Ichabods vs Vikings

The Game . . .

The Washburn Ichabods (1-0) fresh off their 28-17 win over No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines, will take on Western Washington (1-0) for the first time in school history as they open the 2005 home slate in Yager Stadium. Today's game will be the first of two opponents the Ichabods will take on from the Great Northwest Athletic Conference as they will travel to Ellensburg, Wash., to battle Central Washington on Sept. 17. The Ichabods will travel to Bellingham, Wash. next year on Sept. 9, 2005 to take on the Vikings. Western Washington topped Mesa State 49-20 to open their season. The Ichabods and the Vikings both received votes in this week's AFCA Coaches Poll. It is the first time in school history the Ichabods have received votes in the national poll as an NCAA Division II School. The Ichabods appeared at No. 25 in the D2Football.com national poll. The last time the Ichabods were in any national top 25 poll was when they were listed as No. 14 in the final NAIA Division I rankings of 1988.

The Coaches . . .

Washburn head football coach Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001.

Schurig is 17-18 in his fourth season as the Ichabod head coach and he is 12-15 against the MIAA.

In only three seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl.

The Ichabods finished the 2004 season with an 8-4 record as Washburn has improved five victories in the win column since Schurig's first season at the helm.

Western Washington head coach Rob Smith (Washington, 1981) is in his 17th year as head coach and his victory total (106-56-1) and winning

percentage of .651 are the best in Western history. Smith has directed the Vikings to their only five national playoff berths in 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1999, and guided them to their best regular-season (No.1, 1995) and final (No.1, 1995) national rankings. He was named GNAC Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2003, Columbia Football Association Coach of the Year in 1989, 1995, 1996, 1999 and 2000, and American Football Coaches Association College Division Region V Coach of the Year in 1995 and 1996..

Ichabods last time out . . .

The Ichabods last time out - Washburn 28, No. 14 Colorado Mines 17 - Aug. 27, 2005: Golden, Colo.. - The Washburn Ichabods opened the 2005 season in fine fashion as they topped No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines 28-17. In the process, the Ichabods won their fourth straight overall game since the 1988 season when they won four straight from Oct. 1 to Oct. 22.

The Ichabods jumped on the board early as sophomore quarterback Jordan Brill, making his second career start, hit Sam Sissom on a 62-yard touchdown strike. It was the first of three Sissom touchdown receptions from Brill as he would finish with seven receptions for 231 yards and lifted his career touchdown tally to 36, setting the Washburn all-time record. He also raised his career point total to 226, tying Troy Slusser for the most points in school history. Sissom's 35 regular season touchdown receptions also ties Jamaica Rector's (Northwest Missouri, 2001-04) record for most in MIAA history.

After trading possessions with the Orediggers, Brill and Sissom hooked up again for an 82-yard touchdown to put the Ichabods up 14-0. The Ichabods would increase their lead to 21-0 after Sissom caught his final TD pass capping a 7-play, 97-yard drive after the Ichabod defense held the Orediggers out of the endzone from inside the Washburn 10 yard line.

<u>Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig</u>

A new era in Washburn football began when Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001.

In only three seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl.

The Ichabods finished the 2004 season with an 8-4 record as Washburn has improved five victories in the win column since Schurig's first season at the helm.

After coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program, Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In his three seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 27 players receive All-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 40 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, including two Academic All-Americans.

While under Schurig, the Ichabod football pro-

gram has also seen sweeping changes in facilities with the improvements to Yager Stadium and equipment upgrades in the weight room.

While on the Pittsburg State coaching staff, Schurig was a part of an NCAA national finalist squad in 1995, four MIAA Championship teams and eight NCAA Division II playoff teams. He helped guide one of the top defenses in Division II including the top-ranked defensive squad in 1999.

Prior to working with the defensive backs, he worked three seasons with the Gorillas' tight ends.

Before arriving at Pittsburg State, Schurig spent the 1992 season as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater, Colorado School of Mines joining the Gorillas in 1993.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a fouryear letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

The Orediggers would rebound with a 50-yard drive right before the half converting a 38-yard field goal to cut the Ichabod lead to 21-3 at the break.

