## Ichabods vs Orediggers

#### The Game . . .

Game on! The 2005 defending MIAA Champions open the 2006 season at home against the Colorado School of Mines. The game will be the first for the Ichabods on the new field turf inside Yager Stadium. Today's meeting will also be the third in a six-game series contract between the Ichabods and the Orediggers. Last season, Washburn topped Colorado Mines 28-17 in Golden while the Orediggers outgunned Washburn 34-27 on Aug. 28, 2004 in Topeka in the first meeting between the two schools in 40 years.

#### Ichabods on Radio . . .

The game will be broadcast live on AM 580 WIBW - the home of the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The game can also be heard on the internet at www.wusports.com by following the "Listen to the Game" links. Bruce Steinbrock will be the play-by-play voice of the Ichabods and former WU quarterback Mark Elliott will be the color analyst. Jamie Overocker will provide sideline reports. Join the WIBW broadcast team and Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig at 7 p.m. on Thursdays at Skinny's Sports Bar and Grille in the Huntoon Shopping Plaza for the Washburn Coaches Show.

#### The Coaches . . .

**Washburn head football coach Craig Schurig** was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001. Schurig is 25-21 (.543) in his fifth season as the Ichabod head coach and he is 19-16 (.559) against the MIAA. He also led the Ichabods their first MIAA title since joining the league and the first conference title since the Ichabods won the CSIC in 1983.

In only four seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first NCAA postseason appearance in school history.

**Colorado Mines head coach Bob Stitt** is in his seventh season as the Orediggers' coach. He is 40-27 entering his seventh season as the Orediggers head coach. He is a 1986 graduate of Doane College.

## The Ichabods last time out - No. 21 Northwest Missouri 42, No. 12 Washburn 32-second round of NCAA Playoffs:

TOPEKA, — The Washburn Ichabods season came to an end in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs with a 42-32 loss to Northwest Missouri.

The Ichabods were down early as the Bearcats scored two touchdowns on their first four drives as the Ichabod were shutout until the 9:54 mark of the second quarter as Jordan Brill hooked up with Aaron Gardiner for a 45-yard touchdown pass capping a 5-play, 68-yard drive cutting the Bearcat lead to 28-7. The Bearcats would score on the following possession as Xavier Oman ran 70 yards to put Northwest up 35-7.

Washburn then came back with a 75 yard drive with Trent Hearn finishing the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run with 4:51 left in the second quarter. The Ichabods added three more points on a 35-yard Connor Sabel field goal with :16 left in the first half cutting the Bearcat lead to 35-17.

Northwest took the opening possession of the second half and drove 83 yards in 11 plays

for their final touchdown of the game with 11:03 remaining in the third quarter.

Brill and Mike Odupitan connected with each other for the final two touchdowns of the game. The first was a 30-yard strike and the second was a 15-yard reception that pulled the Ichabods within 10 at 42-32.

For the game, the Bearcats outgained the Ichabods 494 to 372 as the Bearcats racked up 311 yards passing, the Ichabods passed for 296. On the ground, Northwest outgained the Ichabods 183 to 76.

Brill was 16 of 29 for 296 yards and 3 TD's, hitting Odupitan for five receptions and 118 with the two TD's to the senior. Hearn finished the game with 61 yards rushing and his season with 1,203 yards snapping a 22-year old school record held by Dino DeLisa who rushed for 1,185 during his sophomore season in 1983.

#### About the Opponent . . . last time out

#### Colorado School of Mines 42, Adams State 27 - Nov. 5, 2005

GOLDEN, Colo. - The Colorado School of Mines football team clinched its school-record sixth consecutive winning season with a 42-27 win over Adams State in the 2005 season finale in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference action Saturday afternoon at Brooks Field.

The program has had a streak of six straight nonlosing seasons and a streak of seven non-losing seasons back in the early 1900's, but the streaks included teams with .500 records.

