✓ **LADY BLUES SET FOR TUESDAY MATCHUP AT SOUTHWEST BAPTIST:** The No. 8 Washburn Lady Blues travel to Bolivar, Mo. 5:30 Tuesday night to take on Southwest Baptist. The Lady Blues are 13-2 and 4-2 in the MIAA after a 73-55 win over Truman State Saturday afternoon. Southwest Baptist is 11-4 and 3-3 in MIAA action after a 64-52 loss at Missouri Southern Saturday.

Washburn is 14-10 all-time against the Lady Bearcats after winning the last five matchups between the two schools. Washburn has also won two straight in Bolivar after winning 56-50 in Davison Fieldhouse Feb. 6, 2003.

The Lady Blues are 40-20 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a 33-9 record the past three seasons.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** All Lady Blue games will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with former Washburn quarterback Mark Elliott calling the play-by-play action and Bruce Steinbrock adding color analysis. ✓ **COACHES:** Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, Ron McHenry has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted a **79-27 (.745)** overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

SBU's winningest women's basketball coach **Jim Middleton** is in his tenth year as the head of the Lady Bearcat basketball team. In 2001, he took the team to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the fourth consecutive season. The Lady 'Cats have traveled to post-season play six of the nine years Middleton has been at the helm of the program.

In July of 2001, Middleton added to his duties as the athletics director for SBU. He now dreams of taking the success he has had in his own program and help to make Bearcat athletics one of the best overall programs in the nation.

Middleton, whose record at SBU is 179-91 (.663), holds the most wins of any head women's basketball coach at the school and also has the highest winning percentage.

Middleton took his team to a berth in the Sweet 16 in 2000 and a second round trip in 2001. In 2000-01, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named Middleton the District VII Coach of the Year. At one time, his 1999-2000 team was ranked No. 7 in the nation.

He was named the new women's basketball coach at Southwest Baptist on April 4, 1994.

✓ SCOUTING THE LADY BEARCATS: JOPLIN, Mo. -

A 15-0 run with 16:18 left in the game put Missouri Southern State University ahead for good as they went on to defeat Southwest Baptist University 64-52. SBU was only behind 34-31 when MSSU made their run.

Junior Jenny Miller went 5 of 10 from the floor and 4 of 6 from the three-point line to record a career-high 15 points. Alicia Mercer added a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds.

At the 16:18 mark in the second half, Smith cut the MSSU lead to three, 34-31, after MSSU had taken a seven point lead. It was at this point that MSSU made their 15-0 run to put the game away. By the 9:26 mark

SBU reeled off nine straight points in three minutes to put the lead back to single digits at 49-40. SBU's momentum was stopped abruptly as MSSU made two jumpers in 45 seconds to regain a 13-point lead. SBU did get the lead back down to eight, 55-47, with 1:12 left, but it was too late for the comeback.

Amber Wheeler, who was MIAA freshman of the year in 2002-03, leads SBU with 14.5 points a game and has 31 3-pointers this season. Alecia Mercer is averaging 12.4 points, while Gwyn Smith and Jennifer Clymore are averaging 11.3 and 10.5 points a game respectively. Smith leads the MIAA with 9.1 rebounds a game.

✓ **THE SERIES:** The Lady Blues are 14-10 against the Lady Bearcats all-time after winning the last five meetings in the series. Washburn also has won the last two in Bolivar, including a 56-50 win at Davison Fieldhouse Feb. 6, 2003.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT AT TRUMAN STATE JAN. 17, 2003:** TOPEKA - Behind a career-best effort from Erin Menard, the No. 8 Washburn Lady Blues beat Truman State 73-55 in Lee Arena Saturday afternoon.

Menard hit 10 of 15 3-pointers to finish with a career-high 30 points to help Washburn improve to 13-2 and 4-2 in the MIAA. Menard broke the school record and was one shy of the MIAA record for 3-pointers made in a game.

The Lady Blues connected on 14 of 40 3-pointers as a team to break the school record for both made 3-pointers and attempted 3-pointers. Their 40 attempts was an MIAA record.

Washburn trailed Truman State by as many as seven in the first half, before Menard and Alison Garrett each hit two 3-pointers in the final six minutes of the half. Washburn used a 12-0 run late to take a 39-27 lead at the break.

After Garrett hit another 3-pointer to begin the second half, Menard added four treys in a four minute stretch to extend the lead to 58-37. Menard hit her 10th 3-pointer just before leaving the game for good with 4:29 left.

Sarah Sommer led Truman with 15 points, while Jamie Huffman added 12 points.

✓ WASHBURN VS. TSU LEFTOVERS:

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME VS. SOUTHWEST BAPTIST ON FEB. 6, 2003:** BOLIVAR, Mo. - Crystal Walker scored 20 of Washburn's 28 points in the second half, collecting a career-high 32 to lead the No. 12 Lady Blues to a rugged 56-50 victory over Southwest Baptist in an MIAA game at Davison Fieldhouse.

The win snapped a two-game losing streak for the Lady Blues and kept them tied for second place in the conference with Missouri Western, one game behind Emporia State.

Washburn led 28-18 at halftime with Southwest Baptist shooting a dismal 18.5 percent from the field (5 of 27). The Lady Blues made 13 of 26 shots and also outrebounded the Bearcats 23-13.

Walker scored WU's first 13 points of the second half before Carissa Goeglein made a 3-pointer for a 44-38 lead. Southwest Baptist was within two points when Lora Westling made a 3-pointer, and twice the Bearcats cut WU's lead to one point but Walker scored on a baseline drive and Goeglein made two free throw with 30 seconds remaining to keep the Lady Blues on top.

