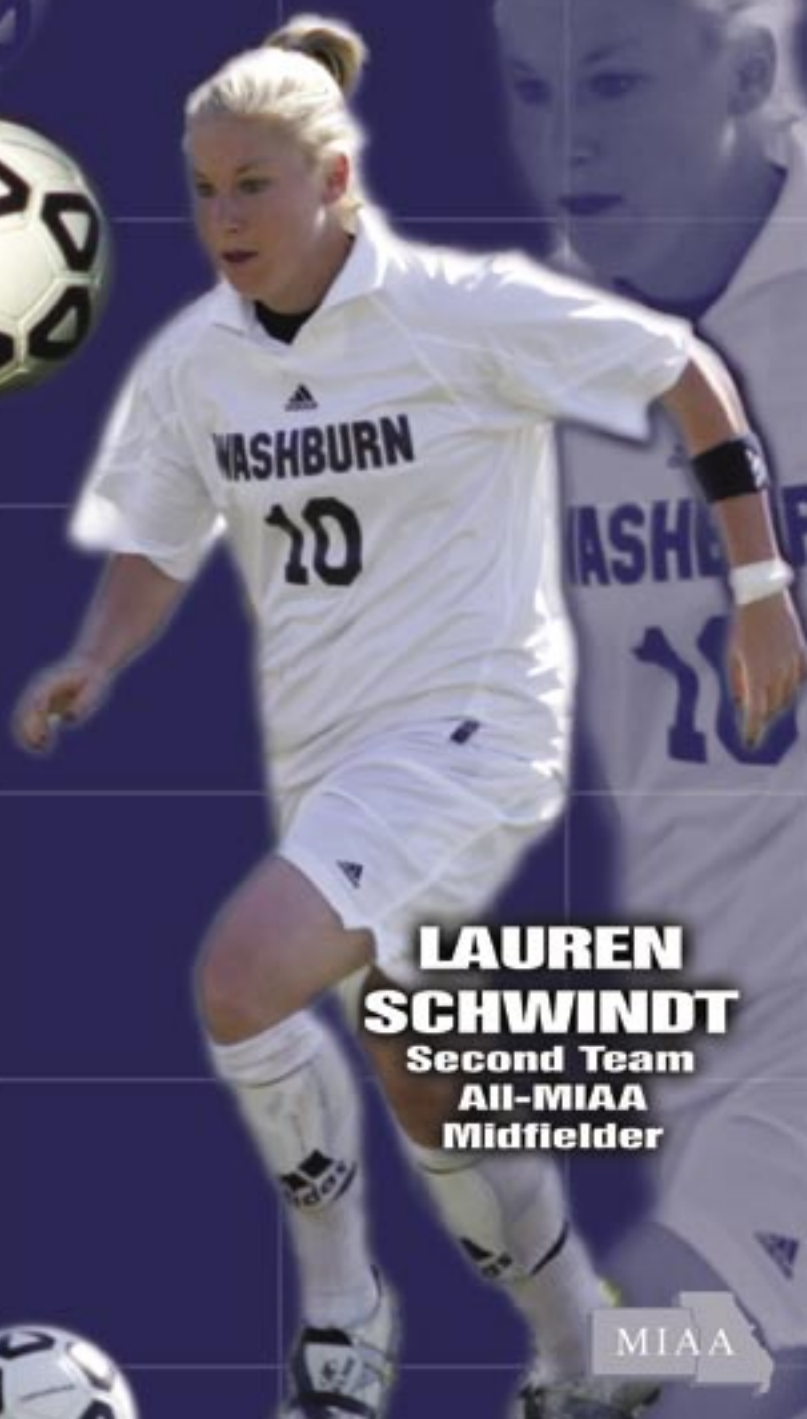

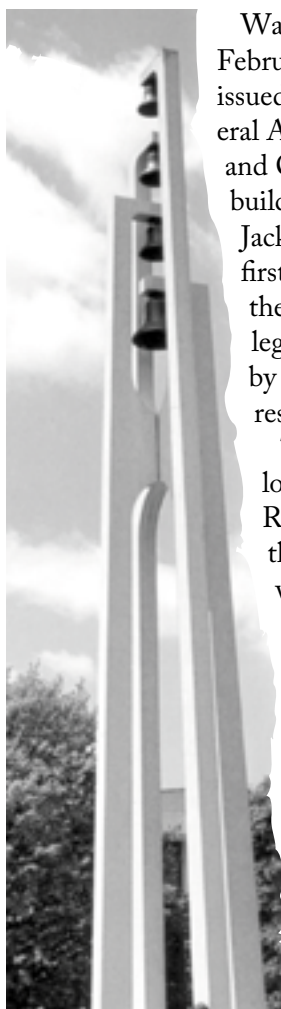

Washburn University was established in February 1865 as Lincoln College by a charter issued by the State of Kansas and the General Association of Congregational Ministers and Churches of Kansas. A two-story brick building on the northeast corner of 10th and Jackson Streets was soon erected and the first classes began in January 1866. In 1868, the school was renamed Washburn College, in recognition of a \$25,000 donation by Ichabod Washburn, a church deacon and resident of Worcester, Mass.

The university was granted a permanent location in 1865 when Topekan Col. John Ritchie donated a 160-acre site, which at the time was a considerable distance southwest of the city. Construction on the first building began in 1872, with occupancy

taking place in 1874. For the next two decades, college President Peter MacVicar conducted an aggressive development campaign. His efforts resulted in the establishment of numerous Victorian limestone structures which characterized the campus for the next 90 years.

Expansion of the school was constant. The School of Law was organized in 1903, as was a School of Fine Arts and a medical school, which educated physicians until 1913. During the next three decades structures such as the Mulvane Art Museum, Benton Hall and Whiting Field House were added to the campus. In June 1966, a tornado struck Topeka and several historic buildings on campus were demolished. The Washburn community rallied and financial support from friends and alumni made possible the rebuilding of many school facilities during the coming years.





Today, university facilities offer more than one million square feet of modern academic and support space.

In 1941, the citizens of Topeka endorsed Washburn by voting to establish a municipal university, supported in part by the city and governed by a local board of regents.

In 1952, the Washburn Board of Regents officially changed the name of the school to Washburn University of Topeka. In 1999, the university's primary funding was moved from city property tax to county sales tax sources, with the school retaining status as a municipal subdivision of the state.

