

The 2006-07 Washburn University Men's Baskethall Media Guide is intended to provide information for writers, broadcasters, sports editors, sports information personnel and fans who follow the Ichabods. Material in the guide was current as of the printing deadline of Oct. 18, 2006. Additional information is available in the Washburn Sports Information Office and through weekly releases available to personnel from accredited media outlets covering the Ichabods.

Washburn University is in Topeka, Kan., at the intersection of 21st Street and Washburn Avenue. Lee Arena is located in the Petro Allied Health Center at the east edge of the Washburn campus. Parking for the facility is adjacent to Washburn Avenue.

The Washburn University Sports Information Office is located in room 200 of the Petro Allied Health Center. Office hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Media credentials are available to personnel from accredited media outlets by contacting Jeremy Wangler, Assistant Sports Information Director, Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas, 66621. Credentials are available 60 minutes before tipoff at the Will Call window at the southeast entrance of Lee Arena. All media seating in the Lee Arena press box is reserved on a game-by-game basis and space is limited. Please contact the Sports Information Office at least four days before the game date to ensure a seat in the press box.

Radio stations wishing to broadcast from Lee Arena should make broadcast requests through the Sports Information Office at

least one week prior. One courtesy line will be made available to the official station of each visiting team. Additional stations wishing to broadcast must install their own line. AM 580 WIBW and Country Legends 106.9 FM are the official broadcast stations of the Washburn Ichabods.

Ethernet and wireless internet connections are available in the press, as well as telephone lines. Instructions are provided in the press box to connect to the Washburn network.

Media services include a game program and lineups, plus statistics and game notes for each team. Halftime stats are provided as well as individual and team stats and a play-by-play summary. Statistics are kept on the Automated Scorebook computer system. Pizza and refreshments are available before each game.

Postgame interviews with Coach Bob Chipman are available to media personnel after his brief meeting with the team immediately following the game. Players will be brought, by request, to Lee Arena press box or made available outside the locker room.

Ichabods on the World Wide Web

Starting in 2006-07, all Washburn Ichabods and Lady Blues home MIAA games will be shown on a live webcast. Fans can catch the action by logging on to www.wusports.com from anywhere in the world. Along with the live webcast, live stats, and live streaming of the radio broadcast can be found there.

www.wusports.com is also the home for scores, schedules, stats, rosters and game stories from all Washburn sports.

Ichabods on Radio

Washburn Basketball games will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on either AM580 WIBW or Country Legends 106.9 FM. Bruce Steinbrock is the play-by-play voice of the Ichabods and Lady Blues basketball squads and former Ichabod quarterback and assistant coach, Mark Elliott, will provide color commentary.

The AM580 signal has a signal strength of six states.

With four players returning with starting experience, including their leading scorer, the Ichabods will enter 2006-07 hoping they can put last year behind them and return to the glory days of Washburn basketball.

Last year's 10-16 record marked the first losing season since 1976-77 and the first of head coach Bob Chipman's 27-year career. Coming into the season, the Ichabods had won three straight MIAA titles and had been to the NCAA tournament four of the last five years. Their 4-12 conference record last year kept them out of the postseason for the first time since joining the MIAA and NCAA II in 1989-90.

Bringing back seven letterwinners and two redshirts and adding six newcomers, the Ichabods will hope that 2006-07 can be a year to build themselves back into a championship contender in the conference, region and nation. And with just one player returning as a senior, Washburn will look to remain strong for years to come.

Another positive the Ichabods have entering the new season is that they have already played together as a team. Chipman, an experienced world traveler, brought the 'Bods on a 10-day summer trip to China. As the Ichabods experienced the country with a mix of ancient history and Western modernization they managed to win four games against Chinese universities by an average of 50 points, outscoring them 107-57. The last time Chipman took his team overseas, they visited Paris, France, and played in the NCAA II national title game later that season.

The Guards

Junior **Andrew Meile** comes back for his third year as the only returning starter at guard. Joining him is **Kyle Fisher**, the lone returning senior.



Junior Brady Sisk led Washburn last year with 14.4 points per game and 5.7 rebounds per game. In 23 games played he reached double figures 17 times.

Meile averaged 8.6 points per game last year with 4.5 rebounds and 2.8 assists. He reached double figures 10 times and had a career-high of 20 against Central Missouri.

