✓ **LADY BLUES STILL DANCING IN NCAA TOURNAMENT:** The Washburn Lady Blues defeated Drury University 87-71 in the South Central Regional finals to earn a berth to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight March 26-29 in St. Joseph, Mo. The Lady Blues will open with Northern Kentucky 3 p.m. March 26 in the St. Joseph Civic Arena. Washburn will be making its third appearance into the Elite Eight and first since the 1992-93 season.

The Lady Blues opened the national tournament with a 67-56 win over Midwestern State in the regional quarterfinals behind Crystal Walker's 31 points, before beating Emporia State 66-60 in the regional semifinals. Walker was the South Central Regional tournament's Most Valuable Player. Washburn's Carissa Goeglein and Kristy Chapman were named to the all-tournament team.

Washburn, now 30-3 overall, was the MIAA regular season champion and Sonic MIAA Tournament champion. The Lady Blues are riding a 14-game winning streak and are the first MIAA team to reach the Elite Eight since Emporia State in 1999-2000.

Tournament passes are \$30 for Premium Seating and \$25 for General Admission Seating. Day Passes for the quarterfinals are \$25 for Premium Seating and \$20 for General Admission Seating, while Day Passes for the semifinals are \$15 for Premium Seating and \$12 for General Admission Seating. Tickets for the championship game are \$12 for Premium Seating and \$10 for General Seating. All Day Passes are walk-up only and are based on availability.

✓ **WASHBURN IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:** Washburn is 9-6 in NCAA Division II playoff games after sweeping through the South Central Regional in Topeka March 14-17.

✓ **ABOUT NORTHERN KENTUCKY:** The Northern Kentucky Norse enter the tournament with a 24-7 record after 64-61 comeback win in the Great Lakes Regional finals against Quincy in Indianapolis, Ind. Northern Kentucky trailed by as many as 16 points in the second half, before regional Most Valuable Player Amy Mobley brought them back with 19 points, five steals, nine rebounds and five assists.

NKU, which finished tied for second in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with a 15-5 record, is led by Mobley. Mobley earned second team All-Great Lakes Valley honors and enters the Elite Eight with 15.6 points and 6.6 rebounds a game averages. She is No. 9 in all-time scoring at NKU with 1,370 career points. Senior Bridget Flanagan, also a second team all-conference selection, averages 14.0

points a game after breaking the school record for 3-pointers in a season for the second straight year with 88. Flanagan hit 81 3-pointers in 2001-02 and is the career leader with 246 treys.

The Norse are making their fourth trip to the Elite Eight in their last five seasons under 20th year head coach Nancy Winstel, who has boasts a 437-139 record at NKU. She has a 476-180 record overall in 23 seasons.

Northern Kentucky is 17-12 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, having won the national title during the 1999-2000 season in Pine Bluff, Ark.

### ✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT AT THE NCAA SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL TOURNAMENT:

TOPEKA — Washburn used a 15-6 run to open the second half, breaking open a tie game, to advance to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Div. II National Women's Basketball Tournament. Washburn defeated Drury, 87-71, to advance to the national finals in St. Joseph, Mo., March 26-29. It will be the third Elite Eight appearance for the Lady Blues, who also advanced in 1993.

With the halftime score knotted at 35, the Lady Blues made six of their first eight shots, including two 3-pointers by Lora Westling and another by Bethany McGraw. Carissa Goeglein's jumper with 16:32 to go put the Lady Blues up by nine, 50-41.

The Lady Panthers, making their first NCAA post-season appearance in just their third year as a varsity program, used a 7-0 run, sparked by five points from Magen Brunson, to close within two, 50-48, with 15:04 to play.

But the rest of the game belonged to Washburn, which scored a season-best 52 points in the second half. The Lady Blues outrebounded the Lady Panthers, 17-10, in the second half, and shot 52 percent from the field in the final 20 minutes.

The first half ended in a 35-35 draw as the teams exchanged the lead 13 times and with six ties. Neither team led by more than four points at any time during the opening 20 minutes.

