✓ **LADY BLUES NEEDING A WIN TO PULL EVEN WITH NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE:** The No. 13 Washburn Lady Blues host No. 17 Northwest Missouri State 5:30 p.m. Wednesday in Lee Arena. Washburn is alone in third place in the MIAA with a 20-3 overall and 11-3 MIAA record after a 97-94 double overtime win at Truman State Saturday. Northwest Missouri State is tied with Emporia State for first in the MIAA with a 19-4 and 12-2 MIAA record after a 76-54 win at home against Pittsburg State Saturday.

Washburn owns a 29-6 record all-time against the Bearcats after falling 67-59 in the first meeting in Maryville, Mo. The loss was the only non-overtime loss of the season for Washburn and snapped a six-game winning streak in the series. The Lady Blues are 47-21 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a league-best 40-10 record the past three seasons.

✓ **COACHES:** Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, **Ron McHenry** has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted an **86-28 (.754)** overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

Northwest Missouri State University head women's basketball coach **Gene Steinmeyer** took over the Bearcat program in 1999. He is currently in his fifth season and has posted a 62-68 record at Northwest and has a 422-209 record in 20 seasons overall.

Steinmeyer was named MIAA Coach of the Year in 2003, leading the Bearcats to a 16-12 mark. Northwest advanced to the semifinals of the MIAA Tournament for the first time in more than a decade during the 2002-03 season.

Steinmeyer came to Northwest from Doane College in Crete, Neb., where he put together a very impressive program. At Doane, Steinmeyer had a record of 366-135. He took Doane to eight conference championships, three district titles and made three consecutive NAIA Final Four appearances.

✓ **SCOUTING THE BEARCATS:** The Bearcats are tied for first in the MIAA with a 19-4 overall and 12-2 MIAA record after a 76-54 win over Pittsburg State in Bearcat Arena Saturday.

The Bearcats opened with a 19-2 lead and never looked back behind 11-for-26 shooting beyond the arch. Erica Hatterman hit 5 of 9 3-point attempts and finished with a team-high 22 points. Sarah Vollertsen and Laura Friederich added 17 and 15 points respectively, while Ashely Poptanycz had a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Vollertsen leads Northwest with 13.1 points and 7.5 rebounds a game. Friederich and Poptanycz add 11.5 and 10.7 points a game respectively.

✓ **THE SERIES:** The Lady Blues own a 29-6 advantage in the all-time series despite a 67-59 loss to the Bearcats in Maryville Jan. 14 earlier this season. Washburn had won the previous six meetings prior to the loss.

Washburn has won the last 18 meetings and hold an 18-1 advantage over the Bearcats in Lee Arena. The Bearcats only win in Lee Arena was a 79-65 Nov. 30, 1985.

✓ **RIVERS EARNS WILSON/MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS:** Juwanna Rivers, a 5-7 junior from Cleveland, Ohio, scored 10 of her career-high 28 points in the two overtime periods, hitting key shots down the stretch as No. 13 Washburn won at Truman, 97-94, Saturday. Her efforts helped Rivers share Wilson/MIAA Player of the Week honors for the past week.

She had 18 points in regulation (nine in each half), including the three-point play which tied the game with 15 seconds left in regulation. Rivers also hit the bucket with 28 seconds left to send the game into the second overtime, and WU's last four points of the second extra session. Her rebound on the Bulldogs' tying three-point try sealed the win.

She also added four rebounds, three assists and two steals vs. Truman.

In the Lady Blues' 82-59 win over Southwest Baptist Wednesday, Rivers dished out a career high eight assists in 15 minutes of action, scoring two points.

For the week, she averaged 15.0 points and 5.5 assists, making 9-of-16 from the field (1-of-4 from the arc) and 11-of-15 at the foul line.

Rivers transferred to WU from Tyler (Texas) Junior College and is a 2001 graduate of East Technical High School in Cleveland, Ohio. She shared this week's award with Missouri Western's Eldra Paixao, who averaged 19 points, seven assists and 3.5 steals.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT AT TSU FEB. 14, 2004:** The Bulldogs took No. 13 Washburn into two overtimes but they came up just short in the end, falling 97-94 to the Lady Blues as the Lady Blues' Juwanna Rivers scored 10 of her career-high 28 points over the two overtime sessions as Washburn reached the 20-win plateau for the third time during head coach Ron McHenry's four-year tenure as the Lady Blues' head coach.

