✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues have won three straight MIAA games heading into a 5:30 p.m. matchup with Central Missouri State Saturday evening in Warrensburg, Mo.

Washburn leads the all-time series with Central Missouri State 16-10 after winning 59-53 on Jan. 18 earlier this season. The Jennies have won the last four meetings in Warrensburg with Washburn last winning 50-49 Feb. 7, 1998 in the CMSU Multipurpose Building.

Washburn (19-3, 10-3 MIAA) is a game behind Emporia State (18-4, 11-2 MIAA) in the conference standings and is tied with Missouri Western for second place.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Greg Sharpe calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. The Ron McHenry show can be heard Thursday at 6 p.m. and is broadcast live from McB's Sports Bar, 4731 NW Hunters Ridge on AM 580 with Bruce Steinbrock.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 55-24 (.696) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

Scott Ballard has led the Jennies to a 150-74 record in eight seasons at the helm.

He has led Central Missouri State to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Post-Season Tournament seven times, three NCAA tourney appearances and a share of one conference championship.

This past season (2001-2002) the Jennies were 21-9, 12-6 in the MIAA.

Ballard, who was named CMSU's head coach on June 29, 1995, led the Jennies to a 23-5 record in his inaugural season at the helm, giving them their first 20-win season in four years, while their 12-4 conference mark won them a share of their first league title in five seasons.

The next year, the Jennies went 21-9 and were MIAA regular-season (13-5) and tourney runners-up to earn their first NCAA bid since 1993. In 1997-98, they were 19-10 and tied for fifth in the conference standings (9-7) and tournament, but reached the regional semifinals, while a young 1998-99 squad posted a 17-11 record, tied for sixth in the league (9-7) and advanced to the MIAA tourney semifinals.

In 1999-2000 the Jennies were picked seventh in the MIAA preseason coaches' poll, but went 14-4 to finish second and were 22-7 overall after receiving an NCAA regional bid. Ballard was MIAA Coach of the Year.

Ballard came to Central following five seasons as head coach at conference-rival Missouri Southern State College, where he led the Lady Lions to a 102-42 record (.708), one league tourney crown and two trips to the NCAA Tournament. He was named MIAA Co-Coach of

the Year in '91-92 after leading MSSC to an 18-10 record and a third-place conference finish. His final three teams all had 20-win seasons and were second in the league, highlighted by school-record marks of 27-4 overall and 14-2 MIAA in 1992-93.

Ballard, whose twelve-year college coaching record is 244-102 (.705), went to MSSC following nine seasons as girls basketball coach at Marshfield (Mo.) High School.

that time, the Lady Jays were 199-55 (.783) and won five league titles, four district crowns and three state championships. Those state titles came in his final three years at the helm as Marshfield posted three straight 32-0 campaigns, winning an unofficial state-record 96 consecutive games, to earn him Class 3A girls coach-of-the-year honors all three seasons.

Ballard began his coaching career with a two-year stint in his hometown of Niangua, Mo., where he coached softball and volleyball his first season and volleyball and girls basketball his second. All of his teams had winning marks, with the basketball squad going 26-3 and claiming league and district crowns. His overall prep basketball coaching record was 225-58 (.795).

The 44-year-old Ballard received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Southwest Missouri State University in 1979 and his master's degree in education from Drury University in 1988. He and his wife, Nita, have three sons, Ryan (23), Justin (20) and Rory (17), and a daughter, Shalee (13).

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT FEB. 12 AGAINST NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE:

The No. 12 Washburn Lady Blues used a career-high 18 point effort from Alison Garrett to win 63-55 over Northwest Missouri State Wednesday night. Garrett hit 7 of 10 shots (4 of 5 3-pointers) in her third career start.

Bethany McGraw added 12 points and sealed the win with six straight free throws down the stretch. Lora Westling had five assists and seven rebounds for the Lady Blues, who tied a team record with nine three pointers. The win

improved the Lady Blues to 19-3 and 10-3 in the MIAA, tied for second with Missouri Western and one game behind Emporia State.

✓ **LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. CENTRAL MISSOURI STATE JAN. 18, 2003:** TOPEKA - The No. 4 Washburn Lady Blues improved to 15-0 and 6-0 in MIAA play with a 59-53 comeback victory over Central Missouri State.

Senior Crystal Walker had 22 of her game-high 24 points in the second half to help Washburn erase a 12-point deficit in the second half.

Washburn finished the game on a 28-10 run after trailing 43-31 with 13:30 left. The win extended Washburn's home court winning streak to 19 games.