In addition to local financial support, Washburn has received state funds since 1961, which have been coordinated by the Kansas Board of Regents since 1991. Washburn is governed by its own nine member Board of Regents.

Washburn provides broadly-based liberal arts and professional education through more than 190 certificate, associate, baccalaureate, master's and juris doctor programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Law, Business, Nursing and Applied Studies. Ninety-seven percent of the faculty hold a doctorate or the highest degree available in their discipline.

Loren Ferré became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D. Ferré is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

This past season, Ferré was named the Central Region Athletic Director of the Year.

At Washburn, Ferré has been instrumental in the establishment of a strong Ichabod Club support team and the raising of funds for athletic scholarships.

While at BHSU, Ferré was also director of the Donald E. Young Sports Fitness Center, a 172,000 square foot, \$10.2 million facility. During his Black Hills tenure, the athletics department nearly tripled its outside revenue, including large increases in ticket sales and scholarship funding. All 10 varsity teams won a conference title in his final three years.

Before joining the staff at Black Hills State, Ferré spent 17 years at the University of North Texas. He was the director of the Coliseum (1987-90) and was the associate and assistant director since 1980. He held the post of event coordinator (1978-80).

Ferré is a 1971 graduate of Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of arts degree. He earned a master's in journalism from North Texas in 1982.

Ferré has just finished a three-year term as Chair of the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball South Central Regional Chairman.

Ferré and his wife Sarah, have two daughters, Caitlin and Hope.

