✓ **THE GAME:** The Lady Blues are looking to claim sole possession of their second MIAA title 5:30 p.m. with a Senior Night matchup against Missouri Southern in Lee Arena Saturday night. Washbum (23-3, 14-3 MIAA) snapped an 11-game losing skid against Missouri Western Wednesday night in St. Joseph, Mo. to take a one-game lead in the conference standings over Emporia State (20-6, 13-4 MIAA). Emporia State lost 60-50 at Northwest Missouri State Wednesday night in Maryville, Mo. Washburn's only MIAA title was in 1992-93, when the squad went 31-1 and 16-0 in MIAA play and reached the national quarterfinals.

After the game, Washburn will honor its five seniors (Kristy Chapman, Gosia Czarnecka, Carissa Goeglein, Bethany McGraw and Crystal Walker), who have compiled a 71-42 record in four seasons. Chapman and McGraw have played all four seasons at Washburn. Walker has played three and one-half seasons, while Goeglein and Czarnecka have played two seasons for the Lady Blues. The Lady Blues have won two straight Senior Night games after beating Central Missouri State 94-85 Feb. 16, 2002.

✓ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. The Ron McHenry show can be heard Thursday at 6 p.m. and is broadcast live from McB's Sports Bar, 4731 NW Hunters Ridge on AM 580 with Bruce Steinbrock.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 59-24 (.711) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University

of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

Maryann Mitts is in her second season at Missouri Southern, posting a 32-24 record.

On April 6, 2001, Maryann Mitts became the eighth head coach to lead the Missouri Southern women's basketball team.

She brings with her a reputation for developing programs and helping young women reach their fullest potential. As head coach of the Rockhurst University Lady Hawks, Mitts took a highly successful NAIA Division II program and led it into the ranks of NCAA Division II.

In five seasons, she posted a record of 83-57 (.600). After serving as assistant coach at her alma mater from 1993 to 1996, Mitts led the 1996-97 Lady Hawks to an 18-10 record in their first season as a dual NAIA/NCAA Division II institution. That season Rockhurst won the National Catholic Basketball Tournament title, and Mitts was named NCBT Coach of the Year.

For an encore, Mitts led Rockhurst to a 24-7 record in 1997-98. The Lady Hawks won the Midwest Region and advanced to the NAIA Sweet 16 as Mitts was named Regional Coach of the Year.

Her next two squads finished at 13-14, and last season the Lady Hawks were 15-12, 7-5 and fourth in the fledgling Heartland Conference.

Mitts' squads have also been successful in the classroom, as her 1998-99 squad was No. 1 in the nation academically in NCAA Division II, and her 1999-2000 Lady Hawks were 13th.

While the assistant at Rockhurst, Mitts also initiated and directed the men's and women's tennis teams. In three seasons, she led her team to a 41-14 record and two National Tournament appearances. She was also named Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1995 and 1996.

Mitts graduated from Rockhurst University in 1992 with a bachelor of arts degree in secondary education, and from the University of MissouriKansas City in 1995 with a master of arts degree in higher education administration, emphasis in Athletic Administration.

As a two-sports standout for the Lady Hawks, Mitts earned All-America honors in volleyball and basketball. She was also Regional Player of the Year in volleyball as a senior, and was a two-time Scholastic All-American.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT AT MISSOURI WESTERN FEB. 26, 2003: ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — The No. 11 Washburn Lady Blues (23-3, 14-3 MIAA) claimed at least a share of their second MIAA title with a 70-55 win at Missouri Western Wednesday night. Emporia State (20-6, 13-4 MIAA) fell one game behind Washburn in the confence standings with a 60-50 loss at Northwest Missouri State

The win snapped Washburn's 11-game losing streak to Missouri Western and gave Washburn at least a share of the MIAA crown. Washburn's only other MIAA title was during the 1992-93 season, when the Lady Blues went 31-1 and 16-0 in MIAA play.

The win was Washburn's seventh straight in MIAA play and first at MWSC Fieldhouse since Feb. 10, 1996.

The Lady Blues trailed 26-25, before closing the first half on a 9-0 that was capped by two layups by Alison Garrett to make it 34-26.

Nicole Lindsey made two free throws to pull Western within 46-44 with 9:55 left in the game, before Washburn went on another big run.

Crystal Walker capped a 13-0 run with a jumper after Carissa Goeglein canned two 3-pointers to give Washburn a 59-44 lead with 6:05 left. The Griffons got within nine points before the Lady Blues hit six straight free throws to ice the win.

► LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. MISSOURI SOUTHERN DEG. 30, 2002: JOPLIN, Mo — The Lady Blues extended a 1-point halftime lead to 33-23 with a 9-0 run to start the second half and never looked back in their 62-54 win to open MIAA play on Dec. 30, 2002.

Carissa Goeglein exploded for 21 points on 9 of 15 shooting from the field, while Crystal Walker added 16 points to lead Washburn.

