The Lady Blues are 15-2 and 6-2 in MIAA play after a 59-47 win over Missouri Southern in Lee Arena Saturday. Pittsburg State is 8-8 and 3-5 in the MIAA after a 77-67 win at Missouri-Rolla Saturday.

Washburn is 32-24 all-time against the Gorillas and has won the last four meetings. Washburn beat Pittsburg State in the last meeting 71-58 in Lee Arena Feb. 22, 2003.

The Lady Blues are 42-20 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a 35-9 record the past three seasons.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** All Lady Blue games will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with former Washburn quarterback Mark Elliott calling the play-by-play action and Bruce Steinbrock adding color analysis. COACHES: Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, **Ron** McHenry has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence. ■

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted a **81-27** (.750) overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the

first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

PSU head coach Steve High is in his 15th season at the helm of the Gorillas. High (Northern Iowa, '74) has compiled a 252-151 (.625) record as head coach at PSU, including two MIAA regular season titles ('92, '96) and five NCAA-II Tournament appearances ('92-93, '95, '97-98).

✓ SCOUTING THE GORILLAS: The Gorillas improved to 8-8 and 3-5 in the MIAA with a 77-67 win at Missouri-Rolla Saturday. Katie Spieker had a game-high 22 points and eight rebounds, while Kami Scrivner had 17 points and seven rebounds. Stephanie Shanline and Janelle Klein added 14 and 13 points respectively.

Scrivner leads the Gorillas with 15.0 points a game, while Spieker is averaging 14.0 points and a team-high 6.1 rebounds a game. Shanline and Klein are averaging 12.9 and 11.6 a game respectively for the Gorillas.

✓ THE SERIES: The Lady Blues are 32-24 in the all-time series with Pittsburg State after winning the last four meetings. Washburn won the last meeting 71-58 on Feb. 22, 2003 in Lee Arena and has won the last two in Pittsburg after a 75-68 win in John Lance Arena Jan. 25, 2003.

✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT VS. MISSOURI SOUTHERN JAN. 24, 2003: TOPEKA - The No. 9 Washburn Lady Blues topped Missouri Southern 59-47 in Lee Arena Saturday night. With the win, Washburn improved to 15-2 and 6-2 in the MIAA, while Southern fell to 11-6 and 2-6 in the MIAA.

With the score tied at 8, Washburn used a 7-0 run to take a 15-8 lead with 6:54 left in the opening half. Juwanna Rivers' 3-point play with three seconds left gave the Lady Blues a 31-22 lead at the break. Both teams struggled and made just 9 of 26 (34.6%) from the field.

The Lions got within 39-32 on Wyketha Harrell's basket early in the second half but couldn't get any closer the rest of the way.

Rivers led the way with a career-high 15 points on 5 of 7 field goals (3 of 5 3-pointers) and four assists. Lora Westling had 12 points and eight rebounds.

✓ WASHBURN VS. MSSU LEFTOVERS:

- Washburn won its sixth straight game against Missouri Southern and eighth straight in Lee Arena against MSSU.
- Washburn improved to 15-0 in games decided by 10 points or more.
- Juwanna Rivers had a career-high 15 points with a career-high three 3-pointers.
- Dani McHenry had a season high and tied a career high with four assists.
- · Erin Menard went scoreless for the first time in her career and also didn't make a 3-pointer in a game for the first time.

✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME VS. PITTSBURG **STATE ON FEB. 22, 2003:** TOPEKA — The No. 12 Washburn Lady Blues shook off a dismal shooting start to win 71-58 over in-state rival Pittsburg State in Lee Arena Saturday night. With the win Washburn improved to 22-3 and 13-3 in the MIAA and stayed tied with Emporia State for the MIAA lead.

The Lady Blues made just two of their first 12 shots in the opening half, before knocking in 13 of their last 17 in the half to surge to a 39-24 lead. Alison Garrett paced the Lady Blues by hitting three of her four 3-point shots for nine points. Garrett hit a 3-pointer with two seconds left in the opening half.

The Gorillas pulled within 41-33 on Amanda Davied's jumper with 16:47 left to cap a 9-2 run. The Lady Blues extended the lead to 54-37 with 9:28 on Kristy Chapman's two free throws. Chapman finished with a season high 19 points to lead the Lady Blues by hitting all six of her field goals and five of six free

Crystal Walker scored 18 points and grabbed five rebounds, while Carissa Goeglein added 13 points.

✓ LADY BLUES RUNS LEADING TO BIG WINS:

Washburn has outscored opponents 78.4-52.5 in large part because of big runs in games this season. The Lady Blues have had 17 runs of 10 or more straight points in their first 17 games this season.

✓ LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH JAN. 25): Washburn was ranked fourth in scoring margin (+25.9), fifth in rebounding margin (+10.5), third in 3-point field goal percentage (42.2%), 20th in scoring offense (78.4), ninth in scoring defense (52.5), 7th in 3-pointers per game (8.18), 25th in opponent field goal percentage (35.3%) and 24th in field goal percentage (45.9%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Jan. 25.

Burlington native Erin Menard was fifth in 3-point percentage (47.8%). Menard was 29th in 3-pointers per game (2.6). Alison Garrett's 54.2 percnet 3-point field goal percentage would lead the NCAA but Garrett does not have the 2.0 minimum 3-pointers per game to qualify.

