✓ **LADY BLUES LOOKING TO GRAB SHARE OF MIAA LEAD AT EMPORIA STATE:** The No. 13 Washburn Lady Blues travel to No. 4 Emporia State 5:30 Wednesday night. Washburn trails Emporia State by a game for the MIAA lead and needs a win to stay in the MIAA title hunt.

Washburn is 22-3 and 13-3 in the MIAA after an 84-48 win over Missouri-Rolla Saturday afternoon. Emporia State is 21-2 and 14-2 in the MIAA after an 81-69 win at Truman State Saturday.

Emporia State owns a 36-25 lead in the all-time series against the Lady Blues after a 78-76 double overtime win in Lee Arena Jan. 7. The loss dropped Washburn to 11-1 and snapped WU's 13-game home court winning streak and 10-game MIAA regular season winning streak.

The Lady Blues are 49-21 in MIAA play under Ron McHenry, including a league-best 42-10 record the past three seasons.

✓ **COACHES:** Since his appointment as the women's head coach prior to the 2000-01 season, **Ron McHenry** has quickly returned the Washburn women's basketball program to national prominence.

In only his third season in 2002-03, McHenry guided the Lady Blues to a regular season MIAA title, a Sonic/MIAA Tournament championship and a berth to the Division II Elite Eight. For his efforts he was named South Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues tied for second most wins in team history at 30-4 and went to the Elite Eight for the third time in team history. He has posted an **88-28 (.757)** overall record during his career.

In his second season McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division II, guiding Washburn to the South Central Regional and finishing with a 23-7 record.

He guided the Lady Blues to back-to-back 20 win seasons after finishing with a 13-14 record in 2000-01, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new

head coach since Patty Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has a bachelor's degree from Washburn in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

**Brandon Schneider** is 147-31 (.826) in his sixth year as head coach at ESU. He was named Women's Division II Bulletin National Coach of the Month for January. He is 20-11 against Top 25 teams. He is the second winningest active coach by percentage in Division II. He was the fastest women's basketball coach in D-II history to win 100 games in his first job.

✓ **SCOUTING THE LADY HORNETS:** The Lady Hornets maintained their one-game lead over Washburn with an 81-69 win over Truman State Saturday afternoon. The Lady Hornets trailed 15-6 early in the game before taking a 24-23 lead late in the half and never trailing again.

Miklannet Tennal led Emporia State with 19 points off the bench, while Nicole Patry added 16 points. Andi McAlexander and Janel McNeal had 14 and 10 points respectively for ESU.

Tennal is Emporia State's leading scorer with 13.6 points a game with a team-high 49 3-pointers. Casey Henningsen is averaging 11.3 points, while McAlexander and Patry are averaging 10.9 and 10.7 points a game respectively.

✓ **THE SERIES:** Emporia State leads the all-time series 36-25 after a 78-76 double overtime win in Lee Arena on Jan. 7. Washburn has won five of the last seven in the series after sweeping three meetings in 2001-02 and winning two of three in 2002-03. Washburn has won just once in its last six games at White Auditorium.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT VS. UMR FEB. 21, 2004:** TOPEKA, Kan. -- The No. 13 Washburn Lady Blues topped Missouri-Rolla 84-48 on Senior Day in Lee Arena Saturday afternoon.

Washburn, which improved to 22-3 and 13-3 in the MIAA, beat UMR for the eighth straight time. WU also moved into sole possession of second place in the MIAA after Northwest Missouri fell 60-59 at Missouri Southern.

The Lady Blues are a game back of Emporia State (21-2, 14-2 MIAA) heading into Wednesday's 5:30 game at White Auditorium in Emporia.

Washburn trailed by as many as six points early as UMR's Julie Hernandez scored eight points in the first four minutes. Andrea Durante's layup with 15:53 left in

the half gave UMR a 10-4 advantage.

Washburn put the clamps on the Lady Miner offense and held UMR to just two more field goals the rest of the half. Montoya Whitfield, WU's lone senior, capped a 17-4 Washburn run with a layup with 2:40 left in the half. The Lady Blues led 36-25 at the break.

UMR didn't fare any better in the second half and finished with just 10 field goals in the game (five in each half). The Lady Miners were 10 of 41 (24.4 percent) from the field but hit 5 of 9 3-pointers and 23 of 26 free throws. Durante led UMR with 15 points, while Hernandez added 11.

Washburn, which won its fourth straight game, was led by Brooke Ubelaker's 17 points. Erin Menard added 11 points off the bench and hit 3 of 5 3-pointers. The Lady Blues outscored UMR 48-23 in the second half and had a 43-29 rebounding edge.

