Ichabods vs **Mules**

The Game . . .

The Washburn Ichabods (2-0) open MIAA play against Central Missouri (2-0) in Yager Stadium on Family Day for Washburn. The Ichabods, who are ranked No. 22 in the D2football.com and received votes in the AFCA national poll, are coming off a 31-21 win over Western Washington. The Mules, who are ranked No. 24 in the D2football.com poll and also also received votes in the AFCA poll last week, blasted Lincoln 83-0 last Thursday in Warrensburg. The Ichabods are looking for their sixth straight win overall, something that has not happened since 1964 for any Washburn football team.

Ichabods on Radio . . .

The game will be broadcast live on AM 580 WIBW - the new home of the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The game can also be heard on the internet at www.wus-ports.com by following the "Listen to the Game" links. Bruce Steinbrock will be the play-by-play voice of the Ichabods and former WU quarterback Mark Elliott will be the color analyst. Jamie Overocker will provide sideline reports. Join the WIBW broadcast team and Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig at 6:30 p.m. on Thursdays at Skinny's Sports Bar and Grille in the Huntoon Shopping Plaza for the Washburn Coaches Show.

The Coaches . . .

Washburn head football coach Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001.

Schurig is 18-18 (.500) in his fourth season as the Ichabod head coach and he is 12-15 against the MIAA.

In only three seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl.

The Ichabods finished the 2004 season with an 8-4 record as Washburn has improved five victories in the win column since Schurig's first season at the helm.

Central Missouri head coach Willie Fritz is in his ninth season as head coach at Central Missouri State University. He is 65-27 as the Mules' mentor, 47-25 vs. MIAA opponents. His .703 winning percentage is third best in CMSU football history, while his 64 career wins rank second. He is a 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University.

Ichabods last time out . . .

The Ichabods last time out - Washburn 31, Western Washington 21 • Sept.

3, 2005: TOPEKA -- The Washburn Ichabods improved to 2-0 with a 31-21 win over Western Washington on Saturday in Yager Stadium.

The Ichabods found themselves down early as the Vikings' All-America wide receiver Andy Olson scored on an 8-yard reverse putting Western Washington up 7-0. The Ichabods would crack the scoring column on the ensuing drive on a career-long 41-yard field goal by Connor Sabel.

Ra'Shawn Mosley put the Ichabods up for good as he capped a 58-yard drive with a

The Ichabods scored again on the very next play from scrimmage as the Fletcher Terrell picked off a Jame Monrean pass and return it 23 yards for a touchdown to give the Ichabods a 17-7 lead before the end of the first quarter.

The Ichabods added another score as Brandon Walker came in at quarterback and scampered 78 yards for a touchdown to pu the 'Bods up 24-7. Trent Hearn rushed 19 yards for a touchdown at the 6:17 mark of the second quarter to put the Ichabods up 31-7, but that would be all the scoring for the Ichabods as they were shutout by the Vikings in the second half.

The Vikings' offense came alive as Monrean would hit Olson for a 35-yard touchdown strike with 4:09 left in the half and Darrius Tuggle for a 28-yard connection with 11 seconds left in the half to end the scoring for both teams.

Grant Gould became Washburn's all-time leading tackler by collecting his 353rd of his career on the afternoon. He finished the game with 10 tackles, passing Tony Scollieri who had 349 for his career at Washburn. Terell Cobb led the Ichabods with 11 tackles and a forced fumble.

The Ichabods racked up 425 yards in total offense behind Hearn's 94 yards rushing on 16 carries. Jordan Brill was 11 for 18 for 199 yards and Mike Odupitan had six catches for 119 yards.

About the Opponent . . .

WARRENSBURG, Mo. -- One week after battling Adams State for a 14-6 win, the Central Missouri State University Mules had no trouble disposing of Lincoln University. The Mules (2-0) rolled to an 83-0 win over the Blue Tigers (1-1).

