On Dec. 23, 2002, Tim Collins was named the first head coach in Lady Blues soccer history and, he brings the experience and winning traditions from the high school ranks to the Washburn campus.

Collins led the Lady Blues to a 4-13-1 record in his first season as Washburn's head coach.

Collins previously coached the Seaman boys team to a fourth-place 5A state finish and a Regional Championship after finishing second in the Centennial League race. Before coaching at Seaman, Collins headed the boys and girls programs at Topeka West High School for 10 years. In 2001, he coached the girls' program to the Class 5A State Championship. He also coached Charger teams to seven regional championships, two tournament championships and two state finalists. He was named the Topeka City Coach of the Year four times and the Kansas Coach of the Year once.

Since 1995 Collins has been the girls director of coaching for the Kansas State Olympic Development Program organizing tryouts and managing camps. Collins also has his National Class "A" Coaching

License.

Collins is a 1991 graduate Ottawa University where he was a four-year letterwinner for the Braves' soccer team. He was the team's MVP and captain his iunior and senior seasons while garnering first team all-conference and all-district accolades. Collins and his wife, Tina, have two boys Nico and CJ.
