✓ LADY BLUES HIT ROAD FOR VALENTINE'S DAY MATCHUP AT TRUMAN STATE: The No. 13 Washburn Lady Blues travel to Kirksville, Mo. for a 1:30 p.m. game against Truman State. The Lady Blues are 19-3 and 10-3 in MIAA play after an 82-59 win over Southwest Baptist Wednesday night. Truman State, which has lost nine of its last 10 games, fell to 8-13 and 2-11 in the MIAA with an 89-61 loss at Northwest Missouri State Wednesday.

Washburn has posted a 24-8 record in the all-time series with Truman State after a 73-55 win over the Bulldogs in Topeka on Jan. 17. Truman State has won the last two and five of the last six meetings in Kirksville, including a 76-71 win Feb. 1 last season.

The Lady Blues are 46-21 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a 39-10 record the past three sea-

✓ **COACHES:** Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, **Ron McHenry** has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted an 85-28 (.752) overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, quiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

John Sloop became the eighth head coach in the 31-year history of the Truman women's basketball program in July of 2000. Sloop had spent the five previous years as the assistant for the Truman men's basketball team. Sloop has a 40-60 overall record as the Bulldog head coach.

✓ **SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS:** The Bulldogs are 8-13 and 2-11 in the MIAA after an 89-61 loss at Northwest Missouri State Wednesday night. The Bulldogs were led by Megan Patti's 13 points off the bench. Truman fell for the third straight outing and has lost nine of their last 10.

The Bulldogs are led in scoring by Sarah Sommer's 15.8 points and 6.9 rebounds a game. Jamie Huffman is averaging 11.4 points a game.

✓ **THE SERIES:** The Lady Blues own a 24-8 advantage in the all-time series, including a 73-55 win on Jan. 17 in Lee Arena.

✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT VS. SBU FEB. 11, 2004: TOPEKA - The No. 13 Washburn Lady Blues topped Southwest Baptist 82-59 in Lee Arena Wednesday night. The Lady Blues improved to 19-3 and 10-3 in the MIAA and pulled within one game of Emporia State and Northwest Missouri State for the

MIAA lead.

The Lady Blues took a 19-5 lead with 14:52 to play in the first half on back-to-back baskets by Montoya Whitfield. SBU rallied to tie the score at 29, before Washburn used a 3-pointer by Erin Menard and jumper with two seconds left by Carla Sintra to take a 34-29 lead at the break.

Southwest Bapist pulled within three on Amber Wheeler's layup seconds into the second half but couldn't get any closer the rest of the way. Washburn later used a 12-0 run to make it 65-42 with 8:22 left.

The run was capped by two 3-pointers from Menard.

Sintra had a team-high 18 points and seven rebounds to lead Washburn, while Menard finished with 15 points on 5-for-5 shooting beyond the arch. Menard has 52 3-pointers for the season, which ties Kristy Chapman's single season record from 2003-04. Wheeler had 21 points to lead SBU, while Alicia Mercer added a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

✓ WASHBURN VS. SBU LEFTOVERS:

- Washburn extended its winning streak to seven games against SBU.
- Washburn improved to 18-0 in games with double digit victory margins.
- The Lady Blues won their fifth straight in Lee Arena.
- Erin Menard's five 3-pointers moved her into a tie for first in single season 3-pointers with 52. Kristy Chapman had 52 last season.
- Menard also became the third player in the MIAA this season to hit five 3-pointers without a miss. Lora Westling also hit five 3-pointers without a miss against Saint Mary College Nov. 22. Menard was the first player to accomplish the feat in MIAA play.
 - Juwanna Rivers had a career-high eight assists.
- April Roadhouse tied a career-high with seven assists.

✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME VS. TRUMAN STATE ON JAN. 17, 2004: TOPEKA — Behind a career-best effort from Erin Menard, the No. 8 Washburn Lady Blues beat Truman State 73-55 in Lee Arena Saturday afternoon.

Menard hit 10 of 15 3-pointers to finish with a career-high 30 points to help Washburn improve to 13-2 and 4-2 in the MIAA. Menard broke the school record and was one shy of the MIAA record for 3-pointers made in a game.

The Lady Blues connected on 14 of 40 3-pointers as a team to break the school record for both made 3-pointers and attempted 3-pointers. Their 40 attempts was an MIAA record.

Washburn trailed Truman State by as many as seven in the first half, before Menard and Alison Garrett each hit two 3-pointers in the final six minutes of the half. Washburn used a 12-0 run late to take a 39-27 lead a the break.

After Garrett hit another 3-pointer to begin the second half, Menard added four treys in a four minute stretch to extend the lead to 58-37. Menard hit her 10th 3-pointer just before leaving the game for good with 4:29 left.

Sarah Sommer led Truman with 15 points, while Jamie Huffman added 12 points.

✓ LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH FEB. 8): Washburn was ranked fourth in scoring margin (+23.4), seventh in rebounding margin (+9.6), sixth in 3-point field goal percentage (41.0%), 36th in scoring offense (75.8), fifth in scoring defense (52.3), 11th in 3-pointers per game (7.5), 20th in opponent field goal percentage (35.5%) and 23rd in field goal percentage (46.0%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Feb. 8.

Burlington native Erin Menard was ninth in 3-point percentage (46.4%). Alison Garrett's 50.0 percent 3-point field goal percentage would be third in the NCAA stats but Garrett does not have the 2.0 minimum 3-pointers per game to qualify.