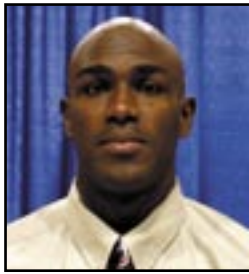

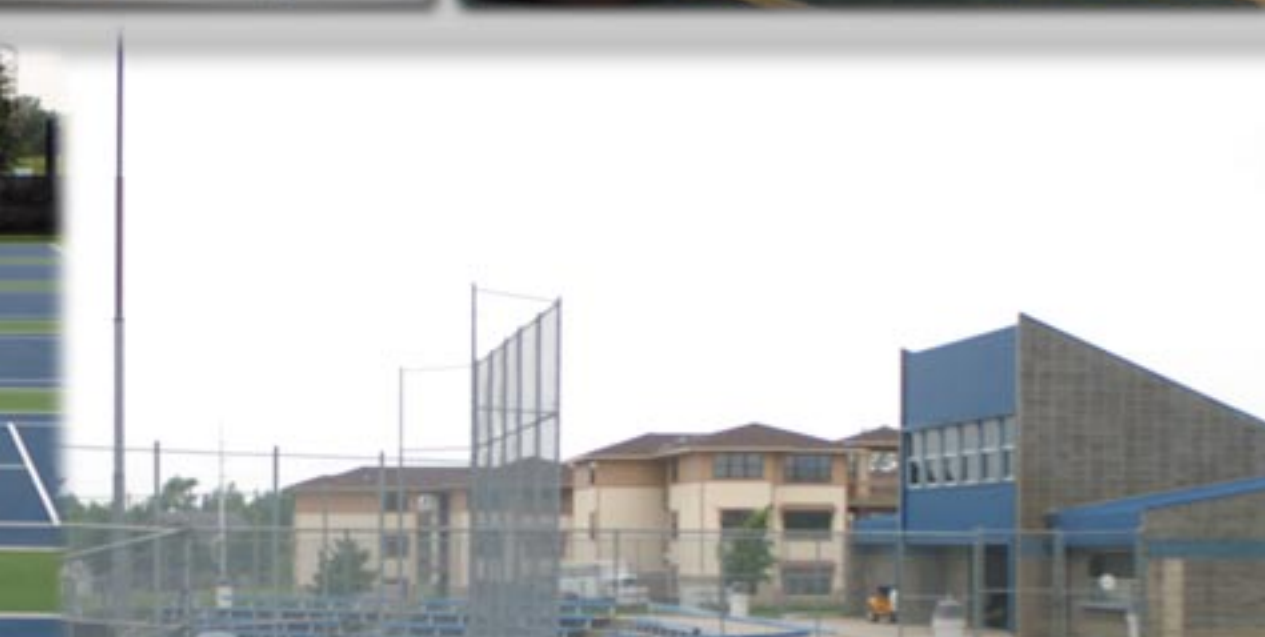
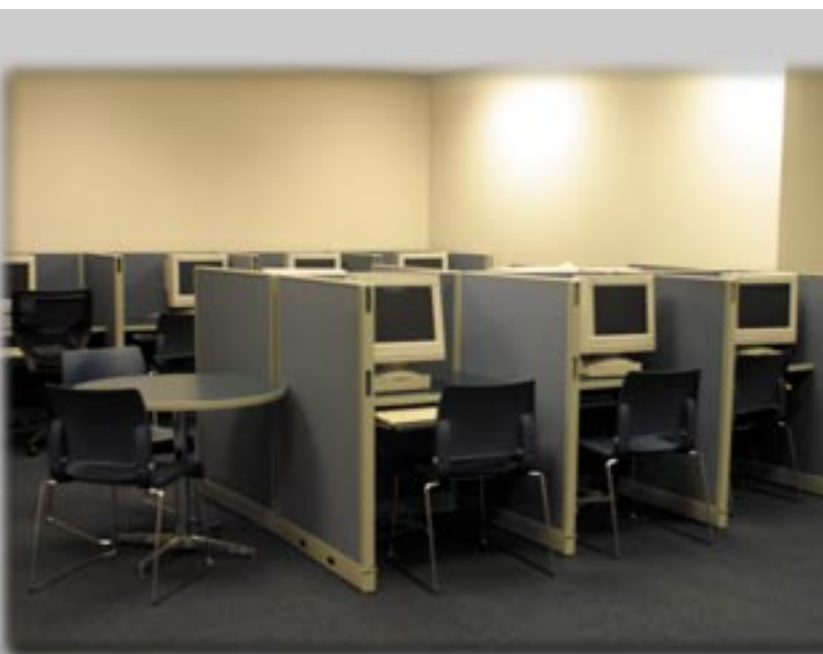
Heartland Park, Topeka (left) has been a world-class destination since 1989 and was the first major motorsports facility to be built in North America since 1968.

