Ichabods vs Hornets The Game . . .

It's Homecoming 2006 as the Washburn Ichabods play host to the Emporia State Hornets in the 103rd edition of the Turnpike Tussle. The Ichabods enter the game with a 4-4 overall record and a 3-3 mark in the MIAA. The Hornets are 3-5 and 2-4 in the MIAA. The Washburn/Emporia State series is the currently the longest running rivalry in NCAA Division II football:

The Coaches . . .

Washburn head football coach Graig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001. Schurig is 29-25 (.569) in his fifth season as the Ichabod head coach and he is 22-19 (.579) against the MIAA. He led the Ichabods their first MIAA title since joining the league and the first conference title since the Ichabods won the CSIC in 1983 this past season. He was the 2005 MIAA Coach of the Year after leading the Ichabods to their first NCAA Playoffs and MIAA Championship. (complete bio on page 2 of notes)

Emporia State head coach Dave Wiemers is 35-29 in his sixth year of guiding the Hornets. The 1990 Washburn graduate was named Wilson/MIAA Coach of the Year in 2003 after guiding ESU to their first MIAA championship and a spot in the NCAA playoffs.

Ichabods last time out . . .

The Ichabods last time out - Truman 21, Washburn 7:

(Oct. 21) KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – The Ichabods turned the ball over on six of their seven second-half possessions, setting up two Truman touchdowns as Washburn lost 21-7 to the Bulldogs on a wet afternoon at Stokes Stadium Saturday. The Ichabods had their record evened at 4-4 overall and 3-3 in the MIAA as they lost their third straight while TSU went to 4-4 and 4-2.

The Ichabods kept the ball on the ground for most of the day with Trent Hearn, Ra'Shawn Mosley and Brandon Walker each rushing for over 50 yards. Mosley had the lone WU touchdown on a five-yard run in the first quarter. Quarterback Beau Wofford, who threw the ball just once in the first half, was 3-for-7 for 19 yards and an interception.

Truman scored first on a short rush from Mickey Masucci. WU had to punt on its next possession and then got the ball back as Fletcher Terrell recovered a TSU fumble on the return. Starting on the Truman 12-yard line, Mosley carried the ball three straight times to get the score.

The Ichabods fumbled on the opening drive in the second half and TSU's Terry Chandler returned it 30 yards for a touchdown to break the 7-7 tie. The Ichabods

Missouri Western 21, Emporia State 6 - Oct. 21, 2006

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. - The Emporia State football team blocked a field goal that turned into a Missouri Western touchdown and gave the Griffons a 7-6 lead on the way to a 24-12 Griffon victory on Saturday in St. Joseph, Mo. Seville Ko gave the Hornets a 6-0 lead following the first of four blocked kicks by ESU. The snap on the extra point was high keeping the lead at six. Jake Richter blocked a MWSU punt from the Griffon 27 yard line to set up a two play, two yard drive for the Hornets. ESU's Alex Otoo intercepted a Western pass in the endzone to thwart a Griffon scoring drive in the first quarter. MWSU had a chance to put points on the board at the end of the half, before Richter blocked a 20 yard field goal attempt to send the Hornets into the half up 6-0. Brandon Stribling blocked a Griffon field goal attempt with 6:18 left in the third that MWSU picked up and threw into the end zone for a 7-6 lead. MWSU went up 10-6 on a 35 yard field goal with 9.4 seconds left in the third and then went up 17-6 with 10:47 remaining in the game on a Jeremiah White touchdown. The Griffons went up 24-6 on a Matt Landess pass to Jarrett Brooks with 3:02 left. The Hornets got their final points on a two yard pass from Ben

lchabod head coach Craig Schurig

Entering his fifth seasons as the Ichabods' head coach, Washburn head coach Craig Schurig has led the Washburn football program to a 29-25 (.569) overall record and a 22-19 (.579) record in the MTAA

The Schurig-led Ichabods built on the momentum of the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl Championship to their first NCAA Playoff appearance as well as Washburn earning their first MIAA Championship in 2005. Schurig earned the MIAA's Coach of the Year for his efforts leading the Ichabods in 2005. The conference championship was the first by the Ichabods since the 1983 season. He was also named the AFCA's Region 3 Coach of the Year.

Washburn finished the 2005 season with a school-record nine wins and a 7-1 mark in conference play.

