The 2000-01 Washburn University Women's Basketball Media Guide is intended to provide information for writers, broadcasters, sports editors, sports information personnel and fans who follow the Lady Blues. Material in the guide was current as of the printing deadline of Oct. 23, 2000. Additional information is available in the Washburn Sports Information Office and through weekly releases available to personnel from accredited media outlets covering the Lady Blues.

Washburn University is in Topeka, Kan., at the intersection of 21st Street and Washburn Avenue. Lee Arena is located in the Petro Allied Health Center at the east edge of the Washburn campus. Parking for the facility is adjacent to Washburn Avenue.

The Washburn University Sports Information Office is located in room 352 of Whiting Fieldhouse. Office hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Media credentials are available to personnel from accredited media outlets by contacting Gene Cassell, Sports Information Director, Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas, 66621. Credentials are available 60 minutes before tipoff at the Will Call window at the northeast entrance of Lee Arena. All media seating in the Lee Arena press box is reserved on a game-by-game

basis and space is limited. Please contact the Sports Information Office at least four days before the game date to ensure a seat in the press box.

Radio stations wishing to broadcast from Lee Arena should make broadcast requests through the Sports Information Office at least one week prior. One courtesy line will be made available to the official station of each visiting team. Additional stations wishing to broadcast must install their own line. KWIC 99.3 FM is the official broadcast station of the Washburn Ichabods and Lady Blues.

Telephone lines for writers to file their stories are available in the Sports Information Office. There are two telephone for writers to file stories in the Lee Arena press box. Writers wishing to file via telephone lines should contact the Sports Information Office to make arrangements.

Media services include a game program and lineups, plus statistics and game notes for each team. Halftime stats are provided as well as individual and team stats and a play-by-play summary. Statistics are kept on the Automated Scorebook computer system by MRR Systems. Pizza and refreshments are available before each game.

Postgame interviews with Coach Ron McHenry are available to media personnel after his brief meeting with the team immediately following the game. Players will be brought, by request, to the Lee Arena press box.

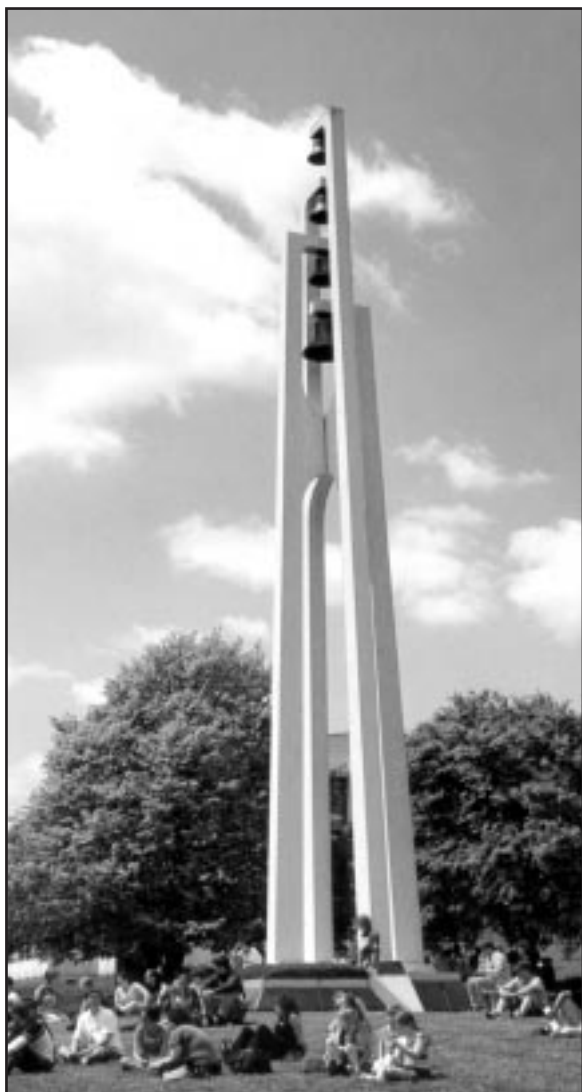


Washburn University, founded in 1865, is one of the oldest universities in Kansas.

University President



Dr. Jerry B. Farley enters his third year as the president of Washburn University after a long association with the University of Oklahoma in Norman.

Farley previously held the position of vice president for community relations and economic development at OU and V.P. for Administrative Affairs at the Norman and Health Sciences Center campuses.

Before that, he held the position of vice president for business and finance at Oklahoma State University and previously served as the associate vice president for administrative affairs and

controller at the University of Oklahoma, Norman campus.

He earned his B.B.A. in accounting and finance and his M.B.A and Ph.D. in higher education administration from OU.

He is a past president of the Southern Association of College and University Business Officers and is actively engaged in state and national associations of the College and University Business Officers.

Dr. Farley has been on the Board of Directors of the American Red Cross, the American Cancer Society, Oklahoma Teachers' Retirement System, the Norman Chamber of Commerce and the Norman Economic Development Coalition.

A Winning Tradition

Washburn teams compete for NCAA Division II championships as a member of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA).

Washburn currently offers intercollegiate competition for men in the sports of baseball, basketball, football, golf and tennis. Women compete in basketball, softball, tennis and volleyball.

Success has been obtained by both teams and individuals. The Ichabod football team continues its move toward the top of the conference after recording its first winning season since 1988 after going 6-5 last season.

