CAMP DETAILS

All children must bring their own racquet!

If you have a child who is advanced and would fit into an older camp, please note that on the entry form.

Each camp is taught by Jennifer Hastert, the Washburn head tennis coach, and her players. Each camp is limited in the number of participants. Entries will be taken until each section is filled up.

CAMP DETAILS

Advanced Bods - Ages 13-18 - 8-9 a.m.: This camp is for the teenager who already knows the basics of tennis and is ready to advance their game. Players will be put throught physical conditioning, strategies and drills for both singles and doubles. Camp Fee: \$60/week

Baby Bods - Ages 4-7 - 9-10 a.m.: This camp is designed to bring a fun introduction of tennis to the little tykes. Players will focus on hand-eye coordination, court awareness and stroke development. These players are encouraged to use a children's racquet, which are shorter and lighter than standard sized racquets. **Camp Fee: \$60/week**

Junior Bods - Ages 8-12 - 10-11 a.m.: This camp is for children who are beginning to learn tennis. Players will learn all the strokes and how to keep score. Then they will apply this knowledge to match play. These players are encouraged to use a standard sized racquet. **Camp Fee: \$60/week**

Location: The camp will be held on the newly renovated Washburn Tennis Complex courts, south of Lee Arena on the Washburn campus.



Coaching Staff: Washburn tennis head coach Jennifer Hastert enters her eighth full season in charge of the Washburn tennis program.

Last year she coached the men's team to its first MIAA championship with a 17-6 record and both teams advanced to the NCAA region tournament. The men hosted a four-team regional pod

and advanced to the second round.

In her seven seasons at Washburn she has led the women's team to two MIAA championships and six NCAA tournament appearances with a 130-42-1 dual record. She has led the men's team to three NCAA tournament appearances, an MIAA title and an 83-67 dual record. In 2004, Hastert was named women's MIAA and North Central Region coach of the year after she coached the team to its first-ever NCAA national tournament appearance.

The Ichabods also reached the NCAA national tournament that year, making Washburn one of only four schools to have both its men's and women's teams reach the Sweet 16.

Hastert played at Washburn from 1991 to 1993 and 1995 to 1996 and had a stellar Washburn career, finishing with three All-America awards and four MIAA championships. In her three campaigns at Washburn, she finished 64-9 in singles and 59-11 in doubles.

Following her freshman season, Hastert was named an NCAA Division II All-American and the Volvo Midwest Tennis Rookie of the Year. Her sophomore season she finished in second at No. 1 singles and third at No. 1 doubles during the MIAA championship tournament and had her second All-America distinction.

After transferring to Drake University her junior season, she returned to Washburn for her senior year during the 1995-96 season after sitting out a season. Hastert returned to win the MIAA No. 1 singles and No. 1 doubles championships.

During her playing career, she was ranked as high as No. 4 in the nation in singles and No. 7 in doubles with partner Jill Bernhardt. Hastert's postseason awards included an NCAA Division II All-America honor and she was a two-time MIAA Player of the Week.

Prior to her coaching appointment, Hastert worked at Hall-brook Country Club in Leawood, Kan., as the associate junior development professional directing junior and adult clinics since 1998.

Hastert and her husband Steven live in Topeka with their son, Noah, who was born Dec. 16, 2003.