Goeglein scored 10 points and Westling, making her second start of the season, had 7 points, 5 rebounds, 5 assists and 4 steals.

✓ **LADY BLUES RUNS LEADING TO BIG WINS:** Washburn has outscored opponents 80.7-53.7 in large part because of big runs in games this season. The Lady Blues have had 17 runs of 10 or more straight points in their first 15 games this season.

✓ LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH JAN. 11):

Washburn was ranked second in scoring margin (+30.5), third in rebounding margin (+13.0), third in 3-point field goal percentage (44.7%), 10th in scoring offense (83.0), 11th in scoring defense (52.5), 10th in 3-pointers per game (8.15), 14th in opponent field goal percentage (34.3%) and 13th in field goal percentage (47.4%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Jan. 11.

Alison Garrett was fourth in 3-point field goal percentage (56.2%), while fellow Burlington native Erin Menard was 14th in 3-point percentage (46.7%).

✓ **LADY BLUES OWN GLASS IN OPENING GAMES:** Washburn has outrebounded its first 15 opponents 642-465 (42.8 to 31.0) to own a +11.8 rebounding margin.

The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and are third in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn has been outrebounded just twice this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville and at Missouri-Rolla).

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 237-53 (.817) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight home games after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan. 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 46-7 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 560-310 (.644) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (JAN. 13, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell to No. 8 in the fifth WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Jan. 20.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and

was **12th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.6** points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are 11th in the nation by holding opponents to **53.7** points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES PUTTING UP RECORD NUMBERS OFFENSIVELY:** In 14 games Washburn has scored 1211 points (80.7 ppg) and is on pace to break the team season scoring average of 78.2 points a game set in 1988-89. The Lady Blues are second in the MIAA and 10th in the NCAA rankings in scoring average.

The Lady Blues have scored 90 points or more in four of 13 games this season, including a 106-point effort against Saint Mary on Nov. 22. It was the first time WU reached 100 points in 360 games.

Washburn has also hit **127 3-pointers** in the first 15 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of **192** from the 2002-03 season. Washburn hit a school record 14 3-pointers and broke the MIAA record for attempts (40) against Truman on Jan. 17.

✓ BURLINGTON GUARDS RAINING TREYS:

Burlington natives Erin Menard and Alison Garrett have been among the MIAA's and nation's best in making 3-pointers this season. Menard has hit 42 of 85 treys, while Garrett has hit 30 of 55 from beyond the arch this season.

Menard is second in the MIAA (15th NCAA) in 3-point field goal percentage at 49.4% and is tied for first in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.80 3s per game.). Garrett is first in the MIAA (4th in NCAA) in 3-point field goal percentage at 54.5% and seventh in 3-pointers made (2.0 per game).

Menard's 10 3-pointers against Truman broke Brenda Schaffer-Dahl (Feb. 16, 1988 vs. ESU) and Rhonda Matzke's (Jan. 30, 1993 vs. NEMSU-now TSU) school record of seven. UMSL's Laura Satterfield (vs. Tampa Nov. 11, 1994) and PSU's Jenni Miller (vs. TSU Jan. 28, 1995) own the MIAA record with 11 3-pointers. California's (Pa.) Lara Thornton set the NCAA Division II record with 12 3-pointers against Clarion March 5, 1994.

The 10 3-pointers were also the most in Division II this season. South Dakota's Erin Bourne hit nine 3-pointers against William Penn on Nov. 29, 2003. Joy Gallagher of Division I Wagner is the only other women's player to reach double figures this year with 11 3-pointers against Boston University Dec. 30, 2003.

✓ DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwana Rivers have combined for 98 assists with only 57 turnovers. Roadhouse is fourth in the MIAA with a 2.26 assist/turnover ratio with 52 assists and 23 turnovers. Rivers is ninth with a 1.35 ratio.

Lora Westling is third in the MIAA with a 2.29 assist/turnover ratio with 48 assists and 21 turnovers.

✓ FRESHMAN MAKING HER MARK:

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has been making her mark in her freshman campaign. The Osborne, Kan. native has made 52 of 94 field goal attempts (55.3 percent) and 20 of 22 free throws (90.9 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

Ubelaker is also the first freshman to be a regular starter since Nikki Olberding started 27 of 31 games in 1994-95. Laura Mueller was the last Washburn freshman to start every game by making 33 starts in 1988-89.

Ubelaker's 8.7 points per game average is the highest for a Washburn freshman since Olberding scored 12.2 a game in 1994-95.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last three seasons with a combined 33-9 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2003-04. Missouri Western (32-10), Emporia State (28-14), Northwest Missouri (22-20) and Southwest Baptist (21-21) are the only other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Central Missouri (20-22), Pittsburg State (20-22), Missouri Southern (18-24), Truman State (13-29) and Missouri-Rolla (3-39) are below .500.

- The Lady Blues have had excellent balance in scoring this season. Five different players have led the Lady Blues in scoring and five players average between 8.7-10.9 points. Lora Westling's team-high 10.9 points a game would be the lowest average to lead the Washburn in team history. Kristy Chapman's 12.7 points a game led the Lady Blues in 2000-01 and was the lowest average to lead a team in school history.

- The Lady Blues average margin of victory **27.0** is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures.

- The Lady Blues were unranked in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**. Washburn was **13th** in the **Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll**.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Emporia State was ranked first in the poll.
