played baseball and Johnson County Community College, but he was a record-setting quarterback at Lawrence High School and will also compete for the second-string quarterback.

#### **Offensive Backfield**



There are not too many offensive backfields that can boast a pair of 1,000-yard rushers, but the Ichabods are one of the few as junior Trent Hearn and sophomore Ra'Shawn Mosley fit the description.

Last season, after Hearn was injured in the sixth game of the season, Mosley took over the starting roll and rushed for 1,084 yards and 11 touchdowns, becoming only the third Ichabod running back to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season, following Hearn who accomplished

the feat in 2003 as a freshman. Despite suffering through a high-ankle sprain for most of the season, Hearn rushed or 46.3 yards per game and

"Depth on a football team is extremely important," Schurig said. "Our running backs proved it last year after Hearn went down, Mosley stepped right in and rushed for 1,000 yards and we look for more of the same this season from both backs. They compliment each other very well. Hearn is strong and has great speed and Mosley is strong

as well and he can outrun people to the corners to get up field. We're excited about having both of their talents."

Other running backs looking for carries will be sophomore Ricky Smith, who was a second team All-Jayhawk Conference back from Fort Scott Community College after rushing for 675 yards on 108 carries with six touchdowns. Sophomore A.J. Patterson also saw action last season in three games rushing for 40 yards averaging 3.1 yards per carry.

At fullback, senior Rawshawn Bland returns to the starting line up for the fourth straight year after rushing for 173 yards and three touchdowns.

"Rawshawn is a big reason we have had the success we have had with the 1,000-yard rushers," Schurig said. "He is a powerful blocker and he is so strong when he carries the ball as well."

Junior Chris McCann had 79 yards in carries last season from the fullback slot and sophomore Jeremy Assal will compete for carries as well.

#### **Receivers**



The Ichabod receivers are the most experienced of any unit on the offense as they return three starters at the wide receiver spots and a fourth starter at tight end.

The senior-laden group features Sam Sissom, Mike Odupitan and Cason Lehman as wide outs and Jeff Scott at tight end.

"We are strong at wide receiver," Schurig said. "This is a very talented group and we will want to use all of their abilities this season."

Sissom, a second team All-MIAA and All-Region pick last season, enters the season with 33 career receiving touchdowns, needing

five touchdowns to set a new all-games record and only three touchdown receptions to set the all-time MIAA record. Sissom's 145 receptions ranks No. 2 on the Washburn all-time chart and his 2,383 yards is third in Washburn history.

Odupitan, who was an honorable mention All-MIAA pick, had 103 career

receptions for 1,685 yards, which both rank seventh on the all-time Washburn chart. Lehman has 72 receptions in his career, in really only two full seasons as he was a reserve quarterback as a freshman in 2002.

Scott is coming off his best season at tight end after recording 20 catches for 238 yards and three touchdowns.

The Ichabods are deep at wide receiver as sophomore Jarod Tetuan saw action in all 12 games recording 14 receptions for 217 yards and three touchdowns.

Sophomore Jake Lebahn will look for more time after recording three receptions for 48 yards.

Lebahn, who has an incredible vertical leap, also blocked an extra point attempt against Missouri Western in the Ichabods' season finale on homecoming and senior day to preserve a tie and propel Washburn to a 30-23 win.

#### **Offensive Line**

The Ichabods return only two starters from last season's squad that led the Ichabods to their fourth highest single-season rushing tally in school history and protected their quarterback for the best passing performance in school history.

Second team All-MIAA selection senior Rudy Sué returns to his left guard position and fellow senior Jim Holland is back at his right tackle position. In between will be new projected starters, sophomore Jeff Rickard at right guard, junior Dan Schneider at center

and junior Pat Mack will anchor the left tackle position. Both Rickard and Mack saw playing time last season on the line and Schneider played in only three games before sitting out the rest of the season with an injury.

"Our offensive line is experienced, even though there is not a lot of starts between all of them," Schurig said. "They now have the pressure of continuing the strong running game we have had and protecting our quarterback in the passing game."

The Ichabods have size and depth in the second unit on the offensive line in juniors Brian Strand and transfer Ernest Clore. Sophomore Terrell McClendon made the move from tight end to tackle midway through last season and redshirt freshmen David Becker at center and Andy Kavanaugh at right tackle will also see reps this season.

#### The Defense

The Ichabod defense returns seven starters and only three of which are seniors. Last season, the Ichabods improved in many areas, including forcing turnovers, which was a goal entering the 2004 season. The Ichabods created 24 turnovers, which was an improvement from the previous season.

"Our defense is an attacking defense and it has to create scoring opportunities for our offense," Schurig said. "We have many players on defense who have been starters since their freshman season, so now in their third season in the defensive system, we are looking for big things out of our defensive unit."

#### **Defensive Line**

The Ichabod defensive line has four players who all started at one time or another last season. At one defensive tackle, juniors Trey Lewis (eight starts) and Nick Bull (four starts) last season. Junior Zach Hemmerling also saw time last season after starting 10 games. At one defensive end, junior Cody Huenefeld started nine games and sophomore Dustin Moyer started three games all saw playing time and gained experience in the trenches.



Lewis was a second team All-MIAA
pick after recording 31 tackles, including three for loss and one sack with a fumble
recovery. Huenefeld had 25 tackles, with six for loss and two quarterback sacks.
Bull had 24 tackles and Moyer had 20 for the Ichabods.

Sophomore Mitch Birt enters camp as a starting defensive end and junior transfer Roy Sims will hold down a defensive tackle position.