Southern guard Jacquie Rzeszut, the MIAA's leading scorer, was held to only one point in the first 39 minutes.

The Lady Blues cashed in on 15 of 17 free throw

With the win Washburn snapped a threegame losing streak in MIAA openers and improved to 9-0 on the season.

✓ **THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 30-21, including a victory in the MIAA opener earlier this season.

Washburn topped Southern 77-55 to get their first MIAA win on Jan. 7 and followed with a 73-60 win in Joplin on Feb. 4 last season.

The Lady Blues have won four straight in the series dating back to the MIAA opener for the 2000-01. Southern beat Washburn 73-67 in Joplin on Jan. 6, 2001.

✓ **ABOUT THE LADY LIONS:** The Lady Lions improved to 15-13 and 7-10 in the MIAA with a 69-53 win over MIssouri-Rolla Wednesday night. Southern was led by Jacquie Rzeszut, who had 12 points and Wyketha Harrell's 11 points.

Rzeszut leads Southern and is second in the MIAA in scoring with 16.8 points a game and has hit a league-high 72 3-pointers. Lucimara Silva is the only other Lady Lion in double figures with 12.5 points.

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 226-52 (.813) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 538-307 (.637) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL (FEB. 26):

The Washburn Lady Blues moved up a spot to No. 11 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Feb. 16, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 14th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.0 points a game.

✓ WALKER TURNING UP GAME FOR SEC-OND MVP RUN?: Senior Crystal Walker is stating her case for MIAA Most Valuable Player for a second straight season by averaging 17.2 points and 7.4 rebounds a game in conference play.

Walker netted a new career-high with 32 points, including 20 of Washburn's 28 points in the second half at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Earlier in the season against Central Missouri State Walker became the 16th Lady Blue to score her 1000th career point and netted 22 of her 24 points in a second half comeback. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State Jan. 15.

Walker is currently third in the MIAA in scoring (16.2) and seventh in rebounding (7.2). She is also fourth in field goal percentage (49.2), third in free throw percentage (81.4) and eighth in blocks (0.81).

✓ SUPER SOPHOMORES GIVE SPARK TO WU LINEUP: The Lady Blues traveled to Southwest Baptist and Missouri-Rolla sporting a new lineup for the first time since the second game of the season.

Washburn's five seniors (Crystal Walker, Carissa Goeglein, Bethany McGraw, Gosia Czarnecka and Kristy Chapman) started 17 straight games before a new lineup started at Southwest Baptist Feb. 6.

Sophomores Alison Garrett and Lora Westling joined Walker, Goeglein and McGraw in the starting lineup.

Garrett and Westling are averaging 10.0 and 5.9 points a game respectively in their seven games since earning the starting nod.

▶ BLUE DEFENSE KEY TO SEVEN-GAME WINNING STEAK: The Lady Blues have also turned up their defense in their current sevengame winning streak, holding opponents to 52.4 points a game. The Lady Blues have held opponents to 35.5 percent from the floor and 22.5 percent from 3-point field goal range in the last seven.

▶ BURLINGTON BOMBER CONTINUES TO TORCH THE NETS BEYOND THE ARCH: After hitting the second most 3-pointers (24) ever by a Washburn freshman last season, Alison Garrett struggled in non-conference play earlier this season by hitting only 8 of 37 (21.6 percent) 3-pointers.

The Burlington, Kan. native has reversed her sophomore slump by hitting 18 of her last 25 (72.0 percent) since joining the starting lineup five games ago. She is now 33 of 65 (50.8 percent in MIAA play). Her percentage is best among all MIAA players in league play.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- With a win over Central Missouri State Feb. 15, Washburn posted its second straight 20-win season for the first time since going 22-8 in 1993-94 and following with a 24-7 record in 1994-95.
- In their three losses the Lady Blues are shooting 36.4 percent (63 of 173) from the field, including 24.1 percent (14 of 58) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.4 percent (580 of 1304) from the field and 37.0 percent (129 of 349) from 3-point range in its 23 victories.

• Crystal Walker is averaging 16.9 points and 7.3 rebounds a game in MIAA regular season play the last two seasons. She has scored 591 points and grabbed 255 rebounds in those 35 conference games.

She also became the 16th Washburn player to score 1000 points and 14th player to score 1000 points and grab 500 rebounds earlier this season.

- Kristy Chapman is 20th in career scoring with 921 points and has 109 career 3-pointers. She is just two 3-pointers away from breaking Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's career record of 110.
- Washburn has outscored opponents 68.6 to 56.1 this season and has outrebounded opponents 37.1 to 31.7. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA in both categories.

The Lady Blues were 24rd in scoring margin in the nation (+12.4) when the NCAA statistics report was released Feb. 23. Washburn was also 11th in free throw percentage (76.2 percent).

- Washburn has outshot opponents in 20 of 25 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.
- Washburn's starting frontcourt, Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein were both selected as preseason All-America players by the Women's Division II Bulletin, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.
- The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