The 2004 season saw the Ichabods record their first winning season since 1999 and their first postseason win since 1986 with a 36-33 win over Northern State in the Mineral Water Bowl.

Schurig was named the Ichabod head coach on

Dec. 28, 2001 after coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program. Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.

In his four seasons at Washburn, the Ichabods have had three All-American selections, two MIAA Freshman of the Year and 41 players receive all-MIAA honors. He has been equally on task with players in the classroom with 54 Ichabods named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, including two Academic All-Americans.

Schurig, a Willingboro, N.J., native, was a fouryear letterman as a defensive back at Colorado Mines and was selected team captain as a senior. He earned second-team all-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering.

Schurig earned a master's degree in physical education at Pittsburg State in 1996. Craig and his wife, Louisa, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Mitchell and Michael.

Series Notes . . .

Today's meeting is the 103rd in the series between the Ichabods and the Hornets. Emporia State and Washburn have met every year since 1899 with the exception of 1943 through 1945 because of World War II and 1989 and 1990 after Washburn moved to NCAA Division II and the Hornets remained in NAIA until 1991. The teams also played twice during the 1966 season. Emporia State leads the all-time series 51-45-6. The Ichabods have won three of the last four meetings. Last season, the Ichabods napped a seven-game losing streak in Emporia winning 42-14. The Ichabods have won the last two meetings in Topeka.

The series is the most played in NCAA Division II after North Dakota and North Dakota State and South have played 110 times, but not since the 2003 season after North Dakota State has moved up to NCAA I-AA in football. South Dakota and South Dakota State have played 104 times, but not since the 2003 season after South Dakota State moved up to NCAA I-AA in football.

Last Meeting with Emporia State . . .

(Oct. 22, 2005) - EMPORIA, Kan. - The No. 10 Washburn Ichabods tied a school record for single season wins as they improved to 8-1 with a 42-14 win over archrival Emporia State in the 102nd edition of the Turnpike Tussle winning in Emporia for the first time since 1987, snapping a sevengame losing streak at Welch Stadium putting a damper on ESU's homecoming festivities. Washburn improved to 8-1 with the win and 6-0 in the MIAA.

The Ichabods set the tone for the game early as they took the opening drive 80 yards in six plays as Jordan Brill hit Jake Lebahn for a 52-yard touchdown pass.

Another piece of history was written as Trent Hearn rushed for a 42-yard touchdown scamper. It was his 32nd of his career, snapping the school record of 31 held by Brandon Rainer. The drive took only:46 seconds and the Ichabods ran three plays covering 70 yards for the score.

Washburn built a 21-0 lead as Brandon Walker came in at quarterback and carried the ball 27 yards converting a two-play drive as Walker covered all 36 yards on the drive in two carries for the score.

The Hornets got on the board after a 16-play, 79-yard drive, helped impart by a Washburn pass interference penalty in the end zone keeping the ESU drive alive cutting the Ichabod lead to 21-7 at the half.

Emporia State received the kickoff to open the second half, but fumbled the return and the Ichabods Aaron Hicks recovered setting up the short field for Washburn. The Ichabods would score six plays latter as Brill hit Mike Odupitan for the touchdown strike that covered 20 yards to push the Ichabods to a 28-7 lead.

After trading drives, the Ichabods' Eric Lawrence picked off an ESU pass attempt and Brill again hit Odupitan on a 10-yard reception and a 35-7 Ichabod lead with 5:56 left in the third quarter.

On the ensuing ESU drive, Fletcher Terrell intercepted his 14th pass of his career and returned it 66 yards for an Ichabod score putting the Ichabods up 42-7. His 14th interception passed A.C. Poynter on top of the Washburn record book.

The Hornets would add a late touchdown with 2:09 left in the game placing the final score at 42-14.

Hearn finished the day with 60 yards

Ichabods vs ranked opponents . .

The Ichabods are 5-33 vs ranked Division II opponents after their win over No. 4 ranked Pittsburg State on Oct. 1, 2005. The win was the highest win over a ranked opponent since the Ichabods joined the D-II ranks. The win over the then No. 14 ranked Colorado Mines in the 2005 opener was the first win over a ranked team on the road for the Ichabods and the win over then No. 5 Northwest Missouri was the Ichabods' highest win over a ranked opponent on the road. The other two wins over a ranked opponents are Emporia State 34-21, when the Hornets were ranked No. 16 in the nation on Nov. 2, 2002. The other two wins over ranked opponents were both against UCM - on Oct. 17, 1992 when the Ichabods beat 20th-ranked Central Missouri 13-10 in Topeka and on Sept. 16, 2006 when the Ichabods beat the Mules in Warrensburg 14-10.

