The Ichabods last time out: Topeka - Aug. 28, 2004 - The Washburn Ichabods fell in their season opener 34-27 to the Colorado School of Mines. The Orediggers scored the winning touchdown with 4:55 to play in the fourth quarter to hand Washburn the loss.

The Ichabods opened the game with a 68-yard, 9-play touchdown drive that was capped by a 38-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Schuerman to Sam Sissom. It was the first of two touchdown passes from the duo of Schuerman to Sissom. However, the extra point attempt missed and the Ichabods led 6-0. The Orediggers would take the ensuing kickoff and score a touchdown of their own, but like the Ichabods could not convert on the extra point.

Both teams would trade touchdown drives to wrap up the first quarter with the score locked at 13. The Ichabods scored a 4-yard touchdown run by Trent Hearn. Mines would score the next 14 points of the game to take a 27-13 lead. The Ichabods would cut into the lead before half-time on a Ra'Shawn Moseley 13-yard scamper to decrease the margin to seven.

In the second half, the Ichabods and Orediggers would go scoreless in the third quarter. The Ichabods struck next on Sissom's second touchdown of the afternoon - a 64-yard strike from Schuerman that tied the score at 27 with 7:52 remaining. The Orediggers took the kickoff and then marched 77 yards in 11 plays as Chad Frieauf connected with Jonny Chan on a 10-yard touchdown pass.

Moseley finished the game with 108 yards rushing and Hearn finished with 71 yards. Schuerman was 14 of 23 with two tipped interceptions and 178 yards.

Sissom would finished with 113 yards receiving and three receptions for a 37.7 yard per catch average. The Ichabod defense was led by Grant Gould who had 15 tackles and an interception return of 31 yards. Adam Ewy had 12 tackles.

Schurig is 8-15 in his second season as the Ichabod head coach and he is 6-12 against the MIAA.

After two seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has already made his mark at Washburn defeating arch-rival Emporia State in the final game in Moore Bowl snapping an 11-game losing streak to the Hornets in the 2002 finale.

The Ichabods improved two wins from the first season to the second season under Schurig finishing the 2003 season 5-6.

After coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program, Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In each of his two seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 16 players receive all-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 29 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll. Following the 2003 season, 16 were named to the honor roll, the most in one single season since joining the MIAA.

While under Schurig, the Ichabod football program has also seen sweeping changes in facilities with the improvements to Yager Stadium and equipment upgrades in the weight room.

Prior to working with the defensive backs, he worked three seasons with the Gorillas' tight ends.

While on the Gorillas coaching staff, Schurig was a part of an NCAA national finalist squad in 1995, four MIAA Championship teams and eight NCAA Division II playoff teams. He helped guide one of the top defenses in Division II including the top-ranked defensive squad in 1999.

Before arriving at Pittsburg State, Schurig spent the 1992 season as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater, Colorado School of Mines joining the Gorillas in 1993.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a four-year letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

Langston head coach Greg Johnson is in his second stint at the Lions' helm. He is 35-31 in his seventh year coaching at Langston.

Texas. Paul Quinn took the opening kickoff of the game and returned it 96 yards for the first score of the game. However it would be the only scoring the Tigers would get as Langston would roll off 30 straight points.

The defense scored the first points for the Lions as Adrian Stargell sacked the Tigers' quarterback, scooped up the ball and returned it 25 yards for the score.

In the second quarter, quarterback Ross Smith hooked up with Jimmy Early for a 33 yard touchdown strike.

Fred Brown and Jimmy Scales each ran for touchdown scores in the third quarter and Israel Jacobs added a 27-yard field goal to round out the scoring.

Scales finished with 113 yards on 15 carries and Smith was 6 of 14 for 86 yards passing.

Jason Fobbs led the defense with eight tackles and Dexter Falls had two sacks and a forced fumble to go along with five solo tackles.

The Lions racked up 20 first downs and 298 yards in total offense holding the Tigers to 176 total yards. The Lions also forced Paul Quinn into three turnovers.

Washburn Ichabods opened the 2003 football season with a 28-0 victory over Langston University on the road and snapped a two-game losing streak on opening day in the process.

The Ichabods took only six plays to go 60 yards for a touchdown in their initial drive of the season. Washburn tailback Trent Hearn scampered 29 yards for a touchdown with 12:56 left in the first quarter. Hearn finished the game with 106 yards on 18 carries in his debut in an Ichabod uniform.