✓ BURLINGTON BOMBERS RAINING TREYS:

Burlington natives Erin Menard and Alison Garrett have been among the MIAA's and nation's best in making 3-pointers this season. Menard has hit 44 of 92 treys, while Garrett has hit 32 of 59 from beyond the arch this season.

Menard is second in the MIAA (6th NCAA) in 3-point field goal percentage at 47.8% and is third in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.59 3s per game.). Garrett is first in the MIAA in 3-point field goal percentage at 54.2% and eighth in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (1.88 per game).

Menard's 10 3-pointers against Truman broke Brenda Schaffer-Dahl (Feb. 16, 1988 vs. ESU) and Rhonda Matzke's (Jan. 30, 1993 vs. NEMSU-now TSU) school record of seven. UMSL's Laura Satterfield (vs. Tampa Nov. 11, 1994) and PSU's Jenni Miller (vs. TSU Jan. 28, 1995) own the MIAA record with 11 3-pointers. California's (Pa.) Lara Thornton set the NCAA Division II record with 12 3-pointers against Clarion March 5, 1994.

The 10 3-pointers were also the most in Division II this season. South Dakota's Erin Bourne hit nine 3-pointers against William Penn on Nov. 29, 2003. Joy Gallagher of Division I Wagner is the only other women's player to reach double figures this year with 11 3-pointers against Boston University Dec. 30, 2003.

✓ DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwanna Rivers have combined for 113 assists with only 62 turnovers. Roadhouse is second in the MIAA with a 2.44 assist/turnover ratio with 61 assists and 25 turnovers. Rivers is ninth with a 1.41 ratio.

Lora Westling is fifth in the MIAA with a 2.17 assist/turnover ratio with 52 assists and 24 turnovers.

✓ FRESHMAN MAKING HER MARK:

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has been making her mark in her freshman campaign. The Osborne, Kan. native has made 58 of 107 field goal attempts (54.2 percent) and 20 of 22 free throws (90.9 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

Ubelaker is also the first freshman to be a regular starter since Nikki Olberding started 27 of 31 games in 1994-95. Laura Mueller was the last Washburn freshman to start every game by making 33 starts in 1988-89.

Ubelaker's 8.4 points per game average is the highest for a Washburn freshman since Olberding scored 12.2 a game in 1994-95.

✓ **BENCH BRIGADE:** Washburn's bench has scored 665 (49.9%) of the team's 1333 points this season. Montoya Whitfield (9.9 ppg) and Erin Menard (9.6 ppg), two of WU's top three leading scorers, come off the bench. Lora Westling is the only Washburn player double figures in scoring with 11.2 points a game. Washburn's bench has outscored opponents bench players 665-234 (39.1-13.8 ppg).

✓ LADY BLUES OWN GLASS IN OPENING GAMES: Washburn has outrebounded its first 17 opponents 704-525 (41.4 to 30.9) to own a +10.5 rebounding margin.

The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and are third in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn has been outrebounded three times this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville, at Missouri-Rolla and Missouri Southern).

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 238-53 (.818) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season. The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 47-7 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ LADY BLUES HISTORY: Washburn is 562-310 (.644) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (JAN. 20, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell to No. 9 in the sixth WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Jan. 20.

✓ SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL RANKINGS (JAN. 21, 2004):

The Lady Blues were No. 8 in the first South Central Region rankings released by the NCAA Wednesday. Three automatic qualifiers (MIAA, Lone Star and Heartland conference's champions) and five at-large teams will advance to the South Central Region tournament March 12-15 at a site to be determined.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues **led** the MIAA and were **24th** in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn **led** the MIAA and was **12th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.6** points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are 9th in the nation by holding opponents to **52.5** points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES PUTTING UP RECORD NUMBERS OFFENSIVELY:** In 16 games Washburn has scored 1333 points (78.4 ppg) and is on pace to break the team season scoring average of 78.2 points a game set in 1988-89. The Lady Blues are third in the MIAA and 20th in the NCAA rankings in scoring average.

The Lady Blues have scored 90 points or more in four games this season, including a 106-point effort against Saint Mary on Nov. 22. It was the first time WU reached 100 points in 360 games.

Washburn has also hit 139 3-pointers in the first 15 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of 192 from the 2002-03 season. Washburn hit a school record 14 3-pointers and broke the MIAA record for attempts (40) against Truman on Jan. 17.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

• The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last three seasons with a combined 35-9 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2003-04. Missouri Western (34-10), Emporia State (30-14), Northwest Missouri (23-21) and Central Missouri (22-22) are the only other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Southwest Baptist (21-23), Pittsburg State (21-23), Missouri Southern (18-26), Truman State (13-31) and Missouri-Rolla (3-41) are below .500.

• The Lady Blues have had excellent balance in scoring this season. Six different players have led the Lady Blues in scoring and five players average between 8.4-11.2 points. Lora Westling's team-high 11.2 points a game would be the lowest average to lead the Washburn in team history. Kristy Chapman's 12.7 points a game led the Lady Blues in 2000-01 and was the lowest average to lead a team in school history.

• The Lady Blues average margin of victory **25.9** is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures. Washburn is 15-0 in games with double digit victory margins and 0-2 in single digit victory margins. Washburn leads the MIAA and is fourth in the nation in scoring margin.

 The Lady Blues were unranked in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll. Washburn was 13th in the Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll.** Emporia State was ranked first in the poll.
