✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues host Truman State University Saturday night, looking to improve on their 9-0 overall and 1-0 MIAA record. The Lady Blues are off to their best start since 1992-93, when they opened 31-0 before falling in the national quarterfinals.

Washburn is also looking to extend its 14-game home court winning streak at Lee Arena, dating back to its second MIAA home game of the 2001-02.

The Lady Blues also are looking to win 10 straight games for the first time since their run through MIAA opponents to finish with a 10-0 record in February last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. ✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 45-21 (.682) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the

University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and will also play basketball.

John Sloop is in his third season at Truman State, posting a 28-21 record.

Sloop became the eighth head coach in the 30-year history of the Truman women's basketball program in July of 2000.

Sloop had spent the five previous years as the assistant for the Truman men's basketball team.

In his first season as taskmaster for the Bulldogs, Sloop's team posted nine wins, but made a rapid improvement last year with a 14-13 record.

The 2001-02 squad qualified for the MIAA tournament for the fourth time in the last five years and produced a first-team all-MIAA center, Jennifer Perkins.

His experience with the Truman men includes an NCAA Division II Final Four appearance in 1999, as well as some of the top names in Missouri college and high school basketball.

After Sloop graduated from Maryville University in St. Louis in 1991, Sloop served under Charlie Spoonhour for one season at Southwest Missouri State.

University before moving to St. Louis University with Spoonhour for the next two seasons.

He was an assistant coach at Southwest Missouri State University during the 1994-95 season for Mark Bernsen. While at Division I SMSU, Sloop assisted in nearly every aspect of the program, including recruiting, scouting and on-the-floor coaching.

He began his coaching career while still in college. After a career-ending ankle injury, he was hired by his former high school basketball coach as an assistant at Lafayette High School in St. Louis. While at Lafayette, Sloop also directed summer basketball camps for boys and girls in kindergarten through high school age. In 1992, he served as head coach of the Springfield Kings, a 16-and-under Amateur Athletic Union team.

Sloop's duties as the men's assistant at Truman included recruiting, organizing practice sessions, on-the-floor coaching, strategy development, scheduling, travel arrangements, video and monitoring academic progress of student-athletes. He was also a member of the NABC Assistant Coaches Board of Directors.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME AT MISSOURI SOUTHERN:

JOPLIN, Mo — The Lady Blues extended a 1-point halftime lead to 33-23 with a 9-0 run to start the second half and never looked back in their 62-54 win Monday night.

Carissa Goeglein exploded for 21 points on 9 of 15 shooting from the field, while Crystal Walker added 16 points to lead Washburn.

Southern guard Jacquie Rzeszut, the MIAA's leading scorer, was held to only one point in the first 39 minutes.

The Lady Blues cashed in on 15 of 17 free throw attempts.

With the win Washburn snapped a three-game losing streak in MIAA openers and improved to 9-0 on the season.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. TRUMAN STATE FEBRUARY 2, 2002:

The Washburn Lady Blues used an early hot-shooting performance to roll to an 82-58 victory over Truman State in Lee Arena Saturday night.

After Truman took an early lead, the Lady Blues responded with a 9-0 run and a capped a 10-0 run to take a 28-14 lead on Bethany McGraw's baseline jumper with 7:14 left in the

Washburn finished the first half 19-of-33 (57.6%) from the field, including 6-of-12 3-point baskets to go ahead 49-30.

Washburn led by as many as 30 in the second half and finished the game 35-of-66 (53.0%) from the field.

Carissa Goeglein led the Lady Blues for the second straight game offensively with 17 points. Kristy Chapman added 13, Latasha Moore had a career-high 12 and Maggie Diehl added 10 off the bench.

✓ **ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 21-7 after the squads split two matchups last season.

Washburn won the last outing in the series with a 82-58 win at home on Feb. 2, 2002, while Truman State edged Washburn 55-53 in Kirksville, Mo. on Jan. 5, 2002.

✓ **ABOUT TRUMAN STATE:** Midway through the second half, the Truman Bulldogs used 8-0 and 7-0 runs to overcome a 15-point deficit and tie the score, sending the MIAA women's basketball opener into overtime before pulling out an 80-76 win at Central Missouri Monday night to improve to 5-4 and 1-0 in the MIAA.

Senior forward Jennifer Fisher came off the bench and tied the score at 70 with less than a second remaining. Guards Keagan Thalín and Kelli Floyd combined to go 7-of-8 from the line as the 'Dogs made 8-of-10 free throws in the extra session to seal the win.

Thalín led the team with 16 points, going 5-of-7 from the field and the line, and sinking her only three-point attempt. A total of four 'Dogs scored in double figures as junior forward Annie Westhoff had 15 points, sophomore Jamie Huffman had 14 and junior transfer Sarah Sommer had 13.

Fisher had nine points and a team-best eight rebounds, while Huffman was 8-of-10 from the free throw line.

It was just the fifth win in the 47-game series and snapped a five-game losing streak to the Jennies. The 'Dogs last win over the CMSU was in Warrensburg on Jan. 5, 2000, 72-70.

Annie Westhoff leads the team with a 13.8 scoring average, while Sarah Sommer and Keagan Thalín are the only other two Bulldogs in double figures with 11.7 and 10.9 points a game respectively.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 218-51 (.810) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn has won **14 straight games** in Lee Arena after falling 69-67 to No. 5 Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 526-304 (.633) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL:

The Washburn Lady Blues are No. 16 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll since.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- Washburn is looking to extend its winning streak to 10 games for the first time since last season, when the squad was a perfect 10-0 in February.

- Crystal Walker is now 19th on the all-time scoring list with 911 career points. She is also 16th on the all-time rebounding list with 475 career boards.

- Washburn has outscored opponents 68.1 to 53.8 this season and is outrebounding opponents 38.9 to 32.6.

- Washburn has opened the season with a 9-0 record for the first time since 1992-93, when it opened 31-0 and grabbed the top spot in the national poll before falling to Michigan Tech in overtime in the quarterfinals of the national tournament.

- Washburn has outshot opponents in eight of nine games (all but MSSC on Dec.