Junior quarterback Mike Spiegel rushed for 111 yards on four carries with three touchdowns, setting a new school record for touchdowns in a game by a quarterback. His 75-yard TD jaunt in the second quarter is believed to be a record for a quarterback as well.

Freshman placekicker Spencer Webb hit 11-of-12 extra points, both new school records.

Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig

A new era in Washburn football began when Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001.

In only three seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl.

The Ichabods finished the 2004 season with an 8-4 record as Washburn has improved five victories in the win column since Schurig's first season at the helm.

After coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program, Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In his three seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 27 players receive All-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 40 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, including two Academic All-Americans.

While under Schurig, the Ichabod football pro-

gram has also seen sweeping changes in facilities with the improvements to Yager Stadium and equipment upgrades in the weight room.

While on the Pittsburg State coaching staff, Schurig was a part of an NCAA national finalist squad in 1995, four MIAA Championship teams and eight NCAA Division II playoff teams. He helped guide one of the top defenses in Division II including the top-ranked defensive squad in 1999.

Prior to working with the defensive backs, he worked three seasons with the Gorillas' tight ends.

Before arriving at Pittsburg State, Schurig spent the 1992 season as a volunteer assistant coach at his alma mater, Colorado School of Mines joining the Gorillas in 1993.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a fouryear letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

Senior wide receiver Delanie Walker returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a score, the third of his career, tying the CMSU and MIAA records.

And while it isn't a record, the 83 points hung on the board by the Mules are the most scored by CMSU since it defeated Northeast Missouri State 76-0 in 1914.

It was 27-0 after the first quarter, and then the Mules put 42 points up in the second stanza.

Lincoln came out passing against the Mules' third and fourth teamers and got to the Mules four yard line before its drive stalled. A 27-yard field goal was blocked by RoShawn Marshall to preserve the shutout. Marshall also had a 63-yard punt return for a touchdown, as all three phases produced for the Mules.

Central Missouri State totaled 542 yards of total offense (372 rushing, 170 passing). Lincoln meanwhile had -44 yards rushing and 144 passing, 72 coming on its final drive of the game.

Will Caldwell leads the Mules' rushing attack with 96 yards per game. Mike Spiegel has completed 9 of 17 passes with one interception and one touchdown averaging 81 yards per game passing. Delanie Walker, the Mules leading receiver, is averaging 63 yards per game and averaging 18.1 yards per catch.

Series Notes . . .

Today's meeting is the 37th meeting in the series. The Mules lead the series 19-15-2. The Mules have won 10 of the last 13 meetings, including the last eight straight. The Ichabods last win in the series came during the Oct. 12, 1996 season when Washburn won 23-7 in Topeka. The Ichabods have not won in Warrensburg since Oct. 7, 1995 when the Ichabods won 37-21. The Mules have won the last games played in Topeka.

Washburn Football History . . .

Washburn is 461-530-44 in its 115th year of college football. The Ichabods have had seven 8-win seasons, including last year's 8-4 mark. The other eight-win seasons were 1906. 1907, 1964, 1974, 1983, 1986, and 2004.

A win for Washburn would . . .

- lift the Ichabods to 462-530-44 in its football history.
- give the Ichabods a 16-19-2 overall record with the Mules.
- be their sixth straight win overall (the last time any Ichabod team had won six straight games in a row was in 1964 when the eventual CIC Champions won their final eight games of the season after falling in their opener 14-12 to Nebraska-Kearney)
- be their eighth win in their last nine games.
- snap a eight-game losing streak to the Mules.
- snap a four-game losing streak to the Mules in Topeka.
- be the second straight season the Ichabods won their MIAA opener.

The last meeting with the Mules . . .

The Washburn Ichabods fell 47-21 to Central Missouri State at Walton Stadium in Warrensburg. Sam Sissom caught two touchdowns from Tyler Schuerman to lead the WU offense. Sissom has 12 touchdown receptions for the season. Washburn fell to 5-4 and is in a tie for third in the MIAA at 4-3.

