✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues have won six straight MIAA games heading into a 5:30 p.m. matchup at Missouri Western Wednesday night. Washburn (22-3, 13-3 MIAA) is tied with Emporia State (20-5, 13-3 MIAA) for first in the conference standings. Missouri Western is in third at 20-5 and 12-4 in MIAA play. The Griffons had won nine straight in MIAA play before a 94-80 loss at Southwest Baptist Saturday.

Missouri Western leads the all-time series 35-24 and owns an 11-game winning streak against the Lady Blues. Washburn's last win in the series was a 71-64 triumph Jan. 11, 1999 in Lee Arena behind Jennifer Butcher's 25 points. The Griffons entered that game with a 13-0 record. Western ended Washburn's 19-game home court winning streak earlier on Jan. 29.

Washburn has also lost its last 10 times to Missouri Western in St. Joseph, Mo., dating back to Washburn's 93-79 win on Feb. 10, 1996 at MWSC Fieldhouse.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. The Ron McHenry show can be heard Thursday at 6 p.m. and is broadcast live from McB's Sports Bar, 4731 NW Hunters Ridge on AM 580 with Bruce Steinbrock.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 58-24 (.707) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

Dave Slifer is in his 8th season at Missouri Western State College, posting a 181-57 record at Western and 359-87 overall record.

Coach Slifer and the Griffons made their sixth straight appearance to the NCAA South Central Regional Tournament, finishing the year at 27-3 overall.

The Griffons have won 20+ games in six straight seasons and have been in the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Postseason Tournament championship game the last six years in a row. Western won both the MIAA regular season and postseason tournament titles last season. Western was ranked No. 1 in the country 4-weeks last season, the first ever Missouri Western team to hold a No. 1 ranking in any sport in school history.

Slifer became the winningest coach in MWSC women's basketball history vs. Columbia College last season. Slifer surpassed Debbie Bumpus who previously held the mark.

The Griffons made the semifinal round of the South Central Regional in 2002 and have a 9-8 overall record in NCAA post-season competition. Slifer was named the MIAA's Coach-of-the-Year in 2001-02. He previously held that honor in 1996-97 and was also honored by the WBCA as its District 6 Division II Coach of the Year in 1998-99.

Prior to Missouri Western, Slifer coached six years at Mount Mercy (Iowa) College before accepting the Griffon head coaching position in May, 1995. His record was 178-30 and his 1994 and 1995 Mustang teams reached the NAIA final four, compiling 31-3 and 31-6 records.

His Mount Mercy stint closed with a streak of five straight NAIA national tournament appearances, also reaching the national quarterfinals in 1992 and 1993. A 1982 graduate of Mount Mercy, Slifer has a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration.

He earned a Master's Degree in Business Administration from Eastern Illinois University in 1985.

Slifer's wife Tammy is an assistant coach for the Griffons and teaches in the St. Joseph School District. They are the parents of Brittney, D.J. and Maggie.

### ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT FEB. 22 AGAINST PITTSBURG STATE: TOPEKA

The No. 12 Washburn Lady Blues shook off a dismal shooting start to win 71-58 over in-state rival Pittsburg State in Lee Arena Saturday night. With the win Washburn improved to 22-3 and 13-3 in the MIAA and stayed tied with Emporia State for the MIAA lead.

The Lady Blues made just two of their first 12 shots in the opening half, before knocking in 13 of their last 17 in the half to surge to a 39-24 lead. Alison Garrett paced the Lady Blues by hitting three of her four 3-point shots for nine points. Garrett hit a 3-pointer with two seconds left in the opening half.

The Gorillas pulled within 41-33 on Amanda Davied's jumper with 16:47 left to cap a 9-2 run. The Lady Blues extended the lead to 54-37 with 9:28 on Kristy Chapman's two free throws. Chapman finished with a season high 19 points to lead the Lady Blues by hitting all six of her field goals and five of six free throws.

Crystal Walker scored 18 points and grabbed five rebounds, while Carissa Goeglein added 13 points.

### ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. MISSOURI WESTERN JAN. 29, 2003: TOPEKA

The Washburn Lady Blues fell behind early and never caught up in their 60-56 loss to Missouri Western in Lee Arena Wednesday night. The loss snapped Washburn's 19-game home court winning streak and gave the Griffons their 11th straight win in the series.

With the loss Washburn (16-2, 7-2 MIAA) fell one game behind Emporia State (15-3, 8-1 MIAA) in the MIAA standings. Emporia State

topped Northwest Missouri State 85-69 Wednesday night.

The Griffons took an early 8-0 lead three minutes into the game when Carly Lee canned her second 3-pointer of the game. Lee and Steph Jones each scored 11 points to help Western to a 41-28 halftime lead.

The Lady Blues closed the gap within 50-47 on Crystal Walker's two made free throws with 7:49 left.

Walker added eight of Washburn's final 11 points and made it 58-56 with a baseline jumper with 1:01 left.

The Lady Blues got the ball back with 20 seconds left and had a chance to take the lead on Kristy Chapman's 3-point attempt that rimmed out.