Construction started in May, 2003 on the Lady Blues soccer field southeast of the Washburn Softball Complex with the removing of several trees and then levelling of the ground. On July 14, 2003, workers came in to lay down the sod that would soon become the Lady Blues' soccer field. The field has portable seating for more than 300 and plenty of room for chairs and blankets on the east side of the field.

The Lady Blues won the first game played on the soccer field and their first game in school history in a 5-1 win over Ottawa University on Sept. 3, 2003. University President, Dr. Jerry Farley (right) had the ceremonial first kick to open the complex before the game.

On Sept. 10, 2004 the Lady Blues set the NCAA Division II all-time attendance mark against Missouri Southern when 1,848 people attended the game. The Lady Blues led Division II in attendance with 447 people per match and 4,020 for the season.

The Lady Blues have a home record of 7-10-2 in their two seasons at the Washburn Soccer Field.

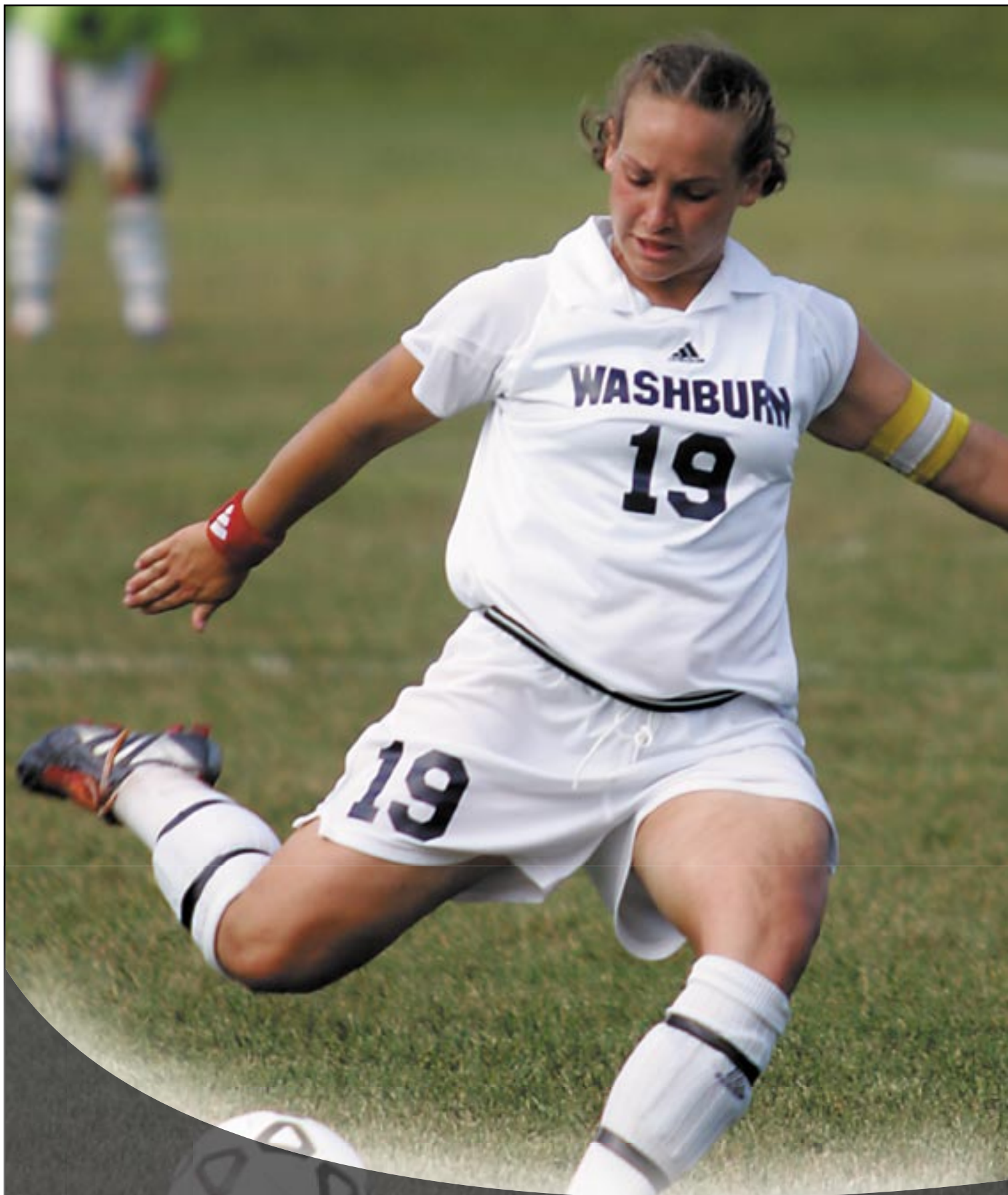

As the Washburn Lady Blues enter their third year of existence, there is a great confidence among those in the program who have seen the improvement the team has undergone in the last two seasons.

From year No. 1 to year No. 2, the Lady Blues improved from eighth place in the MIAA to fifth place in 2004 and with lineup the Lady Blues have returning, coupled with what could be the best overall recruiting class the team has seen, the third year could be a charm for the Lady Blues.

"We're excited about the upcoming year," head coach Tim Collins said. "We do have a solid group of returners, but we also believe our newcomers will all contribute to the team not only this season, but for the next four years to come and help us push our program up the ranks in the MIAA and in the national rankings."

## The Returners

The Lady Blues return 10 letterwinners off of last season's team that went 5-11-3 overall and 3-9-2 in the MIAA. Headlining the group is a quartet of juniors who all earned MIAA honors last season. Defender Meagan Horvath and midfielder Lauren Schwindt each were named second team All-MIAA and forward Jenna Lawless and goalkeeper Jenna Hatlestad were tabbed as honorable mention All-MIAA picks.

