Washburn has won the last four meetings against the Bearcats and the last 15 in Lee Arena. Northwest's only win in Lee Arena was a 79-65 victory during the 1985-86 season.

Missouri Western snapped Washburn's 19-game home court winning streak 60-56 in their last home game Jan. 29.

Washburn (18-3, 9-3 MIAA) is a game behind Emporia State (17-4, 10-2 MIAA) in the conference standings and is tied with Missouri Western for second place.

- ✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 54-24 (.692) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate

assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

Gene Steinmeyer is in his fourth season at Northwest Missouri State, posting a 39-60 record. He is 399-201 overall. Steinmeyer took over the Bearcat program in 1999.

Steinmeyer came to Northwest from Doane College in Crete, Neb., where he put together a very impressive program. At Doane, Steinmeyer had a record of 366-135.

He took Doane to eight conference championships, three district titles and made three consecutive NAIA Final Four appearances.

Steinmeyer has been named NAIA District 11 Coach of the Year five times and

Nebraska State College Coach of the Year twice.

Prior to his tenure at Doane, Steinmeyer found success in the high school coaching ranks. In five years as the head girls' coach at Wilber-Clatonia (Neb.) High School, he won a state championship, two conference titles and a district championship.

He has also served as an assistant boys' basketball coach at Milford (Neb.) High School and Humboldt (Neb.) High School.

Coach Steinmeyer holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska-Kearney. He earned his master's degree from Nebraska-Lincoln in 1988.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT FEB. 8 AGAINST MISSOURI-ROLLA: ROLLA, Mo. -

The No. 12 ranked Washburn Lady Blues shutdown the Missouri-Rolla Lady Miners in the first half allowing 13 points and five field goals racing to a 40-13 halftime lead and never looked back in a 79-44 win.

The 13 points were the lowest scored by a Lady Blue opponent since Dec. 4, 1993 when Tabor scored eight points in the first half against Washburn.

In the second half it was much the same as the Lady Miners hit eight field goals and 12 free throws scoring 31 points.

Lora Westling scored 15 to lead the Lady Blues and Carissa Goeglein scored 14. Crystal Walker recorded 12 rebounds and had three blocks.

The win improved the Lady Blues to 18-3 and 9-3 in the MIAA, tied for second with Missouri Western and one game behind Emporia State.

In the second half, the Bearcats would cut the lead to 10 at 46-36 with 13:42 left, but the Lady Blues would go on a 16-5 run over the next four minutes to put the game away.

Crystal Walker led four Lady Blues in double figures with 19 points. Kristy Chapman scored 18, Carissa Goeglein scored 17 and Bethany McGraw scored 11. The Lady Blues tied a school record for the second straight game with nine 3-pointers in the contest.

✓ **THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series with Northwest Missouri State 27-5, including a 72-58 win in Maryville, Mo. on Jan. 15.

The Lady Blues have won the last four meetings overall with the Bearcats and have won the last 15 meetings with the Bearcats in Topeka. Northwest's only win in Topeka was a 79-65 victory early in the 1985-86 season.

✓ **ABOUT THE BEARCATS:** The Bearcats are 12-8 and 7-5 in the MIAA after beating Missouri Southern 66-37 in Maryville Saturday evening. Southern's 37 points were the fewest ever allowed by the Bearcats in an MIAA game. Jenna Wolfe, Erica Hatterman and Tanesha Fields each tallied 13 points for the Bearcats.

Sarah Vollertson is leading Northwest with 13.8 points and 6.9 rebounds per game averages. She leads four Bearcats in double figure scoring.

∠ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 223-52 (.811) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

∠ LADY BLUES HISTORY: Washburn is 535-307 (.635) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL (FEB. 5):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell seven spots to No. 12 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ TURNING UP THE D: Under coach
Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the
Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Feb. 9, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 15th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.4 points a game.

✓ WALKER TURNING UP GAME FOR SECOND MVP RUN?: Senior Crystal Walker is stating her case for MIAA Most Valuable Player for a second straight season by averaging 18.7 points and 7.9 rebounds a game in conference play.

Walker netted a new career-high with 32 points, including 20 of Washburn's 28 points in the second half at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Earlier in the season against Central Missouri State Walker became the 16th Lady Blue to score her 1000th career point and netted 22 of her 24 points in a second half comeback. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State Jan. 15.

Walker is currently third in the MIAA in scoring (16.8) and sixth in rebounding (7.5). She is also fifth in field goal per-

✓ **NEW LINEUP NETS TWO WINS ON ROAD TRIP:** The Lady Blues traveled to Southwest Baptist and Missouri-Rolla sporting a new lineup for the first time since the second game of the season.

Washburn's five seniors (Crystal Walker, Carissa Goeglein, Bethany McGraw, Gosia Czarnecka and Kristy Chapman) started 17 straight games before a new lineup started at Southwest Baptist.

Sophomores Alison Garrett and Lora Westling joined Walker, Goeglein and McGraw in the starting lineup.

Garrett was 4-for-4 from the field (all 3-pointers) to net 12 points combined in her first two starts in a Washburn uniform. Westling, who also started the season opener, was 10-for-17 on the road trip and led the Lady Blues with 15 points at Missouri-Rolla.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

• In their three losses the Lady Blues are shooting 36.4 percent (63 of 173) from the field, including 24.1 percent (14 of 58) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.5 percent (471 of 1059) from the field and 36.4 percent (99 of 284) from 3-point range in its 18 victories.

• Crystal Walker is averaging 17.4 points and 7.5 rebounds a game in MIAA regular season play the last two seasons. She has scored 522 points and grabbed 224 rebounds in those 30 conference games.

She also became the 16th Washburn player to score 1000 points and 14th player to score 1000 points and grab 500 rebounds earlier this season.

- Carissa Goeglein is leading Washburn and is fourth in the MIAA with a 50.0 percent clip from the field. She is also 12th in the MIAA in scoring (13.9 ppg).
 - Kristy Chapman is 20th in career scoring with 885 points

and has 105 career 3-pointers. She is just six 3-pointers away from breaking Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's career record of 110.

• Washburn has outscored opponents 69.6 to 56.4 this season and has outrebounded opponents 38.2 to 32.3. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA in scoring margin.

The Lady Blues were 22nd in scoring margin in the nation (+13.2) when the NCAA statistics report was released Feb. 9. Washburn was also 24th in free throw percentage (74.9 percent).

- Washburn has outshot opponents in 16 of 21 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.
- Washburn's starting frontcourt, Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein were both selected as preseason All-America players by the Women's Division II Bulletin, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.
- The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
