Lady Blues Basketball

Last season was full of ups and downs for first year head coach Ron McHenry and his squad.

His team fired out of the blocks early and jumped to a 6-1 record. However, the Lady Blues struggled with inconsistency and poor shooting during the remainder of the season and finished with a 13-14 record.

"That's something we tried to change," McHenry said. "We went out and got a good class of girls who can put the ball in the basket and I think that will help us tremendously."

The Lady Blues will be a young team this season. Out of the nine new players, six are true freshmen - all of whom are from Kansas except for Casper, Wyoming native Lora Westling.

This group will be scrutinized closely because this off-season was the first full recruiting season for McHenry.

"We'll be able to do some more things this year," McHenry said. "It's still too early to tell who we have as far as go-to players, but as far as being able to do more things out of offensive sets and things like that."

McHenry will look for leadership from his returning players. Of the seven returning, six saw significant playing time and five of them started at some point.

"That will be important for us," McHenry said. "We've got more than a couple girls on this team now who have been through the MIAA conference schedule at least once. I'll expect them to teach the new players what to expect during the season and I'll expect our seniors to show a 'ready to come and work hard every day' attitude."

"If we are going to be successful, we have to have that type of leadership, no matter what they do on the floor."

Getting on the floor may be tough this year for any of the Lady Blues.

This isn't a bad thing according to McHenry. In fact, he thinks the competition will only make his players better.

"We have six guards who can play and we've added some height down low," McHenry said. "The girls are going to have to prove themselves in practice and then show it in the game."

As is the case for any team at the start of the season, each of the Lady Blues will have to find a role within the team that allows for them to "show" themselves.



One way to step up may be to fill the spot Manhattan High product Ineke Ingram was expected to fill. Ingram tore the ACL in her right knee in September during off-season workouts and will miss the entire year.

"She would have added a scoring punch," McHenry said. "Ineke has an ability to go get her shot when she wants it. "But we do have some others who can score. From what I've seen, (Carissa) Goeglein is a good scorer and others will have to be as well."

Whether or not the Lady Blues shoot the ball consistently will be the determining factor for their success this year.

The defense was a solid fourth in the MIAA in points allowed (64.1 points per game). But the offense was ranked ninth averaging only 61 points every contest.

"We'll be a better team this year," McHenry said. "We won't have a 'steal and go score' defense but more of a 'settled in' defensive mind set and be tough to score on."

"Offensively, we have the players who can get their shots out of our system and they have the ability to put the ball in the basket."

GUARDS

Playing time will be up for grabs this season with the addition of several guards during the off-season.

The Lady Blues will be led by the returning back-court duo of Kristy Chapman and Bethany McGraw.

Both juniors this season, McGraw started all 27 games last season and Chapman led the team in scoring with 12.7 points per game.

Senior Sharina Watkins didn't start but appeared in all 27 games while averaging 12.4 minutes a game. Senior Linsey Modellmog, who had a strong outing against Missouri Western in the final game last season, will also help lead the Lady Blues.

A big boost in scoring may come from freshman Lora Westling. At Natrona County High School last year, the 5-10 Casper, Wyo., native averaged 13 points, five rebounds and four assists for a squad en

route to a second consecutive state championship.

Thorlan Buchanan, who started 13 games at the point last year, has taken an academic redshirt for the season.

In light of Buchanan's absence, Barton County transfer Gosia Czarnecka will see significant time at the point.

Freshmen Karen DeDonder, Crystal Tutschulte and Alison Garrett will also see playing time for the Lady Blues.

POSTS

The Lady Blues will welcome back junior Crystal Walker and senior Jovanae St. Cyr.

Walker was perhaps the most consistent player for the Lady Blues toward the end of last season. She started slowly, but in the final 10 games, Walker averaged 10.7 points and 5.7 rebounds and scored 37 in her last two. She should be rested and ready to go the entire year after deciding against playing volleyball this fall, after playing in the 2000 season.

St. Cyr brought attitude and intensity to the defensive end of the floor for the Lady Blues. St. Cyr averaged 5.7 rebounds last season.

Their leadership will be needed after the departure

OUTLOOK

The Lady Blues hope a good returning nucleus of players and a solid recruiting class are the recipe for success in the MIAA for the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues looked competitive at times in the MIAA by defeating Central Missouri State and nearly beating the Emporia State Hornets on the road, but the team's consistency was the main concern.

Emporia State looks to extend its four-year reign as MIAA champions and return as the favorite, despite losing three starters and two other key members from last season.

The Hornets have reloaded with 1998-99 MIAA Freshman of the Year, Janel McNeal, who transferred from Missouri-Rolla, along with Louisiana Tech transfer Kristie McClain. McNeal and McClain join honorable mention all-MIAA selection Jamie Blakely and Deena Holloway.

Missouri Western is picked second after finishing tied for second place last season. They return three starters this season, including all-MIAA second team pick Lakesha Jones to the lineup.

