✓ **LADY BLUES HIT ROAD TO TAKE ON MIAA-LEADING BEARCATS:** The No. 8 Washburn Lady Blues travel to Maryville, Mo. to take on Northwest Missouri State 5:30 p.m. Wednesday night. Washburn is 12-1 and 3-1 in the MIAA after beating Missouri-Rolla 64-53 in Rolla, Mo. Saturday afternoon. Northwest Missouri State is 11-2 and 4-0 in MIAA play after beating Missouri Southern 70-51 in Maryville Saturday. The Bearcats are tied with Emporia State for first in the MIAA.

Washburn has won six straight over the Bearcats and the last two in Bearcat Arena. Washburn won the last meeting 57-52 in the Sonic MIAA Tournament semifinals on March 8, 2003.

The Lady Blues are 39-19 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a 32-8 record the past three seasons. The Lady Blues have won 11 of their last 12 MIAA games.

✓ **COACHES:** Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, **Ron McHenry** has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted a **78-26 (.750)** overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

Northwest Missouri State University head women's basketball coach **Gene Steinmeyer** took over the Bearcat program in 1999. He is currently in his fifth season and has posted a 54-66 record at Northwest and has a 414-207 record in 20 seasons overall.

Steinmeyer was named MIAA Coach of the Year in 2003, leading the Bearcats to a 16-12 mark. Northwest advanced to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament for the first time in more than a decade during the 2002-03 season.

Steinmeyer came to Northwest from Doane College in Crete, Neb., where he put together a very impressive program. At Doane, Steinmeyer had a record of 366-135. He took Doane to eight conference championships, three district titles and made three consecutive NAIA Final Four appearances.

Steinmeyer has been named NAIA District 11 Coach of the Year five times and Nebraska State College Coach of the Year twice.

Prior to his tenure at Doane, Steinmeyer found success in the high school coaching ranks. In five years as the head girls' coach at Wilber-Clatonia (Neb.) High School, he won a state championship, two conference titles and a district championship.

He has also served as an assistant boys' basket-

ball coach at Milford (Neb.) High School and Humboldt (Neb.) High School.

Steinmeyer holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska-Kearney. He earned his master's degree from Nebraska-Lincoln in 1988

✓ **SCOUTING THE BEARCATS:** MARYVILLE, Mo. - Northwest Missouri State defeated Missouri Southern, 70-51, Saturday afternoon in Bearcat Arena to remain undefeated in MIAA play.

The Lions held the lead for most of the first half and had the advantage at the break, 28-27, but the Bearcats came out hot in the second half.

With 16:38 remaining in the game, Sarah Vollertsen hit a jumper that put the 'Cats in the lead for good. Her jumper ignited a 16-2 run, which included Northwest's first three-pointer of the day by Ashely Poptanycz, giving the Bearcats a 15-point lead with 11 minutes remaining.

The Lions continued to battle, but the Northwest defense proved to be too much. The 'Cats forced 28 turnovers on the day, with 10 of those coming in the second half.

Vollertsen led the 'Cats with her second consecutive double-double. She notched a career-high tying 23 points and 10 boards, while Poptanycz added 18 points and five boards.

Vollertsen leads Northwest with 15.2 points and 9.6 rebounds a game. She is first in the conference in rebounding and third in scoring. Brooke Hogue leads the MIAA with 2.92 3-pointers a game and has made 38 of 86 treys this season. The Bearcats have five players averaging double figures in scoring.

✓ **THE SERIES:** The Lady Blues are 29-5 against the Bearcats and have won the last six in the series. Washburn ended Northwest's season with a 57-52 win on March 8, 2003 in the Sonic MIAA Tournament semifinals.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT VS. MISSOURI-ROLLA JAN. 10, 2003:** ROLLA, Mo. - The No. 5 ranked Washburn Lady Blues improved to 12-1 and 3-1 in the MIAA with a 64-53 win over Missouri-Rolla. The Lady Blues will now travel to take on 11-2 and 4-0 Northwest Missouri who topped Missouri Southern 70-51 on Saturday afternoon.

a lead as many as 13 in the first half and took a 32-28 halftime lead, much in part to hitting 10 of 14 free throws compared to 4 of 4 for the Lady Blues.

In the second half, the Lady Blues would build a lead as many as 18 in the second half before taking the 11-point win.

The Lady Blues were led by Carla Sintra who scored 15 points. Alison Garrett scored 12 on 4 3-pointers and Montoya Whitfield scored 11 off the bench.

Washburn held UMR to 29 percent field goal shooting while connecting on 44 percent. In the game, UMR finished 23 of 32 from the free throw line while the Lady Blues were 10 of 18. The Lady Blues also forced 20 UMR turnovers. Washburn was rebounded for only the second time this season as the Lady Miners held a 38-32 advantage.

