✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues host Rockhurst University 7 p.m. Monday night, looking to improve on their 10-0 record. The Lady Blues are off to their best start since 1992-93, when they opened 31-0 before falling in the national quarterfinals.

Washburn is also looking to extend its 15-game home court winning streak at Lee Arena, dating back to its second MIAA home game of the 2001-02.

The Lady Blues also are looking to win 11 straight games for the first time since 1992-93 and have won 10 straight for the first time since their run through MIAA opponents by winning 10 straight in February last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. ✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 46-21 (.687) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assis-

tant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

Rebecca Morrissey is in her second season at Rockhurst, posting a 5-33 record.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT AGAINST TRUMAN STATE:

TOPEKA, Kan. — The Washburn Lady Blues topped Truman State 85-57 in Lee Arena Saturday night.

Washburn, which shot 50.9 percent from the field and owned a 39-28 rebounding edge, improved to 10-0 and 2-0 in MIAA play, while the Bulldogs fell to 5-5 and 1-1 in the MIAA.

After Truman pulled within 19-16 with 10:48 in the opening half, the Lady Blues went on a 15-3 run to make it 34-19 on two free throws at the 6:25 mark.

The Lady Blues finished the half with a 41-29 lead, led by Kristy Chapman who canned 4 of 4 3-pointers for 12 points.

Washburn had another big run with a 12-

0 spurt in the second half, capped by Lora Westling's layup with 13:09 to play to extend the lead to 59-36.

Crystal Walker led the Lady Blues with 22 points, while Carissa Goeglein had a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. ROCKHURST DECEMBER 7, 1999:

TOPEKA — The Washburn Lady Blues held on to defeat Rockhurst 77-70 in overtime at Lee Arena.

Washburn outscored the Lady Hawks 17-10 in overtime by hitting nine straight free throws in the extra period. Leading 62-60 a minute into overtime, Lisa Hoelting dropped a 3-pointer and converted a four-point play after she was fouled.

After Rockhurst made one last charge on a layup by Elaine Williams to make it 73-70 with 36 seconds to go, Hoelting scored the game's final four points to secure the victory.

Washburn entered the second half with a 29-23 advantage and was pulling away after Jennifer Butcher's jumper made it 60-52 with three minutes to go in regulation.

Rockhurst reeled off eight straight points, including Laura Crowley's 3-point basket with 18 seconds left to make it 60-60. Washburn's last chance to win it in regulation faded when Hoelting's layup came up just short.

Butcher led the Lady Blues with 24 points, including 10-of-10 shooting from the foul line and a career-high 13 rebounds, and Hoelting added 17 points on 7-of-7 shooting from the line.

✓ **ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 10-3 and have won the last three meetings between the two squads.

Rockhurst's last win in the series was a 73-60 win in Kansas City, Mo. during the

✓ **ABOUT ROCKHURST:** The Lady Hawks are 1-10 after dropping two games at the Hoop-n-Surf Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii on Dec. 18-19.

The Lady Hawks fell to No. 3 Central Arkansas 94-75 in the first game, while Patrycja Koslowski led the Lady Hawks with 16 points and eight rebounds.

Rockhurst then fell to No. 8 Arkansas Tech 62-45 in their second game of the Classic. Kelly Nitsche led the way with 13 points for the Lady Hawks.

The Lady Hawks are 0-6 against MIAA opponents this season and have been outscored 523 to 366 in six games (87.2 to 61.0 per game).

✓ **WASHBURN AGAINST THE HEARTLAND CONFERENCE:** The Lady Blues are 1-0 this season against teams from the Heartland Conference after topping Drury 79-73 on Dec. 6 in the Lady Panther Classic in Springfield, Mo.

Washburn is 28-3 in games against teams from the Heartland conference and 3-0 against Heartland teams since the Division II conference was founded in 1999.

✓ **MIAA VS. HEARTLAND CONFERENCE THIS SEASON :** Squads from both the MIAA and the Heartland Conference will be represented in the eight-team South Central Region field along with the Lone Star Conference on March 14-16.

The MIAA has a 11-5 edge over Heartland conference teams this season, including Washburn's win over Drury earlier this season.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 219-51 (.811) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn has won **15 straight games** in Lee Arena after falling 69-67 to No. 5 Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season. The streak is the **6th longest** in NCAA Division II Women's Basketball.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 527-304 (.634) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL:

The Washburn Lady Blues are No. 16 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll since.

time since a 31-0 streak to begin the 1992-93 season.

The Lady Blues won 10 straight games in February last season.

- Crystal Walker is now 19th on the all-time scoring list with 933 career points. She is also 16th on the all-time rebounding list with 475 career boards.

- Washburn has outscored opponents 69.8 to 54.1 this season and has outrebounded opponents 38.0 to 32.1.

- Washburn has opened the season with a 10-0 record for the first time since 1992-93, when it opened 31-0 and grabbed the top spot in the national poll before falling to Michigan Tech in overtime in the quarterfinals of the national tournament.

- Washburn has outshot opponents in nine of 10 games (all but MSSC on Dec. 30) this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.

- Washburn's starting frontcourt, **Crystal Walker** and **Carissa Goeglein** were both selected as preseason All-America players by the **Women's Division II Bulletin**, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.

- The Lady Blues were picked **16th** in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**.

- The Lady Blues were picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
