Ichabods vs Vikings

The Game . . .

The Washburn Ichabods will hit the road for the first time this season traveling to Bellingham, Wash., to take on the Western Washington University Vikings. The Ichabods enter the game with a 1-0 record winning their opener 41-21 over Colorado Mines. The Vikings are 0-1 after falling 28-23 to Humboldt State. It is the home opener for the Vikings this week.

Ichabods on Radio . . .

The game will be broadcast live on FM 106.9 - the home of the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The game can also be heard on the internet at www.wusports.com by following the "Listen to the Game" links. Bruce Steinbrock will be the play-by-play voice of the Ichabods and former WU quarterback Mark Elliott will be the color analyst. Jamie Overocker will provide sideline reports. Join the broadcast team and Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig at 7 p.m. on Thursdays at Skinny's Sports Bar and Grille in the Huntoon Shopping Plaza for the Washburn Coaches Show.

The Coaches . . .

Washburn head football coach Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001. Schurig is 26-21 (.553) in his fifth season as the Ichabod head coach and he is 19-16 (.559) against the MIAA. He led the Ichabods their first MIAA title since joining the league and the first conference title since the Ichabods won the CSIC in 1983 this past season.

In only four seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a new level with a school-best finish in the MIAA, their first winning season since 1999 and their first NCAA postseason appearance in school history.

Western Washington head coach Rob Ross is in his first season as the Vikings' head coach. He spent this past season, Ross was linebackers coach at Oregon State University, where the Beavers led the PAC 10 in run defense, allowing 108.0 yards per game. He spent the previous four seasons as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at University of Oregon. The Ducks won the 2001 PAC 10 championship, finishing second in the ESPN Coaches Poll after defeating Colorado in the 2002 Fiesta Bowl. He was also at Oregon as an assistant during the 1997 and 1998 seasons. He was the defensive coordinator for two of the finest teams in school history in the mid-1990s. Now, Rob Ross brings three decades of coaching experience to his new post - head football coach at Western Washington University.

Ichabods last time out . . .

The Ichabods last time out - No. 16 Washburn 41, Colorado School of Mines 21:

TOPEKA, Kan. - Junior quarterback Jordan Brill passed for 309 yards and tied his career high with five touchdown passes in the win completing 18 of 27 passes as the No. 16 ranked Washburn Ichabods opened the 2006 season with a 41-21 win over the Colorado School of Mines in front of 6,156 people in Yager Stadium.

Washburn won the opening toss and marched 69 yards in five plays as Brill hooked up with senior wide receiver Sam Sissom for a 12-yard touchdown pass. The reception gave Sissom 37 for his career, one shy of the MIAA's career all-game record of 38 held by Jamaica Rector (Northwest Missouri).

On the Orediggers first possession of the game, they marched down to the Ichabod 4-yard line, but the Ichabod defense stopped them on four plays, including two inside the 1-yard line. Washburn took the ball and marched 95 yards on 13 plays as Brill found senior wide receiver

Aaron Gardiner for a 25-yard touchdown strike putting the Ichabods up 14-0 with 33 seconds left in the first quarter.

After forcing a three-and-out for the Orediggers, junior wide receiver Jake Lebahn hooked up with Brill for a 17-yard touchdown reception capping a three-play, 22 yard drive set up by Sissom's 36-yard punt return into Oredigger territory.

Connor Sabel added a 36-yard field goal at the 6:16 mark of the second quarter after freshman linebacker Michael Krajicek picked off a Garrett Mehl pass at the Mines' 45 yard line.

On their next possession, Mines scored their first points as Mehl hit Derek Dyktra on a 16-yard touchdown reception, but the extra point attempt was blocked by senior defensive tackle Trey Lewis cutting the Washburn lead to 24-6.

Washburn fumbled the ensuing kickoff and the Orediggers took advantage of the mistake scoring their second touchdown in :25 seconds and Mehl rushed for eight yards to cut the Washburn lead to 10 points at 24-14 following the two-point conversion. Gardiner recorded his second touchdown pass of the afternoon with the only points of the third quarter as Brill hit him on a seven yard touchdown reception pushing the Washburn lead to 31-14.

In the fourth quarter, both teams traded punts and Sabel connected on a 38-yard field goal with 12:05 left in the game.

The Orediggers capped a 68-yard drive as Mehl rushed 33 yards down the sideline to once again cut the Washburn lead to two scores at 34-21. After a Washburn punt by Ben Boswell that was downed at the CSM 1-yard line, junior cornerback Cary Williams picked off a Mehl pass and returned it to the Orediggers' 30 yard line. Four plays latter, Brill tossed his fifth touchdown pass of the afternoon to junior tight end Ben Ramsey on a 3-yard connection, wrapping the scoring at 41-21

Brill's 309 yard passing performance was his third of his Washburn career and his second high-

lchabod head coach Craig Schurig

Entering his fifth seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Washburn head coach Craig Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a 26-21 (.543) overall record and a 19-16 (543) record in the MIAA.

