Ichabods on Radio: The game will be broadcast live on AM 580 WIBW - the new home of the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The game can also be heard on the internet at www.washburn.edu/athletics by following the "Listen to the Game" links. The Craig Schurig Coaches Show will be heard from 6:30 to 7 p.m. on Thursday nights at Tucker's on 8th and Kansas in downtown Topeka. Bruce Steinbrock will be the play-by-play voice of the Ichabods and former WU quarterback Mark Elliott will be the color analyst. Jan Lunsford will provide sideline reports.



The Coaches: Craig Schurig is 4-8 in his second season as the Ichabod head football coach. Schurig spent nine seasons as a member of Pittsburg State's coaching staff. While at Pitt State, Schurig coached 10 All-MIAA players and four All-Americans.

His last duties on the Gorillas' coaching staff was directing the defensive backs for six seasons in Pittsburg. While coaching the defensive backs, Schurig also spent six seasons as the punt team coordinator.

Prior to working with the defensive backs, he worked three seasons with the Gorillas' tight ends.

While on the Gorillas coaching staff, Schurig was a part of an NCAA national finalist squad in 1995, four MIAA Championship teams and eight

Before arriving at Pittsburg State, Schurig spent the 1992 season as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater, Colorado School of Mines joining the Gorillas in 1993.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a four-year letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

Tim O'Connor is in his third year as the Tigers' head coach. The 1991 Boise State grad is 8-15 at the helm of the Fort Hays State program.

Ichabod Quick Hits



The Ichabods last time out: *Washburn 28, Langston 0* - Guthrie, Okla. - The Washburn Ichabods opened the 2003 football season with a 28-0 victory over Langston University Saturday night.

The Ichabods took only six plays to go 60 yards for a touchdown in their initial drive of the season. Washburn tailback Trent Hearn scampered 29 yards for a touchdown with 12:56 left in the first quarter Hearn finished the game with 106 yards on 18 carries in his debut in an Ichabod uniform.

Dustin Hickel connected on a touchdown pass for the 13th straight game with 40 seconds left in the opening quarter. Hickel threw a 13-yard touchdown to Sam Sissom to cap a 73-yard drive in 13 plays.

Joe Corcoran capped the first half scoring with a 22-yard touchdown interception return with 5:38 left in the first half. Corcoran finished with nine tackles, a fumble recovery and two interceptions. After a scoreless third quarter Tyler Schuerman connected with Cason Lehman on a 30-yard pass on fourth and 11.

The Washburn defense secured the shutout, surrendering just 175 yards on 53 plays.




Washburn/Fort Hays Series Notes: Tonight's meeting is the 60th meeting between the Ichabods and the Tigers. The Ichabods lead the all-time series 34-22-3. The two teams have traded wins the last seven meetings. Additionally, the home team has won seven of the last 10 meetings.

Scouting the Tigers

The Tigers fell 31-21 to Emporia State in their home opener. The Hornets jumped out to a 21-0 lead and the Tigers would get no closer than 10 the rest of the way. The Tigers allowed 502 yards in total offense to the Hornets giving up 250 on the ground and 252 through the air. Jeremy Rusco had 72 yards on 16 carries for the Tigers and Reed Gottula was 10 of 26 for 136 yards with two interceptions. On defense, Marcus West had nine tackles and a pass breakup for the Tigers.



Ichabods and Tigers last meeting

Hays, Kan. - Sept. 14, 2003 - The Washburn Ichabods scored two touchdowns in the final 1:42 of the game with Fort Hays State, but it wasn't enough as the Tigers pulled out a 37-29 win over the Ichabods.

The Ichabods opened the scoring with a 9-yard touchdown pass from sophomore Dustin Hickel to freshman Sam Sissom capping a 72-yard, eight play drive. However the Tigers would come back before the first quarter ended to tied the score at seven. Earlier in the drive, junior Brooks Myers picked off a Dustin Demel pass, but a roughing the quarterback penalty against the Ichabods kept the drive alive allowing the tying touchdown.