The Ichabods basketball team has won seven MIAA regular season championships in the last 14 years and advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament during those same seasons. The Ichabods advanced to the NCAA Regional Tournament last season. The Ichabods reached the semifinals of the national tournament in 1994.

The Lady Blues basketball team reached the "Sweet 16" of its 1995 national tournament while making a fifth straight appearance at the national event. In 1996-97, WU was the top-ranked academic team in NCAA Division II, and the second ranked during the 1997-98 school year.

The volleyball program accomplished its second winning season since 1986 three seasons ago and notched its first upper division MIAA finish in the same year.

The men's tennis team was selected for its third appearance in the NCAA Division II national tournament in 1998. The women's tennis team also advanced to the NAAs and hosted the Midwest Regional on campus this past season for the third straight year.

Both the baseball and softball teams have had much success in recent years. The Ichabods finished second in the MIAA and advanced to the MIAA Championship game. The Lady Blues were MIAA co-champs in 2000 and were runner-ups in the conference tournament.

The Ichabod golf program has made great strides since joining the MIAA. Washburn was ranked in the nation's top-25 in 1998 and made its first ever NCAA appearance.

Individually, many student-athletes earn all-conference, all-region and All-America honors each year. During the 1999-2000 season, 39 student-athletes representing all nine of Washburn's teams earned an all-MIAA honor in their respective sport.

While Washburn strives for success on the playing field, the university also takes pride in the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes.

During the 1999-2000 academic year, 94 of the university's 196 student-athletes maintained a 3.0 grade point average or above. Forty-five Ichabods and Lady Blues representing nine Washburn teams were named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll for their respective sport. The cumulative grade point average entering the 2000 fall semester was 2.85.

Each year, several student-athletes are honored at the district or national level through the GTE Academic All-America program. Washburn placed two student-athletes on national all-America teams. Baseball player Pat Colley and football player Aaron Doonan were each named to the second team in their respective sport.

Loren Ferré Athletics Director



Loren Ferré became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D.

Ferre' is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

In his three-plus years at Washburn, Ferré has been instrumental in the establishment of a strong Ichabod Club support team and the raising of funds for athletic scholarships. In addition, he created a position for a full-time marketing and promotions director who will help bring in new private dollars for scholarships and more excitement at all Washburn athletic contests.

While at BHSU, Ferré was also director of the Donald E. Young Sports Fitness Center, a 172,000 square foot, \$10.2 million facility. During his Black Hills tenure, the athletics department nearly tripled its outside revenue, including large increases in ticket sales and scholarship funding. All 10 varsity teams won a conference title in his final three years.

Before joining the staff at Black Hills State, Ferré spent 17 years at the University of North Texas. He was the director of the Coliseum (1987-90) and prior to that was the associate and assistant director since 1980. He held the post of event coordinator (1978-80).

Ferre' is a 1971 graduate of Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of arts degree. He earned a master's in journalism from North Texas in 1982. He is currently completing course requirements for a doctorate of education in sports administration from the University of Northern Colorado.

Ferre' and his wife Sarah, have two daughters, Caitlin and Hope, and reside in Topeka.

Jordan Canfield is entering his third year as Washburn's associate athletics director for development.

Canfield returned to his alma mater after a year in private business. He was a first team all-MIAA guard for the Ichabods in 1996-97 and holds every Washburn and all but one MIAA assist record, including the career assist mark he set as a senior. He won four conference titles in his four years on the basketball hardwood from 1992-97.

Canfield's main responsibility is to increase scholarship dollars for one of the best small college athletic programs in the country. He oversees the fund-raising efforts of the Ichabod Club, the Athletics Department booster club, and the Washburn Athletic Fund, a major giving campaign initiated by Canfield.

Canfield is a 1996 graduate of Washburn University with a BBA degree in finance. He went on to earn an additional degree in economics in 1997 and has begun work on his MBA. He is married to Eileen Brungardt, a member of the Lady Blues volleyball team while at Washburn. The couple lives in Topeka with their son, Jordan Jett who was born last year.

Janet Degginger is entering her 13th year as Washburn's assistant athletics director.

Degginger returned to her alma mater in 1987 as assistant director of athletics. Lady Blues Basketball

Lee Arena has served as the home of Washburn basketball since the 1984-85 basketball season. The arena has a capacity of 4,298, twice that of Whiting Fieldhouse, which housed the home court prior to 1984.

Lee Arena has provided an outstanding homecourt advantage for both the Ichabods and Lady Blues.



Since the Lady Blues christened Lee Arena with a 89-65 win over Friends on Nov. 20, 1984, the team has posted an overall home record of 206-48 (.811).

The recent success of the Washburn basketball teams combined with an outstanding facility in Lee Arena has led the NCAA to select Washburn as a host site for postseason competition. The Lady Blues are 3-1 in NCAA postseason play in Lee Arena. On July 6, 1999, Lee Arena was fitted with a new basketball court design. The previous design was the original found on the court when Lee Arena opened for its

first basketball game on Nov. 17, 1984.

The new court, which was designed by Sports Information Director Gene Cassell, features major changes, including a filled-in 3-point circle and an enlarged Washburn "W" in the center of the court.

The arena was built as part of the \$8.4 million Kelsey H. and Edna B. Petro Allied Health Center, the largest building on campus covering more than 126,000 square feet. Lee Arena is named after former Washburn baseball coach and player Bob Lee and his wife, Sallee, to recognize their \$250,000 donation.
