✓ **LADY BLUES BACK HOME TO HOST MISSOURI SOUTHERN:** The No. 9 Washburn Lady Blues are back home 5:30 p.m. Saturday to host Missouri Southern. The Lady Blues are 14-2 and 5-2 in the MIAA after a 63-41 win over Southwest Baptist Tuesday night. Missouri Southern is 11-5 and 2-5 in the MIAA after a 78-57 loss at Emporia State Wednesday night.

Washburn is 31-21 all-time against Missouri Southern and has won the last five in series. The Lady Blues have won six straight against Missouri Southern in Lee Arena.

The Lady Blues are 41-20 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a 34-9 record the past three seasons.

✓ **COACHES:** Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, **Ron McHenry** has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted a **80-27 (.748)** overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

**Maryann Mitts** is in her third season at Missouri Southern and holds a 43-31 (.581) mark at the school.

In her eighth year as a collegiate head coach, Mitts has a 126-88 (.589) ledger. A 1992 graduate of Rockhurst University, she has led Southern to back-to-back berths in the MIAApostseason tournament and took this year's edition to the team's best start since 1995-96.

✓ **SCOUTING THE LIONS:** The Lions trailed just 39-36 at halftime before falling 78-57 at Emporia State Wednesday night. The Lions were led by Aubrie Hallman's 25 points. It was Hallman's fourth 20-point performance of the season. Carol Koenig added 14 points.

The Lions, who opened the season 9-0, are led by Hallman's 15.9 points a game. Wyketha Harrell is averaging 11.7 points a game, while Koenig is averaging 10.4 points a game. Harrell leads Southern with 6.3 rebounds a game.

✓ **THE SERIES:** The Lady Blues 31-21 against Missouri Southern after winning the last five meetings between the two schools. Washburn beat Southern 61-55 on Senior Night in Lee Arena March 1, 2003 and has won the last six meetings in Topeka.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT AT SOUTHWEST BAPTIST JAN. 20, 2003:** BOLIVAR, Mo. - The No. 9 Washburn Lady Blues used a stellar defensive performance to beat Southwest Baptist 63-41 at Davison Fieldhouse Tuesday night.

Washburn held Southwest Baptist to 41 points by surrendering only 15 field goals in 41 attempts. The 41 points were the least by the Lady blues against MIAA opponent since Washburn topped Lincoln 89-38 Feb. 14, 1990 in Lee Arena. The points were also the least by the Lady Bearcats in the all-time series against Washburn.

Washburn led 17-16 in the opening half before going on a 13-2 run that was capped by Lora Westling's jumper with 53 seconds left. Amber Wheeler's jumper in the final seconds pulled SBU within 30-20 at the break.

Brooke Ubelaker scored nine of Washburn's first 12 points in the second half to cap a 12-2 run and increase the lead to 42-22 with 15:35 left. SBU didn't get within 16 the rest of the way.

Westling led Washburn with 15 points, including 11 in the first half. Brooke Ubelaker added 11 points and seven rebounds, while Carla Sintra had eight points and nine rebounds.

Washburn won its sixth straight over Southwest Baptist and third straight at Davison Fieldhouse to improve to 14-2 and 5-2 in the MIAA. Southwest Baptist fell to 11-5 and 3-4 in the MIAA.

## ✓ WASHBURN VS. SBU LEFTOVERS:

• Washburn won its sixth straight game against SBU and third straight at Davison Fieldhouse.

• Washburn held SBU to 41 points, which was the fewest in MIAA play since an 89-38 win over Lincoln Feb. 14, 1990 in Lee Arena.

• April Roadhouse had a season high with eight points. She also tied her career high.

• Carla Sintra had a career-high three steals.

## ✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME VS. MISSOURI SOUTHERN ON MARCH 1, 2003:

TOPEKA — The No. 11 Washburn Lady Blues (24-3, 15-3 MIAA) claimed the MIAA title outright with a 61-55 win over Missouri Southern on Senior Night in Lee Arena. The title was the second for Washburn, which won the MIAA title in 1992-93 with a 31-1 and 16-0 MIAA record.

The Lady Blues took an early 20-11 lead on Carissa Goeglein's jumper with 8:57 left in the opening half. Southern responded and took its first lead at 34-32 on Carol Koenig's 3-pointer from the right wing as the buzzer sounded.

Southern extended the lead to as many as six points in the second half, before Washburn took the lead for good on Lora Westling's jumper with 10:51 left.

Westling led the Lady Blues with 13 points, while Carissa Goeglein posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. Gosia Czarnecka added a season-high 10 points.

## ✓ LADY BLUES RUNS LEADING TO BIG WINS:

Washburn has outscored opponents 79.6-52.9 in large part because of big runs in games this season. The Lady Blues have had 17 runs of 10 or more straight points in their first 16 games this season.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH JAN. 18):** Washburn was ranked fourth in scoring margin (+27.1), third in rebounding margin (+11.8), third in 3-point field goal percentage (42.5%), 17th in scoring offense (80.7), 10th in scoring defense (53.7), 7th in 3-pointers per game (8.5), 16th in opponent field goal percentage (35.0%) and 21st in field goal percentage (46.4%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Jan. 18.

Alison Garrett was second in 3-point field goal percentage (54.5%), while fellow Burlington native Erin Menard was sixth in 3-point percentage (49.4%). Menard was 13th in 3-pointers per game (2.8).

