✓ **THE TOURNAMENT:** The Washburn Lady Blues will travel to Kansas City, Mo. for the 2003 Sonic MIAA Women's Basketball Tournament March 6-9. The Lady Blues won the MIAA regular season title and are the No. 1 seed in the tournament and will play a 12 p.m. game Thursday against No. 8 seed Truman State. The Lady Blues have won eight straight since losing to Truman State 76-71 in Kirksville, Mo on Feb. 1.

Washburn is 12-10 all-time in the MIAA Tournament and has never faced Truman State. The Lady Blues have won two MIAA Tournament titles, including 1992-93 when the squad went 3-0 in their only stint as a No. 1 seed in tournament history.

✓ **WALKER WINS SECOND MVP AWARD AND IS NAMED DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR:** KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Crystal Walker, a 6-foot senior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was named MIAA Most Valuable Player Sunday night at the MIAA Media Welcome Reception. Walker was fourth in the MIAA in scoring with 15.8 points a game, seventh in rebounding (7.1 rpg) and fourth in field goal percentage (49.3 percent). She also earned MIAA Player of the Week honors twice this season.

On Jan. 18 earlier this season Walker became the 16th Washburn player to reach the 1,000 point plateau by netting 22 of her 24 points in the second half of a comeback win against Central Missouri State in Lee Arena. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State on Jan. 15. She currently has 1,207 points and 605 rebounds in her career.

Walker is the first player to win back-to-back MIAA Most Valuable Player awards since Aneta Kausaite of Emporia State shared the award in 1996-97 and won the award again in 1997-98. She is the only Washburn Lady Blue to win MIAA MVP honors twice.

Walker also was a member of the MIAA's Inaugural All-Defensive Team and was selected as the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year.

Carissa Goegelein earned second team All-MIAA honors by averaging 13.1 points and 5.0 rebounds a game. Goegelein, a 5-11 junior from Yuma, Colo. was also a first team All-MIAA selection as a junior in 2001-02.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast on AM 580-WIBW radio with Bruce Steinbrock calling play-by-play action and Mark Elliott adding the color commentary. ✓ **HEAD COACH RON MCHENRY:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 60-24 (.714) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching

career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

✓ **LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT VS MISSOURI SOUTHERN MARCH 1, 2003:** TOPEKA — The No. 11 Washburn Lady Blues (24-3, 15-3 MIAA) claimed the MIAA title outright with a 61-55 win over Missouri Southern on Senior Night in Lee Arena. The title was the second for Washburn, which won the MIAA title in 1992-93 with a 31-1 and 16-0 MIAA record.

The Lady Blues took an early 20-11 lead on Carissa Goeglein's jumper with 8:57 left in the opening half. Southern responded and took its first lead at 34-32 on Carol Koenig's 3-pointer from the right wing as the buzzer sounded.

Southern extended the lead to as many as six points in the second half, before Washburn took the lead for good on Lora Westling's

Westling led the Lady Blues with 13 points, while Carissa Goeglein posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. Gosia Czarnecka added a season-high 10 points.

✓ **LADY BLUES LAST TIME VS. TRUMAN STATE FEB. 1, 2003:** KIRKSVILLE, MO - The No. 5 Washburn Lady Blues lost their second straight game 76-71 to the Truman State Bulldogs. The loss dropped the Lady Blues to 16-3 and 7-3 in the MIAA. The Lady Blues now find themselves two games behind Emporia State who topped Missouri-Rolla 66-63 in Rolla.

The Lady Blues ran into a hot shooting Bulldog squad who hit 11 of 18 from 3-point land in the game, led by Annie Westhoff's career-high 27 points. In the second half, the Lady Blues fought back to tie the score at 43 after the first media time out at 14:32, but the Bulldogs went on a 17-6 run to take the lead at 60-49 at the eight minute mark. The Lady Blues would go on a 5-0 run to claw back to 60-54 with 6:10 remaining. After another Bulldog three, Truman would take a 63-54 lead at the 4:55 media time out.

Again, the Lady Blues would cut the lead to five at 67-62 on a pair of Bethany McGraw free throws.

After a Lady Blues turnover, the Bulldogs would push the lead back to 69-62 with 3:04 left. The Lady Blues would not convert a 3-point attempt and would not get any closer than four the rest of the way after a Gosia Czarnecka 3-pointer cutting the lead to 70-66 with 1:41 left. The Bulldogs would convert a pair of free throws to take the lead 72-66 with 1:22 remaining and the Lady Blues would not get any closer than five as the Bulldogs would hit 6 of 10 free throws in the final 1:22 to finish the game.