Lawless was the Lady Blues' leading scorer last season after she recorded 19 total points with team highs with seven goals and five assists. Schwindt, after making transferring from Louisiana-Lafayette, scored five goals recording 14 total points.

On the defensive side, Horvath scored two goals with two assists from her defender position after moving from midfielder after her freshman season. The two-time Lady Blues Most Valuable Player will again captain a Lady Blues defense. In goal, Hatlestad started all 19 games playing every minute of the season tallying a 2.04 goals against average while setting a MIAA record with 160 saves on the season with a save percentage of .800. She also recorded two shutouts as a sophomore – the first two in Lady Blues history.

"We can continue to build around these four, but they all going to have to step their game up and continue to improve so we can build the program to where we want to be," Collins said.

Also returning is the team's second leading scorer in junior Jolene Silovsky, who finished second on the team with six goals while starting all 19 games at a midfielder's position.

A pair of juniors, Amanda Geist and Anna Fahey, return at the midfielder's positions along with sopho-

more McKinley Rainen. The defense has a pair of juniors returning in Erica Schmidt and Erica Painting.

## The Newcomers

The Lady Blues will have seven newcomers for the upcoming season. Of the seven newcomers are five freshmen, they will be joined by a senior and a sophomore rounding out the new faces on the team.

The five freshmen are Lisa Fahey, Traci Nigg, Kaydi Hooker, Lisa Coleman and Jessica Mainz. Fahey was a first team All-league and All-district pick as a senior. Nigg was a three-time first team All-State pick. Hooker was named Wyoming's Soccer Player of the Year after leading her team to the state championship. Coleman, who played tennis at Johnson County for two seasons before transferring to play both soccer and tennis at Washburn, was an All-league and All-city pick. Mainz was an All-State, All-region, All-league and All-city pick as a senior.

