

After finishing with 30-4 overall and a 15-3 MIAA record, the Washburn Lady Blues win have to reload this season. The Lady Blues graduated five seniors from its MIAA regular season and tournament champion squad, which made the Elite Eight for the first time since 1992-93.

Gone are the All-MIAA frontcourt of Crystal Walker (two-time All-American) and Carissa Goeglein. The squad also lost guards Bethany McGraw, Kristy Chapman and Gosia Czarnecka.

Instead of rebuilding coach Ron McHenry has reloaded the team into a potential national powerhouse once again this season by adding 11 talented newcomers to a group of five returnees.

"We've got a good group coming back that we believe has a lot of confidence in playing in big games after their experience last season," said McHenry. "A lot of them will be asked to step up and take on new roles this season."

Washburn returns two players in Lora Westling and Alison Garrett with starting experience from last year and several others who are ready for increased roles.

Returners

The 2003-04 Lady Blues return only 29 percent of their scoring and 28 percent of their rebounding from last season's Elite Eight squad. Five players return from that group ready to make a bigger impact in 2003-04.

Lora Westling worked her way into the starting lineup by the end of the 2002-03 season, making 15 starts to 7.0 points and 3.7 rebounds a game. She will be looked at to be one of the leaders on both sides of the floor as a junior this

season.

"Lora is a tough competitor who we look to be a team leader this year," said McHenry. "She will be asked to defend the other team's top player and score on the other end."

Fellow junior Alison Garrett started seven games before a broken hand slowed her down last season. She averaged 6.0 points a game, including 41 3pointers in 28 games.

Sophomore

April Roadhouse will look to replace Bethany McGraw as the team's starting point guard after learning the ropes last season. Roadhouse averaged 2.2 points a game and dished out 35 assists last season.

Sophomore Dani McHenry added strength to the Washburn post position last year with 2.8 points and 2.2 rebounds a game off the bench. McHenry will join the team after finishing out the season with the Lady Blues volleyball squad.

Sophomore Jill Heiman added depth at guard last season and continues to improve in the Washburn system. She averaged 1.8 points and 1.2 rebounds a game in 2002-03.

Newcomers

The Lady Blues have added 11 new players into the mix this season, including five transfers and six freshman. With the graduation of several key players, the group will be asked to compete right away for playing time and starting spots.

"When you mix 11 new kids into a program, the biggest challenge is getting everyone on the same page, "said McHenry. "This group coming in is very talented and we expect them to develop into the system quick enough to contribute right away."

Two junior college transfers - Carla Sintra of South Plains College and Montoya Whitfield of Paris Junior College will be counted on to add immediate depth to the post.

Sintra was an all-region selection after averaging 11.5

points and 6.8 rebounds a game last season, while Whitfield averaged 8.8 points and 5.9 rebounds a game.

Transfer guards Juwanna Rivers from Tyler Junior College and Erin Menard from Oral Roberts will be asked to play key minutes at guard.

Rivers was a second team All-American after leading Tyler with 16.0 points a game. Menard averaged 2.9 points a game for ORU. University of Kansas transfer Stacey Becker will redshirt this season.

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker joins the Washburn frontcourt after a record-breaking career at Osborne High School, where she was a former teammate of Roadhouse.

Ubelaker broke Osborne's school record with 2,293 points, which also ranks seventh in Kansas high school history. The Bulldogs went 99-5 and won two state titles in her career.

Megan Sullivan also helped her team to a state title, by averaging 18 points and 10 rebounds a game as a senior at Spring Hill High School last season. Sullivan earned 4A all-state honors.

Four additional freshman will give Washburn depth in the backcourt this season. Charlotte Dikeman, Holly Henrichs, Cindy Keeley and Anna Nimz all finished stellar high school careers in 2002-03.

Dikeman was an all-state selection three seasons at Larned, where she broke school records for steals and blocked shots. She also garnered All-American honors at the Miss Basketball Showcase in Kearney, Neb.

Henrichs was a four-year starter at Dodge City, where she earned all-conference honors as a junior and senior. She averaged 8.8 points, 9.0 assists and 3.2 steals as a senior.

Keeley was a second team all-state all-class selection as a senior at Great Bend High School. Keeley owns Great Bend single game and season records for both points and steals.

Nimz left Hayden High School as the career leader in points with 1,225 and assists with 282. She also broke school records for 437 points and 111 assists as a senior in 2002-03 to lead the Wildcats to a second straight runner-up finish in the state tournament.

Outlook

After finishing first in the MIAA in 2002-03, Washburn is picked second in the MIAA Coaches Poll.

Making another run at the MIAA regular season title and a third straight trip to the NCAA Tournament won't be easy with another slate of tough MIAA competition ahead.

Emporia State, which finished second last year, is the top pick with two starters returning from last year's regional semifinalist team. The Hornets gained five first place votes in the poll and had 77 points overall, followed by Washburn's 72 points with three first place votes.

ESU Juniors Nicole Patry and Esmary Vargas-Sanchez averaged 12.0 and 9.4 points a game respectively. Vargas-Sanchez averaged 8.7 rebounds a game an was on the MIAA's All-Defensive squad.

Northwest Missouri State is primed to make a run at the MIAA top spot, returning all five starters from last year's team, which finished fourth in the MIAA. Sarah Vollertsen averaged 13.9 points and 7.4 rebounds a game and is the leading returnee as a senior. The Bearcats were third in the poll with 62 points and one first place vote.

Missouri Western, which made a seventh straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, is picked fourth after losing 75 percent of their offense from last season. Carly Lee is the top returning scoring at 9.0 points a game. The Griffons earned 53 points in the poll.

Southwest Baptist returns four starters from last year, including the MIAA Freshman of the Year in Amber Wheeler. Wheeler averaged 15.7 points a game and hit 39 percent fro the 3-point range. The Lady Bearcats had 52 points, including one first place vote.

Pittsburg State leads the bottom half of the poll with 39 points, followed by Missouri Southern with 33, Central Missouri State with 30, Truman at 23 and Missouri-Rolla at 9 points.

"The conference race is really wide open this year and five or six teams have a legitimate shot to win it," said McHenry. "It should be another exciting race for the title this season and every night we have to come out and play at the top of our game in this league."




