✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 42-21 (.667) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000. He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987. McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie.

Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and will also play basketball.

Florida Southern coach **Diane Foli** is in her sixth season at the helm of the Moccasins, posting a 104-48 record.

Foli has coached the Mocs to four regional tournaments in her first five seasons and in her first season at FSC she went 24-5 to earn Sunshine State Conference Coach of the Year honors

She served as an assistant coach at Florida Southern for four seasons prior to being promoted to head coach.

Foli is a 1987 graduate of the College of St. Mary in Omaha, Neb., where she was the school's athlete of the year in 1986 and 1987 after excelling in both softball and basketball. She also served as a graduate assistant coach at Nebraska-Omaha, where she received her master's degree in exercise science.

Celia Slater is in her fifth season at the helm of the Fighting Knights women's basketball program, posting a 53-65 record. A native of Dunedin, Florida, Slater was a splendid athlete at Clearwater Central Catholic High School where she was named MVP of the basketball team for three seasons and earned all-conference honors. She also starred in volleyball and softball.

But basketball was her favorite sport. She played it in college for four years, first at Clemson and then at Florida State for current Barry University head coach Jan Allen, where she was the team MVP her senior season. After receiving a bachelor's degree in Leisure Science and Studies, Slater returned to Clemson as an assistant basketball coach for one season.

After trying the field of sporting goods retail and managing a sporting goods store for a short time, Slater became a graduate assistant basketball coach for one season at the University of Alabama.

Slater was then named to coach and begin the women's basketball program at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (UCCS), where she went from a 3-19 record her initial campaign to 18-9 three years later and second place in the conference. In addition, her defense ranked 12th in the nation and she was nominated for Coach of the Year in her district.

Upon leaving UCCS, Slater headed for New York City and worked for Bruce Levy Associates as the vice president of client services for a professional sports agency that serviced over 100 clients.

Slater then became assistant basketball coach at Washburn University for two years before being hired to take over the women's basketball program at Lynn University.

She served two seasons at Washburn under Patti Dick from 1996-98 and helped the Lady Blues to a 32-22 record.

#### ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. SOUTH-WESTERN OKLAHOMA STATE SATURDAY NIGHT:

TOPEKA – The No. 24 Washburn Lady Blues outlasted Southwestern Oklahoma State 69-59 in Lee Arena Saturday night.

After leading by as many as 11 in the opening half, Washburn saw its lead close to 52-51 with 7:33 left in the game on a 3-point play by Southwestern guard Ashlee Hamar.

The Lady Blues responded with an 11-0 run to pull away and take a 63-51 lead on Bethany McGraw's 3-pointer at the top of the key with the shot clock winding down. The Lady Bulldogs never got within eight after McGraw's basket.

The Lady Blues opened with a 17-7 lead after steals by their reserves led to easy baskets. April Roadhouse got a steal and a layup and Ineke Ingram scored after Lora Westling's steal to give Washburn a lift early. Southwestern Oklahoma State pulled within 33-29 at the half by hitting 5 of 6 3-pointers.

Carissa Goeglein led Washburn with 18 points and 10 rebounds for her first double-

## ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. FLORIDA SOUTHERN DECEMBER 28, 1998:

Becky Bridson led the charge with 18 points on 8 of 14 shooting and added seven rebounds and six assists. Jennifer Butcher had 14 points, while Jodi Rausch had 12 points and six rebounds.

The Lady Blues improved to 7-1 on the season.

✓ **ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn and Florida Southern have split the only two meetings between the two squads.

Washburn won the last meeting 58-54 on Dec. 28, 1998 in Lakeland, Fla., while Florida Southern won the first meeting 62-55 Dec. 2, 1995 in the North Florida Tournament in Jacksonville, Fla.

Washburn and Lynn University have never met.

## ✓ **ABOUT FLORIDA SOUTHERN:** Florida Southern enters the tournament

Florida Southern enters the tournament with a 5-2 record after beating Webber International 84-73 in Lakeland Dec. 4.

Lucresia West led the way with 20 points on 10 of 16 shooting and added eight rebounds. Brook Kohlheim and Tina Gillems added 15 and 14 points respectively, while Jamie Atkins came off the bench with 13 points. The Mocs out-rebounded Webber International 46-35.

West leads the team in scoring with a 17.4 average. She has scored 20 points in each of the last three games in which she has played. Antonia Newman leads the team in rebounding with a 10.4 average and also is averaging 15.0 points per game. Kohlheim is the leading 3-point shooter, canning 20 of 40 behind the arc.

Florida Southern's lone losses are against No. 18 Delta State and at No. 8 Arkansas Tech.

#### ✓ ABOUT LYNN UNIVERSITY:

Junior Alshaa' Hodges poured in 21 points as the Lynn women's basketball team (2-5 overall) defeated Palm Beach Atlantic (5-5) 74-54 Saturday evening.

Hodges scored 13 of her points in the first half to help the Knights to a 36-23 lead at the intermission.

Palm Beach Atlantic's Laura Lewis hit a

jumper early in the first half to give the Sailfish a 5-4 lead. It would be their only lead of the night as Lynn responded with a 17-0 run to retake the lead, 21-5. The Sailfish didn't go quietly and cut Lynn's lead to one, 22-21, on a three-pointer by Amy Johansen with 5:55 left in the half. Johansen's bucket capped a 16-1 run by the Sailfish. The Knights turned up the heat on defense and limited Palm Beach Atlantic to just two more points the rest of the half.

Lynn shot a sizzling 62% from the floor in the second half to take complete control of the game. The Knights used a 16-5 run to extend their lead to 31 points, 74-43, with 2:46 left in the game. Palm Beach Atlantic took advantage of some sloppy play by the Knights to hold Lynn scoreless and trim 11 points off the lead down the stretch.

Hodges was the only Knight to reach double figures in points. Michele Newman and Anne Mooney each scored nine points while Harriet Monroe and Precious Wright chipped in with eight and seven, respectively. Newman had a great all-around game grabbing nine rebounds and recording five assists and three steals. Monroe had eight boards while Gabi Gonda dished out five assists.

Johansen led the Sailfish with 13 points. Lewis added 12 points and five rebounds. Alexis Balkman had a team-high seven rebounds.

The win was Lynn's second straight after losing five games to open the season. Hodges leads the Knights with 19.6 points a game and has made 24 3-pointers. Newman averages 9.2 points and a teamhigh 6.8 rebounds a game.

▶ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 218-51 (.810) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current ten-game home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn has won **14 straight games** in Lee Arena after falling 69-67 to No. 5 Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

#### **✓ LATEST WBCA POLL:**

The Washburn women's basketball team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in this week's poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Wednesday.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and have not been in the WBCA National Poll since.

#### **✓** WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- Washburn's starting frontcourt, **Crystal Walker** and **Carissa Goeglein** were both selected as preseason All-America players by the **Women's Division II Bulletin**, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.
- The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.
- The Lady Blues were picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll.** Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
- Washburn is now 2-0 in the region after beating South Central Region foes Drury and Cameron in the Drury Classic Dec. 6-7.
- Crystal Walker is now 20th on the all-time scoring list after passing current assistant coach Jodi Rausch at the Drury Classic on Dec. 6-7. Walker currently has 861 career points. She is also 17th on the all-time rebounding list with 449 career boards.

- Washburn has outscored opponents 71.8 to 53.4 this season and is outrebounding opponents 41.6 to 30.6.
- Washburn has opened the season with a 6-0 record for the first time since 1997-98, when it opened 6-0 and held a No. 19 national ranking before finishing 13-14.