### ✓ BURLINGTON BOMBERS RAINING TREYS:

Burlington natives Erin Menard and Alison Garrett have been among the MIAA's and nation's best in making 3-pointers this season. Menard has hit 44 of 88 treys, while Garrett has hit 32 of 58 from beyond the arch this season.

Menard is second in the MIAA (6th NCAA) in 3-point field goal percentage at 50.0% and is second in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.75 3s per game.). Garrett is first in the MIAA (2nd in NCAA) in 3-point field goal percentage at 55.2% and seventh in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.0 per game).

Menard's 10 3-pointers against Truman broke Brenda Schaffer-Dahl (Feb. 16, 1988 vs. ESU) and Rhonda Matzke's (Jan. 30, 1993 vs. NEMSU-now TSU) school record of seven. UMSL's Laura Satterfield (vs. Tampa Nov. 11, 1994) and PSU's Jenni Miller (vs. TSU Jan. 28, 1995) own the MIAA record with 11 3-pointers. California's (Pa.) Lara Thornton set the NCAA Division II record with 12 3-pointers against Clarion March 5, 1994.

The 10 3-pointers were also the most in Division II this season. South Dakota's Erin Bourne hit nine 3-pointers against William Penn on Nov. 29, 2003. Joy Gallagher of Division I Wagner is the only other women's player to reach double figures this year with 11 3-pointers against Boston University Dec. 30, 2003.

### ✓ DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwanna Rivers have combined for 106 assists with only 59 turnovers. Roadhouse is third in the MIAA with a 2.42 assist/turnover ratio with 58 assists and 24 turnovers. Rivers is ninth with a 1.14 ratio.

Lora Westling is fourth in the MIAA with a 2.22 assist/turnover ratio with 51 assists and 23 turnovers.

### ✓ FRESHMAN MAKING HER MARK:

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has been making her mark in her freshman campaign. The Osborne, Kan. native has made 57 of 103 field goal attempts (55.3 percent) and 20 of 22 free throws (90.9 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

Ubelaker is also the first freshman to be a regular starter since Nikki Olberding started 27 of 31 games in 1994-95. Laura Mueller was the last Washburn freshman to start every game by making 33 starts in 1988-89.

Ubelaker's 8.8 points per game average is the highest for a Washburn freshman since Olberding scored 12.2 a game in 1994-95.

✓ **BENCH BRIGADE:** Washburn's bench has scored 636 (49.9%) of the team's 1274 points this season. Montoya Whitfield (10.3 ppg) and Erin Menard (10.2 ppg), two of WU's double figures scorers for the season, come off the bench. Lora Westling is the only Washburn starter in double figures in scoring with 11.1 points a game. Washburn's bench has outscored opponents bench players 636-211 (39.8-13.2 ppg).

✓ **LADY BLUES OWN GLASS IN OPENING GAMES:** Washburn has outrebounded its first 16 opponents 672-491 (42.0 to 30.7) to own a +11.3 rebounding margin.

The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and are third in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn has been outrebounded just twice this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville and at Missouri-Rolla).



# Lady Blues Basketball

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 237-53 (.817) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season. The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 46-7 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 561-310 (.644) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

## ✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (JAN. 20, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell to No. 9 in the sixth WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Jan. 20.

## ✓ SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL RANKINGS (JAN. 21, 2004):

The Lady Blues were No. 8 in the first South Central Region rankings released by the NCAA Wednesday. Three automatic qualifiers (MIAA, Lone Star and Heartland conference's champions) and five at-large teams will advance to the South Central Region tournament March 12-15 at a site to be determined.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues **led** the MIAA and were **24th** in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn **led** the MIAA and was **12th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.6** points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are 10th in the nation by holding opponents to **52.9** points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES PUTTING UP RECORD NUMBERS OFFENSIVELY:** In 16 games Washburn has scored 1274 points (79.6 ppg) and is on pace to break the team season scoring average of 78.2 points a game set in 1988-89. The Lady Blues are second in the MIAA and 17th in the NCAA rankings in scoring average.

The Lady Blues have scored 90 points or more in four of 13 games this season, including a 106-point effort against Saint Mary on Nov. 22. It was the first time WU reached 100 points in 360 games.

Washburn has also hit **133 3-pointers** in the first 15 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of **192** from the 2002-03 season. Washburn hit a school record 14 3-pointers and broke the MIAA record for attempts (40) against Truman on Jan. 17.

## ✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last three seasons with a combined 34-9 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2003-04. Missouri Western (33-10), Emporia State (29-14) and Northwest Missouri (23-20) are the only other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Southwest Baptist (21-22), Central Missouri (21-22), Pittsburg State (20-23), Missouri Southern (18-25), Truman State (13-30) and Missouri-Rolla (3-40) are below .500.

- The Lady Blues have had excellent balance in scoring this season. Five different players have led the Lady Blues in scoring and five players average between 8.8-11.1 points. Lora Westling's team-high 11.1 points a game would be the lowest average to lead the Washburn in team history. Kristy Chapman's 12.7 points a game led the Lady Blues in 2000-01 and was the lowest average to lead a team in school history.

- The Lady Blues average margin of victory **26.8** is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures. Washburn is 14-0 in games with double digit victory margins and 0-2 in single digit victory margins.

- The Lady Blues were unranked in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**. Washburn was **13th** in the **Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll**.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Emporia State was ranked first in the poll.
