scored 30 points, while Brooke Ubelaker and Bojana Samardziska added 23 and 14 points respectively. Washburn's Ubelaker was named the Classic's MVP and Harris was named to the all-tournament team as well.

UBELAKER NAMED MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Brooke Ubelaker was named Wilson/MIAA Women's Basketball Player of the Week by the conference Monday.

Ubelaker, a 5-foot-10 junior from Osborne, Kan., averaged 25 points, seven rebounds, 2.5 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.5 blocks as she collected Most Valuable Player honors at the Missouri Southern Pizza Hut/Fairfield Inn Classic last weekend.

She was one point shy of a career high with 27 to go with five rebounds, two assists, one block and one steal as the top-ranked Lady Blues defeated Central Oklahoma, 96-59, Friday night (Nov. 18).

That was followed with a 23-point, nine-rebound performance in a 92-40 defeat of Southwestern Oklahoma State the next day. Ubelaker was 5-of-8 from the three-point line in the game, and added three assists, three steals and two blocked shots.

For the weekend, she was 17-of-29 from the field (58.6 percent), 8-of-16 from the three-point arc (50.0 percent) and a perfect 8-of-8 at the foul line.

THE COACHES: Since his appointment as head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, Ron McHenry has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In 2004-05, McHenry was named MIAA Coach of the Year and Molten/Division II Bulletin National Coach of the Year after guiding Washburn to its first-ever NCAA Division II crown in any sport. He also led the Lady Blues to a third straight MIAA regular season title, an MIAA Tournament title and a South Central Regional title with a 35-2 record.

In his five seasons McHenry has posted a **129-32 (.801)** record overall and **67-23 (.744)** record in the MIAA. He is 114-18 the last four seasons. He is third among active women's NCAA Division II Coaches in winning percentage.

The Lady Blues posted a 26-5 record and winning a second straight MIAA regular season crown in 2003-04. The Lady Blues also earned a berth to the NCAA Division II National Tournament for the third straight year.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history.

In his second season McHenry engineered one

of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

Sharon Turner-Dean is in her fourth season at CSU-Stanislaus, posting a 27-40 record. She is a 1986 graduate of San Jose State.

Reggie Carrick is in his second season at West Virginia Tech, posting a 10-19 record overall.

WASHBURN AGAINST CAL-STATE STANISLAUS

ALL-TIME: Washburn is 2-0 all-time against CSU-Stanislaus, winning the last meeting 82-58 in Turlock, Calif. Dec. 30, 1992 in the CSU-Stanislaus Invitational. Rhonda Matzke scored 29 points to lead five WU players in double figures.

WASHBURN AGAINST WEST VIRGINIA TECH

ALL-TIME: Washburn has never faced West Virginia Tech.

points a game, while Brittany Cartwright is averaging a team-best 8.5 rebounds a game.

LADY BLUES IN THE FINAL NATIONAL STATS IN 2004-05:

Washburn was ranked fourth in scoring defense (53.1), eighth in scoring margin (+19.1), 10th in rebounding margin (+8.4), 10th in field goal defense (34.7%), 13th in field goal percentage (46.1%) and 24th in 3-pointers per game (6.8) as a team in the final NCAA stats on March 27, 2005.

Carla Sintra was 11th in field goal percentage (57.5%), while Brooke Ubelaker was 37th at 53.3% from the field.

HARRIS READY TO PROVIDE SCORING PUNCH AGAIN AS A SENIOR AND FINISH SUCCESSFUL COLLEGIATE HOOPS CAREER:

Senior Jennifer Harris led the Lady Blues with 14.4 points a game but earned just honorable mention All-MIAA honors last season. Harris had a career-high 31 points in the regional final against Emporia State March 14. She was named South Central Regional MVP. She also scored 21 points (all in second half) at Kansas Dec. 2, and a then-career best 26 points at Drury Dec. 11 last season.

Harris, named to the Division II Bulletin's Super 16 Preseason All-American team, has a 101-3 record in her collegiate career after going 30-1 (2002-03) & 36-0 (2003-04) to win a national title at Trinity Valley Community College and 35-2 with the Lady Blues last season.

ROADHOUSE DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guard April Roadhouse dished out 138 assists with only 59 turnovers to lead the MIAA with a 2.34 assist/turnover ratio last season. Her 3.73 assists per game were eighth in the MIAA. She led the league with 101 assists and 42 turnovers as a sophomore in 2003-04 and was also 10th in the MIAA with 3.26 assists a game.

Roadhouse has **283** assists in her career and is tied for **ninth** in Washburn history with Shelly Foster.

UBELAKER READY TO LEAD LADY BLUE FRONT COURT DURING JUNIOR CAMPAIGN:

Junior Brooke Ubelaker followed a stellar freshman campaign with a great sophomore season. The Osborne, Kan. native made 185 of 347 field goal attempts (53.3 percent) to finish 37th in NCAA rankings and made 55 of 77 free throws (71.4 percent). She earned All-MIAA first team honors and second team All-South Central Region honors.

Ubelaker has 794 points and 382 rebounds in her two seasons at Washburn for 11.7 points and 5.6 rebounds a game average. She has also made 73 of 170 3-point attempts for a 42.9 percent clip in her career.

Ubelaker currently has **844** points and **396** rebounds in her career. She passed former teammate Carla Sintra to move into **22nd** in scoring and is **26th** in rebounding in Washburn career history.

LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 19th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are **268-53** (.835) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-0 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by a 78.2-49.9 average. The Lady Blues were 13-1 in Lee Arena in 2003-04, 16-1 in 2002-03 and 15-1 in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight home games after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn also won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan. 29, 2003. The last loss prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU 78-76 in double overtime on Jan. 7 2004. Washburn is **66-8** in home games under Ron McHenry. The Lady Blues currently have a **21-game** winning streak in Lee Arena.

LADY BLUES HISTORY: Washburn is 610-315 (.659) in its 37th season of intercollegiate action.

LADY BLUES FIRST IN PRESEASON WBCA NATIONAL POLL (NOV. 9, 2005): The Washburn Lady Blues basketball team was No. 1 in the WBCA NCAA Division II Top 25 Poll released Tuesday. The Lady Blues received 18 first place votes.

It was also the 46th straight WBCA National Poll that the Lady Blues have been ranked in the top 25.

The Lady Blues were ranked in all 16 polls each of the last two seasons and were ranked in the last 14 polls in the 2002-03 season after entering the poll Dec. 11, 2002.

TURNING UP THE D: Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation in 2001-02 by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further each season.

In the final statistics report on in 2002-03, Washburn led the MIAA and was 12th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.6 points a game.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and finished 10th in the nation by holding opponents to 55.8 points a game in 2003-04.

Washburn allowed just 1964 points in 2004-05 for a 53.1 per game average to lead the MIAA and finish fourth in the final NCAA Division II statistics. The Lady Blues were also 10th in NCAA stats with an +8.4 rebounding margin.

WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last four seasons with a combined 60-12 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2004-05. Missouri Western (51-21), Emporia State (51-21), Central Missouri (38-34) and Pittsburg State (36-36) are the other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Northwest Missouri (35-37), Missouri Southern (35-37), Southwest Baptist (29-43), Truman State (17-55) and Missouri-Rolla (7-65) are below .500.

- The Lady Blues were No. 1 in the WBCA Division II Preseason Coaches Poll, which was released Nov. 9. The Lady Blues were ranked No. 2 in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll. Senior guard Jennifer Harris was a Super 16 selection as part of the Bulletin's preseason All-American team.

The Lady Blues were picked first by picking up six first place votes in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Emporia State was ranked second with one first place vote in the poll.
