Media credentials are available to personnel from accredited media outlets by contacting Gene Cassell, Sports Information Director, Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas 66621. Media may also call the office for access to the softball complex as seating is limited.

Radio stations wishing to broadcast from the softball complex should make broadcast requests through the Sports Information Office.

Telephones for writers from which to file are available in the softball complex press box.

Media services include lineups, plus statistics and game notes for each team. Complete stat packets will be available approximately five minutes after the completion of the game.

Postgame interviews with Coach Lisa Carey are available to media personnel after her brief meeting with the team immediately following the game. Players will not be made available between games of a doubleheader.

Washburn University was established in February 1865 as Lincoln College by a charter issued by the State of Kansas and the General Association of Congregational Ministers and Churches of Kansas. A two-story brick building on the northeast corner of 10th and Jackson Streets was soon erected and the first classes began in January 1866. In 1868, the school was renamed Washburn College, in recognition of a \$25,000 donation by Ichabod Washburn, a church deacon and resident of Worcester, Mass.

The university was granted a permanent location in 1865 when Topekan Col. John Ritchie donated a 160-acre site, which at the time was a considerable distance southwest of the city. Construction on the first building began in 1872, with occupancy taking place in 1874. For the next two decades, college President Peter McVicar conducted an aggressive development campaign. His efforts resulted in the establishment of numerous Victorian limestone structures which characterized the campus for the next 90 years.

Expansion of the school was constant. The School of Law was organized in 1903, as was a School of Fine Arts and a medical school, which educated physicians until 1913. During the next three decades structures such as the Mulvane Art Museum, Benton Hall and Whiting Field House were added to the campus. In June 1966, a tornado struck Topeka and several historic buildings on campus were demolished. The Washburn community rallied and financial support from friends and alumni made possible

the rebuilding of many school facilities during the coming years. Today, university facilities offer more than one million square feet of modern academic and support space.

In 1941, the citizens of Topeka endorsed Washburn by voting to establish a municipal university, supported in part by the city and governed by a local board of regents. In 1952, the Washburn Board of Regents officially changed the name of the school to Washburn University of Topeka. In 1999, the university's primary funding was moved from city property tax to county sales tax sources, with the school retaining status as a municipal subdivision of the state. In addition to local financial support, Washburn has received state funds since 1961, which have been coordinated by the Kansas Board of Regents since 1991. Washburn is governed by its own nine member Board of Regents.

Washburn provides broadly-based liberal arts and professional education through more than 190 certificate, associate, baccalaureate, master's and juris doctor programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Law, Business, Nursing and Applied Studies. Ninety-seven percent of the faculty hold a doctorate or the highest degree available in their discipline.



Dr. Jerry B. Farley
University President

Jerry Farley became the 14th President of Washburn University in 1997 following an extensive career in finance and business affairs at several Oklahoma higher education institutions. Aside from a full schedule of Washburn responsibilities, Dr. Farley speaks and teaches around the United States on topics related to Higher Education Finance, Auditing, Management and Leadership. He is a C.P.A. and has been the president and chair of the board of several state and national professional

organizations. He has authored or co-authored numerous articles and books on finance and accounting.

Dr. Farley holds a degree in finance and accounting, an MBA, and a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration - all from the University of Oklahoma.

Serving on local and state boards has always been a priority for Dr. Farley. He is past president of the Topeka Chamber of Commerce. He has served on the board of directors of Red Cross, American Cancer Society, Boy Scouts, United Way and economic development corporations including Go Topeka.

He is the recipient of awards for outstanding contributions in public service, accounting, and higher education.

Athletic Director

Loren Ferre' became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D. Ferre' is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

At Washburn, Ferre' has been instrumental in the establishment of a strong Ichabod Club support team and the raising of funds for athletic scholarships.

While at BHSU, Ferre' was also director of the Donald E. Young Sports Fitness Center, a 172,000 square foot, \$10.2 million facility. During his Black Hills tenure, the athletics department nearly tripled its outside revenue, including large increases in ticket sales and scholarship funding. All 10 varsity teams won a conference title in his final three years.

Before joining the staff at Black Hills State, Ferre' spent 17 years at the University of North Texas. He was the director of the Coliseum (1987-90) was the associate and assistant director since 1980. He held the post of event coordinator (1978-80).

Ferre' is a 1971 graduate of Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of arts degree. He earned a master's in journalism from North Texas in 1982.

Ferre' is the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball South Central Regional Chairman serving his third year on the committee last season.

Ferre' and his wife Sarah, have two daughters, Caitlin and Hope.

The Washburn Lady Blues have played every season of action at the Washburn Softball Complex. Prior to the 2001 season, the facility underwent its first major upgrade since the first season of 1970.