Under head coach Craig Schurig, the Ichabods are 5-12 against ranked opponents since 2002. They are 4-5 since the 2004 season including a 3-1 record in 2005.

Senior running back Trent Hearn became Washburn's all-time leading rusher passing Dino DeLisa (1983-85) on top of the all-time rushing chart lifting against Central Missouri. He has rushed for 2,992 career yards and has also recorded 46 rushing touchdowns ... with eight more yards he'll become the first Ichabod to rush for at least 3,000 yards in a career ... Hearn also owns the single season record of 1,203 yards set last season ... his 282 points is also tops on the school scoring chart.

Sam Sissom and the receiving charts

• This season, Sissom has snapped the WU all-time receptions with 181 and his 3,150 career receiving yards ... against SBU, Sissom recorded his 39th career TD, breaking the MIAA's career touchdown reception record for all games record held by Northwest Missouri's Jamaica Rector ... Sissom's 3,150 career receiving yards is pushes him into fifth on the all-time chart. He trails ESU's Lester McCoy (1997-2000), who recorded 3,234 needing 84 yards to move into fourth.

Connor Sabel and the kicking charts

• Senior placekicker Connor Sabel has recorded 187 career points, which is tied for fifth on the all-time scoring chart with Brandon Rainer ... the school kick scoring record is 210 held by Chad Todd (1997-2000).

Schurig and the Washburn coaching charts

Fifth-year head coach Craig Schurig enters the season ranked fifth on the school wins chart with 29 ... next on the list is Tony

DeMeo (1994-2001) who recorded 31 in his eight seasons at Washburn.

Ichabods in homecoming games . . .

Today's game will be the Ichabods' second homecoming game of the season after taking on Truman for their homecoming game last time out. The Ichabods have won 16 of their last 22 homecoming matchups played on the road and in Yager Stadium. The Ichabods have won three straight homecoming games in Yager Stadium last falling on Oct. 26, 2002 in double overtime to Missouri Western 34-28.

'Bods and Ends . . .

- Of Sam Sissom's 39 touchdown receptions, Jordan Brill has thrown six of his career 39 to Sissom. Other quarterbacks who have tossed TD's to Sissom are Tyler Schuerman (16 of his career 53), Dustin Hickel (15 of his career 32), Cason Lehman (2 of his career 4).
- The Ichabods are outscoring their opponents 61 to 28 in the third quarter. But they are being outscored in the second quarter 55-45.
- The Ichabods are 22 of 29 in the redzone this season and 20 trips have been converted into touchdowns with two field goals. Ichabod opponents are 19 of 26 in the redzone and they have scored 13 touchdowns with six field goals.
- In addition to needing only eight yards to become the first Ichabod to rush for 3,000 yards in a career, Trent Hearn needs 21 carries to break Dino DeLisa's career rushing attempts mark of 665.

Washburn Athletics Hall of Fame Inductees . . .

Before Saturday's game, the Washburn athletic department will induct four new members into the current 106 of the Washburn Athletic Hall of Fame.

Michael Dritlein, ba '99 Football, 1992-95

Dritlein was a member of the Ichabod football team from 1992-95 and was named Washburn's first football All-American as a member of the NCAA first team Football Gazette honors and second team CoSIDA honors in 1995 after he recorded 1,112 receiving yards as a senior. The same organization also choose him as a first team all-region pick in 1995. Dritlein second team academic All-American honors as a sophomore and as a senior, he was a weekly recipient of the \$25,000 Burger King Scholar Athlete of the Week Award, which endowed a scholarship in his name at Washburn. He was also a three-time all-MIAA Academic pick and a three-time commissioner's academic honor roll member. Dritlein finished his career as WU's career leader in receptions with 170 and in receiving yards with 3,103.

Chris Torrez, ba '96 Softball, 1993-96

Torrez was a member of the Lady Blues softball team from 1993-96 and she received third team All-America honors as an outfielder in 1996. She is the only Lady Blue to receive team MVP honors three times. Torrez is one of two Washburn softball players to receive first team All-MIAA honors three seasons (1994-96) after receiving second team all-MIAA honors as a freshman. She also is a two-time first team all-region selection as a junior and senior. She finished her career as the school leader in career hits (245) and is still atop the career home runs (32), runs batted in (167) and batting average (.398).