Though he only started seven games last year, Fisher started all four in China and he will enter the year looking to keep that starting spot. During his junior year he averaged 5.1 points per game and 1.8 rebounds. He reached double figures three times and a had a career-high 14 points against Newman.

Adam Head will look for his first action as an Ichabod after redshirting last year. He will be a sophomore after playing one year at Barton County Community College.

The coaching staff also brought four transfers and one freshman into the guard mix with this year's class of recruits. Division I transfer **Michael Williams** comes to Washburn after a year at Northern Iowa and two years at Hutchinson Community College. Williams played in 19 games at UNI as the Panthers went 23-10 and made it to the NCAA tournament. Topeka native **Reed Hein** will return to his hometown after a two-year stint at Cloud County Community College. He set a school record for the T-Birds with 95 single-season 3-pointers. Also look-

ing to get playing time at guard will be **Sergio Negrin**, a transfer from Clearwater Christian (Fla.) who averaged 19.7 points per game, eight assists and four steals in two years as he earned NCCAA All-America honors. **Grant Hargett** will look for time at guard after two years at Kirkwood Community College (Iowa). He helped KCC to two national runner-up performances and averaged 9.4 points per game last year. **Garrett Love**, one of just two Ichabods directly from high school, is coming off a senior season in which he scored 20.5 points per game and 8.4 rebounds.

The Forwards

Junior **Brady Sisk** returns after leading the Ichabods and finishing eighth in the MIAA with 14.4 points per game. He was also 10th in the league with 5.7 rebounds per game. Sisk started 13 of the 23 games he played in and reached double figures in 17 of those games, passing the 20-point mark six times. Also returning with starting experience as a forward is junior **Dylan Channel**, Washburn's second leading returning scorer with 10.1 points per game last year. The all-MIAA honorable mention pick reached double figures 14 times.

Returning for his sophomore season is forward **Paul Byers**. Playing all 26 games with 19 starts, he led the Ichabods last year with 31 blocks, the seventh highest single-season total at WU and 14th highest career total. He can

get near the Washburn top-five with a repeat performance this year. Junior **Kyle Snyder** will return after getting a medical redshirt last year. In his career he is averaging 3.4 points per game and 3.3 rebounds. He has seven career double-figure scoring games and one double-double. **Moriba DeCoteau** will return after seeing limited action with 13 points in 17 games. He did have a strong outing in China as he averaged 7.5 points per game with 8.0 rebounds. He also blocked four shots and had five steals.

Two others will look to make their Ichabod debuts this year. **Frank Phifer**, a transfer from Kentucky Wesleyan who missed last year at WU with a preseason injury, averaged 12.0 points in four games in China with a team-leading 10 blocks. **Jake Carter** joins the 'Bods out of high school where he earned all-state honors and averaged 16 points in his career. He will be the tallest Ichabod to take the court this year at 6-10.

The Schedule

Chipman did not cut his team any slack when setting the schedule this year. After opening the season with exhibitions against instate Division I opponents Kansas and Kansas State, Washburn will host Kansas Wesleyan, the only NAIA team on the schedule, in the season opener.

Following that the Ichabods will play in a four-team tournament at Eastern New Mexico. Fort Hays State, the newest member of the MIAA, will play WU in a non-conference game before the two square up two more times later in the year.

After that tournament the Ichabods will play at Division I Nevada-Las Vegas in a regular season game. Last year Washburn traveled to UNLV for an exhibition game, but this year it will count.

WU will play five more non-conference games, including a home-and-away series with Cameron, before finishing up with MIAA teams. March 1 marks the tip-off of the MIAA Postseason Tournament in Kansas City, Mo., and then the NCAA tournament begins March 10.

Wrapping it All Up

If the Ichabods can find a consistent starting five, keep them healthy and have the ability to go deep into their bench late in their games they can contend for a top spot in the MIAA and have another chance at the NCAA tournament. Last year the Ichabods started 11 different players and used nine different starting lineups. Their best combination managed just three wins.

Washburn returns seven letterwinners, including four with a lot of starting experience. If the Ichabods can build off that experience while the newcomers mesh into the system then the 'Bods will return to the type of basketball fans are used to.
