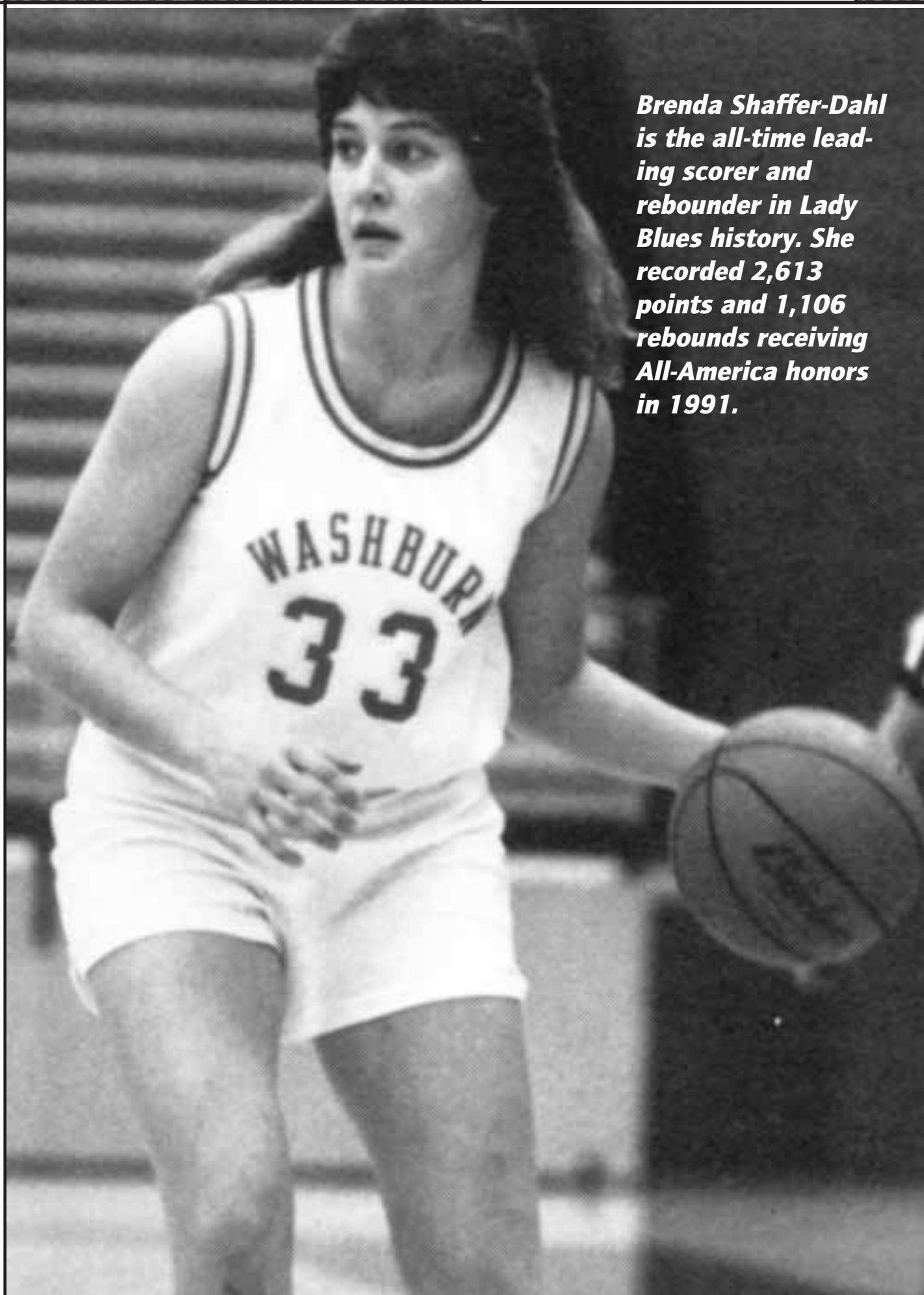

The 1992-93 Lady Blues

The 1992-93 season was full of firsts for Head Coach Patty Dick and her Lady Blues as the team enjoyed its best season in history.

The Lady Blues' first-ever undefeated regular season (26-0) was highlighted by the team's first No. 1 national ranking. That distinction came on Feb. 9, 1993, and the Lady Blues held onto the No. 1 spot for the remainder of the season.

Washburn won its first-ever MIAA regular season championship while claiming a postseason tournament crown for good measure.

The Lady Blues won their second straight NCAA South Central regional title to advance to the quar-

terfinals of the national tournament. It was in the quarterfinals that the Lady Blues suffered their only defeat of the season, losing, 78-77, in overtime to Michigan Tech, ending Washburn's season at 31-1.

The team set nine single-season Washburn team records, including wins (31), fewest losses (1), winning percentage (.969) and consecutive wins (31).

The squad also set team records for points scored (2,449), rebounds (1,341), free throws made (526) and free throw percentage (.773).

The Lady Blues also set or tied four MIAA records enroute to a sweep of league titles.
