✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues open MIAA play with a 5:30 p.m. game Monday night at Joplin, Mo. against the Missouri Southern Lady Lions in the Leggett and Platt Athletic Center.

Washburn is currently No. 16 in the nation and is off to its best start since 1992-93 after finishing the non-conference portion of its schedule with an 8-0 record. The Lady Blues have lost their last three MIAA openers, including a 69-67 loss to Missouri Western last season in Lee Arena.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 44-21 (.677) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000. He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the

University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and will also play basketball.

Maryann Mitts is in her second season at Missouri Southern, posting a 25-14 record.

On April 6, 2001, Maryann Mitts became the eighth head coach to lead the Missouri Southern women's basketball team.

She brings with her a reputation for developing programs and helping young women reach their fullest potential. As head coach of the Rockhurst University Lady Hawks, Mitts took a highly successful NAIA Division II program and led it into the ranks of NCAA Division II.

In five seasons, she posted a record of 83-57 (.600). After serving as assistant coach at her alma mater from 1993 to 1996, Mitts led the 1996-97 Lady Hawks to an 18-10 record in their first season as a dual NAIA/NCAA Division II institution. That season Rockhurst won the National Catholic Basketball Tournament title, and Mitts was named NCBT Coach of the Year.

For an encore, Mitts led Rockhurst to a 24-7 record in 1997-98. The Lady Hawks won the Midwest Region and advanced to the NAIA Sweet 16 as Mitts was named Regional Coach of the Year.

Her next two squads finished at 13-14, and last season the Lady Hawks were 15-12, 7-5 and fourth in the fledgling Heartland Conference.

Mitts' squads have also been successful in the classroom, as her 1998-99 squad was No. 1 in the nation academically in NCAA Division II, and her 1999-2000 Lady Hawks

were 13th.

While the assistant at Rockhurst, Mitts also initiated and directed the men's and women's tennis teams. In three seasons, she led her team to a 41-14 record and two National Tournament appearances. She was also named Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1995 and 1996.

Mitts graduated from Rockhurst University in 1992 with a bachelor of arts degree in secondary education, and from the University of Missouri-Kansas City in 1995 with a master of arts degree in higher education administration, emphasis in Athletic Administration.

As a two-sports standout for the Lady Hawks, Mitts earned All-America honors in volleyball and basketball. She was also Regional Player of the Year in volleyball as a senior, and was a two-time Scholastic All-American.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME AT LYNN CLASSIC DEC. 17-18 :

BOCA RATON, FLA - The No. 16 ranked Washburn Lady Blues improved to 8-0, their best start since the 1992-93 squad went 31-0, with a 59-47 win over host school Lynn University at the Lynn Classic on Dec. 18.

The Lady Blues were led by Crystal Walker who recorded a double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Carissa Goeglein scored 10. The Lady Blues hit 8 of 18 3-point attempts, tying a school record. The Lady Blues are off until Dec. 30 when they start MIAA play at Missouri Southern.

The Lady Blues improved to 7-0 with a 64-57 win against Florida Southern in their first game at the Lynn Classic.

The Lady Blues were led by Carissa Goeglein, who scored 19 points including 4 of 4 from the free throw line the last 38 seconds of the game after Florida Southern had cut the lead to three. Lora Westling scored 13 points off the bench and Bethany McGraw added 10.

JOPLIN, Mo. — The Washburn Lady Blues picked up a big South Central Region win on the road against the Missouri Southern Lady Lions 73-60.

The win moved the Lady Blues to 15-5 and 7-4 in conference play. With the win, the Lady Blues move into a second place tie with the Lady Lions, but they would have the tie breaker after beating them in both meetings.

In the first half the Lady Blues shot 61 percent from the field hitting 16 of 26 shots including 3 of 5 from behind the arc holding a 13-11 advantage on the boards taking a 40-34 lead into the break.

Missouri Southern, keeping pace with the Lady Blues hit 50 percent of its shots hitting 13 of 26 shots - 5 of 8 from 3-point land.

Neither team led by more than six in the first half with six lead changes in the first half.

In the second half, the Lady Blues cooled off from the field hitting 12 of 30 shots, but were 8 of 11 from the free line while maintaining their two rebound margin. The Lady Lions would take the lead at 53-52 with 11:09 remaining, but the Lady Blues would go on a 8-0 run over the next 5-plus minutes to put Missouri Southern away.

The Lady Blues were led by Carissa Goeglein who scored 22 points on 9 of 14 shooting. She scored 12 of those in the second half. Crystal Walker scored 18.

✓ **ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 29-21, including two wins over the Lady Lions last season.

Washburn topped Southern 77-55 to get their first MIAA win on Jan. 7 and followed with a 73-60 win in Joplin on Feb. 4.

The Lady Blues have won three straight in the series dating back to the MIAA opener for the 2000-01. Southern beat Washburn 73-67 in Joplin on Jan. 6, 2001.

✓ **ABOUT MISSOURI SOUTHERN:** The Lady Lions enter the game with an 8-3 record after beating Newman University 88-73 in Joplin Friday night. Jacquie Rzeszut led the Lady Lions with 27 points and eight rebounds.

Rzeszut leads Missouri Southern and the MIAA with 17.6 points a game and has a team-high 29 steals this season. Lucimara Silva is averaging 13.3 points a game, while Katie Deen and Wyketha Harrell are averaging 11.3 points a game apiece. Harrell has a team-high 5.7 rebounds a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady

Blues are 218-51 (.810) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current ten-game home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn has won **14 straight games** in Lee Arena after falling 69-67 to No. 5 Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 525-304 (.633) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL:

The Washburn Lady Blues are No. 16 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Wednesday.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and have not been in the WBCA National Poll since.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- Washburn's starting frontcourt, **Crystal Walker** and **Carissa Goeglein** were both selected as preseason All-America players by the **Women's Division II Bulletin**, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.

- The Lady Blues were picked **16th** in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**.

- The Lady Blues were picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.

- Washburn is 2-0 in the region after beating South Central Region foes Drury and Cameron in the Drury Classic Dec. 6-7.

- Washburn has outscored opponents 68.9 to 53.8 this season and is outrebounding opponents 38.9 to 32.6.

- Washburn has opened the season with a 8-0 record for the first time since 1992-93, when it opened 31-0 and grabbed the top spot in the national poll before falling to Michigan Tech in overtime in the quarterfinals of the national tournament.

- Washburn has outshot opponents in every game this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.