A new press box was constructed with restrooms, concession stands, training table and storage on the lower level and a working press area on the second level. Before the start of play in the 2002 season, the facility was completed with the addition of a public address system.

The complex houses two fields with 200 feet fences all around the outfield. Each field has two separate microphone systems for announcing.

The past six seasons, the Lady Blues have enjoyed great success playing at home compiling a 81-23 (.779) record. The first game played in the complex with the new press box was a doubleheader sweep over Bethany winning 13-0 and 8-0.

The first run was scored by Stacie Carpenter who scored via the first hit - a home run by Katie Schmidt in the second inning.

Future plans for the complex include covered dugouts, a new scoreboard, lights and new fences for the east field.

The Lady Blues home attendance in 2004 was the fourth best in the nation.

Lisa Carey, former University of Oklahoma three-time All-American and National Champion begins her third season as the Lady Blues' head coach. She was named the program's 13th coach Aug. 14, 2002.

In her first season as the Lady Blues' head coach, Carey posted a 34-14 and a second place finish in the MIAA and a seventh place regional ranking.

Carey was the starting first baseman on Oklahoma's 2000 National Championship and Big 12 Championship teams as a junior. That same season she was selected as the Big 12 Player of the Year and First team All-America honors after leading the Sooners in batting (.405), hits (90), home runs (20), RBI (77), total bases (173) and slugging percentage (.779) in 74 games.

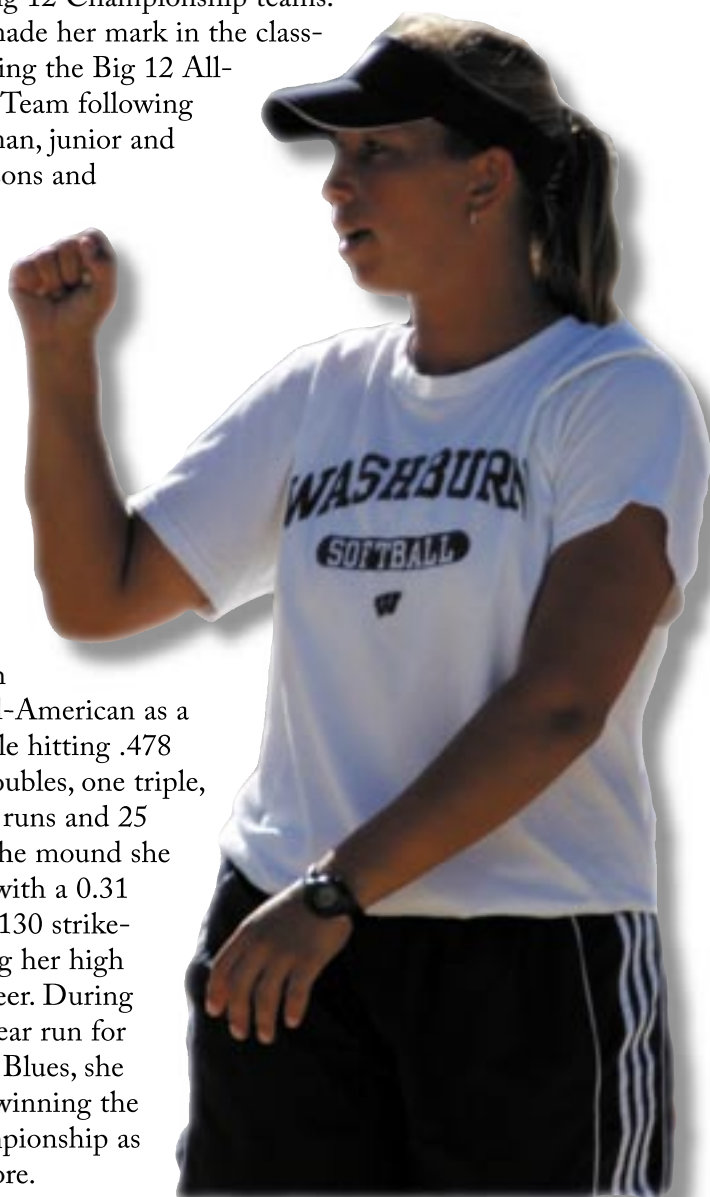
As a senior, Carey was named all-American for the third time after leading the Sooners to the College World Series after batting .400, scoring 50 runs with 76 hits in 59 games.

While at Oklahoma, Carey was a member of three Big 12 Championship teams.

She also made her mark in the classroom making the Big 12 All-Academic Team following her freshman, junior and senior seasons and a member

of the Dean's Honor Roll as a sophomore.

At Washburn Rural High School, she was a 1996 High School All-American as a junior while hitting .478 with 10 doubles, one triple, two home runs and 25 RBI. On the mound she was 48-3 with a 0.31 ERA and 130 strikeouts during her high school career. During her four-year run for the Junior Blues, she was 87-4 winning the state championship as a sophomore.