Sims was named Gavilan College's most valuable player, first team All-conference, the California Coast Conference's Most Valuable Defensive Player as well as All-Region, All-State and a California Junior College All-American after he wrapped up 19 sacks, 54 total tackles and 11 tackles for loss as a sophomore.

"Our defensive line will be exciting to watch," Schurig said. "We have size and strength unlike any we have had. Even though we have many of the same players, our strength and condition program has really paid huge dividends for our defensive line."

Also looking for playing time will be redshirt freshman Eric Lawrence on the front line for the Ichabods as he will compete for time at defensive end.

#### Linebackers


The Ichabod linebackers corps returns an experienced group who should improve on their success from a year ago.

"This defense is built for linebackers," Schurig said. "This group is experienced

seniors Grant Gould, Mike Gonzalez and Terrel Cobb at the inside linebacker spots. Gould, has had a stellar Washburn career recording 331 tackles in his career, needing only 19 total tackles to become the Ichabods all-time leader in stops. Last year he set a school record for his 73 assisted tackles and snapped the career record for assisted tackles with 184 in three season. He needs 50 solo stops to break the record for solo tackles in a career. Gonzalez joined the Ichabods last season and he saw action in 11 games recording 38 tackles including five for loss and one sack. Cobb has been a twoyear starter after moving to linebacker from defensive end after his freshman season.

Sophomore Aaron Hicks will also see

playing time in the rotation at the inside linebacker positions.

On the outside, the Ichabods will have senior Josh Looney, junior Aaron Neal and sophomore Chris Brown. Neal recorded 40 tackles last season and five tackles for loss. Brown, who moved from offense to defense before last season, recorded 25 tackles with two for loss, a forced fumble, fumble recovery and pass break-up in 12 games last year. Looney has recorded 171 career tackles and is just shy of moving into the top 10 on the all-time chart. He has recorded 17 tackles for loss and five sacks since joining the Ichabods as a redshirt freshman coming from Southwest Missouri State.

Sophomore Henry Talley is moving to linebacker from cornerback and will start with the second unit.

#### Secondary

The Washburn secondary returns experience as both starters return at the cornerback positions and at safety.

At the corners, senior Calvin Stuckey, who was named defensive MVP of the Mineral Water Bowl returns after starting all 12 games and recorded 33 tackles, nine pass break-ups and four interceptions, two of those coming in the bowl win over Northern State. At the other corner, junior Fletcher Terrell has already set the Washburn record for passes defended with 39, including breaking his own single-season record of 19 from his freshman year with 20



last season. He has nine interceptions, needing five to break the schools all-time record that has stood for 22 years.

"Our corners are solid and they both have great speed and do a great job in pass coverage and in run support," Schurig said.

Junior Marquetis Burgess made the switch from wide receiver to cornerback midway through last season and recorded 20 tackles with three pass break-ups. Redshirt freshman Xavier Beckford will also see time at a cornerback position and in passing situations.

At safety, sophomore Adam Ewy returns to his starting position. Last season he started seven games before suffering a concussion, but still managed 49 tackles and four pass break-ups. Sophomore Erin Beck will also see reps in the secondary after a solid freshman campaign after 31 tackles and an interception.

#### **Special Teams**

The Ichabods return both their punter and placekicker from last season's squad plus all of their kick and return specialists.



The punting unit is led by senior first team All-MIAA pick Curtis Massey. Massey led the league and was tenth in the nation with his 40.9 yards per punt average, setting a new record for punting average and punting yards as a junior.

Returning placekicker, junior Connor Sabel set a school high-water mark with 45 extra points last season and his 32-yard field goal as time expired was the winning field goal against Northern

State in the Mineral Water Bowl.

Returning punts again will be senior

Sam Sissom, who returned a punt for a touchdown against Missouri Southern in the regular season finale. He averaged 13.5 yards per return, which was third in the MIAA last season.

The Ichabods return both kickoff return specialists in senior Mike Odupitan and sophomore Jarod Tetuan. Tetuan was seventh in the MIAA in return average with a 20.6 yard average and Odupitan averaged 16.4 per return.



#### **Bod Notes**

For the second straight season, there are more than 100 Ichabods who will enter fall camp.

"Our numbers are up again as far as players on the roster," Schurig said. "But the skill level and talent level of the players on the roster has improved each year as well. Our numbers create depth and our depth will create competition for starting positions and for playing time, which will only help this program get to where we want to be."

## The Story Behind Mr. Ichabod

The name "Ichabod" was derived from the first name of Ichabod Washburn, an early benefactor of the university. Ichabod Washburn was born in Kingston, Mass., on Aug. 11, 1798.

In 1831, he began what was his life work - and the pride of Worchester, Mass., - when he essayed the drawing of wire. He was co-founder of Washburn and Moen Manufacturing (later American Steel and Wire).

His own lack of formal education made him acutely aware of its importance. When approached by the residents of Topeka to help save the ailing Lincoln College, Ichabod Washburn responded with a \$25,000 gift. In May, 1869, Lincoln College was renamed Washburn College in recognition of his outstanding contribution.

Until 1938, there was no graphic representation or any particular characteristics associated with the mascot. During the 1937-38 school year, the editors of the KAW yearbook decided that such items were important to the university

and began to accept suggestions for a design of Mr. Ichabod. The adopted design was drawn by Bradbury Thompson (BA '34).

> The following explanatory material accompanied the first representation of an Ichabod in the KAW: "He has courage and enthusiasm as shown by his brisk walk.

> > He is democratic and courteous, for he tips his hat as he passes. Sincere in his search for truth and knowledge, he studiously carries a book under

his arm. His friendly smile makes you like him. He is neatly dressed and he fits well into his generation ... but adopts himself with equal ease to any change in life.