## ✓ WASHBURN VS. UMR LEFTOVERS:

- Washburn topped UMR for the eighth straight time and won its seventh straight in Lee Arena.
- UMR lost for the 25th straight time in MIAA play.
- UMR's 10 field goals were the fewest by a Washburn opponent this season.

✓ **WASHBURN LAST MEETING WITH EMPORIA STATE JAN. 7, 2004:** TOPEKA- The No. 5 Washburn Lady Blues fell 78-76 to No. 9 Emporia State in double overtime in Lee Arena Wednesday night.

After falling behind 9-4 early, Washburn responded to take a 22-13 lead on Montoya Whitfield's basket with 11:08 left in the opening half. Lora Westling, who had nine of her 13 points in the first half, hit a 3-pointer to put Washburn up by 11 before going into the half with a 40-31 lead.

The Lady Blues held off several ESU comeback attempts early in the second half and had a 59-53 lead with 4:42 left.

Emporia State pulled within 61-59 with 36 seconds left on Esmay Vargas-Sanchez's basket, before Nicole Patry got a steal and got fouled by April Roadhouse with 13 seconds left. Patry tied the score before both teams had turnovers to finish regulation with at 61 all.

Montoya Whitfield's layup with 50 seconds left put Washburn ahead by three, before Patry came through again with a big play. Patry knocked in her second 3-pointer of the night with 29 seconds left to send the game into a second overtime at 68.

The two squads traded baskets in the second overtime before Andi McAlexander gave ESU the lead for good at 77-74 on a 3-pointer with 1:24 left. Lora Westling pulled Washburn within 77-76 before the Lady Blues had a shot

✓ **LADY BLUES RUNS LEADING TO BIG WINS:** Washburn has outscored opponents 76.8-54.3 in large part because of big runs in games this season. The Lady Blues have had 25 runs of 10 or more straight points in their first 25 games this season.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN THE NATIONAL STATS (THROUGH FEB. 22):** Washburn was ranked fifth in scoring margin (+22.5), seventh in rebounding margin (+9.8), ninth in 3-point field goal percentage (39.3%), 30th in scoring offense (76.8), eighth in scoring defense (54.3), 13th in 3-pointers per game (7.3), 15th in opponent field goal percentage (35.5%) and 21st in field goal percentage (45.9%) as a team in the latest NCAA stats for games through Feb. 22.

Burlington native Erin Menard is third in the nation in 3-point percentage (48.4%). Alison Garrett's 48.8 percent 3-point field goal percentage would lead the NCAA stats but Garrett does not have the 2.0 minimum 3-pointers per game to qualify.

### ✓ BURLINGTON BOMBERS RAINING TREYS:

Burlington natives Erin Menard and Alison Garrett have been among the MIAA's and nation's best in making 3-pointers this season. Menard has the school record with 59 3-pointers this season in 122 attempts, while Garrett has hit 39 of 80 from beyond the arch this season.

Menard is second in the MIAA (first in NCAA stats) in 3-point field goal percentage at 48.4% and is third in the MIAA in 3-pointers made (2.36 3s per game.). Garrett is first in the MIAA in 3-point field goal percentage at 48.8%.

Garrett does not have the minimum 2.0 3-pointers made per game to qualify for NCAA stats.

Menard's 10 3-pointers against Truman State Jan. 17 broke Brenda Schaffer-Dahl (Feb. 16, 1988 vs. ESU) and Rhonda Matzke's (Jan. 30, 1993 vs. NEMSU-now TSU) school record of seven. UMSL's Laura Satterfield (vs. Tampa Nov. 11, 1994) and PSU's Jenni Miller (vs. TSU Jan. 28, 1995) own the MIAA record with 11 3-pointers. California's (Pa.) Lara Thornton set the NCAA Division II record with 12 3-pointers against Clarion March 5, 1994.

The 10 3-pointers were also the most in Division II this season. Carlee Howard of West Texas A&M also hit 10 3-pointers against Texas A&M-Commerce Feb. 19, 2004. Joy Gallagher of Division I Wagner is the only other women's player to hit more 3-pointers in a game this year with 11 3-pointers against Boston University Dec. 30, 2003.

### ✓ DISHING IT OUT:

Washburn point guards April Roadhouse and Juwanna Rivers have combined for 164 assists with only 99 turnovers. Roadhouse leads the MIAA with a 2.42 assist/turnover ratio with 87 assists and 36 turnovers, while Rivers is ninth with a 1.22 assist/turnover ratio with 77 assists and 63 turnovers. Roadhouse is also 9th in the MIAA with 3.48 assists a game.