Another newcomer, senior Lora Westling, has spent the last four seasons on the Lady Blues basketball court where she finished her career as the school's all-time leading 3-point shooter. Westling, who practiced with the soccer team after leading the basketball squad to a NCAA National Championship, was heavily recruited out of high school to play soccer after earning All-state honors.

The Lady Blues have a Division I transfer goalkeeper for the second straight season in sophomore Ryann Werner. Werner played one season as Wisconsin-Green Bay recording a 1.91 goal against average playing in eight matches.

"With the exception of Lora because she will only play for one season, I expect these newcomers to be the ones who will help take the team to a new level and improve our team building it to new heights," Collins said.

## The MIAA

The Washburn Lady Blues were picked sixth in the MIAA Coaches Poll that was released by the MIAA Offices.

"The conference race will be tough," Collins said. "But with the improvements we have made to the team, we look forward to competing against the schools in the MIAA."

# COACHES



On Dec. 23, 2002, Tim Collins was named the first head coach in Lady Blues soccer history and, he brings the experience and winning traditions from the high school ranks to the Washburn campus.

Collins has compiled a 9-24-4 record in his two seasons as the Lady Blues coach. In thier second season of existance, Collins coached the Lady Blues from an eighth place finish from the first season to a fifth place finish in the MIAA standings.

In his two seasons at the helm of the Lady Blues program, he has coaches six Washburn soccer players who have earned All-MIAA honors. Collins' enthusiasm has led to increased attendance at Lady Blues matches as Washburn led the NCAA Division II ranks in attendance last season, including setting a new Division II single-match attendance record of 1,848 against Missouri Southern.

Collins previously coached the Seaman boys team to a fourth-place 5A state finish and a Regional Championship after finishing second in the Centennial League race. Before coaching at Seaman, Collins headed the boys and girls programs at Topeka West High School for 10 years. In 2001, he coached the girls' program to the Class 5A State Championship.

He also coached Charger teams to seven regional championships, two tournament championships and two state finalists. He was named the Topeka City Coach of the Year four times and the Kansas Coach of the Year once.

Since 1995 Collins has been the girls director of coaching for the Kansas State Olympic Development Program organizing tryouts and managing camps. Collins also has his National Class "A" Coaching License.

Collins is a 1991 graduate Ottawa University where he was a four-year letterwinner for the Braves' soccer team. He was the team's MVP and captain his junior and senior seasons while garnering first team all-conference and all-district accolades.

Collins and his wife, Tina, have two boys Nico and CJ.

## Season Review

The Lady Blues started the season with back-to-back wins to over Southwest Minnesota State 4-2 behind two Jenna Lawless goals and then a 3-0 shutout win over Benedictine. The win over the Ravens was big for three reasons – 1) the win was the first shutout in Lady Blues history recorded by Jenna Hatlestad in goal. 2) The win was the first road win for the Lady Blues. 3) The win evened the series at a win a piece after the Raven topped the Lady Blues in 2003.

The Lady Blues then fell on hard times as they faced three nationally ranked teams in a row after a tough overtime loss to Missouri Southern. Even though the Lady Blues fell to the Lions, they did set the NCAA Division II All-time attendance record when 1,848 saw the Lady Blues play. The attendance mark snapped Emporia State's record of 1,820. After the loss to the Lions, the Lady Blues took on No. 6 Truman falling 4-1, No. 24 Southwest Baptist losing 4-0 and then dropped a 3-0 decision to Nebraska-Omaha all in a period of one week. Washburn responded with a 2-1 win over Northwest Missouri at home as Jolene Silovsky scored the first goal from a Lawless assist and Silovsky later would return the favor assisting on Lawless' goal.

The Lady Blues recorded their first double overtime tie of the season when they knotted Missouri-Rolla 2-2. The following day, the Lady Blues dropped a 3-1 match to Missouri Southern.

After taking on the Lions, the Lady Blues fell 4-3 to Emporia State. The Lady Blues led at the half, but two goals by Meagan Horvath were not enough as Washburn fell to their arch-rivals.