Rhonda (Matzke) Flerlage, ba '94, ba '96 Basketball. 1992-94

Matzke was a member of the Lady Blues basketball team from 1992-94 and scored 956 points in two seasons after transferring from Oklahoma. Her point total ranked No. 13 on the all-time scoring chart when her career ended. As a junior, her first season at Washburn, she was named the MIAA's Newcomer of the Year and was a two-time first team all-MIAA selection. Matzke's 81 three-pointers was No. 2 on the career chart when she finished playing. Her career .820 free throw percentage (201-245) is No. 2 on the all-time chart. In 1994, Matzke was a second team academic All-American selection, a first team academic all-region selection, NCAA Kansas Woman of the Year and a two-time All-MIAA Academic team member.

Basketball, 1985-89

Wilson was a member of the Ichabod basketball team from 1985-89. He finished his career fourth on the all-time point chart with 1,321 and fourth on the rebounding list with 569. Both those totals rank seventh on today's charts. Wilson played in 135 games at Washburn, which is the second most a player has played in school history. He currently ranks fifth in field goal attempts (1,106), tied for sixth in field goals made (514), seventh in free throws made (290) and eighth in free throws attempted (407). He was a first team all-CSIC selection in 1988.

Up next . . .

The Ichabods will hit the road for the final time during the regular season as they travel to Joplin, Mo., on Nov. 4 to take on Missouri Southern at 2 p.m. before returning home for senior day on Nov. 11 against Missouri Western at 1 p.m. in Yager Stadium.



TOPEKA, Kan. - Junior quarterback Jordan Brill passed for 309 yards and tied his career high with five touchdown passes in the win completing 18 of 27 passes as the No. 16 ranked Washburn Ichabods opened the 2006 season with a 41-21 win over the Colorado School of Mines in front of 6,156 people in Yager Stadium.

Washburn won the opening toss and marched 69 yards in five plays as Brill hooked up with senior wide receiver Sam Sissom for a 12-yard touchdown pass. The reception gave Sissom 37 for his career, one shy of the MIAA's career all-game record of 38 held by Jamaica Rector (Northwest Missouri).

On the Orediggers first possession of the game, they marched down to the Ichabod 4-yard line, but the Ichabod defense stopped them on four plays, including two

inside the 1-yard line. Washburn took the ball and marched 95 yards on 13 plays as Brill found senior wide receiver Aaron Gardiner for a 25-yard touchdown strike putting the Ichabods up 14-0 with 33 seconds left in the first quarter.

After forcing a three-and-out for the Orediggers, junior wide receiver Jake Lebahn hooked up with Brill for a 17-yard touchdown reception capping a three-play, 22 yard drive set up by Sissom's 36-yard punt return into Oredigger territory.

Connor Sabel added a 36-yard field goal at the 6:16 mark of the second quarter after freshman linebacker Michael Krajicek picked off a Garrett Mehl pass at the Mines' 45 yard line.

On their next possession, Mines scored their first points as Mehl hit Derek Dyktra on a 16-yard touchdown reception, but the extra point attempt was blocked by senior defensive tackle Trey Lewis cutting the Washburn lead to 24-6.

Gardiner recorded his second touchdown pass of the afternoon with the only points of the third quarter as Brill hit him on a seven yard touchdown reception pushing the Washburn lead to 31-14.

In the fourth quarter, both teams traded punts and Sabel connected on a 38-yard field goal with 12:05 left in the game.

The Orediggers capped a 68yard drive as Mehl rushed 33 yards down the sideline to once again cut the Washburn lead to two scores at 34-21. After a Washburn punt by Ben Boswell that was downed at the CSM 1yard line, junior cornerback Cary Williams picked off a Mehl pass and returned it to the Orediggers'

30 yard line. Four plays latter, Brill tossed his fifth touchdown pass of the afternoon to junior tight end Ben Ramsey on a 3-yard connection, wrapping the scoring at 41-21.

Brill's 309 yard passing performance was his third of his Washburn career and his second highest total following a 348 yard outing against the Orediggers and a 328 yard day against Central Washington last season. In two starts against the Orediggers, Brill is 32-of-52 for 657 yards and eight touchdowns.