Rivers won the game for her team, taking over the contest in the second extra period. She scored six points in the second overtime, including the final four points of the game. Truman led by five early in the final period and still led 94-93 with a minute remaining. Rivers, however, converted on a layup with 36 seconds left to give the Lady Blues the lead. Following a Bulldog turnover, Rivers hit two free throws to push the lead to three and a last second three-point attempt by Truman was off the mark.

Washburn led almost the entire time in regulation. The team opened up a 13-point lead early in the first-half after a 12-0 run gave them a 30-17 advantage. The Bulldogs were able to cut into the deficit and only trailed 41-35 at the break.

The Lady Blues appeared comfortably ahead with a ten-point lead with less than eight minutes remaining in the game. Truman fought back though and took the lead at 78-76 when Adri Tromp hit a jumper with the shot clock going off with 46 seconds left in the game.

Following two Washburn misses, the Bulldogs got the rebound and hit one-of-two free throws to make it a three-point lead. Rivers tied the game after getting a three-point play with a layup and free throw after being fouled. Washburn knocked the ball out of bounds with one second left and Truman's final shot was no good.

Rivers ended the game with 28 for Washburn, 10 of which came in overtime. Carla Sintra added 20 points and Lora Westling had 18. Montoya Whitfield was the leading rebounder with seven.

✓ WASHBURN VS. TSU LEFTOVERS:

- Washburn snapped a two-game losing skid and won for just the second time in its last seven in Kirksville.
- Washburn improved to 2-3 in games decided by single digit victory margins and 1-2 in overtime games.
- Washburn set school records for free throws made (37) and attempted (46). The Lady Blues hit 32 of 45 against Northwest Missouri State Feb. 26, 1994.
- Truman's 94 points were the most by a Washburn opponent since a 106-66 loss at Emporia State Jan. 27, 1999.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME AT NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE JAN. 14, 2004:** MARYVILLE, Mo. - The No. 8 ranked Washburn Lady Blues fell behind early and could not make a second half comeback in a 67-59 loss to Northwest Missouri.

With the loss the Lady Blues fell to 12-2 and 3-2 in the MIAA. The Lady Blues committed 17 first half turnovers and found themselves behind 37-20 at intermission.

Washburn was held to 29 percent shooting from the field. In the second frame, the Lady Blues cut the lead to as little as six at 50-44 with seven minutes remaining, but could not get any closer.

Erin Menard led the Lady Blues with 16 points off the bench. Lora Westling scored 11 and Montoya Whitfield scored 10.

✓ **LADY BLUES RUNS LEADING TO BIG WINS:** Washburn has outscored opponents 77.0-54.4 in large part because of big runs in games this season. The Lady Blues have had 22 runs of 10 or more straight points in their first 23 games this season.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH FEB. 15):** Washburn was ranked fourth in scoring margin (+22.5), eighth in rebounding margin (+9.3), sixth in 3-point field goal percentage (39.5%), 28th in scoring offense (77.0), fourth in scoring defense (54.4), 11th in 3-pointers per game (7.5), 26th in opponent field goal percentage (36.1%) and 22nd in field goal percentage (46.1%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Feb. 15.

Burlington native Erin Menard leads the nation in 3-point percentage (47.8%). Alison Garrett's 48.7 percent 3-point field goal percentage would lead the NCAA

stats but Garrett does not have the 2.0 minimum 3-pointers per game to qualify.

✓ BURLINGTON BOMBERS RAINING TREYS:

Burlington natives Erin Menard and Alison Garrett have been among the MIAA's and nation's best in making 3-pointers this season. Menard set a school record by hitting 54 3-pointers this season in 113 attempts, while Garrett has hit 38 of 78 from beyond the arch this season.

Menard is second in the MIAA (first in NCAA stats) in 3-point field goal percentage at 47.8% and is third in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.36 3s per game.). Garrett is first in the MIAA in 3-point field goal percentage at 48.7% and 10th in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (1.68 per game). Garrett does not have the minimum 2.0 3-pointers made per game to qualify for NCAA stats.