The Lady Blues traveled to Edmond, Okla. for two games against Midwestern State and Central Oklahoma. The Lady Blues tied Midwestern State 1-1 in double overtime and then fell 3-0 to UCO in a rain-soaked game that was halted after 70 minutes because of wet field conditions.

Washburn recorded its first overtime win in school history as Jolene Silovsky scored six-plus minutes into overtime on a corner kick as the Lady Blues topped Northwest Missouri.

After nearly two weeks on the road, the Lady Blues returned home to take on Central Missouri and again played into overtime tying the Jennies 1-1. The Lady Blues then had two weeks off before taking on No. 3 ranked Truman State. Washburn fell 1-0 after being outshot 27 to 6.

Washburn would pick up its final win of the season with a 1-0 win over Missouri-Rolla as Jenna Lawless recorded the lone goal off a Lauren Schwindt assist and Jenna Hatlestad recorded the second shutout in school history.

The Lady Blues would then fall 3-0 to Southwest Baptist in a match played in Kansas City at Rockhurst University because of wet field conditions in Bolivar. Washburn wrapped up the season with a 2-0 home loss to Emporia State.

## Super Sophomores

In 2004, all 24 goals scored by the Lady Blues were recorded by sophomores. Jenna Lawless led the team with seven goals. Jolene Silovsky had six and Lauren Schwindt had five. Lawless' goal total tied the single-season Washburn record and her five assists set a new single-season record.

## Hatlestad Rewrites Record Books

Sophomore Jenna Hatlestad rewrote the school and the MIAA record books after her performance on the season. Hatlestad played all 1,766 minutes in goal on the season and set a new Lady Blues and MIAA record after she recorded 160 saves on the season. After one season, her save total places her first in the Washburn record book and ninth on the MIAA's all-time save chart. Her 17 saves against Northwest Missouri on Oct. 15 were a new Washburn record and she tied for the second most in the MIAA record books. She also recorded the only two shutouts in Lady Blues history along with a school-best 2.04 goals against average and 8.42 saves per game.

## Washburn's Overtime Obsession

The Lady Blues set a school record by playing in five overtime matches going 1-1-3 picking up their lone overtime win over Northwest Missouri Oct. 15 in Maryville as Jolene Silovsky recorded the first "golden goal" in school history.

## Freshman Straight Shooter

McKinley Rainen led the Lady Blues as a freshman with a .769 shot on goal percentage. Of her 13 shots, 10 of them were on goal. Her 10 shots on goal were the fourth highest on the team.

## Lady Blues Accolades

- Team captain Meagan Horvath was named the Lady Blues Most Valuable Player. She received second team All-MIAA honors as a defender. Lauren Schwindt was also named second team All-MIAA. Jenna Lawless and Jenna Hatlestad each received honorable mention All-MIAA honors at forward and goalkeeper respectively.

- Laura Barnaby, Virginia Barnes, Stephanie Bruegger, Anna Fahey, Amanda Geist, Deidre Gorynski, Meagan Horvath, Erica Painting, Erica Schmidt, Celese Siebert and Jolene Silovsky were all named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll and Deidre Gorynski was named a MIAA Presidential Scholar for the second straight season.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, a nine-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri and Kansas, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 20 years, the league has undergone several changes, highlighted by increased participation in national championships.

The MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 13 national team championships and 141 individual national titles.

The MIAA currently conducts conference championships in eight men's and eight women's sports. Men's championships include football, cross country, basketball,

indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball, tennis, and golf. Women's champions are determined in volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, softball and tennis.

Ralph McFillen, formerly of the Metro and Gulf South conferences, succeeded Ken B. Jones as commissioner of the MIAA in July 1997.

Matt Newbery, previously the assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State University, is the assistant to the commissioner for media relations and in his 12th year with the MIAA. Natasha Oakes, a former All-MIAA track performer at Emporia State University, was added as the third full-time staffer in July 2005 as the assistant to the commissioner for compliance.

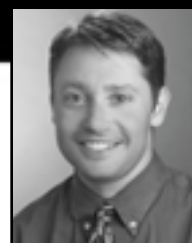