Gardiner led the Ichabods in receiving yards with 128 and six receptions with the two touchdowns and Sissom finished with four receptions for 93 yards.

On the ground, Washburn's Trent Hearn had 22 carries for

Defensively, Washburn's redshirt freshman linebacker Zach Watkins had 11 tackles including six solo stops with a tackle for loss. Senior linebacker Aaron Neal had nine stops. Willams had two interceptions for the Ichabods and three pass breakups.

WARRENSBURG, Mo. - The No. 25 ranked Washburn Ichabods won for the first time in Warrensburg since Oct. 7, 1995 in a 14-10 win over No. 19 Central Missouri. With the win, Washburn improved to 2-1 on the season and 1-0 in the MIAA.

Washburn opened the scoring on their second drive as Trent Hearn scored from 2-yards out at the 9:17 mark of the second quarter capping a 13-play, 70-yard drive. On the drive, Hearn became Washburn's all-time leading rusher on a second and seven from the Central 20 as he picked up the first down and passed Dino DeLisa (1983-85) with he picked up is 2,795th yard. Hearn would finish the day with 46 yards on 13 carries and two touchdown rushes.

UCM came back on the next drive with an eight-play, 63-yard series that was wrapped up by a 19-yard Toby Korrodi touchdown pass to Matt Jacobsen. Korrodi came back to guide

the drive after getting shaken up in the first quarter. Mike Spiegel pulled double duty, playing quarterback and wide receiver. Both teams had one more drive in the half, but nobody could score, going into the break tied 7-7.

The Ichabod defense came up big on the first drive of the second half as UCM drove down to the Washburn 12-yard line, but a Washburn sack by Cody Huenefeld pushed UCM back to the Washburn 22 forcing a fourth and 15. UCM faked the field goal and Ted Maxwell stepped out of bounds before converting the fourth down conversion attempt.

After Washburn took possession and went three-and-out, Ben Boswell bombed a 70-yard punt pushing UCM back to their own 12 yard line. Again UCM drove down to the Washburn redzone and eventually to the 1-yard line, but the Ichabods stopped the Mules on a third and goal from the one and then a Spencer Webb field goal attempt from 17-yards hit the left upright.

Washburn took over and had two more snaps in the third quarter as they had only five plays in the third quarter. Washburn's drive continued into the fourth quarter and they marched 80-yards in eight plays in 2:08 as the Ichabods converted two third down opportunities – both on pass receptions to Jake Lebahn to take a 14-7 lead.

After trading punts, UCM took a short field and converted a 44-yard field goal with 4:25 remaining in the game cutting the Washburn lead to 14-10.

Washburn went three and out and Boswell blasted a 51-yard punt to the UCM 18 which was downed by the Ichabods' special teams.

UCM's Korrodi was called for an intentional grounding on their first play as they took possession with two minutes

remaining. After two incomplete passes to set up a fourth and 22 from their own 6-yard line, his final pass to Mike Spiegel was overthrowned and Washburn took possession at the UCM 6, but Jordan Brill took three straight knees to wrap up the game and the win for the Ichabods.

Ra'Shawn Mosley, seeing his first action this season after suffering an ankle injury, rushed for 77 yards. Hearn finished with 46 raising his WU record total to 2,810 yards.

HAYS, Kan. - The No. 22 ranked Washburn Ichabods moved to 2-0 in the MIAA and 3-1 overall with a 37-7 win over Fort Hays State. In the win, senior wide receiver Sam Sissom became Washburn's all-time career receptions leader with five and tied the MIAA record for touchdown receptions with his 38th. Washburn will play their first game at home since their opener on Sept. 2 this Saturday, Sept. 30 against Southwest Baptist at 1 p.m. inside Yager Stadium.

Placekicker Connor Sa-

bel opened the scoring for the Ichabods with a 25-yard field goal at the 2:54 mark of the first quarter. After forcing a Tiger three-and-out, the Ichabods' Jordan Brill hooked up with Jake Lebahn for a 40-yard touchdown pass to put Washburn up 10-0.

On the Tigers' next possession, Washburn's Jarod Tetuan picked off a deflected pass setting up a five-play, 32 yard scoring drive capped by Brandon Walker's 14-yard run around the right side putting the Ichabods up 17-0.

The Tigers jumped on the board on a 1-yard run by Jordan Hickel finishing off a 61-yard

drive as neither team would score the rest of the way as Washburn led 17-7 at the break.