In the second half, the Orediggers jumped on the board on their first drive of the half to cut the lead to 21-10, but the Ichabods came right back with a 78-yard drive finished off by Trent Hearn's 6-yard run, which would wrap the scoring for the Ichabods.

Colorado Mines added a touchdown late, but would not get any closer.

The Ichabods racked up 144 yards on the ground with Hearn going over the 100-yard mark with 21 carries for 106 yards and Ra'Shawn Mosley had 13 carries for 68 yards. Mike Odupitan had four catches for 57 yards and Jeff Scott had a career high 60 yards receiving with three receptions.

On defense, the Ichabods created five turnovers, including two interceptions by Fletcher Terrell. Calvin Stuckey and Erin Beck each had interceptions and Terell Cobb had a fumble recovery.

Senior Grant Gould had 12 tackles including two sacks for the Ichabods, giving him 343 for his career. He needs seven to break the current school record of 349 held by Tony Scollieri.

About the Opponent . . .

GRAND JUNCTION, Colo. --- Western Washington University scored a pair of touchdowns in the final half-minute of the first half to take the lead for good and defeated Mesa State College, 49-20, in a non-conference football contest Saturday night at Stocker Stadium.

It was the season opener for both schools, and marks the first time since 1998 that the Vikings have won consecutive season openers.

Western quarterback James Monrean completed 20 of 30 passes for 266 yards and four touchdowns, and was intercepted once.

The Vikings won despite a massive night by Mesa State wide receiver Drew Bohannon. Bohannon, a sophomore transfer from Scottsdale JC playing his first game for the Mavericks, had seven receptions for 212 yards and three touchdowns.

With the score tied, 7-7, late in the first half, the Vikings put together a seven-play, 60-yard drive, capped by a 17-yard pass from Monrean to slotback Brett Upchurch with 28.3 seconds left in the second quarter.

Mesa State moved downfield in the dying seconds of the half, getting in range for a 36-yard attempt by Tyler Johnson. The kick missed, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave Johnson another shot from 24 yards. That attempt was blocked by Geoff Hise, and Sly Whitfield, Jr. caught the ball on a bounce and returned it 76 yards for a touchdown on the final play of the half,

giving Western a 21-7 lead.

The Mavericks twice pulled to within eight points in the third quarter on touchdown receptions of 80 and 32 yards by Bohannon, and trailed just 28-20 entering the fourth quarter, but the Vikings put the game away in the first five minutes of the final period.

Monrean hit slotback Chris Robinson for a 3-yards score on the opening play of the fourth quarter, and on Western's following possession, running back Duncan Sherrard slipped out of a tackle and ran 61 yards for a score, the longest run from scrimmage for Western since 1999, giving the Vikings a 42-20 lead with 12:07 to go.

Western running back Jordyn Jackson capped the scoring with five minutes left, having a run of 20 yards that set up a 3yard scoring rush.

Mesa State took an early lead, driving 74 yards in 10 plays on the opening series and scoring on a 35-yard pass to Bohannon from quarterback Sean McGraw, who completed 13-of-26 passes for 228 yards with three touchdowns and one interception.

The Vikings evened the score early in the second quarter on a 13-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Matt Wilson.

The Vikings had a 492-313 edge in total offense, rushing for 218 yards. Sherrard had 10 carries for 94 yards and Jake Carlyle added 63 yards on 14 carries.

Western wide receiver Andy Olson, a preseason All-America pick in three publications, had eight receptions for 121 yards, including a 24-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter that extended his string of games with a touchdown reception to 10. He had a school-record 15 scoring catches last year.

Safety Steve Davis had eight tackles for the Vikings in his first collegiate game. Two transfer newcomers - linebacker Shane Simmons and cornerback Ekene Agwuenu had a fumble recovery

Washburn Football History . . .

Washburn is 460-530-44 in its 115th year of college football. The Ichabods have had seven 8-win seasons, including last year's 8-4 mark. The other eight-win seasons were 1906. 1907, 1964, 1974, 1983, 1986, and 2004.

A win for Washburn would . . .

- lift the Ichabods to 461-530-44 in its football history.

high 348 yards completing 14 of 25 passes and three touchdowns in his second start of his career.