The Schurig-led Ichabods built on the momentum of the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl Championship to their first NCAA Playoff appearance as well as Washburn earning their first MIAA Championship in 2005. Schurig earned the MIAA's Coach of the Year for his efforts leading the Ichabods in 2005. The conference championship was the first by the Ichabods since the 1983 season. He was also named the AFCA's Region 3 Coach of the Year.

Washburn finished the 2005 season with a schoolrecord nine wins and a 7-1 mark in conference play.

The 2004 season saw the Ichabods record their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the Mineral Water Bowl.

Schurig was named the Ichabod head coach on

Dec. 28, 2001 after coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program. Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In his four seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had three All-American selections, two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 41 players receive all-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 54 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, including two Academic All-Americans.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a fouryear letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team all-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

In two starts against the Orediggers, Brill is 32-of-52 for 657 yards and eight touchdowns.

Gardiner led the Ichabods in receiving yards with 128 and six receptions with the two touchdowns and Sissom finished with four receptions for 93 yards.

On the ground, Washburn's Trent Hearn had 22 carries for 99 yards.

Defensively, Washburn's redshirt freshman linebacker Zach Watkins had 11 tackles including six solo stops with a tackle for loss. Senior linebacker Aaron Neal had nine stops. Willams had two interceptions for the Ichabods and three pass breakups.

About the Opponent . . . last time out

Humboldt State 28, Western Washington 23 - Aug. 31, 2006

ARCATA, Calif. - Running back Calvin McCarty rushed for 139 yards and three touchdowns on 30 carries, but it wasn't enough as Western Washington University was unable to overcome an early deficit and fell to Humboldt State University, 28-23, in the season-opening football game for both schools Thursday at the Redwood Bowl.

It was the first game for new Western head coach Robin Ross, who has been a Division I assistant for most of the last 30 years.

Humboldt State marched 98 yards for a touchdown on its opening possession, and led the rest of the game, going up by 14 points on two occasions.

Western pulled to within five, 28-23, with 2:45 to play on a 3-yard run by McCarty, his third touchdown of the game. Humboldt State recovered the ensuing onside kick, then put the game away with 1:45 left as quarterback Blake Moorman found wide receiver Joey Stein for a 12-yard completion on third-and-11, allowing the Lumberjacks to run out the clock.

Moorman completed 15-of-25 passes for 223 yards, three touchdowns and an interception, with Stein having two of the scoring grabs.

McCarty, a transfer from Reedley College (Calif.) playing his first Western game, became the first Viking to rush for three touchdowns in a game since Duncan Sherrard accomplished the feat against Western New Mexico on Oct. 5, 2002. In addition to his fourth-quarter touchdown, he scored on a 5-yard run with 28 seconds left in the first half, and an 8-yard run in the third period. He had 98 yards on 19 carries in the opening half.

After the Vikings punted on the first possession of the game, Humboldt State marched 98 yards in 15 plays, capped by a 19-yard touchdown pass from Moorman to a wide-open Stein, to take a 7-0 lead. The Lumberjacks extended the lead to 14-0 with 3:45 left in the first half, as Tyson Hampson intercepted a Monrean pass in the flat and returned it 18 yards for a touchdown.

Humboldt State's other touchdowns came on a 44-yard pass from Moorman to Richard Perkins in the third quarter, and a 28-yard Moorman-to-Stein connection in the fourth period.

Aside from McCarty's touchdowns, Western's other points came on a 33-yard Robby Smith field goal with 7:17 left. The Vikings then appeared to recover a short kickoff, but the recovery was negated by a penalty, and the Lumberjacks scored in just four plays on Moorman's second touchdown pass to Stein, putting the lead at 11, 28-17, with 5:34 to play.

Humboldt State had a 308-282 edge in total offense.

Western quarterback James Monrean completed 9-of-17 passes for 98 yards and two intercep-

tions. The Vikings had a 184-85 advantage in rushing yards.

Last Meeting with Western Washington . . .

(Sept. 3, 2005) - TOPEKA -- The Washburn Ichabods improved to 2-0 with a 31-21 win over Western Washington.

The Ichabods found themselves down early as the Vikings' all-America wide receiver Andy Olson scored on an 8-yard reverse putting Western Washington up 7-0. The Ichabods would crack the scoring column on the ensuing drive on a careerlong 41-yard field goal by Connor Sabel.

Ra'Shawn Mosley put the Ichabods up for good as he capped a 58-yard drive with a 4-yard touchdown run.

The Ichabods scored again on the very next play from scrimmage as Fletcher Terrell picked off a James Monrean pass and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown to give the Ichabods a 17-7 lead before the end of the first quarter.

The Ichabods added another score as Brandon Walker came in at quarterback and scampered 78 yards for a touchdown to put the 'Bods up 24-7. Trent Hearn rushed 19 yards for a touchdown at the 6:17 mark of the second quarter to put the Ichabods up 31-7, but that would be all the scoring for the Ichabods as they were shutout by the Vikings in the second half.

The Vikings' offense came alive as Monrean would hit Olson for a 35-yard touchdown strike with 4:09 left in the half and Darrius Tuggle for a 28-yard connection with 11 seconds left in the half to end the scoring for both teams.