Mandy Fulton begins her first year as an assistant coach this season for the Lady Blues.

Fulton came to Washburn from Putnam City West High School where she was an assistant softball coach.

This past summer she led several clinics across Oklahoma including several at her alma mater.

The Del City, Okla. native was a four-year letterman at the University of Oklahoma, where she was a member of the 2000 NCAA National Championship squad.

She was a four-year starter for the Sooners at third base while also seeing time at designated player.

Fulton finished her Sooner career in the top 10 of seven school record charts including sixth in doubles with 33, and ninth in extra base hits (51) and walks (50).

Equally dedicated in the classroom, she was a member of the Big 12 first team all-academic squad as a freshman.

She graduated from Oklahoma with a degree in secondary education in 2001.

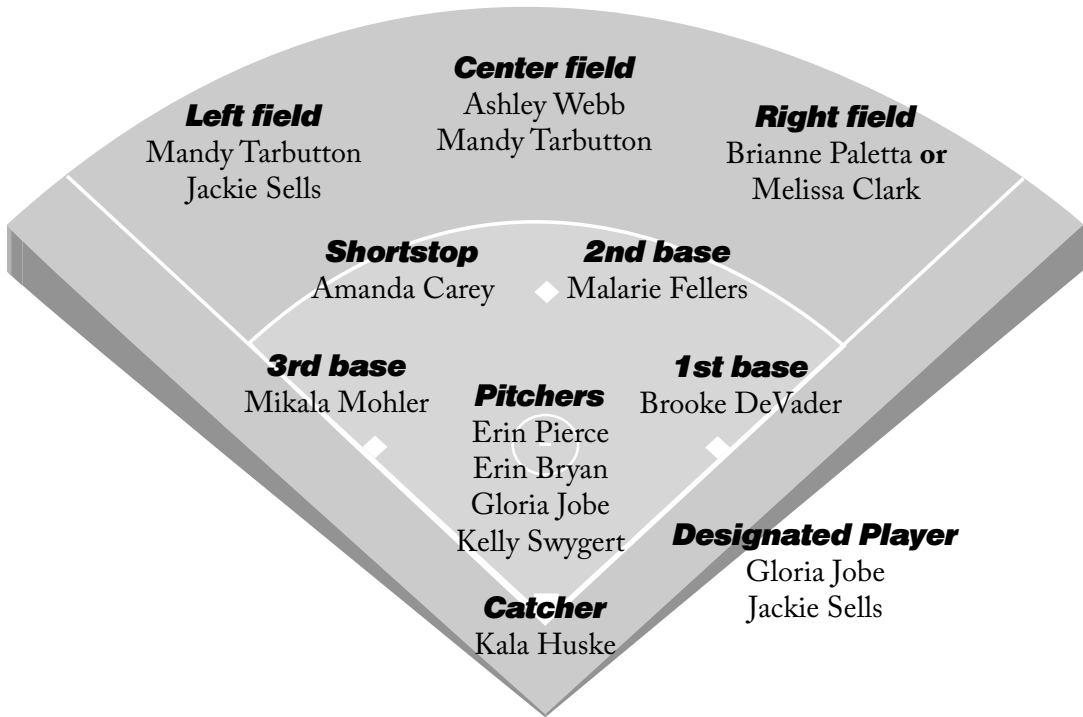

There is a youth movement on the Washburn 2005 softball team

Of the 15 Lady Blues on this season's roster, only three are upperclassmen as there will be 10 softball players lacing up their cleats for the first time in a collegiate uniform this season.

"Our youth can be an advantage to us," third-year coach Lisa Carey said. "These new players all come from winning programs – whether it is from their high school team or their summer traveling teams. With the experience they gained this fall, and the addition of the talent we have coming back from last year, everyone has jelled together. We have worked hard together in every facet with the single goal of becoming a team."

The Lady Blues finished the 2004 season with a 32-25 record and an 8-10 mark in the MIAA qualifying eighth for their 14th straight appearance in the MIAA postseason tournament.

"We were disappointed with last season," Carey said. "We were not on the same page as a team. We've really worked on the team concept and it has paid off so far this season. You can see it in practice and the success we had in the fall."

In their exhibition season in the fall, the Lady Blues finished with a 12-4 record with their three losses coming to Kansas, Oklahoma and Creighton.

Squad Notes

The Lady Blues will have new faces in many positions this season, but one returner who will have an impact on the season will be second team all-MIAA utility player Kala Huske. Huske will handle the catching duties this season and will look to continue the hot batting she finished the 2004 season with. Huske led the Lady Blues with a .460 batting average in conference play.