✓ BURLINGTON BOMBERS RAINING TREYS:

Burlington natives Erin Menard and Alison Garrett have been among the MIAA's and nation's best in making 3-pointers this season. Menard has hit 52 of 107 treys, while Garrett has hit 37 of 76 from beyond the arch this season. Menard's 52 treys ties a school record for 3-pointers in a season.

Menard is second in the MIAA (9th NCAA) in 3-point field goal percentage at 48.6% and is third in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.36 3s per game.). Garrett is first in the MIAA in 3-point field goal percentage at 48.7% and 10th in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (1.68 per game).

Menard's 10 3-pointers against Truman State Jan. 17 broke Brenda Schaffer-Dahl (Feb. 16, 1988 vs. ESU) and Rhonda Matzke's (Jan. 30, 1993 vs. NEMSU-now TSU) school record of seven. UMSL's Laura Satterfield (vs. Tampa Nov. 11, 1994) and PSU's Jenni Miller (vs. TSU Jan. 28, 1995) own the MIAA record with 11 3-pointers. California's (Pa.) Lara Thornton set the NCAA Division II record with 12 3-pointers against Clarion March 5, 1994.

The 10 3-pointers were also the most in Division II this season. South Dakota's Erin Bourne hit nine 3-pointers against William Penn on Nov. 29, 2003. Joy Gallagher of Division I Wagner is the only other women's player to reach double figures this year with 11 3-pointers against Boston University Dec. 30, 2003.

DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwanna Rivers have combined for 152 assists with only 86 turnovers. Roadhouse is first in the MIAA with a 2.48 assist/turnover ratio with 82 assists and 33 turnovers, while Rivers is eighth with a 1.32 assist/turnover ratio with 70 assists and 53 turnovers. Roadhouse is also 9th in the MIAA with 3.73 assists a game, while Rivers is 10th with 3.18 assists a game.

✓ FRESHMAN MAKING HER MARK:

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has been making her mark in her freshman campaign. The Osborne, Kan. native has made 80 of 140 field goal attempts (57.1 percent) and 30 of 34 free throws (88.2 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

Ubelaker is also the first freshman to be a regular starter since Nikki Olberding started 27 of 31 games in 1994-95. Laura Mueller was the last Washburn freshman to start every game by making 33 starts in 1988-89.

Ubelaker's 9.1 points per game average is the highest for a Washburn freshman since Olberding scored 12.2 a game in 1994-95.

✓ BENCH BRIGADE: Washburn's bench has scored 803 (48.0%) of the team's 1673 points this season. Montoya Whitfield (9.5 ppg) and Erin Menard (8.6 ppg) are WU's top leading scorers off the bench. Starters Lora Westling and Carla Sintra are the only Washburn players in double figures

scoring 10.4 and 10.6 points a game. Washburn's bench has outscored opponents bench players 803-279 (36.5-12.7 ppg).

✓ **LADY BLUES WINNING BATTLE OF THE BOARDS:** Washburn has outrebounded its first 22 opponents 896-676 (40.7 to 30.7) to own a +10.0 rebounding margin.

The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and were seventh in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn has been outrebounded three times this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville, at Missouri-Rolla and Missouri Southern).

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 241-53 (.820) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season. The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 49-8 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ LADY BLUES HISTORY: Washburn is 566-311 (.645) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (FEB. 10, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell four spots to No. 13 in the WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Feb. 10.

✓ SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL RANKINGS (FEB. 11, 2004):

The Lady Blues fell stayed at No. 6 in the South Central Region rankings released by the NCAA Wednesday. Three automatic qualifiers (MIAA, Lone Star and Heartland conference's champions) and five at-large teams will advance to the South Central Region tournament March 12-15 at a site to be determined.

✓ TURNING UP THE D: Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues **led** the MIAA and were **24th** in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn **led** the MIAA and was **12th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.6** points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are fifth in the nation by holding opponents to **52.6** points a game.

✓ LADY BLUES NEARING 3-POINT RECORD: Washburn has also hit 164 3-pointers in the first 22 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of 192 from the 2002-03 season. Washburn hit a school record 14 3-pointers and broke the MIAA record for attempts (40) against Truman on Jan. 17. Washburn leads the MIAA by hitting 39.5 percent beyond the arch and making 7.45 3-pointers a game.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last three seasons with a combined 39-10 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2003-04. Missouri Western (37-12), Emporia State (33-16) and Northwest Missouri (27-22) are the only other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Central Missouri (24-25), Southwest Baptist (23-26), Pittsburg State (23-26), Missouri Southern (22-27), Truman State (14-35) and Missouri-Rolla (3-48) are below .500.
- The Lady Blues have had excellent balance in scoring this season. Six different players have led the Lady Blues in scoring and five players average between 8.6-10.6 points. Carla Sintra's team-high 10.6 points a game would be the lowest average to lead the Washburn in team history. Kristy Chapman's 12.7 points a game led the Lady Blues in 2000-01 and was the lowest average to lead a team in school history.
- The Lady Blues average margin of victory **23.4** is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures. Washburn is 18-0 in games with double digit victory margins and 1-3 in single digit victory margins. Washburn leads the MIAA and is fourth in the nation in scoring margin.
- The Lady Blues were unranked in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll. Washburn was 13th in the Women's WBCA Division II