✓ **THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn is 24-35 in the all-time series against Missouri Western after falling 60-56 to the Griffons in Lee Arena on Jan. 29 earlier this season. The loss extended Missouri Western's winning streak in the series to 11 games.

Washburn lost all three games against the Griffons last season. Western topped the Lady Blues 69-67 in Topeka Jan. 2, 72-64 in St. Joseph, Mo. Jan. 30 and 54-51 in St. Joseph, Mo. March 1 last season.

Washburn's last win over the Griffons was a 71-64 triumph Jan. 11, 1999 behind Jennifer Butcher's 25 points. The Griffons entered that game with a 13-0 record.

The Lady Blues have also lost their last 10 times at Missouri Western, last winning 93-79 Feb. 10, 1996 at MWSC Fieldhouse.

The Lady Blues have lost 16 of their last 17 overall and 14 of their last 15 in MWSC Fieldhouse to the Griffons.

✓ **ABOUT THE GRIFFONS:** The Griffons snapped a nine-game MIAA winning streak with a 94-80 loss at Southwest Baptist Wednesday night. Nicole Lindsey led Western with 19 points and nine rebounds, while Steph Jones had 18 points.

Jones leads the Griffons with 16.2 points and averages 7.2 rebounds a game, while Lindsey averages 15.7 points and a team-high 9.0 rebounds a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 226-52 (.813) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan. 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in

the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 537-307 (.637) in its 33rd season of inter-collegiate action.

✓ **LATEST WBCA POLL (FEB. 19):**

The Washburn Lady Blues stayed at No. 12 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Feb. 16, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 14th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.0 points a game.

✓ **WALKER TURNING UP GAME FOR SECOND MVP RUN?:**

Senior Crystal Walker is stating her case for MIAA Most Valuable Player for a second straight season by averaging 17.2 points and 7.5 rebounds a game in conference play.

Walker netted a new career-high with 32 points, including 20 of Washburn's 28 points in the second half at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Earlier in the season against Central Missouri State Walker became the 16th Lady Blue to score her 1000th career point and netted 22 of her 24 points in a second half comeback. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State Jan. 15.

In conference games only, Walker is currently second in the MIAA in scoring (17.1) and sixth in rebounding (7.7). She is also second in field goal percentage (50.0), second in free throw percentage (84.5) and eighth in blocks (0.93).

✓ **SUPER SOPHOMORES GIVE SPARK TO WU LINEUP:**

The Lady Blues traveled to Southwest Baptist and Missouri-Rolla sporting a new lineup for the first time since the second game of the season.

Washburn's five seniors (Crystal Walker, Carissa Goeglein, Bethany McGraw, Gosia Czarnecka and Kristy Chapman) started 17

straight games before a new lineup started at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Sophomores Alison Garrett and Lora Westling joined Walker, Goeglein and McGraw in the starting lineup.

Garrett and Westling are averaging 9.7 and 5.8 points a game respectively in their six games since earning the starting nod.

✓ **BLUE DEFENSE KEY TO SIX GAME WINNING STEAK:** The Lady Blues have also turned up their defense in their current six-game winning streak, holding opponents to 52.0 points a game. The Lady Blues have held opponents to 35.1 percent from the floor and 22.6 percent from 3-point field goal range in the last six.

✓ **BURLINGTON BOMBER HEATING UP BEYOND THE ARCH:** After hitting the second most 3-pointers (24) ever by a Washburn freshman last season, Alison Garrett struggled in non-conference play earlier this season by hitting only 8 of 37 (21.6 percent) 3-pointers.

The Burlington, Kan. native has reversed her sophomore slump by hitting 16 of her last 21 (76.2 percent) since joining the starting lineup five games ago. She is now 31 of 61 (50.8 percent in MIAA play). Her percentage is best among all MIAA players in league play. \*

### ✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

• With a win over Central Missouri State Feb. 15, Washburn posted its second straight 20-win season for the first time since going 22-8 in 1993-94 and following with a 24-7 record in 1994-95.

• In their three losses the Lady Blues are shooting 36.4 percent (63 of 173) from the field, including 24.1 percent (14 of 58) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.5 percent (557 of 1251) from the field and 36.6 percent (123 of 336) from 3-point range in its 22 victories.

• Crystal Walker is averaging 16.9 points and 7.3 rebounds a game in MIAA regular season play the last two seasons. She has scored 573 points and grabbed 249 rebounds in those 34 conference games.

She also became the 16th Washburn player to score 1000 points and 14th player to score 1000 points and grab 500 rebounds earlier this season.

• Kristy Chapman is 20th in career scoring with 917 points and has 109 career 3-pointers. She is just two 3-pointers away from breaking Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's career record of 110.

• Washburn has outscored opponents 68.6 to 56.1 this season and has outrebounded opponents 37.4 to 31.7. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA in both categories.

The Lady Blues were 23rd in scoring margin in the nation (+12.6) when the NCAA statistics report was released Feb. 16. Washburn was also 16th in free throw percentage (75.6 percent).

• Washburn has outshot opponents in 20 of 25 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.

• Washburn's starting frontcourt, Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein were both selected as preseason All-America players by the Women's Division II Bulletin, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.

• The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