Washburn will have only one senior this season in utility player Jackie Sells. Sells played both in the outfield and on the infield last season. Fellow outfielder Ashley Webb will return to centerfield after garnering honorable mention all-MIAA honors last season as a freshman after hitting .284 finishing second on the team with 57 base hits from mainly the leadoff position in the lineup.

The Lady Blues return only one pitcher from last

year in junior Erin Pierce. Pierce was 10-12 last season and recorded a 2.82 ERA.

Returning to the infield, but moving from the middle infield to the hot corner at third base will be sophomore Mikala Mohler. Mohler recorded seven doubles and started 54 games scoring 13 runs.

"We are going to rely a lot on our returners," Carey said. "These women have been through the battles of a collegiate season and the MIAA grind. We're going to look for their leadership to help bring along the newcomers and keep everyone focused for every game."

Newcomers

Although she is new to collegiate softball, Amanda Carey is not new to the Lady Blues after redshirting last season while recovering from a knee injury that forced her to sit out the 2004 season. Carey will hold down the shortstop position.

The Lady Blues have nine true freshman who are on the roster this season and many will start and see a lot of playing time in 2005.

Entering the season, four players are penciled in to start. In the outfield, Webb will be flanked by Mandy Tarbutton in left field and Brianne Paletta or Melissa Clark in right field.

The right side of the infield will have a new look as well. Malarie Fellers will start at second base and Brooke DeVader will be at first base. DeVader might see some time in right field as well.

In the circle, the Lady Blues have added three freshman pitchers to join Pierce. Erin Bryan, Gloria Jobe and Kelly Swygert will all see time this season. Jobe will also be used in the designated player roll as well.

Also looking for time will be Brianne Paletta who can play any of the outfield positions and could be used as a pinch runner. She is one of the fastest Lady Blues on the squad this season.

The Lady Blues will be without the services of Dani White this season, as she suffered a torn ACL and will redshirt. White was slated to play both first base as well as working as a back-up catcher.

"Our freshman are obviously in for some drastic changes from high school softball," Carey said. "But they have played competitive softball against some of the best competition in the country and they will be ready to go when the season starts for real in February."

2004 In Review

The Washburn Lady Blues finished the 2004 season with an overall 32-25 mark and a 8-10 record in the MIAA qualifying for the postseason MIAA Tournament for the 14th straight time. The Lady Blues have qualified for the tournament every season they have been in the MIAA.

Postseason honors

The Lady Blues had two picked for the Second Team all-MIAA squad in senior outfielder Molly Gleisberg and



sophomore utility player Kala Huske. Gleisberg recorded her highest batting average in a Washburn uniform hitting .305 finishing third on the team with a 47 hits. Huske finished second on the team with her .320 batting average, but she batted a scorching .460 with 23 hits in 18 games.

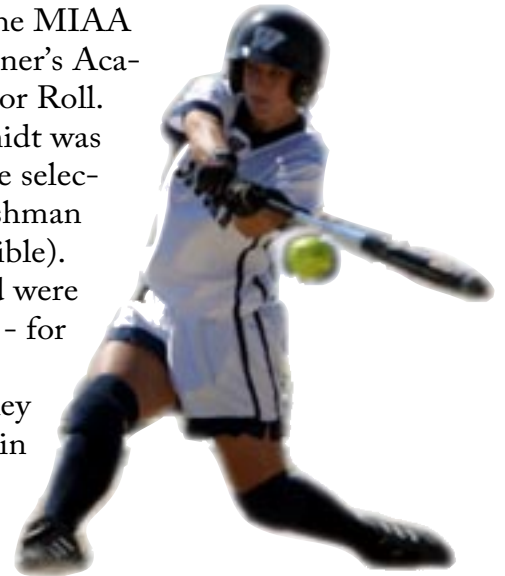
Clouse finished her career as a four-time all-MIAA honoree and Schmidt was picked for conference honors three times.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, a 10-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri and Kansas, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 15 years, the league has undergone several changes, highlighted by expansion and increased participation in national championships.

The MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 11 national championships and more than 100 individual national titles.

The MIAA currently conducts conference championships in eight men's and

eight women's sports. Men's champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball, tennis, and golf. Women's champions are determined in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, softball and tennis.

Ralph McFillen was named to succeed Ken B. Jones as commissioner of the MIAA in January 1997, and took over in July of that year. He formerly served as commissioner of the Metro and Gulf South conferences. Matt Newbery, formerly an assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State University, joined the conference in July 1994 as director of sports information.

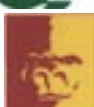

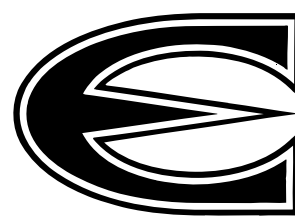
