**2006-07 WASHBURN BASKETBALL**



The Lady Blues, coming off their 2005 national championship, rolled through the regular season and MIAA Tournament without a loss in 32 games. With 19 wins at the end of the previous year, the Lady Blues broke the Division II record with 51 consecutive victories before their season was ended by Emporia State in the South Central Regional final in a heartbreakng 61-59 overtime loss.

### **The Battle for Number 1 Big Preseason Wins**

On Dec. 17, 2006, the Drury Lady Panthers came to Lee Arena on a snowy night as the No. 2 team in the nation and looked to not only knock off the Lady Blues and end their 27-game winning streak, but take over the No. 1 spot in the polls. However the Lady Blues had other ideas as Washburn pounded Drury 89-66. The Lady Blues led from start to finish building a 19-3 lead 6:14 into the game as Drury started 1 for 6 from the field compared to Washburn's 8 of 12 from the field. Jennifer Harris led Washburn with a then career-high 33 points on 10 of 19 shooting from the field and 10 of 13 from the charity stripe. She also had four assists, three blocks and two steals for the Lady Blues.

### **MIAA Champions**

The Lady Blues won their fourth consecutive MIAA regular season championship by going through the season with a 16-0 record. The Lady Blues became only the seventh team to run the table in conference play and the first since Emporia State did it during the 1997-98 season.

### **MIAA Tournament**

The Lady Blues won their NCAA II-tying 49th straight game as they wrapped up their third MIAA Tournament title in the last four years with a 75-71 win over Central Missouri State. After being held to three first-half points, Washburn senior Jennifer Harris scored 30 after halftime to fuel the come-from-behind win by the Lady Blues. Harris finished the three-game event with 75 points, one

shy of the tournament scoring record, and picked up Most Valuable Player honors. She added five rebounds and four assists to her 33 points in the title game. Washburn beat Missouri Western 73-60 in the semifinals and hammered Truman 63-36 in the first round game.

### **NCAA Tournament**

The Lady Blues opened the NCAA Regional Tournament in Topeka with a 92-58 win over St. Mary's (Texas). St. Mary's made just one of its first 18 shots from the field (a three-pointer by senior forward Juliett Williams at the 12:39 mark), as Washburn ran out to a 44-9 lead with 4:56 remaining in the half. The Lady Blues out-scored the Rattlers, 28-2, between the first and second field goals made by St. Mary's in the game.

In the semifinals, the Lady Blues took on Central Missouri for the second time in seven days, and Harris led a second-half rally for the top-ranked Lady Blues as they came back from an 11-point second-half deficit to defeat the Jennies 65-51.

In the finals, Washburn saw their chance at defending their NCAA title from 2005 slip away as No. 8 Emporia State handed No. 1 Washburn its first loss in 52 games, in a 61-59 overtime setback in the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball South Central Regional final in Lee Arena.

### **Postseason honors**

The Lady Blues' Jennifer Harris was named the consensus national player of the year by the WBCA, CoSIDA/Daktronics and the Division II Bulletin after leading the nation with a 24.2 points per game scoring average.

April Roadhouse was named the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year after being named to the team the three previous seasons. Cindy Keeley was also named to the MIAA's all-defensive team.

Brooke Ubelaker was named first team All-MIAA after tying the Washburn record for 3-pointers in a career with 144 and averaging 16.6 points per game. Ubelaker also received honorable mention All-American honors as well.

## Lady Blues 51-game winning streak

The 51-game winning streak began on Jan. 26, 2005 with a 73-49 win over Pittsburg State in Topeka and ended on March 13, 2006 with a 61-59 overtime loss to Emporia State in the NCAA Regional Final.

The top-ranked Washburn Lady Blues won their 50th consecutive game in a 92-58 victory over St. Mary's (Texas) on March 10 in Lee Arena. The 51st win came in a 65-51 win over Central Missouri the following night in the NCAA regional semifinals.

The Lady Blues snapped the previous record held by North Dakota State who had streak of 49 (2/25/94 to 12/15/95) and 42 (1/19/06 to 3/8/97). The 51 consecutive wins is the fourth longest in women's basketball regardless in NCAA history trailing Washington (Mo.) 81, Connecticut - 70, Louisiana Tech (54).
