✓ LADY BLUES OPEN REGULAR SEASON AGAINST NATIONALLY-RANKED NAIA TEAM:

The Washburn Lady Blues host Evangel University Saturday night in Lee Arena. The Lady Crusaders are ranked No. 6 in the preseason NAIA Division II Poll, while the Lady Blues are No. 13 in the WBCA NCAA Division II Poll. Both squads finished last season in the quarterfinals of the national tournaments. Evangel is 1-0 on the season after a 52-44 win in Springfield, Mo. Tuesday night.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The tournament games will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with former Washburn quarterback Mark Elliott calling the play-by-play action and Bruce Steinbrock adding color analysis.

✓ **COACHES:** Since his arrival three seasons ago, **Ron McHenry** has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

Evangel head coach **Leon Neal**, 44, is entering his 15th year on the women's basketball coaching staff and his eighth as head coach. He was co-head coach with Lynn Bowen the five years prior to 1999-2000 and was an assistant for seven years for the lady Crusaders. Neal has also served as the head volleyball coach for two years (1998, 1999) and was the assistant men's basketball coach for 12 years, stepping down from that job prior to the 1998-99 season. Neal has put together an outstanding 150-78 overall coaching record during his seven years as head women's coach.

Neal's seven teams have all advanced to postseason play and, with the exception of two

squads, all won 20 or more games each season. His first team, the 1994-95 squad, finished 20-10. Then in 1995-96 Neal (and Bowen) had their best year ever. That team ended its season with a 33-5 mark, won the conference championship, won the post-season conference tournament and advanced to the final four round of the NAIA 11 national tournament. Neal's 1996-97 team finished 24-11 and in 1997-98, the Crusaders again finished strong with a 25-10 mark. Last year's team was also highly successful, earning a trip to the NAIA II national tournament and finishing with a 20-11 record. The 2000-01 Lady Crusaders also won the Heart of America Athletic Conference championship with a 16-4 record.

A former Crusader basketball standout and arguably one of the best players ever to wear the maroon and white, Neal earned NAIA All-America honors in 1978. He set a new season scoring record at Evangel during the 1977-78 season with 782 points and finished as the No. 13 scorer in the nation (NAIA). In his two-year career at Evangel, Neal averaged 24.4 points per game. He transferred to Evangel from Cuesta College (Calif.), where he had also won all-America status.

A native of Los Angeles (Crenshaw High School), Neal and his wife, (assistant coach) Dawn, have a daughter, NaTasha, who is a member of the Lady Crusader basketball team. The Neals reside in Springfield.

✓ REPLACING FIVE SEASONS NO EASY TASK:

The Washburn Lady Blues will have to replace 70.1 percent (47.9 ppg) of the team scoring and 55.6 percent (20.2 rpg) of the team rebounding after the graduation of five seniors from last year's squad.

First team All-American Crystal Walker averaged 16.6 points and 7.0 rebounds a game as a senior last season, while All-MIAA selection Carissa Goeglein added 12.6 points and 5.1 rebounds a game as a senior. Senior guards Bethany McGraw and Kristy Chapman started three seasons for the Lady Blues and Gosia Czarnecka started 26 games last year.

✓ **ABOUT EVANGEL:** The Lady Crusaders are ranked No. 6 in the NAIA Division II National Poll and are the unanimous selection to win the Heart of

America Conference title. They opened the season with a 52-44 win over College of the Ozarks Tuesday night in Springfield, Mo.

Evangel returns three starters from last year's national quarterfinalist squad, including two-time All-American Natasha Neal. Neal earned first team All-American honors as a sophomore in 2002-03 after averaging 18.7 points and 5.0 rebounds a game. The Lady Crusaders finished 29-9 overall and 18-2 to tie for first in the Heart of America with William Jewell last season.

✓ **OSBORNE CONNECTION:** Evangel freshman guard Denise Hartzler was a former teammate of Washburn's April Roadhouse and Brooke Ubelaker at Osborne High School in Osborne, Kan.

The trio helped Osborne to two state titles in 1999-2000 and 2001-02.

✓ **THE SERIES:** The two squads have never met.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT AT KANSAS STATE NOV. 4:** MANHATTAN, Kan. - The Washburn Lady Blues fell 73-51 to Kansas State in their exhibition opener in Bramlage Coliseum.

The Lady Blues were cold from the field early, while Kansas State took a 26-8 lead with 7:54 left in the first half. The Wildcats stretched the lead to 30-11 before Washburn responded.

Lora Westling hit two 3-pointers and Juwanna Rivers added a layup to pull the Lady Blues within 30-19 with 2:07 left in the opening half. Westling scored all 10 of her points in the half, as Washburn shot 26.9 percent (7-for-26).

Washburn opened the second half by scoring two early baskets, including a 3-pointer by Brooke Ubelaker to pull within 37-28 at the 18:32 mark. Washburn couldn't get any closer as Kansas State pulled away down the stretch.

Ubelaker led Washburn with 14 points by hitting 5 of 6 shots from the field. The Lady Blues finished the game 16 of 48 (33.3 percent) from the field, including 6 of 23 (26.1 percent) from beyond the arch. Nicole Ohlde led all scorers for K-State with 16 points.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 230-52

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 547-308 (.640) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LAST WBCA POLL (NOV. 7, 2003):

The Washburn Lady Blues opened No. 13 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier last season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 12th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.6 points a game.

✓ **WASHBURN IN THE FINAL NATIONAL STATS IN 2002-03:** The Washburn Lady Blues were ranked in the Top 50 in five team categories in the final NCAA Division II Women's basketball stats last season.

- Washburn was 12th in the nation in scoring defense, surrendering 56.6 points a game.
- Washburn was 6th in the nation in free throw percentage, making .773 percent from the foul line.
- Washburn was 42nd in rebounding margin, by outrebounding opponents 36.3 to 31.4 (4.9) a game.

- The Lady Blues were 24th in 3-point field goal percentage, making 36.4 percent beyond the arch.

- Washburn was 24th in the nation in scoring margin, outscoring opponents 68.3 to 56.6 (11.7) points a game.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- With a win over Central Missouri State Feb. 15, 2003 Washburn posted its second straight 20-win season last year for the first time since going 22-8 in 1993-94 and following with a 24-7 record in 1994-95.

- In their four losses last season the Lady Blues are shot 37.1 percent (83 of 224) from the field, including 28.3 percent (21 of 74) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.5 percent (754 of 1694) from the field and 37.7 percent (171 of 453) from 3-point range in its 30 victories.

- Washburn outshot opponents in 28 of 34 games last season. The Lady Blues had held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game until a season ending loss in the Elite Eight, where Northern Kentucky hit 52.2 percent (24 of 46) from the field.

- The Lady Blues were unranked in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**.

The Lady Blues were 13th in the **Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll**.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Emporia State was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
