✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues host Southwest Baptist 5:30 p.m. Wednesday night, looking to improve on their 11-0 overall and 2-0 MIAA record. The Lady Blues are off to their best start since 1992-93, when they opened 31-0 before falling in the national quarterfinals.

The Lady Bearcats enter the game with an 8-3 overall and 2-0 MIAA record and are in a four-way tie with the Lady Blues, Emporia State and Missouri Western for the MIAA lead. Emporia State and Missouri Western also face off Wednesday night.

Washburn is also looking to extend its 16-game home court winning streak at Lee Arena, dating back to its second MIAA home game of the 2001-02 season. The streak is the sixth longest current home court winning streak in Division II women's basketball.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. ✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 47-21 (.691) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assis-

tant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

**Jim Middleton** is in his ninth season at Southwest Baptist, posting a 160-78 record. The Lady 'Cats have traveled to post-season play five of the eight years Middleton has been at the helm of the program.

In July of 2001, Middleton added to his duties as the athletics director for SBU. He now dreams of taking the success he has had in his own program and help to make Bearcat athletics one of the best overall programs in the nation.

Middleton, whose record at SBU is 160-78 (.669), holds the most wins of any head women's basketball coach at the school and also has the highest winning percentage.

Middleton, 41, took his team to a berth in the Sweet 16 in 2000 and a second round trip in 2001. This season the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named Middleton the District VII Coach of the Year. At one time, his 1999-2000 team was

ranked No. 7 in the nation.

He was named the new women's basketball coach at Southwest Baptist on April 4, 1994. In his first season, he laid the groundwork for national success, posting an 18-8 record which tied a school record for most victories in a season. He has since set a new school record for victories, 21, a mark his teams have reached four times.

Middleton served as an assistant coach on the women's basketball staff of his alma mater, Southwest Missouri State University from 1991-1994, prior to coming to SBU.

He is a 1985 magna cum laude graduate of Southwest Missouri State and received a master's degree in educational administration from Southwest Missouri State in 1987. Middleton was a graduate assistant on the Lady Bears basketball coaching staff under head coach Valerie Goodwin-Colbert from 1985-87 and also served as a student assistant for the women's track team and as strength coach for the men's basketball team at Southwest Missouri during the 1988-89 season.

## ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT JAN. 6 AGAINST ROCKHURST:

The Washburn Lady Blues topped Heartland Conference foe Rockhurst University 76-64 in Lee Arena Monday night.

After trailing at the half for the first time this season 33-31, Washburn went on a 23-5 run during the middle of the second half to take its biggest lead of the game at 67-50 with 4:26 left on Ineke Ingram's basket.

The two squads exchanged leads seven times in the first half after Washburn jumped out early to a 7-2 edge. Amber Krumbholz got the Lady Hawks going and led Rockhurst back with 10 of her 13 points in the opening half.

Kristy Chapman brought the Lady Blues back with 13 of her game-high 17 points in the second half and connected on 3 of 4 from the field and 5 of 5 from the foul line

Washburn owned the boards with a decisive 39-28 rebounding edge. Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein joined Chapman in double figures with 16 points apiece.

## ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. SOUTHWEST BAPTIST FEB. 25, 2002:

TOPEKA — For the first time since the 1994-95 season, Washburn won an opening round MIAA tournament game with a 65-52 win over Southwest Baptist in Lee Arena.

The win snapped a six-game MIAA tournament losing skid for the Lady Blues, who capped their ninth straight victory overall and ninth in Lee Arena with the win.

Leading 40-37 with 14:14 to play, Washburn went on an 11-0 run capped by Carissa Goeglein's layup with 9:10 left to make it 51-37.

Goeglein led the way for Washburn with 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the field and nine rebounds, while Lora Westling came off the bench with eight points and five assists.

✓ **ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 12-10 after sweeping three meetings with the Lady Bearcats last season. Washburn knocked Southwest Baptist out of the MIAA tournament in the first round Feb. 25, in Lee Arena last season.

Southwest Baptist had won the last four meetings in the series prior to Washburn's sweep in 2001-02.

✓ **ABOUT THE LADY BEARCATS:** The Lady Bearcats are 8-3 and 2-0 in MIAA play after beating Missouri Southern 72-68 at home Saturday night.

Freshman Amber Wheeler led the Lady Bearcats with 23 points (including four 3-pointers), while Gwyn Smith had 15 points and 10 rebounds in the win.

Wheeler is leading four Lady Bearcats in double figures with 15.9 points and has hit 28 of 51 3-pointers this season. Her 54.9 percent clip beyond the arc is the fourth best percentage in the nation and second best in the MIAA.

Smith averages 13.0 points and a team-high 9.1 rebounds a game, while Allison Davis and Alicia Mercer average 10.7 points apiece for Southwest Baptist.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 220-51 (.812) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20,

1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn has won **16 straight games** in Lee Arena after falling 69-67 to No. 5 Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season. The streak is the **6th longest** in NCAA Division II Women's Basketball.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 528-304 (.634) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

## ✓ LATEST WBCA POLL:

The Washburn Lady Blues are No. 16 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season. The new poll will be released Jan. 8.

## ✓ TURNING UP THE D:

- Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Jan 5, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 13th in

the nation by holding opponents to **54.1** points a game.

### ✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have opened MIAA play with a 2-0 record for the first time since the 1995-96 season and are looking to improve to 3-0 in conference play for the first time since the 1994-95 season.

- **Crystal Walker** is now 18th on the all-time scoring list with 949 career points. She is also 15th on the all-time rebounding list with 482 career boards. Walker, the reigning MIAA MVP, is sixth in the league in scoring at 15.1 ppg.

- **Carissa Goeglein** is leading Washburn and is third in the MIAA with a 52.0 percent clip from the field. She is also ninth in the MIAA with in scoring (14.7 ppg).

- **Kristy Chapman** is 22nd in career scoring with 816 points and has 91 career 3-pointers. She is just 20 3-pointers away from breaking Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's career record of 110.

- **Kristy Chapman** is also 11 of 20 from 3-point range in her last four games, including 4 of 5 against Truman State Saturday. She opened the season by missing her first six 3-pointers in the first two games and has hit 22 of 46 (47.8 percent) since.

- **Bethany McGraw** has dished out 16 assists with only one turnover in six home games this season. She also has made 6 of 9 3-pointers and is 12-for-12 at the foul line in Lee Arena this season.

Reserve guards **Alison Garrett** and **April Roadhouse** have similar assist-to-turnover marks in Lee Arena. Garrett has seven assists without a turnover and Roadhouse has nine assists with two turnovers at home this season.

- Washburn has outscored opponents 70.4 to 55.0 this season and has outrebounded opponents 38.1 to 31.7.

- Washburn has opened the season with a 11-0 record for the first time since 1992-93, when it opened 31-0 and grabbed the top spot in the national poll before falling to Michigan Tech in overtime in the quarterfinals of the national tournament.

- Washburn is looking to extend its winning streak to 12 games for the first time since a 31-0 streak to begin the 1992-93 season.

The Lady Blues won 10 straight games in February last season.

- Washburn has outshot opponents in 9 of 11 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.

- Washburn's starting frontcourt, **Crystal Walker** and **Carissa Goeglein** were both selected as preseason All-America players by the **Women's Division II Bulletin**, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.

- The Lady Blues were picked **16th** in the **Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll**.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll**. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