Dustin Hickel connected on a touchdown pass for the 13th straight game with 40 seconds left in the opening quarter. Hickel threw a 13-yard touchdown to Sam Sissom to cap a 73-yard drive in 13 plays.

Joe Corcoran capped the first half scoring with a 22-yard touchdown interception return with 5:38 left in the first half. Corcoran finished with nine tackles, a fumble recovery and two interceptions.



After a scoreless third quarter Tyler Schuerman connected with Cason Lehman on a 30-yard pass on fourth and 11.

The Washburn defense secured the shutout, surrendering just 175 yards on 53 plays.

The defense was led by Morgan Dewey who had 11 tackles and Josh Looney recorded 10. Joe Corcoran had nine tackles and two interceptions and a fumble recovery as well, and was later named the MIAA Defensive Player of the Week.

Record watch:

Several Ichabods have a chance to break school records during the 2004 season:

- Senior quarterback Tyler Schuerman needs 803 yards to become the all-time leader in total offense. He has 5,820 total offensive yards. He needs 1,133 yards to break the school passing record as well. He currently has 4,395 passing yards.
- Senior outside linebacker Joe Corcoran needs six assisted tackles to break the school record of 153 and he needs 64 total tackles for a new school record. He also needs five interceptions to snap a 21-year old school record of 13 in a career.



Ichabod Captains named

At the conclusion of fall camp, the Ichabods voted on captains for the 2004 season. The five captains were senior offensive lineman Tyrone Barrett, senior quarterback Tyler Schuerman, junior linebacker Grant Gould, junior wide receiver Mike Odupitan.

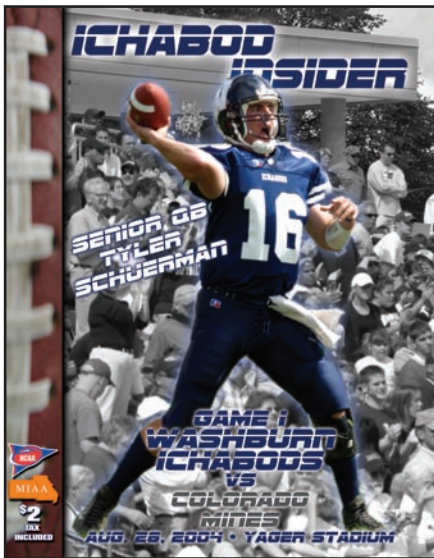

2004 game recaps -- Aug. 28 vs Colorado Mines



TOPEKA - The Washburn Ichabods fell in their season opener 34-27 to the Colorado School of Mines. The Orediggers scored the winning touchdown with 4:55 to play in the fourth quarter to hand Washburn the loss. The Ichabods will take on Langston University next weekend on Sept. 4 at 6 p.m. in Yager Stadium.

The Ichabods opened the game with a 68-yard, 9-play touchdown drive that was capped by a 38-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Schuerman to Sam Sissom. It was the first of two touchdown passes from the duo of Schuerman to Sissom. However, the extra point attempt missed and the Ichabods

led 6-0. The Orediggers would take the ensuing kickoff and score a touchdown of their own, but like the Ichabods could not convert on the extra point.

Both teams would trade touchdown drives to wrap up the first quarter with the score locked at 13. The Ichabods scored a 4-yard touchdown run by Trent Hearn. Mines would score the next 14 points of the game to take a 27-13 lead. The Ichabods would cut into the lead before halftime on a Ra'Shawn Moseley 13-yard scamper to decrease the margin to seven.

In the second half, the Ichabods and Orediggers would go scoreless in the third quarter. The Ichabods struck next on Sissom's second touchdown of the afternoon - a 64-yard strike from Schuerman that tied the score at 27 with 7:52 remaining. The Orediggers took the kickoff and then marched 77 yards in 11 plays as Chad Frieauf connected with Jonny Chan on a 10-yard touchdown pass.

Moseley finished the game with 108 yards rushing and Hearn finished with 71 yards. Schuerman was 14 of 23 with two tipped interceptions and 178 yards.

Sissom would finished with 113 yards receiving and three receptions for a 37.7 yard per catch average. The Ichabod defense was led by Grant Gould who had 15 tackles and an interception return of 31 yards. Adam Ewy had 12 tackles.



Redshirt freshman Ra'Shawn Moseley had 19 carries for 108 yards and one touchdown in the season opener against Colorado Mines. He also had three kickoff returns for 58 yards.