Southwest Baptist and Central Missouri State each hope to contend for the title as well. The Lady Bearcats ended Emporia State's home court winning streak last season and the Jennies reeled off several big wins and were nationally ranked at one time last season.

Following in the MIAA poll were Pittsburg State, Northwest Missouri State, Washburn, Missouri Southern, Truman State and Missouri-Rolla.

of Jennifer Butcher and Jodi Rausch, both of whom will serve as assistant coaches for McHenry this season.

Junior transfer Carissa Goglein (Western Nebraska CC) will see significant time on the blocks and will be expected to fill some of the holes left by Butcher and Rausch.

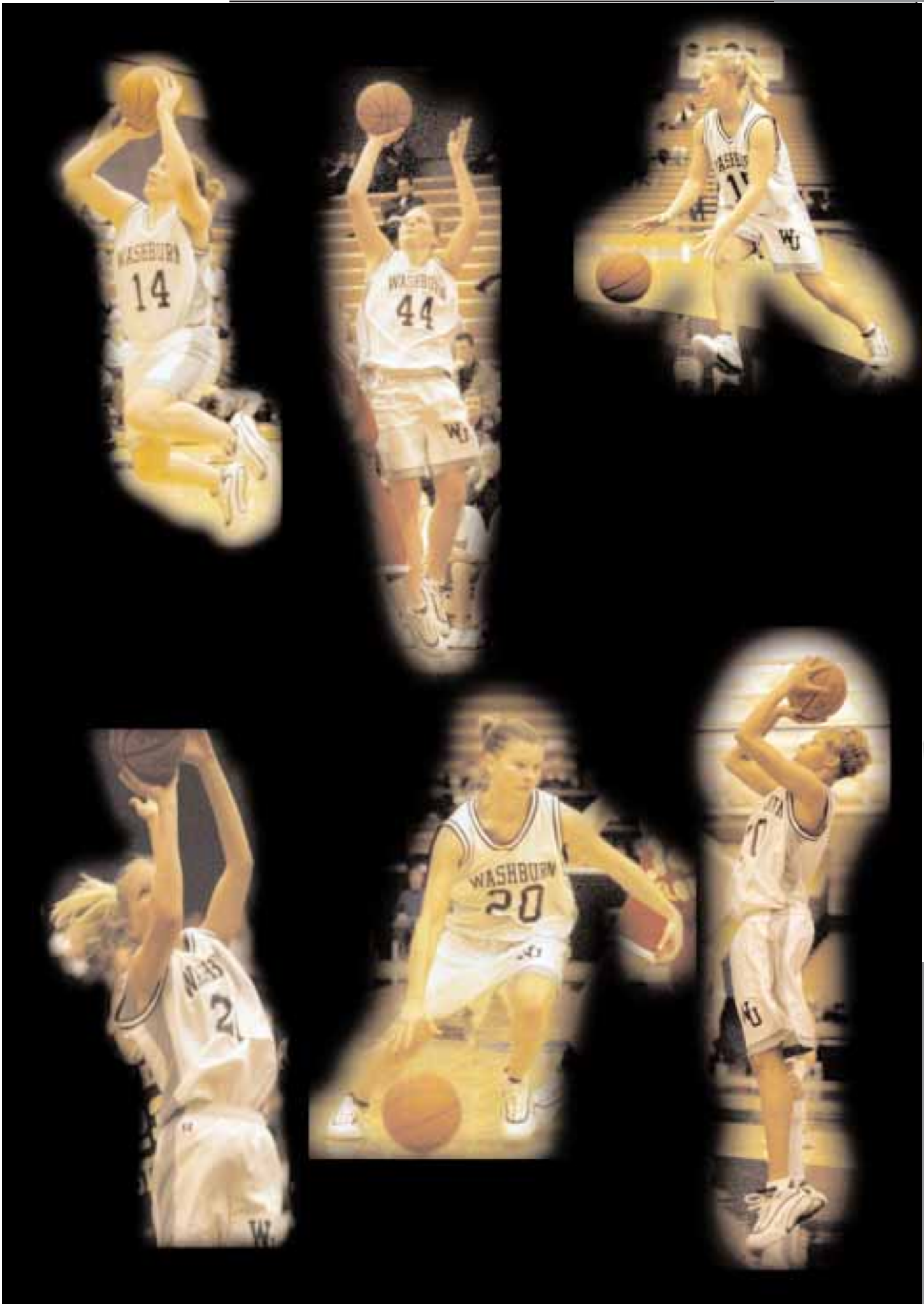
Even though they finished fifth in the MIAA in rebounding last season (+2.7), size was an issue for the Lady Blues.

St. Cyr and Walker should get some help from 6-2 junior transfer Briana Kentfield (College of the Canyons) and 6-1 freshman Maggie Diehl.

Although she is listed as a freshman, Diehl isn't a newcomer to the MIAA. She played volleyball for Emporia State last season, but retained her freshman status by changing to basketball where she has four years of eligibility.
