✓ THE GAME: The Lady Blues have won four straight MIAA games heading into a 5:30 p.m. matchup with arch-rival Emporia State Wednesday evening in Lee Arena. Washburn (20-3, 11-3 MIAA) is a game behind the Lady Hornets (19-4, 12-2 MIAA) in the conference standings and is tied with Missouri Western for second place.

Emporia State leads the all-time series 35-23, including a 61-51 win in Emporia earlier this season. Washburn has won the last two meetings in Lee Arena (both last season), winning 70-61 on Jan. 23, 2002 and 72-59 in the MIAA Tournament semifinals Feb. 27, 2002.

✓ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. ▼ THE COACHES: Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 56-24 (.700) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

Brandon Schneider is 187-50 in his fifth season at the helm of the Hornets.

ESU's all-time coaching leader in winning percentage (.786) was named the fifth head coach in ESU women's basketball history on April 27, 1998. Schneider, who was voted the MIAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career in 2001, saw four players earn All-MIAA status last season, including the NCAA Division II Player of the Year Emily Bloss. He has coached three NCAA II All-Americans (Emily Bloss, 1st team Kodak (2001); 1st team GTE Academic (1999,2000,2001); Tara Holloway, 1st team Kodak (2000); and Jurgita Kausaite, 1st team Kodak (1999)) and two national players of the year (Emily Bloss (2001) and Tara Holloway (2000)) in his first three years as a head coach.

In his first three years as a head coach, he has led the Hornets to three MIAA regular-season titles, three MIAA post-season tournament championships, three NCAA II South Central Regional championship games, and two appearances in the NCAA II Elite Eight. He was the first rookie head coach in the history of the conference to win both the MIAA regular season and tournament titles and was the fastest MIAA coach to 75 wins in conference history.

Schneider was instrumental in helping ESU to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a berth in the 1998 NCAA II championship game. As recruiting coordinator, Schneider has helped attract six NJCAA All- Americans and four high school All-Americans to ESU. In addition, he has also coached three future professional players - Aneta Kausaite, Jurgita Kausaite, and Myshka Wilkerson.

Schneider, a native of Canyon, Texas, was a 1995 honors graduate of Wayland Baptist (Plainview, Texas). At Wayland, Schneider was a four-year letterman in men's basketball and was the school's first-ever Academic All- American, capturing the honor three times. In 1994, he

was named WBU's Outstanding Senior Student-Athlete and was team MVP as a senior after averaging 8.5 points and four assists. In addition, he was voted the institution's Student of the Year in Psychology and Secondary Education.

Schneider's father, Bob, has been one of the most successful women's coaches at the NCAA Division II level, having served as the head coach at West Texas A&M since 1981. His brother, Brett, is an assistant coach under former Hornet head coach Cindy Stein at the University of Missouri.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT FEB. 15
AGAINST CENTRAL MISSOURI STATE: WARRENSBURG, MO - The No. 12 ranked Washburn
Lady Blues snapped a four-game losing streak on
the road to Central Missouri in a 54-48 win.

The Lady Blues led from start to finish as the Lady Blues No. 1 ranked MIAA defense held the Jennies to 15 first half points including four field goals in 21 attempts. The Lady Blues held the Jennies scoreless the first 8:36 of the ballgame.

In the second half, the Jennies would cut the lead to three at 33-30, but the Lady Blues would go on a 16-7 run over the next five minutes and not look back.

Carissa Goeglein and Crystal Walker each scored 13 leading the Lady Blues. Alison Garrett added 10.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. EMPORIA STATE JAN. 22, 2003: EMPORIA, KAN - The No. 4 Washburn Lady Blues suffered their first loss of the season in a 61-51 defeat to the Emporia State Hornets. With the loss, the Lady Blues fall to 15-1 and 6-1 in the MIAA and a into a tie with Emporia State atop the MIAA standings.

In the Lady Blues started slowly as they did not score until the 12:49 mark of the first half after the Lady Hornets jumped out to an 8-0 lead. The Lady Blues scored first on a pair of free throws by freshman Dani McHenry. Overall, the the Lady Blues shot 21 percent for the half connecting on 6 of 28 field goals and were outrebounded 24 to 19.After the

Records as of Feb. 10 Next poll (Feb. 19) Hornets scored the first eight points of the game. The Lady Blues would fight back and tie the score at 13 and take the lead at 15-13, but ESU would eventually take a 32-20 lead into the break at halftime.

The Lady Blues would battle back and cut the lead to eight on two different occassions with under five minutes remaining, but would not get any closer.

Carissa Goeglein led the Lady Blues with 12 points and seven rebounds. Crystal Walker scored eight.