The Washburn Ichabod offense struggled in the first half collecting on seven first downs and gaining 100 total yards, with 61 of the yards coming on the ground. The Mules by the halfway point had rushed for 240 yards and gained 352 yards.

After the Mules had jumped out to a 30-0 lead, the Ichabods scored on an 80-yard drive in seven plays using 3:26 off the clock to cut the lead to 30-7, however CMSU would kick a field goal before the break to take a 33-7 lead into halftime.

In the second half, the Mules would score on their first two possessions of the second half to push the lead to 47-7.

The Ichabods' Sissom caught his second touchdown pass of the afternoon late in the third quarter. The Ichabods' Mike Odupitan had the only score in the fourth quarter, a 35yard touchdown reception from Jordan Brill, that capped a 88-yard drive and ended the scoring for both teams with Central ahead 47-21.

Sissom finished with four receptions for 59 yards and two touchdowns. It was Sissom's 11th and 12th touchdown receptions of the season and his 29th and 30th of his career. Sissom also became only the fourth Ichabod receiver to go over 2,000 yards for a career, he now has 2,001.

Ra'Shawn Mosley led the Ichabods with 76 yards rushing, raising his season total to 716 yards. Schuerman passed for two touchdowns and Brill was 4-of-6 passing for one touchdown and 71 yards through the air.

The Ichabod defense was led by Evin Beck

The Ichabods improved to 3-31 vs ranked Division II opponents. The win over the Orediggers was the first win over a ranked team on the road for the Ichabods. The other two wins over a ranked opponents are Emporia State 34-21, when the Hornets were ranked No. 16 in the nation on Nov. 2, 2002. The other win over a ranked opponent was on Oct. 17, 1992 when the Ichabods beat 20th-ranked Central Missouri 13-10 in Topeka.

- Against the Orediggers he caught his 33rd, 34th and 35th career regular season touch down passes of his career. The MIAA record for regular season games (not counting playoff games) is 35 by former Northwest Missouri State wide receiver Jamaica Rector (2001-04).
- For his career, Sissom has 36 touchdown receptions a new Washburn record -- and he needs three to break MIAA's career record of 38, also held by Rector.
- His 152 catches rank No. 2 second on the all-time chart. He needs 19 to break Dritlein's record of 170 for a career.
- Sissom's 226 points for his career ties the school record held by Troy Slusser (1985-88).
- Sissom's 37 total touchdowns for a career is also tied with Slusser for the school record.

Grant Gould and the tackle charts

Senior linebacker Grant Gould, has started the last 31 games and became Washburn's all-time leading tackler with his 10 tackles against Western Washington. He has 353 career tackles which topped the 349 tackles recorded by Tony Scollieri (1994-97). Gould has already set the school record for assisted tackles (184) for a career and single-season (73) while at Washburn.

Fletcher Terrell and the interception charts

Junior linebacker has been a ball hawk to start the season with three interceptions in two games this season. He has raised his career interception total to 12. He has recorded 326 interception yards in those returns and has returned two of those for touchdowns - his second coming on a 23-yard return against Western Washington last week. His other interception returned for a touchdown was on Sept. 20, 2003 vs Emporia State - a 60 yard return. The all-time interception leader is A.C. Poynter (1982-83) who had 13 in his career for the Ichabods. Terrell is already the Washburn career passes defended record holder with 44.

Ichabods and the national polls. . .

The Ichabods and the Mules both received votes in last week's AFCA Coaches Poll. It is the first time in school history the Ichabods have received votes in the national poll as an NCAA Division II School. The Ichabods appeared at No. 25 in the D2Football.com national poll. The last time the Ichabods were in any national top 25 poll was when they were listed as No. 14 in the final NAIA Division I rankings of 1988.

Up next . . .

The Ichabods will take on non-conference opponent Central Washington in Ellensburg on Sept. 17 and then return to MIAA play against Southwest Baptist in Bolivar on Sept. 24. The Ichabods' next home game will be on Oct. 1 against Pittsburg State.