In the second quarter, the Tigers would take the lead on a 37-yard field goal but with 5:06 remaining in the quarter, junior wide receiver DaWight Benning would score a 30-yard touchdown run on a reverse to put the Ichabods in front 14-10 going into the halftime break.

The lone score in the third quarter would be a Jason Broom touchdown run for the Tigers as they would take the lead for good 30-14. After a pair of touchdowns by FHSU pushing the Tiger lead to 30-14, the Ichabods would mount a furious rally to cut the lead to eight on Sissom's second touchdown reception of the evening from back-up quarterback Cason Lehman, who replaced Hickel for a few plays.

Lehman would then run the swinging gate play for the two point conversion cutting the lead to 30-22.

The Ichabods would then drive 64 yards in six plays as Benning would score his second touchdown of the night on a 36-yard pass reception from Hickel to cut the score to the final 37-29 margin.

Hickel would finish 16 of 27 for 191 yards and two touchdown passes and lead the team with 31 yards rushing. Benning caught four passes for 79 yards and the lone touchdown. Freshman Grant Gould led the Ichabods with 13 tackles and junior Eric Taylor recorded 12. Sophomore Joe Corcoran recorded 11 and senior Chad Gordon picked up 10.



Ichabod Captains named

At the conclusion of fall camp, the Ichabods voted on captains for the 2003 season. The six Ichabods who were named captains were senior offensive lineman Tim Watts, senior defensive lineman Eric Taylor, senior linebacker Morgan Dewey, junior free safety Joe Corcoran and junior quarterbacks Dustin Hickel and Tyler Schuerman.

Streaks for the Ichabods

- Junior quarterback Dustin Hickel has thrown for at least one touchdown in 13 straight games for the Ichabods. The last game he did not toss one was the Missouri-Rolla on Nov. 2, 2001.
- Senior offensive lineman Tim Watts is making his 23rd consecutive start on the offensive line for the Ichabods.
- Redshirt freshman Trent Hearn was the first freshman or redshirt freshman to having 100 yards rushing since Dustin Hickel rushed for 132 on 34 carries against Emporia State on Oct. 27, 2001.



Extra Points:

- The Ichabods are 22-19-1 in home openers since 1961. In the last 10 home openers, the Ichabods are 6-4, including winning four of the last five - which includes a 17-14 win over Fort Hays State on Sept. 11,

1999.

- The Ichabods last non-conference shutout win was a 61-0 win over McPherson on Sept. 6, 1995.
- The Ichabods are 1-5 in games following a shutout since 1989. The last win following a shutout was during the 1996 season when the Ichabods blanked Missouri-Rolla on Oct. 19 and followed that with a 24-20 win over Southwest Baptist on Oct. 26.
- Dustin Hickel needs five yards to pass 1,000 for his career at Washburn.



Up next: The Ichabods hit the road for their arch-rival Emporia State. In their last meeting, the Ichabods knocked off the No. 16 Hornets snapping an 11-game losing streak dating back to a 59-46 win over ESU in Topeka in 1988. It all came on the day when Washburn had groundbreaking on a new stadium facility at halftime. It was also senior day as eight Ichabods played their final game in Topeka. The Ichabods will return home for a Sept. 27th match-up with Truman State at 1 p.m. to celebrate Family Day.

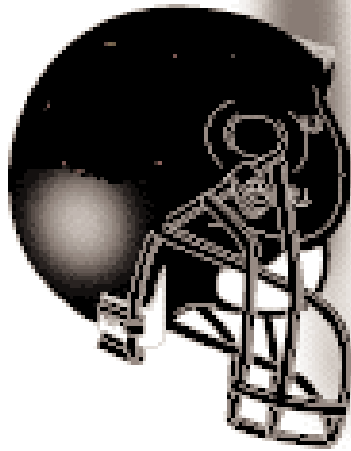
