As the Washburn Lady Blues enter their third year of existence, there is a great confidence among those in the program who have seen the improvement the team has undergone in the last two seasons.

From year No. 1 to year No. 2, the Lady Blues improved from eighth place in the MIAA to fifth place in 2004 and with lineup the Lady Blues have returning, coupled with what could be the best overall recruiting class the team has seen, the third year could be a charm for the Lady Blues.

"We're excited about the upcoming year," head coach Tim Collins said. "We do have a solid group of returners, but we also believe our newcomers will all contribute to the team not only this season, but for the next four years to come and help us push our program up the ranks in the MIAA and in the national rankings."

## The Returners

The Lady Blues return 10 letterwinners off of last season's team that went 5-11-3 overall and 3-9-2 in the MIAA. Headlining the group is a quartet of juniors who all earned MIAA honors last season. Defender Meagan Horvath and midfielder Lauren Schwindt each were named second team All-MIAA and forward Jenna Lawless and goalkeeper Jenna Hatlestad were tabbed as honorable mention All-MIAA picks.

Lawless was the Lady Blues' leading scorer last season after she recorded 19 total points with team highs with seven goals and five assists. Schwindt, after making transferring from Louisiana-Lafayette, scored five goals recording 14 total points.

On the defensive side, Horvath scored two goals with two assists from her defender position after moving from midfielder after her freshman season. The two-time Lady Blues Most Valuable Player will again captain a Lady Blues defense. In goal, Hatlestad started all 19 games playing every minute of the season tallying a 2.04 goals against average while setting a MIAA record with 160 saves on the season with a save percentage of .800. She also recorded two shutouts as a sophomore – the first two in Lady Blues history.

"We can continue to build around these four, but they all going to have to step their game up and continue to improve so we can build the program to where we want to be," Collins said.

Also returning is the team's second leading scorer in junior Jolene Silovsky, who finished second on the team with six goals while starting all 19 games at a midfielder's position.

A pair of juniors, Amanda Geist and Anna Fahey, return at the midfielder's positions along with sopho-

more McKinley Rainen. The defense has a pair of juniors returning in Erica Schmidt and Erica Painting.

## The Newcomers

The Lady Blues will have seven newcomers for the upcoming season. Of the seven newcomers are five freshmen, they will be joined by a senior and a sophomore rounding out the new faces on the team.

The five freshmen are Lisa Fahey, Traci Nigg, Kaydi Hooker, Lisa Coleman and Jessica Mainz. Fahey was a first team All-league and All-district pick as a senior. Nigg was a three-time first team All-State pick. Hooker was named Wyoming's Soccer Player of the Year after leading her team to the state championship. Coleman, who played tennis at Johnson County for two seasons before transferring to play both soccer and tennis at Washburn, was an All-league and All-city pick. Mainz was an All-State, All-region, All-league and All-city pick as a senior.

Another newcomer, senior Lora Westling, has spent the last four seasons on the Lady Blues basketball court where she finished her career as the school's all-time leading 3-point shooter. Westling, who practiced with the soccer team after leading the basketball squad to a NCAA National Championship, was heavily recruited out of high school to play soccer after earning All-state honors.

The Lady Blues have a Division I transfer goalkeeper for the second straight season in sophomore Ryann Werner. Werner played one season as Wisconsin-Green Bay recording a 1.91 goal against average playing in eight matches.

"With the exception of Lora because she will only play for one season, I expect these newcomers to be the ones who will help take the team to a new level and improve our team building it to new heights," Collins said.

## The MIAA

The Washburn Lady Blues were picked sixth in the MIAA Coaches Poll that was released by the MIAA Offices.

"The conference race will be tough," Collins said. "But with the improvements we have made to the team, we look forward to competing against the schools in the MIAA."

Is the only Lady Blues soccer player to start all 37 games in the program's history ... is tied for the school's leader in assists and ranks second on career goals (7) and points (20) charts ... her 67 shots is tops on the career chart ... moved from midfielder to defender to start sophomore season ... a three year captain of the Lady Blues.

### As a SOPHOMORE IN 2004

Earned second team All-MIAA Honors as a defender ... started all 19 games recording two goals and two assists ... named team MVP for the second straight season ... scored the only penalty kick goal in Lady Blues history against Emporia State on Oct. 6 ... her five points against Emporia State tied a school record after she added another goal and an assist against the Hornets ... named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll.

### As a FRESHMAN IN 2003

Scored the first goal in Lady Blues history on Sept. 3 against Ottawa ... recored at least one point in three straight matches from Oct. 12 to Oct. 18 recording six points in those matches with two goals and two assists ... had two unassisted goals and a team-high 22 shots on goal ... led the team with four assists and was second on the squad with five goals ... named honorable mention All-MIAA and team MVP ... her 2.94 shots per match were sixth in the MIAA and .22 assists per match were tenth.
