Washburn set to host 12-team Lady Blues Classic Friday and Saturday

Twelve teams, including five ranked in the top 25, will head to Washburn this weekend for the Lady Blues Classic. No. 9 Washburn (8-2) will host the event and take on South Dakota at 11 a.m. Friday and then Minnesota State at 3. Saturday the Lady Blues will play two ranked opponents as they match up with No. 13 North Alabama at 1 p.m. and then No. 12 Nebraska-Omaha at 5.

Of the 23 matches scheduled at Lee Arena and connected Whiting Fieldhouse, six of them are battles of ranked teams, including a contest that features No. 4 Truman and No. 5 Minnesota Duluth Saturday at 1 p.m. TSU and Pittsburg State's 7 p.m. match Friday will count as an MIAA contest.

The Lady Blues came into the week after a rare two-game losing streak in which they were swept both times. The wiped that streak out by winning their MIAA opener Wednesday at Fort Hays State in three games.

Quick starting Lady Blues unbeatable

The Lady Blues have won their last 65 matches in which they have won the first game of the match. Last year Washburn was 30-0 in such matches and in 2004 the Lady Blues went 27-0. This year they are 7-0 when winning their first match. Last year they lost the first game of a match just eight times and came back to win five of those.

The Lady Blues will look to continue their dominance from last year. They swept their opponent 22 times and were swept just once. This year they have swept their foes five times but were swept twice.

Wrapping up the match at FHSU

Playing without their two All-Americans, the Lady Blues swept Fort Hays State 30-22, 30-23, 30-19 Wednesday evening in their conference opener and FHSU's first MIAA contest. Sophomore outside hitter Bobi Riley led the No. 9 Lady Blues with 11 kills and freshman outside hitter Ashley Shepard added 10 for her first double-digit kill match.

Washburn (8-2, 1-0 MIAA) hit .178 as a team but kept the Tigers to .041 hitting. Shepard led the team with a .308 attack percentage. Sophomore libero Stephanie Holub led with 20 digs and setters sophomore Carolyn Raynes and freshman Kate Hampson each had 20 assists.

Lady Blues suffer rare pair of sweeps

Washburn suffered its first back to back sweeps since the 2001 season as it falied to win a game in the second day of the Colorado Premier Challenge last Saturday. The Lady Blues fell to No. 11 Florida Southern and then lost to fourthranked Concordia St. Paul in the third-place contest by scores of 30-23, 30-16, 30-21.

Tessa Jones, named to the all-tournament team, was the only Lady Blue with a double-digit kill match with 13 against Florida Southern. Monica Miesner had 23 digs and Erica Cowhick added 22 in that match. Washburn hit just .117 as a team and had three total blocks.

Against Concordia WU hit .014 as a team as the Golden Bears blocked 17 of the Lady Blues' attempts. Cowhick had 11 digs.

Herron passes 200 career win mark

The Lady Blues had a pair of 3-1 wins last Friday as they went 2-0 in the first day of the Colorado Premier Challenge. Washburn head coach Chris Herron earned his 200th win with an opening victory over No. 20 Abilene Christian and then he passed that mark as the seventh-ranked Lady Blues (7-0) defeated cohost Metro State in the evening match. Herron is now 201-54 in six years all-time and 126-25 in five seasons at Washburn. He earned his first 75 wins in three years at Benedictine.

In the opening match junior All-American Monica Miesner had 16 kills in her first start of the year. Miesner had a .343 attack percentage and she added 15 digs for a double-double. Junior middle hitter Mandi Cox also slammed down 16 kills and hit .500 with six blocks. Junior libero Erica Cowhick had 17 digs and freshman setter Kate Hampson had 36 assists.

In the second match junior rightside hitter Tessa Jones led the way with 13 kills and sophomore Bobi Riley had 12. Cowhick had 22 digs and Miesner had 16

Riley leading Lady Blues attack

Sophomore Bobi Riley has come out swinging this year. After never having more than four kills in a match last year, Riley led off the year with 17 against Drury and she has added three more double-digit kill matches so far. She leads the team in kills with 97 and is second in attack percentage. She came one kill shy of her first double-double when she had 10 digs and nine kills at Arkansas Tech.

This year she is hitting .263 and averaging 3.13 kills per game, second best on the team. She hit .667 against Newman with 14 kills and just two errors in 18 attempts. Playing just one game against Fort Valley State, she had five kills in five attempts for a 1.000 percentage.

Few coaches can claim the kind of program turnaround that Chris Herron can claim he has had at Washburn. In his four years the Lady Blues have won their first two conference championships and went to their first three NCAA tournaments. Herron has garnered two MIAA coach of the year awards and has seen his players claim All-America honors four times and all-region status 11 times.

The Washburn volleyball program had a .389 winning percentage as an NCAA II team before Herron started in 2002. Since then he has turned that around with an .826 winning percentage. He has built the team into the second winningest MIAA program since 2002, he has set the school record for wins in a season and he has turned a team that had just three winning seasons in the last 15 years before he got here to one that has become a dominant force in the region.

Last year he led the Lady Blues to 35 wins, a school-record .921 winning percentage and a conference championship with a 15-1 MIAA mark, earning coach of the year honors. Washburn made its third trip to the NCAA tournament and Monica Miesner and Tessa Jones became the second and third WU players to be named All-Americans. The Lady Blues were ranked in the top 10 the final 11 weeks of the season, peaking at 7 and finishing at 10.

Herron was named head coach of the Washburn volleyball team March 25, 2002. He spent the previous three seasons as the head coach of Benedictine College, where he compiled a 75-29 record. After going 13-15 in his first year in 1999, Herron guided the Ravens to their first-ever Heart of America Athletic Conference title and the squad's highest win total ever with a 30-8 record in 2000.

He is a 1980 graduate of the College of the Ozarks, where he earned a bachelor's of science in physical education.

Herron lives in Topeka with his wife, Julie, daughter Libby and sons Thatcher Cole and Jordan.