Grant Gould became Washburn's all-time leading tackler by collecting his 353rd of his career on the afternoon. He finished the game with 10 tackles, passing Tony Scollieri who had 349 for his career at Washburn. Terell Cobb led the Ichabods with 11 tackles and a forced fumble.

The Ichabods racked up 425 yards in total offense behind Hearn's 94 yards rushing on 16 carries. Jordan Brill was 11 for 18 for 199 yards and Mike Odupitan had six catches for 119 yards.

A look back at notes from the Colorado Mines game . . .

The Win:

- lifted the Ichabods to 469-533-44 in its football history.
- gave the Ichabods a 10-4 all-time record against the Oredigger
- was the Ichabods' second straight win over the Orediggers
- snapped a two-game home losing streak to the Orediggers
- was the first win over the Orediggers in Topeka since a 20-6 win on Oct. 7, 1961 - nearly 45 years ago

- was the Ichabods' eighth straight regular season home win dating back to a 49-21 loss to Northwest Missouri on Sept. 25, 2004
- pushed the Ichabods to 8-6 in their last 14 season openers

Ichabods vs ranked opponents . .

The Ichabods enter the 2006 season with a 5-31 vs ranked Division II opponents after their win over No. 4 ranked Pittsburg State on Oct. 1, 2005. The win was the highest win over a ranked opponent since the Ichabods joined the D-II ranks. The win over the then No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines in the 2005 opener was the first win over a ranked team on the road for the Ichabods and the win over then No. 5 Northwest Missouri was the Ichabods' highest win over a ranked opponent on the road. The other two wins over a ranked opponents are Emporia State 34-21, when the Hornets were ranked No. 16 in the nation on Nov. 2, 2002. The other win over a ranked opponent was on Oct. 17, 1992 when the Ichabods beat 20th-ranked Central Missouri 13-10 in Topeka.

Under head coach Craig Schurig, the Ichabods are 4-10 against ranked opponents since 2002, but they are 3-3 since the 2004 season including a 3-1 record in 2005.





Washburn 41, Colorado Mines 21 Sept. 2, 2006

TOPEKA, Kan. - Junior quarterback Jordan Brill passed for 309 yards and tied his career high with five touchdown passes in the win completing 18 of 27 passes as the No. 16 ranked Washburn Ichabods opened the 2006 season with a 41-21 win over the Colorado School of Mines in front of 6,156 people in Yager Stadium.

Washburn won the opening toss and marched 69 yards in five plays as Brill hooked up with senior wide receiver Sam Sissom for a 12-yard touchdown pass. The reception gave Sissom 37 for his career, one shy of the MIAA's career all-game record of 38 held by Jamaica Rector (Northwest Missouri).

On the Orediggers first possession of the game, they marched down to the Ichabod 4-yard line, but the Ichabod defense stopped them on four plays, including two

inside the 1-yard line. Washburn took the ball and marched 95 yards on 13 plays as Brill found senior wide receiver Aaron Gardiner for a 25-yard touchdown strike putting the Ichabods up 14-0 with 33 seconds left in the first quarter.

After forcing a three-and-out for the Orediggers, junior wide receiver Jake Lebahn hooked up with Brill for a 17-yard touchdown reception capping a three-play, 22 yard drive set up by Sissom's 36-yard punt return into Oredigger territory.

Connor Sabel added a 36-yard field goal at the 6:16 mark of the second quarter after freshman linebacker Michael Krajicek picked off a Garrett Mehl pass at the Mines' 45 yard line.

in :25 seconds and Mehlf rushed for eight yards to cut the Washburn lead to 10 points at 24-14 following the two-point conversion. Gardiner recorded his second touchdown pass of the afternoon with the only points of the third quarter as Brill hit him on a seven yard touchdown reception pushing the Washburn lead to 31-14.

In the fourth quarter, both teams traded punts and Sabel connected on a 38-yard field goal with 12:05 left in the game.

The Orediggers capped a 68yard drive as Mehl rushed 33 yards down the sideline to once again cut the Washburn lead to two scores at 34-21. After a Washburn punt by Ben Boswell that was downed at the CSM 1yard line, junior cornerback Cary Williams picked off a Mehl pass and returned it to the Orediggers'

30 yard line. Four plays latter, Brill tossed his fifth touchdown pass of the afternoon to junior tight end Ben Ramsey on a 3-yard connection, wrapping the scoring at 41-21.

Brill's 309 yard passing performance was his third of his Washburn career and his second highest total following a 348 yard outing against the Orediggers and a 328 yard day against Central Washington last season. In two starts against the Orediggers, Brill is 32-of-52 for 657 yards and eight touchdowns.

Gardiner led the Ichabods in receiving yards with 128 and six receptions with the two touchdowns and Sissom finished with four receptions for 93 yards.

On the ground, Washburn's Trent Hearn had 22 carries for 99 yards.

Defensively, Washburn's redshirt freshman linebacker Zach Watkins had 11 tackles including six solo stops with a tackle for loss. Senior linebacker Aaron Neal had nine stops. Willams had two interceptions for the Ichabods and three pass breakups.