In the second half, Washburn added two more Brill touchdown passes. One on a 16-yard pass to Ben Ramsey with 5:56 remaining in the third quarter and the other to Sissom on an 11-yard strike tying Northwest Missouri's Jamaica Rector for the MIAA's all-game career touchdown reception record. Sandwiched between the two touchdown

passes was a 5-yard run by Ra'Shawn Mosley.

Mosley led the Ichabods with 63 yards on the ground on 13 carries while Brill finished 13 for 24 for 162 yards and three touchdowns. Sissom finished with five receptions for 63 yards.

Defensively, Zach Watkins and Trey Lewis each had eight tackles to lead the Ichabods.

The Ichabods held the Tigers to nine first downs and 163 yards in total offense and an average of 2.4 yards per play. The Washburn defense also held the Tigers to 1 of 17 on third down conversions.

SBU's Robert Woodson cut the lead to 14-10 after he caught a 49-yard pass from John McCoy at the 1:41 mark of the first quarter. After one quarter, the Washburn defense held SBU (0-5, 0-3 MIAA) to -2 yards rushing.

In the second quarter, Washburn rolled off two straight rushing touchdowns via Ra'Shawn Mosley's 11-yard carry at the 7:29 mark and Trent Hearn's 3-yard dive with 4:33 remaining in the second quarter as the Ichabods took a 28-17 lead into the break.

To begin the second quarter, Washburn's Aaron Neal

picked off a Robert Clardy pass and returned it 74-yards for a touchdown putting the Ichabods up 35-17. On SBU's next possession, Washburn's Zach Watkins recovered a fumble and two plays later Mosley scampered 40-yards for a score putting the Ichabods up 42-17.

TOPEKA - Zach Watkins returned a fumble 72 yards late in the fourth quarter to pull the Ichabods within five points of No. 2 Northwest Missouri State but came up short after the Bearcats ran the clock out and handed Washburn a 31-26 loss Saturday afternoon in front of 6,103 at Yager Stadium. Washburn fell to 4-3 and 3-2 in the MIAA while NWMSU stayed perfect at 7-0 and 5-0.

Beau Wofford, starting in his first game in place of injured Jordan Brill, was 5-of-12 for 69 yards in just his third game. Ra'Shawn Mosley was the leading rusher with 94 yards and a touchdown in 10 carries while Trent Hearn ran for 33 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Aaron Gardiner had 57 receiving yards in three catches.

After the Ichabods went three and out in their opening drive, the Bearcats had a 10-play, 87 yard drive that ended when quarterback Josh Mathews hit Mike Peterson on a 14-yard touchdown pass.

Washburn answered that score right away with a 53-yard run from Mosley, his firth touchdown of the year and longest rush. After a bad snap on the extra point attempt, holder Jarod Tetuan was tackled as he tried to get the ball in, making the score 7-6 NWMSU after a quarter.

The Bearcats scored two touchdowns to start the second quarter and then the Ichabods pulled to within 21-13 at halftime. Trent Hearn found a hole on the left side and darted in for a 28-yard touchdown, his seventh of the year.

Northwest Missouri State scored to open the sec-

ond half but then threw interceptions on its next two drives. Adam Ewy picked off the first one at the NWMSU 26-yard line that set up a one-yard touchdown run for Hearn. The Ichabods could have closed the gap to eight points, but Connor Sabel missed his first extra-point attempt in 82 tries, making the score 28-19 with 4:35 left in the third quarter.

Tetuan then picked off a Mathews pass on the next Bearcat possession but the Ichabods offense couldn't capitalize on the turnover.

In the fourth quarter the Bearcats hit a 40-yard field goal to take a 12point lead. Later they had

the ball with under two minutes to go looking like they could hold on for a victory. Bruce Ringwood sacked Mathews at the Washburn 28 yard-line, forcing a fumble that Watkins returned 72 yards for the score with 1:53 left in the game. Sable's extra point was good but his onside kick attempt only went eight yards to his left before it bounced out of bounds.

The Bearcats got a first down on three rushes and then ran out the rest of the clock.

Ringwood and Aaron Neal led WU on defense with 12 tackles each. Ringwood had a pair of sacks while Ewy and Zach Watkins each had one.

The Bearcats had 25 first downs and allowed WU only eight. The Ichabods were able to stay in the game by taking advantage of two interceptions and a fumble.