Walker netted her 1000th point on a free throw with 10:46 in the opening half and made a second charity for her only two point in the first half, as the Lady Blues struggled and trailed 27-22 at the half.

The Jennies stretched the lead to 43-31 with 13:30 left in the game on Jena Shackelford's 3-pointer, before Walker rallied the Lady Blues.

Walker scored 11 points over the next five minutes and pulled Washburn within two and later gave Washburn its first lead in the second half with two free throws with 1:31 left in the game. Bethany McGraw hit two free throws and Walker hit four more charity tosses to seal the win.

Washburn outscored the Jennies 28-10 in the final 13:30 and held CMSU scoreless over the final 5:23 of the ballgame. Walker was 7 of 8 from the field and 8 of 9 from the foul line in the second half.

✓ **THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series with Central Missouri State 16-10 after winning 59-53 on Jan. 18 earlier this season.

The Jennies have won the last four meetings in Warrensburg with Washburn last winning 50-49 Feb. 7, 1998 in the CMSU Multipurpose Building.

✓ **ABOUT THE JENNIES:** The Jennies are 8-14 and 3-10 in the MIAA after winning 71-52 at Missouri-Rolla Wednesday night. Bethany Orendorff led four Jennies in double figures with 16 points.

Jena Shackelford and Kinsey Lehe are the only two Jennies averaging in double figures with 14.0 and 10.9 points a game respectively.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 224-52 (.818) overall at home. The longest

winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 535-307 (.635) in its 33rd season of inter-collegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL (FEB. 5):

The Washburn Lady Blues fell seven spots to No. 12 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Feb. 9, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 15th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.4 points a game.

✓ **WALKER TURNING UP GAME FOR SECOND MVP RUN?:** Senior Crystal Walker is stating her case for MIAA Most Valuable Player for a second straight season by averaging 17.8 points and 7.8 rebounds a game in conference play.

Walker netted a new career-high with 32 points, including 20 of Washburn's 28 points in the second half at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Earlier in the season against Central Missouri State Walker became the 16th Lady Blue to score her 1000th career point and netted 22 of her 24 points in a second half comeback.

She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State Jan. 15.

Walker is currently third in the MIAA in scoring (16.4) and sixth in rebounding (7.5). She is also fourth in field goal percentage (49.5) and eighth in blocks (0.73).

✓ **GARRETT AND WESTLING GIVE SPARK TO WU LINEUP:** The Lady Blues traveled to Southwest Baptist and Missouri-Rolla sporting a new lineup for the first time since the second game of the season.

Washburn's five seniors (Crystal Walker, Carissa Goeglein, Bethany McGraw, Gosia Czarnecka and Kristy Chapman) started 17 straight games before a new lineup started at Southwest Baptist.

Sophomores Alison Garrett and Lora Westling joined Walker, Goeglein and McGraw in the starting lineup.

Garrett was 4-for-4 from the field (all 3-pointers) to net 12 points combined in her first two starts in a Washburn uniform. She followed that effort with a career-high 18 points on 7 of 10 shooting (4 of 5 3-pointers) Wednesday against Northwest Missouri State.

Westling, who also started the season opener, was 10-for-17 on the road trip and led the Lady Blues with 15 points at Missouri-Rolla. She had a team high five assists and seven rebounds against Northwest Missouri State.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- In their three losses the Lady Blues are shooting 36.4 percent (63 of 173) from the field, including 24.1 percent (14 of 58) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.5 percent (490 of 1101) from the field and 37.1 percent (108 of 291) from 3-point range in its 19 victories.

- Crystal Walker is averaging 17.1 points and 7.5 rebounds a game in MIAA regular season play the last two seasons. She has scored 530 points and grabbed 231 rebounds in those 31 conference games.

She also became the 16th Washburn player to score 1000 points and 14th player to score 1000 points and grab 500 rebounds earlier this season.

- Kristy Chapman is 20th in career scoring with 890 points and has 106 career 3-pointers. She is just five 3-pointers away from

breaking Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's career record of 110.

- Washburn has outscored opponents 69.6 to 56.4 this season and has outrebounded opponents 38.2 to 32.3. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA in scoring margin.

The Lady Blues were 22nd in scoring margin in the nation (+13.2) when the NCAA statistics report was released Feb. 9. Washburn was also 24th in free throw percentage (74.9 percent).

- Washburn has outshot opponents in 17 of 22 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.

- Washburn's starting frontcourt, Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein were both selected as preseason All-America players by the Women's Division II Bulletin, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.

- The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