The Bulldogs led at the break 38-34 after ending the half on a 5-0 run as the Lady Blues went scoreless from the field the final 2:09. The Lady Blues had a chance to go in with at worst the lead at 34-33, but a turnover that resulted in a foul with two Truman free throws and a missed shot the Bulldogs converted into a 3-pointer at the buzzer led to the Bulldog four-point lead. The Lady Blues were outscored 14-4 in the paint in the first half and the Bulldogs forced 10 Washburn turnovers converting them into 13 points.

There were also nine lead changes. The Lady Blues were led by Crystal Walker who scored 24 points. McGraw scored 11 and Carissa Goeglein scored 10. The Lady Blues were 7 of 25 from 3-point arc. The Bulldogs for the game converted 13 Lady Blues

turnovers into 18 points while the Lady Blues capitalized on 11 points off of 17 Bulldog turnovers. The Lady Blues were also outscored 22 to 10 in the paint.

✓ **THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 22-8 after splitting two regular season matchups this season. The Lady Blues won 85-57 in Topeka earlier this season on Jan. 4, before falling 76-71 at Truman on Feb. 1. The squads also split last seasons meetings.

Washburn cruised to a 82-58 win at home on Feb. 2, 2002, while Truman State edged Washburn 55-53 in Kirksville, Mo. on Jan. 5, 2002.

✓ **ABOUT THE BULLDOGS:** The Bulldogs finished the regular season 9-17 and 5-13 in MIAA play after losing 72-50 to Central Missouri State Saturday night. Annie Westhoff had 13 points, while Adri Tromp had seven points and 17 rebounds.

Westhoff is averaging 15.6 points, while Sarah Sommer is averaging 12.3 points a game. Tromp is averaging a team-high 8.1 rebounds a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 227-52 (.814) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 539-307 (.637) in its 33rd season of inter-collegiate action.

✓ **LATEST WBCA POLL (FEB. 26):**

The Washburn Lady Blues moved up a spot to No. 11 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened

the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on Feb. 23, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 14th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.0 points a game.

✓ **BLUE DEFENSE KEY TO EIGHT-GAME WINNING STEAK:**

The Lady Blues have also turned up their defense in their current seven-game winning streak, holding opponents to 52.8 points a game. The Lady Blues have held opponents to 36.0 percent from the floor and 22.7 percent from 3-point field goal range in the last eight.

✓ **WASHBURN TIP-INS:**

• With a win over Central Missouri State Feb. 15, Washburn posted its second straight 20-win season for the first time since going 22-8 in 1993-94 and following with a 24-7 record in 1994-95.

• In their three losses the Lady Blues are shooting 36.4 percent (63 of 173) from the field, including 24.1 percent (14 of 58) from 3-point range.

Washburn is 44.5 percent (598 of 1344) from the field and 37.5 percent (136 of 363) from 3-point range in its 24 victories.

• Crystal Walker is averaging 16.9 points and 7.3 rebounds a game in MIAA regular season play the last two seasons. She has scored 597 points and grabbed 260 rebounds in those 36 conference games.

She also became the 16th Washburn player to score 1000 points and 14th player to score 1000 points and grab 500 rebounds earlier this season.

• Kristy Chapman is 20th in career scoring with 926 points and has 110 career 3-pointers. She is tied with Brenda Shaffer-Dahl's Washburn career 3-point record.

• Washburn has outscored opponents 68.6 to 56.1 this season and has outrebounded opponents 37.1 to 31.7. The Lady Blues lead the MIAA in both categories.

The Lady Blues were 24rd in scoring margin in the nation (+12.4) when the NCAA statistics report was released Feb. 23. Washburn was also 11th in free throw percentage (76.2 percent).

• Washburn has outshot opponents in 20 of 25 games this season. The Lady Blues have held the opposition to under 50 percent from the field in every game.

• Washburn's starting frontcourt, Crystal Walker and Carissa Goeglein were both selected as preseason All-America players by the Women's Division II Bulletin, a publication focused solely on women's Division II basketball.

• The Lady Blues were picked 16th in the Women's Division II Bulletin Preseason Poll.

The Lady Blues were also picked second in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending conference champion Missouri Western was ranked No. 1 in the poll.
