✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues travel to Springfield, Mo. on their first road trip for the Drury University Winter Classic Dec. 6-7. Washburn opens against host Drury College Friday night at 8 p.m., before finishing with a 6 p.m. game Saturday against Cameron (Okla.) University.

Washburn enters the tournament with a 2-0 record after beating Saint Mary College 81-43 Monday night, while Drury and Cameron enter the tournament with 6-0 and 3-0 records respectively.

✓ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Jan Lunsford calling play-by-play action. The Ron McHenry show can be heard every Thursday at 6 p.m. and is broadcast live from McB's Sports Bar, 4731 NW Hunters Ridge on AM 580 with Bruce Steinbrock.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 38-21 (.640) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and will also play

Drury head coach **Nyla Milleson** is in her third season at the helm of the Lady Panthers, posting a 44-15 record.

Milleson, a Goodland, Kan. native, is a 1985 graduate of Kansas State University and began her coaching career at Junction City High School. She coached Junction City to a third place finish at state in 1992.

Cameron head coach **Dick Halterman** is in his first season at the helm of the Lady Aggies.

Halterman spent the previous 19 seasons as the head coach at Oklahoma State University and posted a 333-233 record (.588) as the Cowgirl head coach. He is a 1974 graduate of Truman State University.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT :

TOPEKA – The Washburn Lady Blues topped Saint Mary College 81-43 in Lee Arena Monday night to improve to 2-0 on the season.

The Lady Blues got it going early, taking a 8-0 lead on Ineke Ingram's layup with 15 minutes to go in the first half.

After taking a 33-20 lead at the half, the Lady Blues converted Saint Mary turnovers to points and increased the lead to 63-30 on Bethany McGraw's fourth 3-pointer of the game and cruised to victory.

McGraw finished with a career-high 16 points, including 4 of 5 from 3-point range. Carissa Goeglein and Crystal Walker each added 10 points. The Lady Blues converted 36 turnovers into 38 points in the game.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. DRURY: The Lady Blues survived a scare with a 68-65 overtime victory against Drury University in Lee Arena on Dec. 8, 2002.

Leading by as many as 17 in the second half, Washburn surrendered the lead and a 23-4 run when Drury's Stacy West made a basket to pull the Lady Panthers ahead 51-49 with 4:13 left.

The two squads traded points down the stretch to send the game to overtime, before Carrie Colwell hit two baskets to give Drury a 64-59 lead in overtime.Washburn countered with seven straight points and sealed the victory on Crystal Walker's free throws with three seconds left.

Walker led the Lady Blues with 23 points, while Carissa Goeglein and Kristy Chapman

added	17	and	12	respectively.	

✓ ALL-TIME SERIES: The Lady Blues are 1-0 against Drury after topping the Lady Panthers 68-65 in overtime last season.

Washburn has never faced Cameron in women's basketball.

✓ **ABOUT DRURY:** Drury enters the tournament with a 6-0 record after topping Pittsburg State 84-75 in Pittsburg Tuesday night. The Lady Panthers finished second in the Heartland Conference with a 20-6 record last season.

Junior forward Jill Curry leads the Lady Panthers with a 15.5 scoring and 8.0 rebounding per game average. Amanda Newton and Magen Brunson also average double figures with 12.8 and 12.7 points a game respectively.

✓ **ABOUT CAMERON:** Cameron enters the tournament with a 3-0 record after beating Paul Quinn University at home on Friday night. The Lady Aggies finished first in the Lone Star Conference North in 2001-02 with a 25-5 record.

The squad is led in scoring and rebounding by senior center Signy Hermannsdottir from Reykjavik, Iceland with 14.0 points and 8.67 rebounds a game. Junior guard Kimberle Woods averages 13.0 points a game, while sophomore guard Antonia White averages 12.0 points a game.

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 216-51 (.810) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current ten-game home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

✓ LADY BLUES HISTORY: Washburn is 519-304 (.630) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.