CSM finishes the season at 6-5 overall and tied for second place in the conference at 6-2. Adams State (6-5, 5-3 RMAC) took a 7-0 lead with 9:31 to play in the first quarter when Marcus Sias found paydirt from 1-yard out. However, the Orediggers gained a 14-7

lead at the end of the first quarter as junior running back Bryan Florendo (Crete, Neb./

#### lchabod head coach Craig Schurig

Entering his fifth seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Washburn head coach Craig Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a 25-21 (.543) overall record and a 19-16 (543) record in the MIAA.

The Schurig-led Ichabods built on the momentum of the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl Championship to their first NCAA Playoff appearance as well as Washburn earning their first MIAA Championship in 2005. Schurig earned the MIAA's Coach of the Year for his efforts leading the Ichabods in 2005. The conference championship was the first by the Ichabods since the 1983 season. He was also named the AFCA's Region 3 Coach of the Year.

Washburn finished the 2005 season with a school-record nine wins and a 7-1 mark in conference play.

The 2004 season saw the Ichabods record their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the Mineral Water Bowl.

Schurig was named the Ichabod head coach on

Dec. 28, 2001 after coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program. Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In his four seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had three All-American selections, two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 41 players receive all-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 54 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, including two Academic All-Americans.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a fouryear letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team all-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

Overnight Address: 1500 Illinois Street Golden, CO 80401 Crete) scored on a 21-yard scamper and caught a 33-yard touchdown from senior quarter-back Danny Medina (Pueblo, Colo./Pueblo South) on a fourth down play.

CSM extended its lead to 21-7 as Medina hooked up with sophomore wideout Michael Curl (Houston, Texas/Blinn JC) with 4:59 to play in the first half, but ASC quarterback Scott Coxon scored on a 5-yard draw play with five seconds to play in the half. The extra point was blocked and the Orediggers led at the half, 21-13.

A 2-yard scoring run by Tyree Walton and a two-point conversion knotted the game at 21-21 just four minutes into the second half. The Orediggers struck again at the 4:52 mark of the third quarter as junior wide receiver Brent Chacon (Greeley, Colo./Valley) caught a 25-yard TD pass from junior quarterback Garrett Mehl (Crete, Neb./Crete).

The Grizzlies were once again poised to tie the game at 28-28 after Coxon scored from 1-yard out with 10:24 to play in the game, but CSM once again blocked the extra point attempt by Wayne Durham.

CSM went on to score 14 more points as Mehl hooked up with junior wide receiver Derek Dykstra (Seibert, Colo./Hi Plains) for a 36-yard touchdown and scored on a quarter-back keeper from 6-yards out with 26 seconds to play.

Mehl and Medina combined to go 15-of-29 for 249 yards and four touchdowns. Florendo ran 21 times for 104 yards and a touchdown and also caught five balls for 57 yards and a score, while senior wideout Justin Gallas (Westminster, Colo./Northglenn) caught six passes for 105 yards.

Senior linebacker Jared Heath (Highlands Ranch, Colo./Highlands Ranch) led the defense with a game-high 14 stops, while sophomore defensive end Marin Richardson (Colorado Springs, Colo./Mitchell) produced seven tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

Coxon went 28-of-44 for 384 yards and also ran 12 times for 39 yards and two scores, while Gene Mejia caught eight passes for 151 yards. George Holley led ASC with nine tackles.

#### Series Notes . . .

Today's meeting is the 14th in the all-time series. Today's game is the third in a six-game contract with CSM. The Ichabods lead the all-time series 9-4.

Today's meeting is only the third since Oct. 3, 1964. The Ichabods won that meeting 16-0 in Golden. In the game, the Ichabod defense forced two fumbles, one by Bob Noblitt in the first quarter and Burton Clemons recovered one in the fourth quarter. Bob Hardy rushed for a 49-yard touchdown early in the first quarter. The Ichabod defense picked up a sack for another two points and then quarterback Tom Huber connected with Pete Roscetti on a 21-yard touchdown strike for the final score. Roscetti, who was also the placekicker, connected on both of his PAT's in the game. The 1964 Ichabods finished the season 8-1 and won the CIC Conference Championship.

The Orediggers won the last meeting between the two schools on Aug. 28, 2004 in Yager Stadium in Topeka 34-27.

in fine fashion as they topped No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines 28-17. In the process, the Ichabods won their fourth straight overall game since the 1988 season when they won four straight from Oct. 1 to Oct. 22.