Golden, Colo.. - The Washburn Ichabods opened the 2005 season in fine fashion as they topped No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines 28-17. In the process, the Ichabods won their fourth straight overall game since the 1988 season when they won four straight from Oct. 1 to Oct. 22.

The Ichabods jumped on the board early as sophomore quarterback Jordan Brill, making his second career start, hit Sam Sissom on a 62-yard touchdown strike. It was the first of three Sissom touchdown receptions from Brill as he would finish with

seven receptions for 231 yards and lifted his career touchdown tally to 36, setting the Washburn all-time record. He also raised his career point total to 226, tying Troy Slusser for the most points in school history. Sissom's 35 regular season touchdown receptions also ties Jamaica Rector's (Northwest Missouri, 2001-04) record for most in MIAA history.

After trading possessions with the Orediggers, Brill and Sissom hooked up again for an 82-yard touchdown to put the Ichabods up 14-0. The Ichabods would increase their lead to 21-0 after Sissom caught his final TD pass capping a 7-play, 97-yard drive after the Ichabod defense held the Orediggers out of the endzone from inside the Washburn 10



yard line.

The Orediggers would rebound with a 50-yard drive right before the half converting a 38-yard field goal to cut the Ichabod lead to 21-3 at the break.

In the second half, the Orediggers jumped on the board on their first drive of the half to cut the lead to 21-10, but the Ichabods came right back with a 78-yard drive finished off by Trent Hearn's 6-yard run, which would wrap the scoring for the Ichabods.

Colorado Mines added a touchdown late, but would not get any closer.

The Ichabods racked up 144 yards on the ground with Hearn going over the 100-yard mark with 21 carries for 106 yards and Ra'Shawn Mosley had 13 carries for 68 yards. Mike Odupitan had four catches for 57 yards and Jeff Scott had a career high 60 yards receiving with three receptions.

On the defense, the Ichabods created five turnovers, including two interceptions by Fletcher Terrell. Calvin Stuckey and Erin Beck each had interceptions and Terell Cobb had a fumble recovery.

Senior Grant Gould had 12 tackles including two sacks for the Ichabods, giving him 343 for his career, needing seven to break the current school record of 349 held by Tony Scollieri.

TOPEKA -- The Washburn Ichabods improved to 2-0 with a 31-21 win over Western Washington on Saturday in Yager Stadium.


The Ichabods found themselves down early as the Vikings' All-America wide receiver Andy Olson scored on an 8-yard reverse putting Western Washington up 7-0. The Ichabods would crack the scoring column on the ensuing drive on a careerlong 41-yard field goal by Connor Sabel.

Ra'Shawn Mosley put the Ichabods up for good as he capped a 58yard drive with a 4-yard tochdown run.

The Ichabods scored again on the very next play from scrimmage as the Fletcher Terrell picked off a Jame Monrean pass and return it 23 yards for a touchdown to give the Ichabods a 17-7 lead before the end of the first quarter.

The Ichabods added another score as Brandon Walker came in at quarterback and scampered 78 yards for a touchdown to pu the 'Bods up 24-7. Trent Hearn rushed 19 yards for a touchdown at the 6:17 mark of the

second quarter to put the Ichabods up 31-7, but that would be all the scoring for the Ichabods as they were shutout by the Vikings in the second half.

The Vikings' offense cam alive as Monrean would hit Olson for a 35-yard touchdown strike with 4:09 left in the half and Darrius Tuggle for a 28-yard connection with 11 seconds left in the half to end the scoring for both teams.

Washburn's all-time leading tackler by collecting his 353rd of his career on the afternoon. He finished the game with 10 tackles, passing Tony Scollieri who had 349 for his career at Washburn. Terell Cobb led the Ichabods with 11 tackles and a forced fumble.

The Ichabods racked up 425 yards in total offense behind Hearn's 94 yards rushing on 16 carries. Jordan Brill was 11 for 18 for 199 yards and Mike Odupitan had six catches for 119 yards.