Menard's 10 3-pointers against Truman State Jan. 17 broke Brenda Schaffer-Dahl (Feb. 16, 1988 vs. ESU) and Rhonda Matzke's (Jan. 30, 1993 vs. NEMSU-now TSU) school record of seven. UMSL's Laura Satterfield (vs. Tampa Nov. 11, 1994) and PSU's Jenni Miller (vs. TSU Jan. 28, 1995) own the MIAA record with 11 3-pointers. California's (Pa.) Lara Thornton set the NCAA Division II record with 12 3-pointers against Clarion March 5, 1994.

The 10 3-pointers were also the most in Division II this season. South Dakota's Erin Bourne hit nine 3-pointers against William Penn on Nov. 29, 2003. Joy Gallagher of Division I Wagner is the only other women's player to hit more 3-pointers in a game this year with 11 3-pointers against Boston University Dec. 30, 2003.

✓ DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwanna Rivers have combined for 158 assists with only 92 turnovers. Roadhouse is second in the MIAA with a 2.36 assist/turnover ratio with 85 assists and 36 turnovers, while Rivers is eighth with a 1.30 assist/turnover ratio with 73 assists and 56 turnovers. Roadhouse is also 9th in the MIAA with 3.73 assists a game.

✓ FRESHMAN MAKING HER MARK:

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has been making her mark in her freshman campaign. The Osborne, Kan. native has made 80 of 140 field goal attempts (57.1 percent) and 30 of 34 free throws (88.2 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn

but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

Ubelaker is also the first freshman to be a regular starter since Nikki Olberding started 27 of 31 games in 1994-95. Laura Mueller was the last Washburn freshman to start every game by making 33 starts in 1988-89.

Ubelaker's 9.1 points per game average is the highest for a Washburn freshman since Olberding scored 12.2 a game in 1994-95.

✓ **BENCH BRIGADE:** Washburn's bench has scored 852 (48.1%) of the team's 1770 points this season. Montoya Whitfield (9.3 ppg), Erin Menard (8.5 ppg) and Juwana Rivers (8.1 ppg) are WU's top leading scorers off the bench. Starters Lora Westling and Carla Sintra are the only Washburn players in double figures scoring 10.7 and 11.0 points a game. Washburn's bench has outscored opponents bench players 852-320 (37.0-13.9 ppg).

✓ **LADY BLUES WINNING BATTLE OF THE BOARDS:** Washburn has outrebounded its first 23 opponents 925-712 (40.2 to 31.0) to own a +9.2 rebounding margin. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and were seventh in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn has been outrebounded three times this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville, at Missouri-Rolla, Missouri Southern and at Truman State).

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 241-53 (.820) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 49-8 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 567-311 (.646) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (FEB. 17, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues were tied at No. 13 in the WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Feb. 24.

✓ SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL RANKINGS (FEB. 11, 2004):

The Lady Blues fell stayed at No. 6 in the South Central Region rankings released by the NCAA Wednesday. Three automatic qualifiers (MIAA, Lone Star and Heartland conference's champions) and five at-large teams will advance to the South Central Region tournament March 12-15 at a site to be determined.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 12th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.6 points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are fifth in the nation by holding opponents to 54.4 points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES NEARING 3-POINT RECORD:** Washburn has also hit 172 3-pointers in the first 23 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of 192 from the 2002-03 season. Washburn hit a school record 14 3-pointers and broke the MIAA record for attempts (40) against Truman on Jan. 17. Washburn leads the MIAA by hitting 39.5 percent beyond the arch and making 7.45 3-pointers a game.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last three seasons with a combined 40-10 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2003-04. Missouri Western (38-12), Emporia State (34-16) and Northwest Missouri (28-22) are the only other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Central Missouri (24-26), Southwest Baptist (23-27), Pittsburg State (23-27), Missouri Southern (23-27), Truman State (14-36) and Missouri-Rolla (3-47) are below .500.

- The Lady Blues have had excellent balance in scoring this season. Six different players have led the Lady Blues in scoring and six players average between 8.1-11.0 points. Carla Sintra's team-high 11.0 points a game would be the lowest average to lead the Washburn in team history. Kristy Chapman's 12.7 points a game led the Lady Blues in 2000-01 and was the lowest average to lead a team in school history.

- The Lady Blues average margin of victory 22.5 is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures. Washburn is 18-0 in games with double digit victory margins and 2-3 in single digit victory margins. Washburn leads the MIAA and is fourth in the nation in scoring margin.

- The Lady Blues were unranked in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll. Washburn was 13th in the Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Emporia State was ranked first in the poll.