### ✓ FRESHMAN MAKING HER MARK:

Freshman Brooke Ubelaker has been making her mark in her freshman campaign. The Osborne, Kan. native has made 93 of 163 field goal attempts (57.1 percent) and 35 of 41 free throws (85.4 percent). Both percentages lead Washburn but are not included in MIAA and NCAA statistics because of minimum attempts.

Ubelaker is also the first freshman to be a regular starter since Nikki Olberding started 27 of 31 games in 1994-95. Laura Mueller was the last Washburn freshman to start every game by making 33 starts in 1988-89.

Ubelaker's 9.3 points per game average is the highest for a Washburn freshman since Olberding scored 12.2 a game in 1994-95.



# Lady Blues Basketball

✓ **BENCH BRIGADE:** Washburn's bench has scored 923 (48.1%) of the team's 1920 points this season. Montoya Whitfield (9.1 ppg), Erin Menard (8.5 ppg) and Juwanna Rivers (8.2 ppg) are WU's top leading scorers off the bench. Starters Lora Westling and Carla Sintra are the only Washburn players in double figures scoring 10.7 and 11.0 points a game. Washburn's bench has outscored opponents bench players 923-350 (36.9-14.0 ppg).

✓ **LADY BLUES WINNING BATTLE OF THE BOARDS:** Washburn has outrebounded its first 25 opponents 1021-775 (40.8 to 31.0) to own a +9.8 rebounding margin. The Lady Blues had a season-high 53 rebounds against Northwest Missouri State Feb. 18.

The Lady Blues lead the MIAA and were seventh in the NCAA stats in rebounding margin. Washburn has been outrebounded four times this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville, at Missouri-Rolla, Missouri Southern and at Truman State).

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 243-53 (.821) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena in 2002-03, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern on March 20, 1993.

Washburn won also 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener in the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues had a 13-game home court winning streak snapped against ESU on Jan. 7. Washburn is 52-8 in home games under Ron McHenry.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 569-311 (.647) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

## ✓ WBCA NATIONAL POLL (FEB. 17, 2004):

The Washburn Lady Blues were tied at No. 13 in the WBCA National Poll after opening with a No. 13 ranking in the preseason poll.

The team received its first national ranking last season in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002. The next poll will be released on Feb. 24.

## ✓ SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL RANKINGS (FEB. 25, 2004):

The Lady Blues moved up to No. 4 in the South Central Region rankings released by the NCAA Wednesday. Three automatic qualifiers (MIAA, Lone Star and Heartland conference's champions) and five at-large teams will advance to the South Central Region tournament March 12-15 at a site to be determined.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the Lady Blues have been among the best in the MIAA and the nation in defensive statistics.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation in 2002-03 by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

In the final statistics report on in 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 12th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.6 points a game.

The Lady Blues currently lead the MIAA and are eighth in the nation by holding opponents to 54.3 points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES NEARING 3-POINT RECORD:** Washburn has also hit 183 3-pointers in the first 25 games, which puts the team on pace to break the record of 192 from the 2002-03 season. Washburn hit a school record 14 3-pointers and broke the MIAA record for attempts (40) against Truman on Jan. 17. Washburn leads the MIAA by hitting 39.3 percent beyond the arch and making 7.32 3-pointers a game.

## ✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have been the MIAA's best the last three seasons with a combined 42-10 record in league play from 2001-02 to 2003-04. Missouri Western (40-12), Emporia State (36-16) and Northwest Missouri (28-24) are the only other MIAA schools at .500 or better. Missouri Southern (25-27), Central Missouri (24-28), Southwest Baptist (24-28), Pittsburg State (24-28), Truman State (14-38) and Missouri-Rolla (3-49) are below .500.

- The Lady Blues have had excellent balance in scoring this season. Six different players have led the Lady Blues in scoring and six players average between 8.2-11.0 points. Carla Sintra's team-high 11.0 points a game would be the lowest average to lead the Washburn in team history. Kristy Chapman's 12.7 points a game led the Lady Blues in 2000-01 and was the lowest average to lead a team in school history.

- The Lady Blues average margin of victory 22.5 is well above the school record for margin of victory (+19.8) set in 1992-93. The Lady Blues won their first 11 straight games by 10 points or more. The streak tied the 1992-93 team, which won 11 straight by double figures. Washburn is 19-0 in games with double digit victory margins and 3-3 in single digit victory margins. Washburn leads the MIAA and is fifth in the nation in scoring margin.

- The Lady Blues were unranked in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll. Washburn was 13th in the Women's WBCA Division II Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Emporia State was ranked first in the poll.