### ✓ WASHBURN VS. MISSOURI-ROLLA LEFTOVERS:

- Washburn beat Missouri-Rolla for the seventh straight time, including their fourth straight at the Bullman Multipurpose Building.
- Alison Garrett had a season-high 12 points by hitting a season-high four 3-pointers.
- Carla Sintra reached double figures with 15 points for the first time in MIAA play.
- The Lady Miners made (23) and attempted (32) more free throws than any other Washburn opponent this season.
- Washburn's 64 points were the fewest this season. The Lady Blues were also outrebounded for the second time this season.

**✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME VS. NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE ON MARCH 8, 2003:** KANSAS CITY, Mo. - The No. 9 ranked Washburn Lady Blues survived a furious comeback by the Northwest Missouri Bearcats to advance to the Sonic/MIAA Championship Tournament in a 57-52 win.

The Lady Blues jumped out to a 14-3 lead behind Lora Westling scoring the first nine points for Washburn. The Lady Blues would eventually build the lead to 16 in the first half on four different occasions cutting the lead to eight before April Roadhouse would push the lead back to 11 with a 3-point play as Washburn took a 30-19 lead into halftime.

In the second half, the Lady Blues pushed the lead to 17 at 45-28 with 9:43 remaining, but the Bearcats would go on a 20-4 run over the next six minutes to cut the lead to one at 49-48 with 3:11 left.

The Lady Blues would not hit a field goal for the final 4:23 of the ballgame, but they were 8 of 8 from the free throw line over the final 2:54 to preserve the win. The Bearcats would cut the lead again to one at 51-50, but from that point the Lady Blues were 6 of 6 in the final 48 seconds to finish the game.

Westling led the Lady Blues with 16 points and Crystal Walker finished with 11. The Lady Blues finished 12 of 13 for the game from the free throw stripe.

**✓ LADY BLUES RUNS LEADING TO BIG WINS:** Washburn has outscored opponents 83.0-52.5 in large part because of big runs in games this season. The Lady Blues have had 16 runs of 10 or more straight points in their first 13 games this season.

### ✓ LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH JAN. 11):

Washburn was ranked second in scoring margin (+30.5), third in rebounding margin (+13.0), third in 3-point field goal percentage (44.7%), 10th in scoring offense (83.0), 11th in scoring defense (52.5), 10th in 3-pointers per game (8.15), 14th in opponent field goal percentage (34.3%) and 13th in field goal percentage (47.4%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Jan. 11.

Alison Garrett was fourth in 3-point field goal percentage (56.2%), while fellow Burlington native Erin Menard was 14th in 3-point percentage (46.7%).

**✓ LADY BLUES OWN GLASS IN OPENING GAMES:** Washburn has outrebounded its first 13 opponents 566-397 (43.5 to 30.5) to own a +13.0 rebounding margin.

The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and are third in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn was outrebounded for just the second time against Missouri-Rolla.

**✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 236-53 (.817) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 46-7 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 559-309 (.644) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

## ✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (JAN. 13, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell to No. 8 in the fifth WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Jan. 20.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues **led** the MIAA and were **24th** in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn **led** the MIAA and was **12th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.6** points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are 11th in the nation by holding opponents to **52.5** points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES PUTTING UP RECORD NUMBERS OFFENSIVELY:** In 13 games Washburn has scored 1079 points (83.0 ppg) and is on pace to break the team season scoring average of 78.2 points a game set in 1988-89. The Lady Blues are second in the MIAA and 10th in the NCAA rankings in scoring average.

The Lady Blues have scored 90 points or more in four of 13 games this season, including a 106-point effort against Saint Mary on Nov. 22. It was the first time WU reached 100 points in 360 games.

Washburn has also hit **106 3-pointers** in the first 12 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of **192** from the 2002-03 season.

## ✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- Sophomore Erin Menard has hit at least one 3-pointer in each of her first 13 games at Washburn. Junior Lora Westling has made at least one 3-pointer in 12 of 13 games, while fellow junior Alison Garrett has hit 3-pointers in 11 of 13 games. Garrett (56.3%) leads the MIAA in 3-point field goal shooting percentage, while Westling (46.9%) is second and Menard is third (46.7%). Garrett is fourth in the NCAA rankings, while Menard is 14th in the country in 3-point field goal percentage. Westling was three 3-pointers away (min 2.0 3-pointers made) from being eligible for the national stats.

- Sophomore Dani McHenry had a string of 12 straight made free throws broken in overtime against ESU. She missed the second of two free throws and is now 14 of 16 on the year. McHenry's last miss before was Nov. 18 at Southeastern Oklahoma State.

- Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has made 45 of 82 field goal attempts (54.9 percent) and 20 of 22 free throws (90.9 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

- Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwana Rivers have combined for 87 assists with only 49 turnovers. Roadhouse is fourth in the MIAA with a 2.35 assist/turnover ratio with 47 assists and 20 turnovers. Rivers is eighth with a 1.38 ratio.

- The Lady Blues average margin of victory **30.5** is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures.

- The Lady Blues were unranked in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**. Washburn was **13th** in the **Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll**.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Emporia State was ranked first in the poll.