• Sam Sissom has at least one touchdown reception in the last seven games counting back to last season.

<u>Ichabods vs ranked opponents . .</u>

The Ichabods improved to 3-31 vs ranked Division II opponents. The win over the Orediggers was the first win over a ranked team on the road for the Ichabods. The other two wins over a ranked opponents are Emporia State 34-21, when the Hornets were ranked No. 16 in the nation on Nov. 2, 2002. The other win over a ranked opponent was on Oct. 17, 1992 when the Ichabods beat 20th-ranked Central Missouri 13-10 in Topeka.

Record watch . . .

Sam Sissom and the record books

- Senior wide receiver Sam Sissom became only the fourth Ichabod to go over the 2,000-yard mark in receiving yards for a career recording 2,614 yards in all game for his career. He needs 490 yards in receiving yards to break the school record of 3,103 held by Michael Dritlein (1992-95).
- Against the Orediggers he caught his 33rd, 34th and 35th career regular season touch down passes of his career. The MIAA record for regular season games (not counting playoff games) is 35 by former Northwest Missouri State wide receiver Jamaica Rector (2001-04).
- For his career, Sissom has 36 touchdown receptions a new Washburn record -- and he needs three to break MIAA's career record of 38, also held by Rector.
- His 152 catches rank No. 2 second on the all-time chart. He needs 19 to break Dritlein's record of 170 for a career.
- Sissom's 226 points for his career ties the school record held by Troy Slusser (1985-88).
- Sissom's 37 total touchdowns for a career is also tied with Slusser for the school record.

Grant Gould and the tackle charts

Senior linebacker Grant Gould, has started the last 30 games and needs seven tackles to snap the all-time school record. He has 343 career tackles. The school record is 349 tackles held by Tony Scollieri (1994-97). Gould has already set the school record for assisted tackles (184) for a career and single-season (73) while at Washburn.

Golden, Colo.. - The Washburn Ichabods opened the 2005 season in fine fashion as they topped No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines 28-17. In the process, the Ichabods won their fourth straight overall game since the 1988 season when they won four straight from Oct. 1 to Oct. 22.

The Ichabods jumped on the board early as sophomore quarterback Jordan Brill, making his second career start, hit Sam Sissom on a 62-yard touchdown strike. It was the first of three Sissom touchdown receptions from Brill as he would finish with

seven receptions for 231 yards and lifted his career touchdown tally to 36, setting the Washburn all-time record. He also raised his career point total to 226, tying Troy Slusser for the most points in school history. Sissom's 35 regular season touchdown receptions also ties Jamaica Rector's (Northwest Missouri, 2001-04) record for most in MIAA history.

After trading possessions with the Orediggers, Brill and Sissom hooked up again for an 82-yard touchdown to put the Ichabods up 14-0. The Ichabods would increase their lead to 21-0 after Sissom caught his final TD pass capping a 7-play, 97-yard drive after the Ichabod defense held the Orediggers out of the endzone from inside the Washburn 10

vard line.

The Orediggers would rebound with a 50-yard drive right before the half converting a 38-yard field goal to cut the Ichabod lead to 21-3 at the break.

In the second half, the Orediggers jumped on the board on their first drive of the half to cut the lead to 21-10, but the Ichabods came right back with a 78-yard drive finished off by Trent Hearn's 6-yard run, which would wrap the scoring for the Ichabods.

Colorado Mines added a touchdown late, but would not get any closer.

The Ichabods racked up 144 yards on the ground with Hearn going over the 100-yard mark with 21 carries for 106 yards and Ra'Shawn Mosley had 13 carries for 68 yards. Mike Odupitan had four catches for 57 yards and Jeff Scott had a career high 60 yards receiving with three receptions.

On the defense, the Ichabods created five turnovers, including two interceptions by Fletcher Terrell. Calvin Stuckey and Erin Beck each had interceptions and Terell Cobb had a fumble recovery.

Senior Grant Gould had 12 tackles including two sacks for the Ichabods, giving him 343 for his career, needing seven to break the current school record of 349 held by Tony Scollieri.