For the game, Washburn shot 51 percent from the field and outrebounded Drury, 33-24.

Washburn senior forward Crystal Walker was named the most valuable player of the regional after scoring 18 points in the championship game. Goeglein, also named all-regional, was the game's leading scorer with 19.

Lora Westling (18) and Kristy Chapman (12) also were in double figures for Washburn, and Chapman was named to the all-regional team.

Drury's Jill Curry, with 13 points tonight, and Kara Rutledge also were named to the all-regional team. Magen Brunson led the Lady Panthers in scoring

with 15 while Amanda Newton added 13. Emporia State's Kristie McClain rounded out the all-regional tournament team.

Washburn improves its record to 30-3, including a 14-game winning streak, while Drury finishes its season at 27-5.

### ✓ WALKER ADDS TO HONORS WITH SELECTION TO WBCA ALL-STAR GAME:

ATLANTA, Ga. — As the top senior vote getter in NCAA Division II women's basketball, Crystal Walker was selected to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-Star Challenge April 4.

The WBCA All-Star Challenge includes twenty of the top senior collegiate players in women's basketball will showcas at Georgia Tech's Alexander Memorial Coliseum. The game will be part of a doubleheader with the WBCA High School All-American game, which tips off at 6 p.m. (EST).

The game includes 17 Division I players and the top senior vote getters from each NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III and the NAIA.

Walker, a 6-foot senior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was named to the Daktronics-CoSIDA All-South Central Region first team March 11 and shared the MIAA Player of the Year honors.

Walker was second in the MIAA in scoring with 16.5 points a game, seventh in rebounding (7.0 rpg) and fourth in field goal percentage (49.6 percent). and was the Most Valuable Player of both the Sonic MIAA Tournament and South Central Regional Tournament.

Walker scored 19 of her 21 points in the second half of the Sonic MIAA Tournament championship game Sunday in Washburn's 71-60 win over Missouri Western.

Walker is also a finalist for the WBCA All-America team.

On Jan. 18 earlier this season Walker became the 16th Washburn player to reach the 1,000 point plateau by netting 22 of her 24 points in the second half of a comeback win against Central Missouri State in Lee Arena. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State on Jan. 15.

Walker was the first player to win back-to-back MIAA Most Valuable Player awards since Aneta Kausaite of Emporia State shared the award in 1996-97 and won the award again in 1997-98. She is the only Washburn Lady Blue to win MIAA MVP honors twice.

Walker also was a member of the MIAA's Inaugural All-Defensive Team and was selected as the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year.

honors by averaging 13.1 points and 5.0 rebounds a game. Goeglein, a 5-11 junior from Yuma, Colo. was also a first team All-MIAA selection as a junior in 2001-02.

✓ **MCHENRY TABBED AS REGION 6 COACH OF THE YEAR BY WBCA:** After guiding the Lady Blues to their second MIAA regular season and third MIAA Tournament title, Ron McHenry was named Region 6 Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches of America.

With the honor McHenry becomes one of eight finalists for the Russell Athletic/WBCA National Coach of the Year, which will be presented Monday April 7 during the NCAA Division I women's Final Four weekend in Atlanta, Ga.

✓ **HEAD COACH RON MCHENRY:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 66-24 (.724) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turn-arounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry

eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 230-52 (.816) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 16-1 in Lee Arena this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 71.1 to 56.2 (1209-955 points). The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena in 2001-02.

Washburn won 44 straight homes game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 547-307 (.641) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

## ✓ LATEST WBCA POLL (MARCH 19):

The Washburn Lady Blues moved up to No. 5 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues led the MIAA and were 24th in the nation last season by holding opponents to 58.6 points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on March 16, 2003, Washburn led the MIAA and was 11th in the nation by holding opponents to 56.4 points a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES MAKING GOOD ON CHARITIES:** The Lady Blues were 7th in the NCAA in