✓ **THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** Emporia State leads the all-time series 35-23 after winning 61-51 in Emporia on Jan. 22 earlier this season.

In 2001-02 Washburn snapped a nine-game losing skid in the series in a big way by sweeping three meetings.

The Lady Blues won 70-61 in Topeka on Jan. 23, 2002 and 79-70 in Emporia on Feb. 20, 2002 in the regular season meetings last year. Washburn also ended ESU's 13-game MIAA Tournament winning streak Feb. 27, 2002 winning 72-59 in the MIAA Tournament semifinals.

✓ **ABOUT THE LADY HORNETS:** The No. 24 ranked Emporia State Lady Hornets defeated Missouri Southern 91-80 in White Auditorium on Saturday night. ESU's Kristie McClain tied her career high 31 points to lead the Lady Hornets. Jamie Blakely added 8 assists and is now two behind Jennifer Perine's ESU career record of 615.

McClain is averaging 18.6 points and 7.0 rebounds a game overall and has 22.4 points and 8.0 rebounds a game averages in MIAA play. Nicole Patry is averaging 12.0 points a game. Blakely is one of NCAA Division II's leaders in assists with 174 (7.6 per game) this season.

LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 224-52 (.818) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is

536-307 (.636) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL (FEB. 12):

The Washburn Lady Blues stayed at No. 12 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues **led** the MIAA and were **24th** in the nation last season by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Feb. 9, 2003, Washburn **led** the MIAA and was **15th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.4** points a game.

✓ WALKER TURNING UP GAME FOR SEC-OND MVP RUN?: Senior Crystal Walker is stating her case for MIAA Most Valuable Player for a second straight season by averaging 17.5 points and 7.6 rebounds a game in conference play.

Walker netted a new career-high with 32 points, including 20 of Washburn's 28 points in the second half at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6

Earlier in the season against Central Missouri State Walker became the 16th Lady Blue to score her 1000th career point and netted 22 of her 24 points in a second half comeback. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State Jan. 15.

Walker is currently third in the MIAA in scoring (16.4) and sixth in rebounding (7.5). She is also fourth in field goal percentage (49.5) and eighth in blocks (0.73).

✓ GARRETT AND WESTLING GIVE SPARK

TO WU LINEUP: The Lady Blues traveled to Southwest Baptist and Missouri-Rolla sporting a new lineup for the first time since the second game of the season.

Washburn's five seniors (Crystal Walker, Carissa Goeglein, Bethany McGraw, Gosia Czarnecka and Kristy Chapman) started 17 straight games before a new lineup started at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Sophomores Alison Garrett and Lora Westling joined Walker, Goeglein and McGraw in the starting lineup.

Garrett was 4-for-4 from the field (all 3-pointers) to net 12 points combined in her first two starts in a Washburn uniform. She followed that effort with a career-high 18 points on 7 of 10 shooting (4 of 5 3-pointers) Wednesday against Northwest Missouri State. Garrett is 15 of 19 from the field (10 of 12 3-pointers) since becoming a starter.

Westling, who also started the season opener, was 10-for-17 on the road trip and led the Lady Blues with 15 points at Missouri-Rolla. She had a team high five assists and seven rebounds against Northwest Missouri State. Westling is 13 of 25 from the field in the last four games as a starter.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- With a win over Central Missouri State Saturday, Washburn posted its second straight 20-win season for the first time since going 22-8 in 1993-94 and following with a 24-7 record in 1994-95.
- In their three losses the Lady Blues are shooting 36.4 percent (63 of 173) from the field, including 24.1 percent (14 of 58) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.6 percent (510 of 1144) from the field and 36.7 percent (112 of 2305) from 3-point range in its 20 victories.

• **Crystal Walker** is averaging **17.0** points and **7.4** rebounds a game in MIAA regular season play the last two seasons. She has scored 543 points and grabbed 236 rebounds in those 32 conference games.

She also became the 16th Washburn player to score 1000 points and 14th player to score 1000 points and grab 500 rebounds earlier this season

- **Kristy Chapman** is 20th in career scoring with 893 points and has 107 career 3-pointers. She is just four 3-pointers away from breaking Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's career record of 110.
- Washburn has outscored opponents 68.6 to 56.0 this season and has outrebounded opponents 37.6 to 31.9. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA in scoring margin.

The Lady Blues were **22nd** in scoring margin in the nation **(+13.2)** when the NCAA statistics report was released Feb. 9. Washburn was also **24th** in free throw percentage **(74.9 percent)**.

- Washburn has outshot opponents in 18 of 23 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.
- Washburn's starting frontcourt, Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein were both selected as preseason All-America players by the Women's Division II Bulletin, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.
- The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked **second** in the **MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll.** Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