The Ichabods jumped on the board early as sophomore quarterback Jordan Brill, making his second career start, hit Sam Sissom on a 62-yard touchdown strike. It was the first of three Sissom touchdown receptions from Brill as he would finish with seven receptions for 231 yards and lifted his career touchdown tally to 36, setting the Washburn all-time record. He also raised his career point total to 226, tying Troy Slusser for the most points in school history. Sissom's 35 regular season touchdown receptions also ties Jamaica Rector's (Northwest Missouri, 2001-04) record for most in MIAA history.

After trading possessions with the Orediggers, Brill and Sissom hooked up again for an 82-yard touchdown to put the Ichabods up 14-0. The Ichabods would increase their lead to 21-0 after Sissom caught his final TD pass capping a 7-play, 97-yard drive after the Ichabod defense held the Orediggers out of the endzone from inside the Washburn 10 yard line.

The Orediggers would rebound with a 50-yard drive right before the half converting a 38-yard field goal to cut the Ichabod lead to 21-3 at the break.

In the second half, the Orediggers jumped on the board on their first drive of the half to cut the lead to 21-10, but the Ichabods came right back with a 78-yard drive finished off by Trent Hearn's 6-yard run, which would wrap the scoring for the Ichabods.

Colorado Mines added a touchdown late, but would not get any closer.

The Ichabods racked up 144 yards on the ground with Hearn going over the 100-yard mark with 21 carries for 106 yards and Ra'Shawn Mosley had 13 carries for 68 yards. Mike Odupitan had four catches for 57 yards and Jeff Scott had a career high 60 yards receiving with three receptions.

On the defense, the Ichabods created five turnovers, including two interceptions by Fletcher Terrell. Calvin Stuckey and Erin Beck each had interceptions and Terell Cobb had a fumble recovery.

Senior Grant Gould had 12 tackles including two sacks for the Ichabods, giving him 343 for his career, needing seven to break the current school record of 349 held by Tony Scollieri.

- lift the Ichabods to 469-533-44 in its football history.
- give the Ichabods a 10-4 all-time record against the Oredigger
- be the Ichabods' second straight win over the Orediggers
- snap a two-game home losing streak to the Orediggers
- be the first win over the Orediggers in Topeka since a 20-6 win on Oct. 7, 1961 nearly 45 years ago
- be the Ichabods' eighth straight regular season home win dating back to a 49-21 loss to Northwest Missouri on Sept. 25, 2004
- push the Ichabods to 8-6 in their last 14 season openers

#### A loss for Washburn would . . .

- drop the Ichabods to 468-534-44 in its football history.
- be the Orediggers' third straight win in Topeka
- drop the Ichabods to 9-5 all-time against the Orediggers
- drop the Ichabods to 7-7 in their last 14 season openers

#### Ichabods vs ranked opponents . .

The Ichabods enter the 2006 season with a 5-31 vs ranked Division II opponents after their win over No. 4 ranked Pittsburg State on Oct. 1, 2005. The win was the highest win over a ranked opponent since the Ichabods joined the D-II ranks. The win over the then No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines in the 2005 opener was the first win over a ranked team on the road for the Ichabods and the win over then No. 5 Northwest Missouri was the Ichabods' highest win over a ranked opponent on the road. The other two wins over a ranked opponents are Emporia State 34-21, when the Hornets were ranked No. 16 in the nation on Nov. 2, 2002. The other win over a ranked opponent was on Oct. 17, 1992 when the Ichabods beat 20th-ranked Central Missouri 13-10 in Topeka.

Under head coach Craig Schurig, the Ichabods are 4-10 against ranked opponents since 2002, but they are 3-3 since the 2004 season including a 3-1 record in 2005.

#### The Ichabods in the national rankings this season . . .

For the first time in school history, the Washburn Ichabods are ranked in the AFCA National Football Coaches Poll, which they entered at No. 17. The Ichabods are No. 13 in the 2005 final poll. Washburn was No. 15 in the D2Football.com national preseason poll. The Ichabods have been ranked in the top 25 in eight straight AFCA polls dating back to the seventh poll of 2005.




