2005-06 Washburn Basketball -- 3-time defending MIAA Champions

Head Coach Bob Chipman

Bob Chipman, one of college basketball's winningest coaches, begins his 27th season at the helm of the Ichabod basketball program.

Chipman, the all-time winningest coach in Washburn University's basketball history, enters the season with a career record of 612-206 (.748).

With the Ichabods' 82-62 win over Southwest Baptist on Jan. 19, 2005 Chipman became the tenth coach in Division II to reach 600 wins. Chipman enters this season ranked fifth in victories and sixth by winning percentage among active NCAA Division II coaches. He is eighth in all-time winning percentage and coaching wins, in winning percentage, and 12th in all-time Division II victories.

Chipman has guided his teams to 22 20-win seasons, including seven in a row from 1983-84 to 1989-90, and four in a row from 1991-92 to 1994-95 and seven in a row from 1998-99 to 2004-05. Chipman's teams have made 13 national tournament appearances, nine in the NCAA and four in the NAIA. His teams have averaged 24 wins a year. Coach Chipman has never seen a losing season.

Chipman joined the Washburn staff in 1976 as an assistant to longtime head coach Glenn Cafer. He served as assistant coach for three seasons, in addition to being an associate professor of physical education, softball and men's tennis coach, and facilities coordinator. Chipman was promoted to head coach in April 1979 when Cafer was appointed director of athletics. Chipman enjoyed a banner season in 1986-87, capping a 35-4 campaign with an NAIA national championship crown. A 90-59 win over Marymount that season gave him career victory No. 173, making him the winningest coach in Washburn history. Chipman was well-recognized for his accomplishments, garnering conference, district, area and national coach of the year honors.

In addition to the coaching awards obtained after the 1986-87 season, Chipman was named MIAA coach of the year following the 1992, 1993 and 2004 seasons. He was named Kodak district coach of the year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) in 1993 and the men's four-year coach of the year by the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association (KBCA) in 1994 and 2001.

His success at the collegiate level has brought Chipman the opportunity to coach on an international level as well. He served a second stint as an assistant coach for the U.S. entry in the Pan American Games during the summer of 1991, earning a bronze medal. In 1983, he was an assistant to the team that won the gold medal. He helped coach the U.S. entry in the World University Games to a gold medal in 1989. In 1985, he was an assistant coach for the Amateur Basketball Association/USA Jones Cup Team that won a silver medal. Chipman holds both bachelor's and master's degrees from Kansas State University.

Chipman has always looked to Kansas basketball players first as evident from the six Kansas players on this year's roster. In his 24 years as the Ichabod's head coach, he has spent more than \$1 million in scholarship money for basketball players from the Sunflower State.

The 1973 graduate earned two letters as a guard while playing for Wildcat coaching legend Jack Hartman. He played his first two seasons of college ball at Flint Community Junior College, in his hometown of Flint, Mich.

Chipman and his wife, Carol, live in Topeka with their children, Kelsey and Bobby.

ICHABODS LAST TIME OUT . . .

Nov. 22, 2005 • Washburn 94, Ottawa 69

The Washburn Ichabods pulled away from a three-point half-time lead to a 25-point win over Ottawa in the Lee Arena home opener. Rashad Adams led five Ichabods in double figures with 16 points, scoring all his points in the second half. Also in double figures for the Ichabods were Kris Milburn with 15, while Kyle Fisher and Brady Sisk each had 13. J.B. Murray scored 10. The Ichabods held Ottawa to 32 percent shooting in the second half. The Ichabods outrebounded the Braves 47 to 37.

KNOW THE FOES . . .

Sterling is 3-3 this season after topping Newman on Tuesday night in Wichita 53-49. The Warriors are coached by Tommy DeSalme who is 36-27 in his fourth season as Sterling's head coach.

Southeastern Oklahoma is 1-0 this season after topping Ouchita Baptist 67-51 in their opener on Tuesday. Eric Babers had 21 points and seven rebounds to lead the Savages to the win. Jason Stampley had 16 as SOSU hit 24 of 33 free throw attempts compared to 5 of 8 for Ouchita Baptist. The Savages are coached by Tony Robinson, the SOSU alum is 195-193 in his 15th season as the head coach. Last season he led SOSU to a 17-11 record and a 6-6 record in the north division.

SERIES NOTES . . .

The Ichabods lead the all-time series with Sterling 6-0. The Ichabods won last season in Lee Arena 92-43. The largest win for the Ichabods in the series was a 95-43 win on Jan. 22, 1983.

Washburn and Southeastern Oklahoma have never met.

THE ICHABODS IN THE HOLIDAY CLASSIC . . .

In 13 years of hosting the holiday classic, the Ichabods are 30-2 with the two losses coming in the finals of the 1988 finals when they fell to David Lipscomb 98-89 and to Metro State 74-73 in the 2001 finals.
