Three chapters of the first recruiting class in the Washburn Lady Blues soccer program have been written and entering their final season, the first class of seven seniors still have one more chapter to write – and it starts with improving on 2005's second place MIAA finish.

Last season, the Lady Blues finished with a school-best 11 wins and a second place finish in the MIAA going 7-3-4.

"We were pleased with last season," said head coach Tim Collins. "But now we're ready to take the next step and build off of last season's success."

The Lady Blues return 98.9 percent of their points from last season (91 of 92) with the only loss being assistant coach Lora Westling who wrapped up her one-year soccer career for the Lady Blues with first team all-MIAA and second team all-region honors.

The Lady Blues return 16 letterwinners off of last year's squad and look to challenge for the conference title with the reigning MIAA Coach of the Year in Collins at the helm in his fourth season as the Lady Blues head coach.

The Lady Blues have a solid mix of returners and newcomers who will set up on the Washburn front line.

"Our front line will be as good as anyone in the MIAA," Collins said. "They are experienced and from top to bottom we have more speed than we have ever had."

Sophomore forward Jessica Mainz rewrote the record books after her first campaign with 13 goals and 30 total points. Mainz earned unanimous first team all-MIAA honors and was a second team all-region pick. Mainz had five match-winning goals including a winner with :04 seconds left in the second overtime in a 2-1 win over arch-rival Emporia State in Emporia. Mainz's 1.50 points per match tied for the MIAA lead and she led the conference in shots, shots per match and shots on goal and shots on goal per match.

Along side Mainz is senior Jolene Silovsky, who is Washburn's career goal leader with 15, will wrap up her collegiate career after playing her freshman year at Missouri-

Also at forward is senior Jenna Lawless, who sits as Washburn's all-time leader in points with 38 and second on the goals chart with 14.

A pair of freshman in Ashley Taylor and Lauren Lawless will also be in the mix for playing time. Taylor was a state champion at Olathe East in 2004 while lettering all four seasons and Lawless also lettered four seasons at Washburn Rural.

The Lady Blues return three seniors, a junior and a sophomore at the midfielder's position and will have added depth with the addition of two two incoming freshmen.

Our midfielders are versatile enough where they can play at a forward position as well, so that will help us this year," Collins said.

Senior Lauren Schwindt led the Lady Blues in assists last season with seven, including a school-record three against Minnesota-Crookston in the second game of the year. She went on to earn third team all-region honors finishing with three goals and 13 points with two match-winning goals.

Washburn's career leader in starts and matches played Amanda Geist returns for her senior season at another midfielder's position. She earned honorable mention all-MIAA honors after recording an assist.

Fellow senior Anna Fahey returns having played in 53 matches and has recorded a goal and two assists. Junior McKinley Rainen has started nine matches while playing in 35 in her career and recorded two assists in 2005. Sophomore Traci Nigg scored two goals while recording the match-winning goal against Southwest Baptist with an assist finishing with five points while starting 19 games.

Joining the quintet will be incoming freshmen Angela Wiseman and Keeley Lambeth. Wiseman was a four-year letterman at Shawnee Heights and earned second team all-state honors and Lambeth was an honorable mention all-state pick and named all-city and all conference.

The Lady Blues are the deepest at defender as seven letterwinners return from last season's squad.

"We are fast and solid at defense and have improved our depth at our defenders position," Collins said.

Returning after suffering a knee injury is senior captain Megan Horvath. Horvath started the first six games of the season scoring one goal, but missed the remainder of the year after her injury against No. 5 South Dakota.

A pair of seniors in Erica Schmidt and Erica Painting are also back for their third season on the defense. Painting played her first season in goal before moving to a defender position and Schmidt is second on the career list in games played with 55 after playing in 18 in 2005.

Sophomores Kaydi Hooker and Lisa Fahey were honorable mention all-MIAA picks last season and fellow sophomore Lisa Coleman was fourth on the team with nine points and third in goals scored with four. Junior Brie Forman also returns after playing in 13 matches last season.

The Lady Blues have one goalie in second team all-MIAA pick Jenna Hatlestad.

"Jenna has really improved her decision making skills over the past two seasons and we really look forward to her play this season," Collins said.

In 2005, Hatlestad recorded a 0.80 goal against average with 94 saves and a .855 save percentage. She is currently sixth in career goal against average on the MIAA chart with a 1.41 average and sixth on the career save chart with 254 after setting the single season record with 160 as a sophomore in 2004. In case of emergency, Painting would be called on to back up Hatlestad.

MIAA

The MIAA race should be wide open this season as three teams picked up first place votes. Truman was tabbed as the team to beat in the conference race with five first place votes and 47 total points. Central Missouri and Missouri Southern each recorded 39 points and Washburn was picked fourth with 35 points. Northwest Missouri and Southwest Baptist were tied for fifth with 21 points followed by Emporia State with 14 and Missouri Western with eight points.

"The conference race is really wide open," Collins said. "We believe that any of the top teams can win this league and we are working to make that team be us in 2006."
